#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by the *Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1137) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide the colony of Victoria into districts and assign the said colony and districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he may think fit, and may define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts: And whereas it is expedient to define the limits of a new district to be called the Flemington Registration District: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby define the limits and boundaries of the said district in manner following, that is to say:—

#### FLEMINGTON REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point at the crossing of the Racecourse-road and Moonee Ponds Creek; thence westerly by the Racecourse-road to Ascot Vale-road; thence northerly by that road to Kent-street; thence easterly by that street to the Mount Alexander-road; thence north-westerly by that road to Middle-street; thence easterly by a line, being the boundary of the borough, to Moonee Ponds Creek; thence by that creek to the point of commencement.

A VACANCY at present exists in the Lands Department for a Chief Clerk, Office of Agriculture, Third Class, Clerical Division.

#### The duties to be performed are—

- To conduct correspondence;
- To deal with applications, and arrange dates for lectures by experts;
- To keep record of, and communicate with competitors for, departmental prizes;
- To keep record of areas set apart for endowment of Agricultural Colleges;
- To keep rent-roll, and issue receipts for payment of rents of College lands;
- To issue leases of College lands, and arrange schedules of areas to be let;
- To keep register of applications for admission to Agricultural Colleges as students, and notify of vacancies, and deal with correspondence generally relating to Colleges;
- To prepare all Orders in Council under the Stock Act, Bonus Regulations, Agricultural Colleges Act, Veterinary Surgeons Act, &c., &c.;
- To revise articles of bulletin, and printer's proof of same;
- To act as Secretary to Council of Agricultural Education in absence of the Secretary for Agriculture, and to take charge of the office during the latter's absence on duty;
- To instruct the clerks in the matter of work to be performed;
- To supervise compilation of Agricultural College rolls, prepare returns required by the Honorable the Minister, &c.

#### PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.

APPLICATIONS are invited from officers in the Public Service who may be desirous of obtaining the appointment of Assistant Medical Inspector under the Board of Public Health, at a salary of £500 per annum.

The officer appointed will be required to perform the following duties, viz. :—

1. To advise the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
2. To prepare regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.
3. To peruse, minute, and advise on the reports of the local health officers (these are very numerous).
4. To watch the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advise when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.
5. To investigate the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, and to make recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and to guard against their recurrence.
6. To make periodical inspections of, and to report on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of the various municipal districts of the colony (190 in number). Such inspection including inspection of drainage and sewerage works, water supply, methods of conservancy in regard to refuse and excrement, inspection of hospitals and asylums, factories, common lodging-houses, abattoirs, noxious trade establishments, dairies, butchers' shops, and private dwellings and premises; inquiry into the prevalence of various diseases and their incidence, into the management of infectious and contagious diseases, into the duties assigned to health officers, sanitary inspectors, and the manner of fulfilment, into by-laws and their observance, into the management of cemeteries; advising the local authorities and health officers on all these matters, and reporting to the Board where its intervention is needed, either to recommend or to order improvements.
7. To study and advise the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
8. To inspect, report on, and direct the work of public vaccination throughout the colony (there are about 250 public vaccinators), and supervise the issuing of lymph and the establishment where it is prepared; to inquire into any allegations in regard to ill effects arising from vaccination, or as to inefficacy of the lymph.

9. To advise the Board when the Governor in Council should be moved to proclaim places beyond the sea infected; to advise as to diseases to be quarantined; periods of quarantine; arrangements for quarantining, supplying medical attendance, nurses, &c.; to inspect the quarantine establishments.

10. In connexion with paragraph 9, and with other duties, to keep conversant with the spread of infectious and contagious diseases in other parts of Australia and of the world, and with all advances in sanitary and medical science.

11. To take immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.

12. To make original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.

13. To advise the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food; and otherwise.

14. To advise the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for the granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

Every applicant should be between the ages of twenty-seven and forty years, and must be vigorous and of sound health, and he must show that he possesses a surgical and medical qualification recognised by the Medical Board of Victoria, and that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable diseases.

The possession by applicants of the following additional qualifications will be considered to be valuable, although not essential:—

(a) A scientific degree.

(b) A diploma or certificate in State Medicine.

