THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Rules made under the provisions of Section 74 of the *Patents Act* 1890, and has ordered that they take effect on and from the 1st day of January, 1891.

RULES.

1. In the construction of these Rules any words herein used defined by the *Patents Act* 1890 shall have the meanings thereby assigned to them respectively. The word "Agent" shall include a licensed patent agent and a solicitor. Interpretation of terms.

APPLICATIONS, ETC.

2. An application for a patent must be in one of the forms contained in the First Schedule hereto. All other documents may be signed by, and all communications between the applicant and the Commissioner, and all attendances may be made by or through an agent duly authorized by such applicant. Application and specification and other documents. Schedule 1. Form 1.

3. The attorney of any corporation, howsoever or wheresoever incorporated, whether already constituted or hereafter to be constituted, by a power of attorney under a seal purporting to be the common seal of the corporation giving the power, may make any application, petition, or solemn declaration, for or on behalf of the corporation of which he is the attorney, and may make the requisite declarations to the best of his knowledge, information, and belief, and may subscribe the same in his own name. In case of corporation.

4. Every application shall be accompanied by a statement of an address, within the colony of Victoria, to which all notices and communications by the Commissioner may be sent, and such statement shall thereafter be binding upon the applicant, unless and until a substituted statement of address shall be furnished by him. Address or service. Schedule 1. Forms 4 and 5.

5. All applications shall be numbered in the order of their receipt at the Patent Office, and shall be also marked with the date and time of day of receiving the same. Applications to be numbered and dated.

6. Where the applicant or applicants applies or apply as the assignee or assignees of the actual inventor, he or they shall lodge with the application the deed of assignment duly executed under the hand and seal of the assignor, attested, and also a certified copy thereof. Where applicant an assignee.

7. Where the applicant applies as executor or administrator of the actual inventor, he shall lodge with his application the probate or letters of administration, or an office copy thereof or extract therefrom, for the inspection of the Commissioner. Where applicant an executor.

8. Where the applicant applies under a communication from abroad, he shall be resident within the colony, and shall lodge with his application, for the inspection of the Commissioner, evidence of his authority from the actual inventor, his legal representatives, or assigns. Where applicant a communicatee.

9. In applications under section 56 of the Act, a certified copy of the letters patent granted abroad shall be attached to and lodged with the application, and be referred to therein as an exhibit. Application by foreign patentee.

DOCUMENTS.

10. All documents and copies of documents sent to or left at the Patent Office or otherwise furnished to the Commissioner shall be written or printed, or partly written and partly printed, in large and legible characters in the English language, upon strong white paper, on one side only, of a size 13 inches by 8 inches, leaving a margin of two inches on the left-hand side thereof. How to be prepared.

11. In all cases duplicates of the application, provisional and complete specifications, and of all drawings required to accompany the same shall be lodged with and at the same time as the originals or within such time as the Commissioner may in any case direct. Duplicates.

Each such duplicate shall be marked "True Copy," and shall be signed by the applicant or his agent in testimony that the same is in fact a true copy. True copy.

12. No drawing or sketch such as requires a special engraving for letterpress should appear in the specification itself. No drawings specification.

DRAWINGS.

13. Drawings are not required if the specification sufficiently describes the invention without them. When drawings not required.

14. Duplicates or fac-similes of drawings may be prepared upon tracing cloth in lieu of drawing paper, but in all other respects must conform to the requirements of Rules 13 to 21. Duplicates of drawings.

15. Drawings must be delivered at the Patent Office either flat or on rollers, so as to be free from creases, folds, or breaks. They must be made on pure white, hot-pressed, rolled, or calendered drawing paper, of smooth surface and good quality, and, where possible, without colour or Indian ink washes. They must be on sheets of the same size as the other documents, viz., 13 inches at the sides by 8 inches at the top and bottom, including margin all round, which must be half-an-inch wide. If there are more figures or drawings than can be shown on one of the sheets, two or more of these sheets should be used. Where a larger drawing is required than can be conveniently made on one sheet, it may be drawn upon a double sheet 13 inches at the sides by 16 inches at the top and bottom with a half-inch margin. When an exceptionally large drawing is required, it should be continued upon subsequent sheets. Sizes and methods of preparing.

16. To insure their satisfactory reproduction, the drawings must be executed with absolutely black Indian ink, the same strength of colour of fine and shade lines to be maintained throughout. Section lines and lines for effect, or shading lines, must not be closely drawn. Reference figures and letters must be bold and distinct, not less than one-eighth of an inch in height, and the same letters must be used in different views of the same parts. Ink and reference figures.

