PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of the said section 30 in the

DRESSMAKING, MILLINERY, AND MANTLE MAKING WORKROOMS OF MESSRS. MORREY AND MURRAY, 11, 13, AND 18 BRIDGE-STREET, BALLARAT EAST,

from the 15th October next, for a period of eleven weeks, upon these express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said workrooms more than twenty-eight females for more than fifty-six hours in any one week in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That none of such females shall be so employed without receiving payment for the extra work they are called upon to perform.
3. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
4. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such workrooms for the information of all concerned.

No. 1110, section 7).

THE majority of the trustees for the time being of the body politic and corporate, named the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria, do hereby repeal the rules made on the 21st day of December, 1886, and on the 22nd day of September, 1887, by the majority for the time being of the above-named trustees, and in lieu thereof do hereby make the following rules and regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS OF THE GENERAL BODY OF TRUSTEES.

1. *Ordinary Meetings.*—The trustees shall meet monthly.
2. *Special Meetings.*—A Special Meeting shall be convened by the librarian on the requisition of two trustees.
3. *Quorums and Adjourned Meetings.*—Three trustees shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not formed within half-an-hour of the time named, the meeting, whether ordinary or special, shall be called for a day to be named by the trustee or trustees then present; but if no trustee be present, the business will be adjourned until the next monthly meeting.
4. *Notice of Meeting.*—The trustees shall be duly supplied by the librarian with a notice of the day, hour, and place of every meeting, and of all motions to be made or special matters to be considered thereat; and any trustee may hand to the librarian a notice of motion in writing, which it shall be the librarian's duty to insert in such notice-paper, and also in a book to be called the notice of motion book.
5. *Sections.*—For the more convenient and effectual performance of the duties imposed upon the trustees they shall be divided into five sections.
 - (1) The Library.
 - (2) The National Gallery.
 - (3) The Industrial and Technological Museum.
 - (4) The National Museum.
 - (5) The building and general.

For each of the sections a committee shall be appointed from the trustees, which committee shall have the control and management of the business of the section, subject to the approval of the trustees; and it shall be competent for the trustees to dissolve such committee and appoint another in its place. Each sectional committee shall once at least in twelve months report its proceedings to the trustees; and the trustees may at any time require a special report.

6. *President.*—There shall be a president, a vice-president, and a treasurer elected annually in April, and each shall remain in office until his successor be appointed. The president shall preside at the meetings of the trustees; in his absence the vice-president; in the absence of both the meeting shall elect its chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes shall give a casting vote.

7. *Treasurer.*—(1) One of the trustees shall act as treasurer, and shall sign all vouchers and financial documents. (2) The treasurer shall be an *ex officio* member of each sectional committee but shall not be chairman.

8. *Committees.*—Each committee shall meet monthly. Three members shall form a quorum. A special meeting for the consideration of business shall be convened on the requisition of any member.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT AND INFORMATION OF VISITORS TO THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY.

GENERAL.

1. The library shall be open every day, except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.
2. The museums and galleries shall be open daily during such hours as may be appointed, except on such days as the trustees may by special order direct.
3. Any visitor behaving in an unbecoming manner or being in the opinion of the officer in charge unfit to remain in the institution shall be excluded therefrom.

SPECIAL.

The Library.

1. No book is to be taken out of the library.
2. In making extracts from books no person shall lay the paper upon which he is writing on the book he is using.
3. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited. Ink is not to be used except by special permission.
4. Children under fourteen years of age are not admitted.
5. No person, unless he be a medical practitioner, a medical student, or an attorney or a barrister-at-law, shall be admitted to the Medical department without special permission from the librarian or from the officer in charge of the library.
6. No person shall be admitted to the Fine Arts Gallery without written permission from the librarian. All books must be used under the supervision of the officer in charge of the gallery at a table provided for the purpose, and must be returned to him.
7. No person shall be admitted to the Patent Gallery without special permission from the librarian or from the officer in charge of the library.

Lending Library.

Conditions upon which duplicate books will be lent by the trustees to Free Libraries:—

1. Books may be lent to the trustees or committees of mechanics' or literary institutions, or to the councils of municipalities.

2. The borrowers shall place the books lent in a suitable apartment, to be approved by the committee; and shall admit the public to the use of the books therein for such hours as may be appointed by the local committee, but subject to the following rules of the Public Library:—

- (a) No book is to be taken out of the library.
- (b) Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book is strictly prohibited. Ink is not to be used, except by special permission.
3. The borrowers shall pay all the expenses for cartage to and from the railway stations.
4. The borrowers shall give security to the satisfaction of the committee, in an amount equal to the value of the books lent to them, that the works will be returned at the expiration of the period of the loan in good condition, regard being had to reasonable wear.
5. The borrowers and sureties are to be liable for—
 - i. The value of any volume not returned, or where a work consists of more than one volume, the value of the work, set, or series to which the volume belongs.
 - ii. The estimated value of the injury done to any volume, work, set, or series, or book-case.
6. When any work, set, or series, rendered imperfect, is replaced by the borrower, the imperfect work, set, or series, shall be handed over to such borrower.
7. The committee shall be the sole judges of the value of, or injury done to, any volume, work, set, or series, or book-case.