#### Land Act 1890, Part I.

#### ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-ninth day of September, 1890.

#### PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by section 142 of the Land Act 1890 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind such part of Schedule LXXI. to the Regulations made under the said Act on 4th August, 1890, by His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice aforesaid, as relates to the removal of sand from unappropriated Crown lands within Sandridge Bend, and doth hereby make, in lieu of such part of the said schedule, the Regulations following, which shall commence and take effect from the 1st October, 1890:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. No sand shall be removed under any pretence for purposes of reclamation or filling up.
2. Sand for building purposes shall be removed from within the bounds only of the ground specially set apart for the purpose.
3. No sand shall be removed except between the hours of Seven a.m. and Noon on Saturdays, or between the hours of Seven a.m. and Four p.m. on other week days.
4. Every person removing sand for building purposes shall, prior to entering the ground, pay to the caretaker Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) for each load of sand required; and, on payment of the sum specified, shall obtain from the caretaker a "sand permit" for each load.
5. Every person shall surrender to the employé in charge of the pit, prior to loading, the "sand permit" issued to the former by the caretaker.
6. Every person shall receive from such employé, after the loading is completed, half of the "sand permit" so surrendered.
7. Every person shall, on departure from the ground, produce to the caretaker or his deputy such half of the "sand permit."
8. Any person found removing sand without a permit from the ground set apart for sand carters, and all persons found removing sand from the unappropriated Crown lands at Sandridge Bend beyond those bounds, with or without a permit, shall be summoned by any Crown lands bailiff or police constable to appear before justices of the peace to answer for such offence.
9. The caretaker shall decline to issue a "sand permit" to any person neglecting or refusing to observe the foregoing requirements.

And the Honorable John Lamont Dow, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**WHEREAS** by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby cancel all orders and regulations at present in force relating to drawbacks from the date the Orders and Regulations hereinafter referred to shall come into force, and doth approve of the following Regulations being substituted for those hereby cancelled; and doth direct and order that the articles shown in Schedules 1, 2, and 3 to such Regulations shall be the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and that the rates set opposite each article shall be the amount of drawback to be so allowed, under the provisions of the above-recited Act.

These Orders and Regulations shall come into force and take effect from the 1st October, 1890, from which date all previous orders and regulations relating to drawback shall be cancelled.

**DRAWBACK REGULATIONS.****I.—GENERAL.**

1. A drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on the exportation therefrom of the goods mentioned in Schedules Nos. 1, 2, and 3, hereunto attached, and at the rate therein respectively specified, provided that in no case the amount of drawback shall exceed the amount of duty paid on importation; and that Schedule No. 1 shall cease and determine on 31st December, 1889, except as to goods upon which a lower rate of duty has been paid than that shown in Schedules Nos. 2 and 3.

2. In order to entitle the exporter to claim any such drawback, he shall comply with the following conditions:—

**Form A.** (a) A notice in the Form A must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export, at least two working hours before packing, of the intention to pack.

(b) The usual export entry must be passed and security given by bond as provided by ss. 136 and 137 of the Act No. 1081 (or, if desired, the said entry and bond may be deposited with the Inspector of Drawbacks before the vessel by which the goods will eventually be shipped has been entered out, the name of the ship being subsequently filled in prior to shipment of the goods), accompanied by invoices, distinguishing—

Goods—Free;

“ Liabile to *ad valorem* duty, specifying the rate of duty paid on importation;

“ Boots and shoes, specifying the sizes and rates of duty paid on importation;

“ Manufactured in Victoria from materials imported, and rate of duty paid on such material;

“ Liabile to fixed duties, specifying the rates of duty paid on same;

such invoices shall set forth legibly in respect to each specific class of articles the quantities, qualities, sizes, values, and general description of same, the actual cost price received, or to be received, from the purchaser of the goods, and in respect to boots and shoes the respective sizes, number of pairs, &c. In cases where the export value would give as drawback an amount greater than the duty paid, the exporters must take care to place on their entries and invoices the words “Drawback claimed on £—” (inserting a value which would give as drawback a sum not greater than the duty paid). The entry having been passed or deposited (as required above), and invoices in duplicate as required having been stamped, the said entries and invoices, together with the notice (Form A) must be presented to the proper officer of Customs, before whom or any justice of the peace such of the declarations contained in Form E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case must be made and subscribed by the exporter or his duly authorized representative, and in case such goods shall be exported by a firm, by its duly authorized representative, or by a member of such firm.