17. In cases of complicated drawings, the reference letters must be shown outside the figure and connected with the part referred to by fine lines.

18. The scale adopted should be large enough to show clearly wherein the invention consists, and only so much of the apparatus, machine, &c., need be shown as effects this purpose. When the scale is shown in the drawing, it should be denoted not by words but by a drawn scale. Scale.

- How to be marked. 19. Drawings must bear the name of the applicant in the left-hand top corner. Drawings left with a complete specification, after a provisional specification, must also bear the number of the application. All drawings must also be marked with the number of sheets sent, and the number of each sheet marked in the right-hand top corner, and the signature of the applicant or his agent in the right-hand bottom corner.
- No written description. 20. No written description of the invention should appear on the drawings.
21. If an applicant desires to adopt the drawings lodged with the provisional specification as the drawings for his complete specification, he should refer to them as those "left with the provisional specification."

DECLARATIONS, ETC.

- Before whom made. 22. All affidavits and declarations shall and may be sworn and taken before any justice, notary public, or other officer duly authorized to administer an oath or take a declaration by the law of the country or place where the same is sworn and taken.
- Evidence of authority. 23. Where any affidavit or declaration is sworn and taken in any foreign parts out of Her Majesty's dominions, the Commissioner, before accepting the same, may require evidence to be produced to him that the person before whom it purports to be sworn or taken was by such law as aforesaid so authorized.
- Assignments to be by deed. 24. Every assignment of any invention, or of any letters patent, or of any interest therein, shall be by deed, and shall be under the hand and seal of the assignor, and be attested.

AMENDMENTS.

- Generally. 25. Any document for the amendment of which no special provision is made by the Act may be amended, and any irregularity in procedure, which in the opinion of the Commissioner may be corrected without detriment to the interests of any person, may be corrected in such manner and on such terms as the Commissioner may direct.
- Amendment where application is for more than one invention. 26. Where the Commissioner refuses to accept an application upon the ground that the same includes more than one invention, the applicant may amend the same so as to apply to one invention only, and may make application for separate patents for each such invention accordingly.
- Amended application to bear original date. 27. Every such application shall bear the date of the first application, and shall, together therewith, be proceeded with in the manner prescribed by the Act and by these Rules, as if every such application had been originally made on that date for one invention only.

Amendment of Provisional Specification.

- Amendment of provisional specification. 28. No amendment of any accepted provisional specification or of the drawings lodged therewith shall, except in the case of clerical errors, be made otherwise than by a direction of the Commissioner.

Amendment of Complete Specification under Section 24.

- Request for leave to amend. 29. A request for leave to amend a specification after acceptance shall be signed by the applicant or the patentee, or his agent, and be accompanied by a copy of the original specification and drawings, showing, in red ink, the proposed amendment, and shall be duly advertised by publication of the request and nature of the proposed amendment.
- Opposition to amendment. 30. A notice of opposition shall state the grounds of such opposition, and shall be signed by the party opposing or his agent, and shall contain an address within Victoria for service.
- Evidence in support of opposition. 31. Within fourteen days after the expiration of one month from the first advertisement of the application for leave to amend, the opponent shall leave at the Patent Office statutory declarations or other evidence in support of his opposition, and deliver to the applicant a list thereof. Upon such list being delivered the provisions of Rules 39 to 42 shall apply, and the further proceedings thereunder be thereby regulated.

ADVERTISEMENT.

- In *Government Gazette*. 32. Where a complete specification has been accepted, the Commissioner shall advertise such acceptance by publishing a notification thereof in the *Government Gazette* or in the "Official Journal" of the Patent Office.
- In other papers. 33. Other advertisements, notices, or documents which by the Act or Rules are required to be published shall be inserted in such gazette, journal, or daily newspaper, as the Commissioner shall approve of or direct.

ENLARGEMENT OF TIME.

- For leaving specification or making payments. 34. Applications for enlargement of time for leaving or accepting a complete specification, or for making any prescribed payment shall be in writing in one of the forms contained in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration, stating in detail in what circumstances and upon what grounds such enlargement is applied for, and the Commissioner may, in lieu of such statutory declaration, require the applicant to substantiate such allegations by such other evidence as he may think necessary. Applications for enlargement of time for leaving or accepting a complete specification shall be lodged in the Patent Office seven clear days at the least before the expiration of the time sought to be enlarged.
- In other cases. 35. The time prescribed by the Act or these Rules for doing any act or taking any proceeding may be enlarged by the Commissioner upon such notice to other parties and upon such terms as he may direct.

OPPOSITION TO GRANTS.