The Industrial and Technological Museum.

Lectures.—Admission to the lectures shall be by ticket, to be obtained either gratuitously or on such terms as the trustees may fix.

Rule for Students.—Persons desirous of joining the class lectures may do so on application to the superintendent of the Museum, on such terms as the committee direct.

THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

RULES FOR STUDENTS IN THE SCHOOLS OF DRAWING AND PAINTING.

1. The period of studentship is limited to five years, but it may be extended from time to time by the permission of the trustees in favour of meritorious students on report from the director. It is divided into two courses—the first for drawing, the second for painting.
2. The year is divided into two terms, the first term commencing on the third Monday and ending on the Saturday before the twenty-sixth Monday in the year, and the second term commencing on the twenty-eighth Monday and ending on the Saturday before the forty-ninth Monday in the year.
3. An applicant for admission as a student shall submit specimens of drawing to the director. If such specimens be considered satisfactory the applicant shall be admitted on probation, and shall prepare drawings within the School of Drawing; and on the same being approved by the director, the applicant shall, on payment of fees, be registered as a student.
4. If an applicant for admission be found endeavouring to impose upon the director by presenting drawings not being the applicant's unaided work, he or she shall not, for a period of two years, be admitted as a student.
5. At the end of each term students shall submit drawings to the trustees; and if at the end of the fourth term the drawings of any student be considered unsatisfactory by the trustees, he or she shall cease to be a student.
6. Before admission to the School of Painting a student shall submit to the trustees a drawing of a figure from the antique, a figure from life, a head from the antique, a head from life, and a perspective drawing, done in the School of Drawing, and, if such drawings be approved, shall be admitted.
7. Every third year a gold medal may be awarded for the best painting done in the school, or, in the case of a landscape, under the supervision of the director, by a student who has attended the School of Painting for not less than three nor more than nine terms.
8. This gold medal will carry a travelling scholarship of £150 a year, tenable for three years.
9. The holder of this scholarship shall study painting in one of the great art schools of Europe, to be approved by the trustees; and shall, during each of the first two years, paint and present to the trustees a copy of some well-known painting by an old master.
10. During the third year he or she shall paint and present to the trustees an original picture.
11. The trustees shall have power to cancel the scholarship in case the above conditions be not complied with, or in case of improper conduct on the part of the holder.
12. An exhibition of the students' works shall be held annually.
13. No student who has been awarded a first prize at the annual exhibition of the students' works shall be eligible to compete for a similar prize in the same department in subsequent years. But this will not disqualify such prize-holder from competing with the same or other painting for the travelling scholarship.
14. Students shall pay in advance to the librarian the term fee fixed by the trustees, and will not be admitted to the class-rooms except upon production of the receipt.
15. No person will be allowed to copy any picture, drawing, or work of art in the galleries of painting and sculpture without having first obtained permission in writing from the committee; and such permission shall specify the part or parts of any such picture, drawing, or work of art not to be included in the copy.

16. All students shall sign the students' book on every day they attend before entering the gallery.

17. All students shall, when leaving the gallery, remove or carefully put away all materials used by them in drawing or painting.

18. The committee will not be responsible for the loss of or injury to property which any student may have left in the gallery.

19. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct on the part of any student will subject the student so offending to suspension, on the written order of the director; and the offence, when proved to the satisfaction of the committee, shall subject such student to be excluded for such period as the committee may think fit; provided that in case of suspension the matter shall be reported by the director to the committee within three days.

20. No work done by students of the Art Schools under the supervision of the director is to be exhibited at any outside exhibition previous to being submitted for competition at the students' annual exhibition.

21. Any student being absent from the classes for the whole of one term shall not be permitted to attend the classes again, except after application to the director, and by permission of the committee.

REGULATIONS.

The Library.

The library shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Ten p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

The Industrial and Technological Museum.

The Industrial and Technological Museum shall be open every day from Ten a.m. to Five p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

The National Museum.

The National Museum shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

The National Gallery.

The National Gallery shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

The Common Seal of the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria was hereto affixed this 19th day of September, 1890, by the authority of a majority of the trustees for the time being whose signatures are hereunto set.

TRIENNIAL GENERAL RENEWAL OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

SPECIAL NOTICE TO ELECTORS.

IT is hereby notified that holders of electors' rights bearing date on or before the 1st December, 1889, must obtain renewed rights in lieu thereof, in order to have their names placed upon the new General Lists to be made up on the 1st December next.