In the case of fixed duty goods only, such of the declarations contained in Form E hereto as will suit the circumstances of the case can be used.

(c) The full amount of *ad valorem* duty paid upon importation may be allowed as drawback on the goods mentioned in Schedule 2, subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

1. The entry having been duly dealt with as hereinbefore provided (*vide* clauses 1 and 2), shall bear on its face the words “Full duty paid claimed as drawback,” and shall show thereon also the original invoice values (with 10 per cent. added thereto), and the rate of duty paid, and the declaration on back of said entry shall be in accordance with the Schedule hereto (Form E).

2. The original invoices produced at the time the import entry was passed, and which must bear the Customs stamp and Landing Waiter's initials as evidence of such production, shall be shown to the proper officer.

3. Statement of original invoice values, &c., as per Form D, must accompany the entries.

4. The goods for export on which drawback is claimed must be capable of easy identification by the officers of Customs with the original invoices, either by showing the maker's marks, or numbers on such goods, or by being still in the original packages in which imported, or such other evidence as to the Collector of Customs shall seem satisfactory.

5. Export (or Purchaser's) invoices must accompany the entry (see Declaration, Form E).

6. Travellers' samples will not be allowed drawback under this clause.

Entries passed under clause (c) must bear on the face of same the following statement, viz.:—

Full duty paid claimed as drawback.

(d) Drawback will be allowed on travellers' samples subject to the conditions that the usual export entry and invoices have been passed and dealt with as directed in clauses (a) and (b), and that the appropriate declarations as provided in Form E have been duly made and subscribed.

Entries passed under clause (d) must bear on the face of the same the statement as follows:—  
"Travellers' Samples."

(e) Every facility desired must be given to the officer to enable him to superintend the examination and packing of the said goods, and to take a correct account according to the invoice thereof.

(f) Upon the completion of the packing, the goods must be secured to the satisfaction of the Inspector of Drawbacks, and despatched in charge of a carrier duly licensed under the Customs laws into the Customs shed, or delivered to the custody of the export officer for shipment; or, if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure room approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, under the lock of the Crown, until removal.

(g) If the exporter cannot specify the number of packages in the entry, such may be inserted, and the officer in charge is hereby required to see that such is inserted, prior to the removal of the packages.

(h) Such proof shall be given to the Inspector of Drawbacks as may be required that full duty was paid on importation.

(i) Words and expressions used in these regulations and the schedules hereto shall have the meanings assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.

(j) The exporter may, in writing, authorize any of his clerks to pass drawback entries, and make the required declarations on same, and also to certify to the correctness of the invoices and statements; provided such authority is previously lodged with and approved by the Collector of Customs. (See Act No. 1081, sec. 99.)

3. No drawback of duty will be due or payable unless the debenture (Form B or C) duly completed is received by the Collector of Customs, Melbourne, or Sub-Collector, Geelong, as the case may be, nor until such debenture has been examined by the Jerquer and found correct by him, and been approved under the hand of such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorized by him.

4. Debentures may be paid one week after the shipment of the goods, but nothing contained in these regulations shall be held to compel the Collector of Customs to pay any claim for drawback which he may consider it inadvisable from any cause whatever to allow.

5. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty shall pay to Her Majesty a charge of Two shillings per hour, or any portion of an hour, during the time an officer is employed under these regulations, and any other expense incurred, as certified by the Inspector of Drawbacks, and no debenture shall be passed for payment until such expenses shall have been paid.

6. Exporters of goods for drawback of duty at any appointed Victorian port on the River Murray must specify on the entry the name of the consignee and final destination of the goods, and at each port on the River Murray the officer in charge will attend at his office, on such day and at such hour as may be directed by public notice from the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, to pass such goods for drawback in respect to which he may have received due notice.

Debentures under this regulation must be rendered to the Collector of Customs at Melbourne (see clause 3), who will, if they are correct, pay them at the Custom House, Melbourne, or remit the money to the claimant, less the cost of remittance.