- Notice of opposition. 36. The notice required by Section 15 of the Act must be signed by the opponent, or by his agent, and must contain an address within Victoria for service.
- Grounds of opposition. 37. Where the ground or one of the grounds of opposition is that the invention is patented in Victoria on an application of prior date, the title, number, and date of the patent granted in such prior application shall be specified in the notice.
- Evidence in support of opposition. 38. Within fourteen days after the expiration of two months from the date of the advertisement of the acceptance of a complete specification, the opponent shall leave at the Patent Office statutory declarations or other evidence taken in manner hereby prescribed in support of his opposition, and deliver to the applicant or his agent a list thereof.

39. Within fourteen days from the delivery of such list, the applicant shall leave at the Patent Office his statutory declarations or other evidence as aforesaid in answer, and deliver to the opponent a list thereof, and within seven days from such delivery the opponent shall leave at the Patent Office his statutory declarations or other evidence as aforesaid in reply, and deliver to the applicant or his agent a list thereof; such last-mentioned declarations or other evidence shall be confined to matters strictly in reply.

40. No further evidence on either side shall be left except by leave of the Commissioner upon the written consent of the parties duly notified to him, or by special leave of the Commissioner on application made to him for that purpose.

41. On the completion of the evidence the Commissioner shall appoint a time for the hearing of the case, and shall give to the parties seven days' notice at the least of such appointment.

On the hearing of the case no opposition shall be allowed in respect of any ground not stated in the notice of opposition.

42. The decision of the Commissioner shall be notified by him to the parties.

REGISTER.

43. A request for entry in the Register of a title by assignment, transmission, or other operation of law, shall be made in writing by the person claiming to be entitled to be registered, or by his agent, addressed to the Commissioner and left at the Patent Office. Such request shall be in the form in the Second Schedule hereto.

44. Every such request shall state the name, address, and description of the claimant, and the particulars of the assignment, transmission, or other operation of law, by virtue of which he claims to be entered in the Register; and all documents and other evidence of title necessary to prove such claim, or as the Commissioner may require, shall be produced to the Commissioner.

45. There shall also be left with the request an examined copy of the assignment or other document above required to be produced.

46. Where an Order of the Court has been made for rectification of the Register, for the revocation of patents, or otherwise affecting the validity or proprietorship of a patent, the person in whose favour such order has been made shall forthwith leave at the Patent Office an office copy of such order, and the same shall thereupon be duly entered in the Register.

47. A body corporate may be registered as patentee or proprietor by its corporate name.

DISCRETIONARY POWER.

48. Before exercising any discretionary power, as referred to in Section 66 of the Act, the Commissioner shall give ten days' notice, or such longer notice as he may think fit, to the applicant of the time when he may be heard personally or by his agent.

49. Within five days from the date when such notice would be delivered in the ordinary course of post, or such longer time as the Commissioner may appoint in such notice, the applicant shall notify to the Commissioner whether or not he intends to be heard upon the matter.

50. Whether the applicant desires to be heard or not, the Commissioner may at any time require him to submit a statement in writing within a time to be notified by the Commissioner, or to attend before him and make oral explanations with respect to such matters as the Commissioner may desire.

51. The decision of the Commissioner shall be notified by him to the applicant and any other person affected thereby.

52. The term "applicant" in these Rules shall include an applicant whose specification bears a title the same as or similar to that of the specification of a prior applicant, and has been reported on by an examiner.

POWER TO WAIVE REQUIREMENTS.

53. Where under these rules any person is required to do any act or thing, or to sign any document, or to make any affidavit or declaration on behalf of himself or any body corporate, or any document or evidence is required to be produced or left with the Commissioner or at the Patent Office, and it is shown to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that from any reasonable cause such person is unable to do such act or thing, or to sign such document or make such affidavit or declaration, or that such declaration or evidence cannot be produced or left as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner, upon such terms as he may think fit, to dispense with any such act or thing, document, declaration, or evidence.

PROCEDURE BEFORE LAW OFFICER.

54. When notice of intention to appeal to the Law Officer from a decision of the Commissioner has been duly given to the Commissioner, he shall forthwith transmit to the Law Officer all the papers relating to the application in respect of which such appeal is made.

55. Seven days' notice at least of the time and place appointed for the hearing of any appeal shall be given by direction of the Law Officer, unless special directions be given by him that any shorter notice be given; such notice shall in all cases be given to the Commissioner and the applicant, or his agent, and where there has been an opposition before the Commissioner, to the opponent or opponents, or his or their agent; and when the Commissioner has refused to seal a patent, on the ground that an application for a patent for the same invention is pending, to the prior applicant or his agent, also.