Neglect of this precaution will result in the omission of the names of the persons so neglecting from the new Lists.

The old right must in every case be delivered up to the Registrar, but the renewed right will be equally available for any election that may take place before the coming into force of the new Rolls.

Intending applicants for electors' rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification (to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that many will be deprived of the opportunity of enrolment.

Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining electors' rights when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of a Province may obtain an elector's right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any division of an Electoral District may obtain an elector's right for such District.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the *Water Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1156, Sec. 251).

REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE KERANG EAST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST AND ITS OFFICERS.

Regulation of the Kerang East Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in pursuance of the *Water Act 1890*, Sec. 254, made by the said Trust this 13th day of September, 1890:—

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meetings to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman of the meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting may be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meeting.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of the business at any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the convenience of the Trust at any meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading copies of letters sent by authority of Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice-paper thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to the Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary of the Trust before the close of the meeting of the Trust; and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating any subject but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Motions to be moved in order in the motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary of the Trust in the notice of motion book, and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

9. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject, unless prevented by the application of one or more clauses of these regulations.

11. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

12. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

13. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

14. *Mover of motion.*—Any commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

15. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

16. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled priority.

17. *Chairman to arise in addressing the Trust.*—The chairman shall arise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

18. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on the same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misunderstood, in which case he must strictly confine himself to an explanation, and must not introduce or discuss any fresh matter or subject.

19. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to the order or explanation in each case shall be final.

20. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

21. *Commissioner to apologize for disorderly, &c.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

22. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

23. *Commissioners twice offending liable to a penalty.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw or apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

24. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

25. *Commissioners not attending order for a call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole of the commissioners of the Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of a majority thereof, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

26. *Commissioners may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may at right demand the production of any documents applying to the question under discussion.

27. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

28. *Questions, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the results thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

29. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on or just before being moved and seconded.

30. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original motion or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment has been disposed of; and if amendment or amendments be negatived the motion shall be put, but if any amendment be carried it shall take the place of the original motion, and shall be so treated.

31. *Effect of rejection of words on original motion.*—If any words of an original motion be rejected, the insertion of the other proposed words shall cause the motion so amended to become the motion before the meeting, thereupon other amendments to insert words may follow.

32. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

33. *Mover of motion to have a right to reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

34. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting other than the statement or explanation of the mover as to his reason for moving

the adjournment, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

35. *A motion for the adjournment shall take precedence.*—Motions for adjournment of meeting shall take precedence of other motions.

36. *The previous question.*—A question may be superseded, first by a motion for the adjournment of the meeting being carried, second by the previous question, namely, "That the question be now put," being proposed and negatived.

37. *The previous question affirmed.*—If the previous question be resolved in the affirmative, the previous question, namely, "That the question be now put," shall be put without any amendment or debate.

38. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary of the Trust, when practical, shall attend all the meetings of the committees.

39. *Meetings of committees.*—The secretary of the Trust shall convene all meetings of committees within ten (10) days of the first appointment of any such committee, or at any other time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two (2) members of the committee.

40. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

41. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision thereof.

42. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name to the beginning thereof.

43. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on each skin or sheet upon which it is written.

44. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names in their own proper handwriting, or their marks duly attested, and by no other person for them, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

45. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, or affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

46. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

47. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven (7) clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

48. *No commissioner to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the trust, or for any work to be done by the Trust.

49. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same, unless otherwise expressly ordered by the Trust.

50. *Plans for work to be open for inspection.*—All plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Trust at least six (6) days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any person interested during that time.

51. *Corporate seal.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept by the secretary of the Trust. The corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document, unless the chairman of the Trust and one other member of the Trust, or in the absence of such chairman, unless two commissioners be present to attest the same.

52. *Suspension of regulations.*—Any one or more of these regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion, upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by an unanimous vote of the Trust.

53. *Penalties.*—If any person shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

Public Service Act 1890, Part III., Section 68.

REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations made by the Classifiers under the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), Part III., section 68, in lieu of the Regulations made under section 47 of *The Public Service Act 1883* (47 Vict. No. 773), which are hereby rescinded.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Public Service Act 1890*, section 68, it is enacted that—"The Classifiers may from time to time make and repeal, alter, and amend Regulations, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council; for all or any of the following purposes:—

- "(i.) For determining the conditions to be fulfilled by candidates for the position of student in training, pupil teacher, or sewing mistress, and for determining by competitive examination the persons to be appointed to any such position when there are more candidates than vacancies to be filled; and for holding any such competitive examination:
- "(ii.) For determining which schools shall be district training schools, and for allotting the studentships therein."

We, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Committee of Classifiers, in pursuance of the said powers, do make and declare the Regulations following, and declare that the same shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council.