7. No drawback of duty will be payable on goods except on packages re-packed in the presence of or inspected by an officer of Customs, who will in the latter case cause such to be examined as may be directed by the Inspector of Drawbacks, and certify on the entry, invoice, or statement, as the case may be, that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, weights, &c., as the case may be, were correct or not on such examination.

8. The person before whom the declaration on the drawback debenture must be made shall be any justice of the peace or such other person or persons as may by law be authorized to take and witness declarations or affidavits; and all other declarations may be made before any such justice or other person or persons duly authorized by law or any officer of Victorian Customs.

9. The hours of business for drawback officers are from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., closing on every Saturday at 12 noon. Should the exporters require an extension of time, an overtime application must be made to the Inspector of Drawbacks, on approval of which such extension will be allowed.

10. No drawback of duty will be allowed on second-hand goods subject to fixed rate of duty on importation.

11. Drawback of duty will be allowed upon second-hand goods liable to an *ad valorem* duty on importation (and enumerated in Schedule No. 2), but such drawback will be calculated only on the value of such goods at the time of export, such value to be specially approved by the Inspector of Drawbacks.

12. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be re-opened or re-examined after having been passed by the drawback officer; and the unpacking or re-packing of such goods shall be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

13. The Commissioner of Trade and Customs is also hereby empowered, but subject to the provisions of the Act No. 1081, to cause any debenture to be passed for payment though these regulations may not have been strictly complied with.

14. When there are a number of debentures for one exporter, the various amounts may be shown on a schedule (see Form F), and on such schedule (with the debentures attached) the one signature of Jerquer and Collector and of the person receiving payment for said debentures shall be sufficient.

**SHEPPARTON WATER TRUST.—REGULATION.**

**T**HE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulation, made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

**REGULATION No. 8.**

1. This Regulation shall apply to all persons within the Shepparton Water Trust District pumping water from the Broken Creek or Baala Creek for any purpose whatsoever.
  2. All water supplied by the Trust shall be by measure, and no person shall pump any water from the Broken Creek or Baala Creek unless and until he provides a meter for the measurement thereof.
  3. The Trust may, by notice in writing, require any person so pumping water as aforesaid to provide a meter within one month after the receipt of such notice, and thereupon such person shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide a meter.
  4. Such meter shall be submitted to and examined by the authorized officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect. The meter when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person. The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection, and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto. The keys of the meter shall be in the possession of the Trust, whose authorized officer shall examine such meter every week.
  5. Any person who, having been served with the notice mentioned in clause 3 of this Regulation, shall refuse or neglect to provide a meter within the time in such notice specified shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day after the expiration of the time mentioned in the notice on which he shall still refuse or neglect to comply with the terms of such notice.
  6. The charge payable in respect of water supplied shall be paid quarterly, on the 31st day of March, the 30th day of June, the 30th day of September, and the 31st day of December in each year. Such charge shall be as follows:—For any quantity not exceeding 250,000 gallons per week, at the rate of Sixpence per thousand (1,000) gallons, and for any quantity in excess of that amount at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for every thousand (1,000) gallons so in excess.
  7. If any person shall commit a breach of this Regulation such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, and his supply of water may be cut off for so long as any cause of complaint remains, or is not remedied.
- The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 1st day of August, 1890.

The position of the wreck is marked by the mast, which is standing out of the water about 4 feet. The wreck will be removed as early as possible, and in the meantime persons navigating in the locality are warned to look out for floating wreckage.

## FITZROY RIVER.—DIRECTIONS FOR NO. 3 CUTTING.

As the dredge *Saurian* has completed the first half-width of 100 feet of the above cutting (i.e., the up-stream or Western half), giving a depth of 10 feet at low water ordinary spring tides, after this date, and until the completion of the second half of the cutting, the present line of leading beacons and lights will be shifted 50 feet up-stream and parallel to the present line, or in the centre line of that part of the cutting just completed.

It will therefore be necessary for vessels passing up the river to leave the dredge on the starboard hand instead of the port hand, as at present. The dredge will be moored about 25 feet only above the line of lights, consequently vessels must be prepared to keep a little below, or on the line, and not get on the upper side of it.