56. The evidence used in an appeal to the Law Officer shall be the same as that used at the hearing before the Commissioner, and no further evidence shall be given, save as to matters which have occurred or come to the knowledge of either party after the date of the decision appealed against, except with the leave of the Law Officer, upon special application for that purpose. All documentary evidence required or allowed by the Law Officer to be filed shall be subject to the same rules in all respects as apply to the procedure before the Commissioner, and shall be filed in the Patent Office, unless the Law Officer shall otherwise order.

57. When by a decision of the Commissioner any costs or other sum of money are or is directed to be paid or deposited by any person appealing from such decision or any part thereof, the Law Officer may decline to proceed with the hearing of such appeal, unless and until such costs or sum of money have or has been duly paid or deposited, or some security to the satisfaction of the Law Officer be approved of by him for the performance of such part of such decision.

COSTS.

Scale of costs.

58. The scale of costs in any proceedings before the Commissioner or the Law Officer shall be the same, as nearly as may be, in business of a like character as is fixed and allowed on the lower scale in proceedings under the *Supreme Court Act* 1890.

FEES.

Fees.

59. In addition to the fees mentioned in the schedule to the *Patents Act* 1890, there shall be paid under the said Act the fees contained in the Third Schedule hereto.

The fee of One Pound payable under the said schedule to the *Patents Act* 1890, "on obtaining Letters Patent," shall be lodged in the Patent Office at the same time as the fee for filing the complete Specification is paid.

PATENT AGENTS.

Who may practise.

60. No person shall be entitled to practise as an agent for the procuring and taking out of letters patent for inventions unless such person shall have previously obtained a licence in accordance with these Rules.

Licence—how obtained.

Any qualified person wishing to practise as a patent agent may apply, in writing, to the Commissioner for permission to do so, and if the Commissioner deems it expedient, and is satisfied as to the ability, fitness, and general qualifications of the applicant, he may issue under his hand and seal a licence under the form and to the effect following (that is to say) :—

61. The Rules made under the *Patents Act* 1889, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 25th day of February, 1890, are hereby repealed.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and issued in pursuance of *The Public Health Statute 1865*, it was notified that the Island of Mauritius was infected with small-pox, and that it was probable that such disease might be brought from such Island to Victoria: And whereas the circumstances which led to the issue of such Proclamation have ceased to exist: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

FISHING IN YARRAM CREEK.—PROCLAMATIONS REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, define the limits of, and what waters shall be deemed to be, and what shall be deemed the mouth or other boundary of any river, creek, stream, bay, estuary, or lake, and may fix a distance from the mouth of any or every river, creek, or stream within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used: And whereas it is further enacted that every proclamation under the said Act may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke wholly or in part, as the case may be, the Proclamations referred to hereunder, that is to say:—

The Proclamation dated the eleventh day of December, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, is hereby revoked so far only as the same relates to fishing in Yarram Creek.

The Proclamation dated the eleventh day of October, One thousand eight hundred and eighty, amending the aforesaid Proclamation, is hereby wholly revoked.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

No. 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And whereas it has been deemed expedient to adjust the conterminous boundaries of the Shires of Dunmunkle and St. Arnaud: Now therefore the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, for the purpose of adjusting the conterminous boundaries of the said Shires of Dunmunkle and St. Arnaud, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said shires in manner following, that is to say:—

DUNMUNKLE SHIRE.

Commencing at a point on the Yarriambiack Creek at its intersection with a road forming the south boundary of allotment 36, parish of Kewell East; thence following said road east, south-easterly, and east to the south-east angle of allotment 128, parish of Nullan; thence south-easterly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 127; thence east by a road to its intersection with the main road from Minyip to Donald at the south boundary of allotment 120; thence north-easterly by the last-named road to a road forming the west boundary of allotment 105B, parish of Dunmunkle; thence north by said road to the south-west angle of allotment 56B; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 73A; thence south by a road to the north-west angle of allotment 15, section C, parish of Laen; thence east by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 14A; thence south by a road to the north-east angle of allotment 17; thence east, south, easterly, northerly, easterly, and southerly by that river and the Richardson River to the west boundary of allotment 191, parish of Wirchilleba; thence south by that allotment to the south-west angle thereof; thence west by a road to the Wimmera River; thence north-westerly by that river to the Yarriambiack Creek aforesaid; and thence northerly by that creek to the commencing point.

FARMERS' COMMON.

In pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the Harcourt, Faraday, Sutton Grange, and Porcupine (Mount Alexander) Farmers' Common having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in every year:—

For every horse, Ten shillings per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, Six shillings per annum.

For every calf under the age of 12 months, Three shillings per annum.

For every sheep or goat, One shilling and fourpence per annum.