STUDENTS IN TRAINING.

Act 1133, Fifth Schedule, Part II.

"The order for appointment to Studentships in Training shall be as follows:—

- "(i.) Pupil teachers who have completed their course. If at any time there are more pupil-teachers candidates than there are studentships to be allotted, the order of precedence shall be determined by competitive examination:
- "(ii.) Other qualified candidates in order of precedence determined by competitive examination."

1. Qualified candidates in (ii.) must be not less than seventeen years of age; they must have passed the Matriculation examination of the University of Melbourne, or the examination for first-class pupil teachers, and in addition must produce satisfactory certificates as to character, health, and aptitude to teach—the last from an inspector of schools.

2. The competitive examinations in (i.) and (ii.) shall be in the subjects contained in the programme of instruction for first-class pupil teachers, as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department, and shall be held at such times and places, and by such officers, as may be determined by the Education Department.

PUPIL TEACHERS.

1. Candidates for employment as pupil teachers must be not less than fourteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed an examination by an inspector of schools in the work, as far as needlework inclusive, prescribed for the Fourth Class or some higher class in the course of Free Instruction, Regulation I., and in singing and drawing, as prescribed for the Third or some higher class in Regulation I., or have passed in singing and drawing as above, and, in addition, have passed the Matriculation examination of the University of Melbourne.

2. Where there is only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, or only one qualified candidate from the school in which the vacancy exists, the name of such candidate shall be entered on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

3. Where there are more qualified candidates than one from the school in which the vacancy exists, or where there is no qualified candidate from the school but more than one other qualified candidate, a competitive examination shall be held, the subjects of which shall be those specified in the programme of instruction for the Sixth Class of State schools as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department. In determining the order of merit of the candidates, consideration shall be given to the aptitude of the respective candidates for teaching as reported on by the district inspector. The examiner shall place in order of merit first the names of candidates from the school in which the vacancy exists, and after them in the same order the names of other candidates, and shall report to the Secretary of the Education Department, for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, the names of the first three candidates in their order. The names of such three candidates shall be entered in the Employment Register in the same order.

4. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the district inspector of schools for examination at any ordinary visit for inspection.

SEWING MISTRESSES.

1. Candidates shall be not less than seventeen years of age, and, prior to appointment, must furnish satisfactory evidence as to good character and sound health.

2. Where there is only one candidate for any vacancy, the Secretary of the Education Department shall, when satisfied that the candidate is competent to perform the duties of the position, inform the Committee of Classifiers thereof, who shall then enter the name of the candidate on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

3. Where there are more candidates than one for any vacancy, a competitive examination shall be held in the subjects of the programme of instruction for the Third Class of State schools, as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department, in ability to perform all the kinds of needlework required from girls in State schools, to teach the same, and to instruct the First and Second classes in any of the programme subjects. The examiner shall arrange the names of the candidates in their order of merit as determined by the examination, and report to the Secretary of the Education Department for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, who shall enter in the Employment Register in such order the names of the first two.

Act No. 1133, Fifth Schedule, Part II.—Note.

"Names of candidates for any of the above-named positions will be struck off the Register after one year, unless they signify their desire to be kept on the Register, and in the case of candidates for appointment as pupil teachers produce a certificate that they are still attending school. In the case of candidates for the position of pupil teacher, the names of not more than three shall be entered for each school, and qualified candidates from the school in which there is a vacancy shall have precedence over others."

TRAINING SCHOOLS.

1. Any school which, at the coming into force of the *Public Service Act* 1890, was recognised by the Education Department as a district training school shall continue to be so recognised subject to the provisions of Reg. 2 *infra*.

2. Before any new district training school shall be established, or any existing district training school shall be closed, a report and recommendation shall be furnished to the Secretary of the Education Department by the Inspector-General, the Superintendent of the Training Institution, and the Senior Inspector of Schools, or any two of them, and on such recommendation the Minister of Public Instruction may direct that any school shall be opened or closed as a district training school.

3. Studentships shall be allotted amongst the district training schools in such manner as may best provide for the training of students near their homes.

TRINITY HARBOUR.—DIRECTIONS FOR NEW CUTTING.

Notice is hereby given that the new cutting into Trinity Harbour is now open for navigation. It is 200 feet wide, and is marked by six piles carrying square black beacons driven 50 feet from the edge on the eastern side of the cutting; the shallowest water in the cutting being 13 feet at low-water ordinary spring tides. After passing through the cutting the water gradually deepens from 3 to 5 fathoms, the depth at the anchorage off the wharves.

DIRECTIONS.

By Day.—After passing the Fairway buoy steer about S.S.W., keeping two white triangular beacons, which are erected on the masts on which the leading lights are exhibited, in line, which will carry in mid-cutting until within a ship's length of the outer leading light mast; then steer mid-stream until abreast the wharves, when a vessel may anchor in mid-channel in 4 or 5 fathoms of water.