## SHIRE OF BRIGHT.

## BY-LAW No. 3.

*Under the Public Health Acts 1865-1889.*

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1889, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bright, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the said shire, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

*Pans and Cesspits.*

The ordinary system of pans for night-soil shall be abolished.

*Double Pan Service.*

In lieu of such system of pans, every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service.

*Removal of Night-soil.*

No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the said Council, and such pan or pans shall be emptied and removed alternately as the said Council shall direct.

*Use of Disinfectant.*

Every householder shall use or cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

*Charge for Removal.*

For the removal of such night-soil every householder or occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the said Council Thirty shillings per annum for every pan used, such sum to be payable quarterly in advance, for a once-a-week service and for a fortnightly service Twenty shillings per annum, and for a twice-a-week service Sixty shillings per annum; and in default of payment the same to be and to become recoverable in any Court of Petty Sessions, provided that in cases of special nature the said Council shall be at liberty to make such charge as it may deem fit.

*Extent of Application of By-law.*

This By-law, numbered 3, shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Harrietville, and Wandiligong.

*Penalties.*

*Use of Disinfectant.*

Every householder shall use or cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

*Extent of Application of By-law.*

This By-law, numbered 4, shall apply to and have operation within the Shire of Bright, save and except that portion of the said shire contained within the boundaries of the townships of Bright, Myrtleford, Harrietville, and Wandiligong.

*Penalties.*

If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not

exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than One pound for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

## SHIRE OF RODNEY.

## BY-LAW No. 10, FOR THE GOVERNMENT AND LICENSING OF NIGHTMEN.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Public Health Acts 1865-1889, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rodney, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within the said shire, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

1. That within the recognised or surveyed boundaries of all townships within the Shire of Rodney a nightman shall be employed, who shall empty and cleanse all closet and privy pans, and dispose of the contents of same, as provided for in By-law No. 6.

2. That whereas by the *Police Offences Act 1890* and the *Local Government Act 1890*, it is provided that any person emptying any privy or cesspool, or carting away any night-soil or any other offensive matter without a licence from and without having given security as is required by the Shire Council, shall, on conviction, pay a fine not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and whereas by the *Health Act 1890* the council of any shire shall have all the powers herein of a city, town, or borough. The council of the shire of Rodney doth hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

Every person desiring to be licensed as a nightman in this shire shall annually apply to the council in writing, setting forth his full name and address, and shall deposit the sum of Five pounds as security, and shall sign a defeasance providing for the forfeiture of such sum for any breach of the conditions of such licence.

3. That all carts used by any licensed nightman shall be constructed in conformity with the by-laws, and shall carry a lighted lamp when used in the course of this business.

4. That any licensed nightman shall produce his licence upon demand made by any officer or servant of the shire council or police constable.

5. That the council may at any time cancel the licence of any nightman if they deem it advisable so to do, and shall not be liable to pay any compensation for so doing.

4. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, but not less than Five shillings, and a further penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, but not less than Five shillings, for every day during which such breach shall continue.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR CRICKET GROUND AND OTHER RECREATION PURPOSES IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHEPPARTON.

THE Council of the Shire of Shepparton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Cricket Ground and other Recreation purposes in the township of Shepparton, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:-

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut or write names, letters, or words on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve, nor remove any soil or sand therefrom.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling, or any booth, or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees, shrubs, or flowers.
9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day it may be set apart by the Committee of Management for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, or, if no date be printed thereon, such ticket shall be of avail on the day of issue only; nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered, on demand, to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the same.
10. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased or is in possession of a ticket of admission thereto.
11. The net proceeds of all sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of public charitable institutions, and all other moneys received in connexion with the reserve, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement thereof.
12. No person shall ride in or about the reserve on horseback.
13. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:-

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

The births of 1,557 children, viz., 800 boys and 757 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. In the month of July, 1,621 births were registered, or 64 more than in the month under review. The births were 441 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 76 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 737, viz., 437 of males and 300 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 820, or 111 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in July by 13, and were above the average of August during the previous ten years by 173. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 11.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.40, and of deaths registered 1.61.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 65.7° on the 28th, and the lowest was 33.6° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (50.3°) was within a fraction of the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.5°) took place on the 5th, and the least range (6.7°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 14.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.317 inches on the 21st, and the lowest was 29.573 inches on the 26th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.919 inches) differed from the average by only a fraction.