4. All owners of stock placed on the common during the currency of a half-year shall pay the full fees for such half-year.

5. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may from time to time set apart for the purpose.

6. The herdsman or managers shall attend at the common yards, or other convenient place appointed by the managers, of which due notice shall be given, during the first week in every month, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m., to receive stock for depasturing on the common; and the owners of such stock shall, on delivery thereof, furnish the managers with a written statement of the number of stock, their brands, and description, and the total amount of fees chargeable thereon, for which the managers shall give a receipt in the prescribed form, and shall cause particulars of such stock to be entered in a register kept for the purpose.

7. All stock legally depasturing upon the common shall be branded with the common brand in tar, and shall have the owner's fire brand thereon; and every goat shall wear around its neck a triangular yoke with the owner's name printed or carved thereon.

8. No entire horse shall be allowed to run upon the common; and no bull, except such as shall be approved by the managers, shall be permitted to depasture thereon.

9. No person shall remove stock from the common after delivery to the herdsman or managers, without first giving due notice in writing of the intention so to do, or unless as herein-after provided; and the herdsman or managers shall, not, after receipt of such notice, be considered to have charge over any such stock until they shall again be handed over to the herdsman or managers. Except in cases where stock may be frequently required, the owner may, upon application, receive permission from the managers to remove and replace such stock at pleasure in a quiet manner, so as not to interfere with or disturb other stock unnecessarily, but the herdsman or managers shall not be considered to have any supervision whatsoever over such stock.

10. It shall be competent for any person, or the managers of neighbouring commons, to register with the herdsman or managers the brands and description of missing stock, upon payment of a fee of One shilling for every head of stock so registered, in a book kept for the purpose; and such stock, if found upon the common, shall not be impounded till notice in writing shall be delivered to the person registering, who shall be required to remove the same within fourteen days from the date of service of notice.

11. No stock affected with any contagious disease shall be placed upon the common, and any stock thereon becoming so affected shall be removed from the common by the owner within one day after written notice to him by the herdsman or managers, and in the event of such stock not being removed by the owner within the time specified, such stock shall be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

12. All complaints against the herdsman shall be made in writing, and shall be forwarded to the managers of the common within seven days from the date on which the cause of complaint arose.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within five (5) miles of the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one (1) additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten (10) acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year, and the owners of stock registered during the currency of any quarter shall pay the agistment-fees for the whole of such quarter:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Two shillings and sixpence per quarter.

For every head of other large cattle, Two shillings per quarter.

For every head of small cattle, One shilling per quarter.

For fillies, colts, and calves under six (6) months old the progeny of dams on the common, Free.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to stock depasturing on the common, except as provided in clause 13.

5. Cattle known to destroy fences shall not be allowed on the common.

No entire horse or bull over the age of six (6) months shall be permitted to depasture on the common without the sanction in writing of the managers.

7. Owners of stock shall register their brands when paying agistment-fees, and all horned cattle after the prescribed fees shall have been paid thereon shall be branded with the common brand by the herdsman or person in charge of the common before being placed thereon.

8. All stock on the common, on which the prescribed fees shall remain unpaid for a period of fourteen (14) days after the commencement of any quarter, shall be liable to be treated as trespassers.

9. All unregistered stock found on the common shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman or person in charge of the common.

10. No stock affected with any contagious disease shall be permitted to depasture on the common, and any stock that may be found or become so affected after being placed thereon, shall be removed from the common within six (6) hours after notice so to do, signed by two (2) of the managers, shall have been served upon the owner or the person in charge of such stock.

11. No person shall remove registered stock from the common without first giving notice in writing to the herdsman or managers, and then only with the consent in writing of the herdsman or managers.

12. No person shall unnecessarily drive, disturb, or wilfully damage or ill-use any stock on the common.

13. The herdsman shall, at his own expense, release from pound all stock having the common brand or entitled to depasture on the common, unless he at once give notice to the owners that such stock is missing from the common.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, and the relatives unable to pay the usual fees, subject to the direction of the Governor in Council. (*Vide* section 49 *Cemeteries Act 1890*.)
- 4th. Order for interment to be given either to the secretary or at the office of the trustees on the day previous, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.
- 5th. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fees. Parties requiring brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any two of them.
- 6th. The time fixed for a funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- 7th. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
- 8th. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- 9th. A plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
- 10th. All persons destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- 11th. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, in accordance with section 19 of *Cemeteries Act 1890*.
- 12th. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
- 13th. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.
- 14th. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.

15th. No grave shall be less than 6 feet in depth for adults, and children over 7 years of age, nor less than 5 feet in depth for children under 7 years of age.