By Night.—Two white leading lights and one red light are exhibited, which enable vessels to enter the port, and reach the wharves by night. The back light is at an elevation of 96 feet, and the front light of 37 feet, above high water, and are at a distance apart of 5,000 feet. The red light, which is at the wharves, is distant half-a-mile above the outer white light. When making for the Fairway buoy the two leading lights will be seen, which, when brought in line, will bear about S.S.W. and will lead in mid-cutting. Steer with the lights in line to within one to two ship's lengths of the outer light, when haul more to the eastward, keeping the red light, which is placed on the outer end of Burns, Philp, and Company's wharf, on the starboard hand. When abreast of the red light a vessel may anchor in from 4 to 5 fathoms.

The old channel is still marked by seven black beacons on the port hand, and seven red beacons on the starboard hand.

A tide-gauge, showing the depth of water in the cutting, is placed on the outer pile marking the eastern side of the cutting.

DECK CARGOES.—NOTICE TO OWNERS AND MASTERS.

THE attention of owners and masters is directed to the 119th section of *The Marine Board Act 1887*, which, for convenience, is set forth hereunder, viz:—

"It shall not be lawful for any home-trade ship carrying passengers, whether British or Foreign, to leave any port in Victoria having more than one ton according to measurement of deck cargo on board in proportion to every 20 tons of net registered tonnage, and any ship having a greater proportion of deck cargo shall be refused a clearance or transire, and may be detained in the like manner, and the owner or master shall be liable to the like penalties as if she were a ship not deemed to be properly equipped under this Act."

That is to say (*vide* sec. 80 of the Act quoted) if the owner appears to be in fault he shall incur a penalty not exceeding £100, and if the master appears to be in fault he shall incur a penalty not exceeding £50.

The Board's surveyors have been instructed to report any case in which the provisions of the Act are not observed.

PURSUANT to the provisions of Part V. of the *Administration and Probate Act* 1890, the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, frames the following Rules and Forms :—

Rule 1. The Rules framed under the "*Duties on the Estates of Deceased Persons Statute 1870*," dated the 12th day of November, 1877, are hereby repealed.

Rule 2. The time referred to in section 97 of the said Act as "the prescribed time," wherever such expression is used in the said section, shall be two calendar months, and the words "the prescribed time," wherever they occur in the said section, shall be read as "two calendar months."

Rule 3. In cases of probate or letters of administration, limited to any particular property of a testator or intestate, the executor or administrator shall, within two calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration to him, file the statement mentioned in sub-section (v.) of section 97 of the said Act.

Rule 4. The respective statements required by section 97 of the said Act shall contain the particulars of property and of debts and liabilities respectively required by the said section, and every such statement shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the person by the said section required to file the same, and if there shall be more than one such person, then of every such person, and if any other person has wholly or partially prepared such statement, then such statement shall be also verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of such other person. Such affidavit or statutory declaration shall be in the form in the Schedule hereto.

Rule 5. The time referred to in section 101 of the said Act, after which the duty payable under the said Part of the said Act must be paid, shall be four calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration, as the case may be.

Rule 6. The notice referred to in section 101 of the said Act, after which the duty payable under the said Part of the said Act must be paid, shall be a notice signed by the Master-in-Equity or the officer appointed by the Governor under the said Part of the said Act, addressed to the person liable to pay such duty, specifying the amount of such duty and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days after service of such notice, and stating that in default of payment within such time application will be made to the Supreme Court for an order that a sufficient part of the testator's or intestate's property may be sold and the proceeds thereof applied in payment of the duty and of the costs of the order and sale and consequent thereon.

Rule 7. Every such notice may be served either personally on the person to whom the same is addressed or his proctor or agent, or if there be more than one such person, then on any one of such persons or his proctor or agent, or by sending it through the post in a registered letter addressed to the person to whom the notice is addressed, or if there be more than one such person, then to any one of such persons at his last-known place of abode or business; but no such notice shall be served until after the expiration of four calendar months from the grant of probate or letters of administration, as the case may be.

Rule 8. Every settlement referred to in section 112 of the said Act shall be registered within two calendar months from the death of the settlor, or such further time as the Master may allow.

Rule 9. The statement required by section 112 of the said Act shall specify the particulars of the real and personal property comprised in the settlement and the value thereof respectively, and shall be verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of the trustee of the settlement; or if there be more than one trustee resident in the colony of Victoria, then of all such trustees; or if there be no trustee of the settlement resident in the colony of Victoria, then by the affidavit or statutory declaration of some person beneficially interested under the settlement; and if any other person has wholly or partially prepared such statement, then such statement shall be also verified by the affidavit or statutory declaration of such other person.