Rain fell on 17 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.47 inch. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1.76 inch, or about a quarter of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 2 days during the month.

Males contributed 59 per cent., and females 41 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 41 per cent. to that mortality, as against 36 per cent. in 1880, 30 per cent. in 1881, 36 per cent. in 1882, 30 per cent. in 1883, 39 per cent. in 1884, 30 per cent. in 1885, 31 per cent. in 1886, 33 per cent. in 1887, 30 per cent. in 1888, and 43 per cent. in 1889.

Thirty-five deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a miner, aged 75, died of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a gentleman, an agent, and a female, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of disease of the lungs; a male teacher, aged 78, of enteritis; a gentleman, aged 79, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a wood and coal dealer, aged 80, of phthisis; a coachpainter, aged 81, of nephritis; a widow, aged 82, of pneumonia; a coachbuilder, aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 84, of pneumonia; a female, aged 85, of diabetes; a gardener and a ladies' nurse, aged 87 and 88 respectively, of bronchitis; a french polisher, aged 90, of enteritis; a gentleman, aged 91, of congestion of the lungs; a carpenter, aged 75, a female, aged 77, a gentleman and a female, each aged 78, a farmer and a tanner, each aged 79, a labourer, aged 82, a carpenter, aged 83, a gentleman, an accountant, and a baker, each aged 84, a carpenter, aged 85, three females, aged 86, 88, and 90 respectively, and a dealer, aged 92, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths were referred to external causes during the month, of which 25 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 7, and a journalist, aged 41, were killed by tramcars; a grocer, aged 25, was killed by a railway train, and a cabman, aged 73, by a cart-wheel passing over him; two carters, aged 17 and 63 respectively, died of injuries—the result of being thrown from carts; a jockey, aged 22, of injuries consequent on a horse falling on him; a carter, aged 37, and a butcher, aged 61, of falls; a boy, aged 3, two females, aged 30 and 45 respectively, and a labourer, aged 49, of burns; a boy, aged 6, of poisoning by carbolic acid; and a bank clerk, aged 31, by an overdose of laudanum; a signwriter, aged 42, and a painter, aged 43, of lead poisoning; an engineer, aged 38, a female, aged 45, and a shipwright, aged 72, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a seaman, aged 45, in Hobson's Bay; a male child, aged 1 month, and a female child, aged 21 days, were overland; a male of occupation unknown, aged 50, and a boy, aged 13, were suffocated by food, the latter whilst vomiting. The homicidal deaths were those of two females, aged 21 and 37 respectively, who were shot—a verdict of manslaughter being returned in the former cases and of wilful murder in the latter. The suicidal deaths were those of a hunter, aged 54, who shot himself; a saddler, aged 55, who cut his throat; a modeller, aged 26, who poisoned himself with bichromate of potash; and a farmer, aged 45, who hanged himself.

One hundred and forty-five deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—59 in the Melbourne Hospital, 21 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homeopathic Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital, 11 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 13 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 2 in the Infant Asylum, and 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 305, of which 200, or 66 per cent., were of males, and 105, or 34 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 233 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two, 20 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 432. Of these, 237, or 55 per cent., were males, and 195, or 45 per cent., were females; 25 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 32 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 39 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 35 were between fifty-five and sixty, 45 were between sixty and sixty-five, 30 were between sixty-five and seventy, 42 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 20 were upwards of eighty.

The most fatal complaints in August were those of the respiratory system, deaths from which numbered 192, as against 132 in July. Under this head deaths from pneumonia and congestion of the lungs increased from 65 to 84, and deaths from bronchitis from 36 to 84. The mortality from typhoid fever and diphtheria was much reduced in August as compared with that prevailing in previous months, deaths from the former having been fewer than in any month since October, 1887, and deaths from the latter than in any month since March, 1889. In addition to the deaths from diphtheria, 7 deaths were set down to diphtheritic croup during the month, as against 8 in July. Fifteen deaths of childbearing women were reported in August, or 1 death of a mother to every 104 births registered.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first eight months of the present and the previous two years:—