Rule 10. The Master may assess the duty payable in respect of any settlement referred to in section 112 of the said Act, and not registered within the prescribed time, or such further time as the Master may allow, according to what he shall find to be the value of the property comprised in such settlement either upon oral evidence taken upon oath before him or upon affidavits or statutory declarations.

Rule 11. The time within which the duty payable in respect of any settlement in the last preceding rule referred to shall be paid, shall be four calendar months from the death of the settlor.

Rule 12. The notice referred to in section 112 of the said Act as "the prescribed notice" shall be a notice signed by the said Master-in-Equity or the officer appointed by the Governor under the said Part of the said Act addressed to the trustees of the settlement or any one of them or to any person beneficially interested under the settlement, specifying the amount of the duty payable under the said Part of the said Act in respect of such settlement, and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days after service of such notice, and stating that, in default of payment within such time, application will be made to the Supreme Court for an order that a sufficient part of the property included in such settlement be sold, and the proceeds of such sale applied in payment of the duty and of the order and sale and consequent thereon.

Rule 13. Every such notice may be served either personally on the person to whom the same is addressed, or his solicitor or agent, or if there be more than one such person, then on any one of such persons or his solicitor or agent, or by sending it through the post in a registered letter, addressed to the person to whom the notice is addressed, or if there be more than one such person, then to any one of such persons at his last-known place of abode or business, but no such notice shall be served until after the expiration of four calendar months from the death of the settlor.

Rule 14. Every statement filed under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act shall specify some address or place in the colony of Victoria to which notices, addressed

SALARIES TO ELECTORAL REGISTRARS AND DEPUTY ELECTORAL REGISTRARS.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that electoral registrars and deputy electoral registrars shall be respectively paid by salary only; and that such salary may be fixed by regulations from time to time made by the Governor in Council; and that in fixing such salaries regard shall be had to the population of the division for which any such registrar or deputy registrar may be acting, but that the amount of the salary of any registrar or deputy registrar shall not be in anywise affected by the number of persons whose names appear upon any list prepared by him: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth revoke the Regulations made by Order in Council, dated the twenty-first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, under section 6 of *The Electoral (Amendment) Act 1889*, and doth hereby make the following Regulations in lieu thereof (that is to say):—

1. *Commencement of regulations.*—These regulations shall have effect on and after the first day of January, One thousand eight hundred and ninety.

2. *Population.*—For the purposes of these regulations the population of any division of an electoral province, or of an electoral district, shall be taken to be that which at the time of any payment hereunder is set forth in the (for the time being) latest official return of the Government Statist as the ascertained or estimated population of such division.

3. *Electoral registrars' salaries.*—The annual salaries to be paid to electoral registrars in respect of the divisions (whether of an electoral province or of an electoral district) for which they respectively act shall be as follow:—

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that every clerk of a municipal district (including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong) shall be entitled to be paid in each year for the performance by him of duties imposed upon him by Part III. of the said Act such salary as may be fixed by regulations from time to time made by the Governor in Council, and that in fixing such salary regard shall be had to the population of the municipal district of such clerk, but that such salary shall not be in anywise affected by the number of persons whose names appear upon any list prepared by him: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

34. *Appointment of times for the sitting of Licensing Courts.*—
 Forthwith after the conclusion of any sittings of the Licensing
 Court for any Licensing District notice of the time and place for the
 next sittings of such court shall be published in the *Government
 Gazette*; and in order to insure compliance with this rule or
 regulation the members of the Licensing Court of any Licensing
 District shall, before the conclusion of any sittings of such court,
 determine the time for the next sittings of the Licensing
 Court for such district and the intervals between such sittings
 are in accordance with any order or the Governor in Council
 for the time being in force in that behalf.

Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to limit the power of such Licensing Court at any time after the conclusion of such first-mentioned sittings to alter any such time so fixed or (where from any cause such time has not been fixed before the conclusion of such first-mentioned sittings) to fix the time for the next sittings of such court.

2. *Exception as to districts within Metropolitan group.*—The last preceding rule or regulation shall not apply to the Licensing Court of any Licensing District included in the Metropolitan group.

3. *Register to be kept.*—*First Schedule.*—The clerk of every Licensing Court shall keep a register of the *Minutes* or *Memoranda* of all the decisions, orders, or judgments, and other proceedings of the court, and of such other proceedings as may be by law required to be registered; and shall keep such register in the form in the First Schedule hereto, and shall set forth the particulars therein mentioned; and the register of each court shall be distinguished by the name of the Licensing District of such court.

4. *Entries in Register to be signed.*—The entries relating to each minute, memorandum, or proceeding shall be signed by the members of the Licensing Court at the sitting of the court at which the matters referred to in such entries were dealt with.

5. *Costs to be fixed by the Court.*—When any Licensing Court makes an order directing the payment of costs by one party to any proceedings before it to any other party or parties such court shall fix the amount of such costs, including the fees to be allowed for counsel and attorneys appearing for the party or parties to whom such costs are directed to be paid.

6. *Costs of witnesses' attendance.*—*Second Schedule.*—The costs of witnesses in attendance at the hearing of any cause by the Licensing Court, although they have not been summoned, and although they have not been examined, may be allowed at any rate not exceeding that mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto.

Rule C.—For Travelling.

1. To every witness or interpreter (not being a member of the Police Force) the sum actually paid, but not exceeding one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for every mile he may reside from the court at which he is required to attend.

2. To every witness and interpreter who may travel by ship, coach, railway, or train, the sum actually and properly paid for fares both in going to and returning from the court at which he may be required to attend.

3. No allowance under clause 1 will be made to any witness or interpreter residing within three miles of the court which he may be required to attend.

4. In all cases where practicable witnesses and interpreters must travel by ship, coach, railway, or train in such part of the vessel, vehicle, or train as may be suitable to their station in life.

THE WESTERN WIMMERA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT DIVIDED INTO DIVISIONS.

THE Governor in Council has, in pursuance of Section 336 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust into the Divisions following, that is to say:—

No. 1. The Township of Dimboola Division, comprising such portions of the Trust district as may be included within the boundaries following, viz.:—Commencing at a point bearing 62° 3' east one chain fifty links from the east angle of suburban allotment 9; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively 27° 57' east sixty chains, south 62° 3' west sixty chains, and north 27° 57' west sixty chains; and thence by a line, allotment 32, a line, allotments 12, 11, and 10, allotment 9 aforesaid, and a line bearing north 62° 3' east sixty chains to the point of commencement.

No. 2. Passengers from roadside stations on the Oakleigh line for the Mordialloc line can travel free to Prince's-bridge station by the 12.8 or 1.22 p.m. Oakleigh line trains, then by the 1.10 or 2.15 p.m. trains.

Bairnsdale train.—The 5.50 a.m. express train from Bairnsdale will stop at Caulfield to set down passengers. The 5.40 p.m. express train from Prince's-bridge station will pick up passengers at Caulfield for stations on the Gippsland line, at which the train stops.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of the said Act, and bearing date the first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber from the unappropriated Crown lands in the parishes of Moora, Murchison, Waranga, and Whiroo, county of Rodney, comprised within the boundaries specified therein: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation aforesaid, so far as the same relates to dead timber.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division eight of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live trees which, at the height of two feet from the surface of the ground, are of less diameter than fifteen inches, or "suckers" which at the height of six inches from the top of the stump on which they are growing are of less diameter than fifteen inches, on or from the Crown lands not being State Forest or Timber Reserve, situate within a radius of fifteen miles from the Post Office, Heathcote, except for mining purposes under a special permit signed by the Minister of Lands, and subject to the conditions specified in such permit.—(90.C.65221.)

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON OF AMHERST.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the United Borough and Gold-field Common of Amherst, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

Regulations.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules, and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats, and the word "farmer" shall mean a person who resides on and uses for the purpose of agriculture, or dairying land held by that person, either in fee or under lease or licence issued under *The Land Act 1862, The Amending Land Act 1865, The Land Act 1869, The Land Act 1884, or the Land Act 1890.*

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing cattle on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year:—For every horse, Three shillings (3s.) per annum; for every head of other large cattle, Two shillings (2s.) per annum; for every sheep, One shilling (1s.) per annum; for every goat up to the number of six (6) belonging to any one household, One shilling (1s.) per annum; for every goat above that number and up to twelve (12), Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per annum.

4. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

5. No person shall be allowed to depasture on the common any entire horse or bull, without the consent in writing of the managers.

6. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.

7. All stock upon which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for fourteen days after the commencement of any half-year shall be liable to be impounded.

8. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

9. The managers may grant to lutechers or to slaughtermen special licences to depasture on the common, for such periods of time as may be agreed on, cattle intended for slaughter subject to the condition that the fees shall not be at a proportionately less rate than Two shillings (2s.) per head per annum for large cattle, and One shilling (1s.) per head per annum for small cattle.

10. Every person depasturing horned cattle on the common shall have all such cattle branded with one brand in distinct characters or letters, and in one place on each animal, and the description of such brand, which shall at all times be kept legible and distinct by the owner, shall be supplied to the managers at the time of registration. All persons not strictly observing and complying with these requirements shall depasture their horned cattle at the risk of being impounded, notwithstanding the prescribed fees may have been paid thereon; and in all cases where such cattle are impounded from the common in consequence of non-observance of or non-compliance with this regulation, the managers shall not be responsible in any respect.

11. All persons depasturing horses on the common shall have them branded with some distinguishing brand in legible and distinct letters or characters, and the description of such brand shall be supplied to the managers at the time of registration. All horses not thus legibly and distinctly branded shall depasture on the common at the risk of being impounded, notwithstanding the prescribed fees may have been paid thereon; and when any of such horses are impounded through the brands not being distinct and legible, the managers shall not be responsible in any respect.

12. Every person depasturing goats on the common shall brand them by cutting the initials of the owner's name in the hair of the animal, such brand to be kept at all times legible and distinct by the owner. A record of the brands, the position of which on the goat shall be determined by the herdsman, shall be made on the licence when issued at the commencement of each half-year.

13. All horned cattle depasturing on the common shall be branded with the common brand in tar, at such times and places as the managers may determine, and the owners of stock shall muster them for this purpose at the times and places named by the managers, on receiving at least three days' notice to do so from the herdsman, either by advertisement in the local paper, or by circular; and the owners or persons in charge of stock shall in all cases render every assistance to the herdsman during the branding.

14. All unbranded horses, horned cattle, and goats found on the common, and all horses, horned cattle, and goats, on which the brand as given at the time of registration has become indistinct and illegible, shall be liable to be impounded, and in all cases of impounding the owners shall defray the expenses of such impounding, and pay the fees in respect thereof.

15. The managers shall not be responsible for stock straying from the common.

16. No person shall disturb or drive from the common any stock depasturing thereon unless the written permission of the herdsman be first obtained.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF DRIK DRIK CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid to the treasurer before the ground is opened.

2. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any poor person on evidence being produced to the Trustees that the friends of such person are unable to pay such fees.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The usual hours of interment will be from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
5. On application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument or fence, in the cemetery being made to the Trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of proper charges.
6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair at the expense of the owner.
7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by slabs of stone, slate, or iron.
8. The Trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug.
9. When a meeting of Trustees is required the same shall be convened by the secretary, three to form a quorum.
10. The friends of deceased persons must erect all monuments, tombs, or fences, under the direction of the Trustees, or whom they may appoint; and plans of every stone, tomb, monument, and pedestal, and a copy of every inscription or epitaph, must be submitted to the Trustees for their approval prior to the erection of the same.
11. Any fence, monument, grave stone, or epitaph placed in the cemetery contrary to the foregoing rule may be removed by the Trustees without notice to, and at the expense of, the owner.
12. No grave to be of a less depth than five feet.
13. The Trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

By-Law No. 27.

Part I.—Streets and Footways.

A By-law of the Borough of Geelong West, made under section 191 of the Local Government Act 1890, and numbered 27, for the purpose of adopting sections 8, 9, 10, 11 of sub-division 2 of Part I. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the said Act.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Geelong West order as follows:—

That the following sections 8, 9, 10, 11 of sub-division 2 of Part I. of the said schedule be adopted, viz.:—

(2.) Naming Streets and Numbering Houses.

8. *Names of streets.*—It shall be lawful for the Council from time to time to cause to be painted or affixed on a conspicuous part of some house or building at or near each end or corner or entrance of every street, and in the direction of the line of such street, the name of such street in legible characters not exceeding three inches in length and proportionately broad and near to each other, and the council may where more than one street or road in the municipal district is called by the same name, alter the name of any or all of such streets or roads save one (to be described in the order altering the same) to any other name which to the council may seem fit, and before any name is given to any new street or road notice of the intended name shall be given to the council, and if there be any street or road in the municipal district called or about to be called by the same name the council may, by notice stating that there is already a street or road in the municipal district called or about to be called by the same name, and describing the locality thereof, given to the person by whom notice of such intended name was given to them, at any time within fourteen days of the receipt of such last-mentioned notice, object to such intended name; and it shall not be lawful to set up any name to any street or road until the expiration of fourteen days after notice thereof has been given as aforesaid to the council, or to set up any name objected to as aforesaid.

9. *Numbering, &c., of houses.*—The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall mark such houses or buildings with such numbers and names, for the purpose of distinguishing the same, as the council shall direct or approve, and shall renew the numbers or names of such houses or buildings as often as they are obliterated or defaced; and if any occupier of any such house or building neglect for one week after notice from the council to mark such house or building with such number or name as the council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding forty shillings; and the council may cause such name to be so marked or renewed, and recover the expense thereof from the owner of such house or building before any justice.

10. *Malicious injury to name or number.*—If any person wilfully and maliciously destroys or pulls down obliterated or defaces the name of any street or road, or the name or number of any house or building, or paints affixes or sets up any name to any street or road, or any name or number to any house or building, contrary to this sub-division, he shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds; and it shall be lawful for the council to cause such name or number so unlawfully painted affixed or set up to be obliterated or destroyed.

11. *Register of alterations.*—The council shall cause to be kept a register of all alterations made by them in the names of streets and roads, and such register shall be kept in such form as to show the date of every such alteration, and the name of every street or road previous to such alteration, and the new name thereof.


