THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the distribution of the sum of £1,000 granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies for the year 1890-91.

Regulations for the Distribution of the Sum of One thousand pounds granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1890-91.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the Grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February, 1891, a statement in the Form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the Form marked E.

2. The distribution of the Vote will be made one month after the above-mentioned date, when a sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away for horticultural exhibits will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole One thousand pounds, and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1890, and the 31st December, 1890, amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

Instructions.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration form E for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January, 1890, and the 31st December, 1890, must be filled up in words as well as in figures; and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management; it should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture.

It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne only.

4. Challenge cups must not be included in the return of prize moneys paid, unless such cups have been finally awarded.

NOTE.—The forms B, C, and D are forwarded herewith by way of guidance, but can be made use of at the option of the society. If, however, extra forms be required, the same must be furnished by the applicant, and be of uniform size and pattern.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1890-91.

REGULATIONS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE VOTE TO PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS, 1890-91.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the distribution of the sum of £9,500 granted by Parliament for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens for the year 1890-91.

Regulations in connexion with the Vote of Nine thousand five hundred pounds (£9,500) for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, Committees of Management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Ten shillings shall be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1890, and 31st December, 1890, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February, 1891. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1890, and 31st December, 1890; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1890.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1890 (*vide* form A), and a sum equal to one-half of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Nine thousand four hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting or in fencing, formation or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, Richmond Park, Richmond, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

A dark-green soft-felt hat, looped at the right side, and with a three-plait puggaree of the same colour, to be worn during the summer months.

- (2) That, for the purposes of such election for the year 1890, the said Carrum Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall cause to be prepared as from the 1st day of January, 1891, a voters' list, in the form of the First Schedule to the aforesaid Regulations, bearing date the 2nd day of December, 1889, and shall revise the same.
- (3) That the two commissioners so elected at such election shall hold office until the 23rd day of December, 1893, when they shall be deemed to have held office as such commissioners for the full period allowed by the said Regulations, and shall retire accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council

not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the fourth May, 1886, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the Nagambie Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were in and by the said Order in Council defined and limited.

And whereas it is expedient to increase the extent of the said Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that the Waterworks District of the said Nagambie Waterworks Trust shall be increased by the addition thereto of the lands comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the existing Trust district; thence north by a line for a distance of thirteen chains; thence west by a line through section XIII. B, parish of Tabilk, to the Nagambie and Murchison three-chain road; thence further west by River-street and a line to a point north of the north-west angle of the existing Trust district; thence south thirteen chains by a line to the said north-west angle of Trust district; thence east by the northern boundary of existing Trust district to the commencing point.

Portion II.—Commencing at a point five chains east of the south-west angle of the existing Trust district; thence south-westerly by a road 19'60 chains to a one-chain road; thence by said road north-westerly twelve chains; thence by a road south-westerly twenty-six chains; thence by a line south-easterly to a point on the eastern boundary of allotment XVII. WHEREAS an Order in Council was made on the seventh day of July, 1887, under the provisions of *The Local Government Act Amendment Act 1888*, authorizing the construction of tramways within the Shire of Moorabbin, and such Order was duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the eighth day of July, 1887: And whereas the said Order directed that section C, forming part of such tramways, and described as follows, viz.:—"From Mordialloc to Cromer-road: Commencing in the township of Mordialloc at the junction of the Beach-road with the western side of the main street (Point Nepean-road); thence on the Beach-road in a north-westerly direction to Cromer-road; thence by a curve of 100 feet radius 126 feet; thence through private land north 54° 19' west 255 feet; thence by curves of 100 feet radius westerly and northerly to join section A, from Cheltenham to Rickett's Point," should be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of three (3) years from the date of such Order: And whereas the council of the said municipality has made application under the provisions of the *Tramways Act 1890* to have the said Order amended by extending the time fixed for the completion of the said section C for a further period of two (2) years, viz., to the seventh day of July, 1892; and the said council having duly complied with the requirements of the said Act and the regulations made thereunder, with regard to the publication of its intention to so apply, and no objections having been lodged thereto within the time provided by the said rules; and the Governor in Council, being satisfied that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions set out in the said Order of the seventh day of July, 1887: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, for the purpose aforesaid, make the Order following, that is to say, "That the time for the completion of the said section C of the said tramway be extended for a further period of two (2) years, viz., to the seventh day of July, 1892."

And the Honorable James Henry Wheeler, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby directs that, on and after the 1st day of January, 1891, the following General Regulations respecting Public Accounts, framed in pursuance of section 5 of Act 54 Vict. No. 1066, shall come into operation in lieu of all General Regulations heretofore made under section 2 of Act 22 Vict. No. 86:—

I.—FINANCIAL YEAR.

1. The financial year commences on the First day of July and ends on the Thirtieth day of June.

II.—BASIS OF ACCOUNTS.

2. The Annual Estimates of Revenue transmitted to the Legislative Assembly, the Special Appropriations under the various Acts, and the Annual Votes under the Appropriation Act shall form the basis of the Public Accounts for each year. The Trust Funds Receipts and Expenditure shall be stated under the respective heads according to law, together with the balance of each description of account. The moneys raised by Loan and the expenditure thereout shall be set forth under the respective Acts by which authorized.

III.—REVENUE AND RECEIPTS.

3. All moneys received by Receivers of Revenue on behalf of the Treasury on and between the first and last days of the financial year shall be deemed and taken to be the receipts for and on account of such financial year.

4. Collectors of Imposts and all other persons in the Public Service who may collect moneys for the Public Account shall, in the event of the notification under section 15 of the *Audit Act* 1890 not being received by them, pay their collections on the last day of each month to the nearest Receiver of Revenue.

5. Collections of revenue and of other public moneys shall not under any circumstances be lodged in any bank to a private account, or be mixed up with private funds.

REVENUE.

6. The full amount of all collections, deducting only charges legally payable therefrom, shall be paid into the Treasury, accompanied with the Statements to be rendered under sections 16 and 18 of the *Audit Act* 1890 known as **A** and **C** and hereinafter designated "Statements of Collections."

TRUST MONEYS, ETC.

7. All moneys collected by any persons in the Public Service for the use or benefit of any other person shall be dealt with and accounted for as directed in sections 22, 23, and 24 of the *Audit Act* 1890.

8. Collections on account of loans, funds, or special accounts shall be paid over and accounted for as nearly as possible in all respects as moneys received on account of revenue.

SURCHARGES AND SHORT COLLECTIONS.

9. When an officer is called upon to satisfy any surcharge which he cannot remove by satisfactorily explaining, he shall forthwith make good the amount thereof by paying the same to the Receiver of Revenue of the District.

IV.—PREPARATION OF STATEMENTS OF COLLECTIONS.

10. The Statements to be furnished by Collectors of Imposts and Receivers of Revenue under sections 16 and 18 of the *Audit Act* 1890 shall be respectively on the Forms **A** and **C** annexed, and shall be prepared as follows:—

- (a) The collections on account of revenue shall be arranged and classified so as to accord with the annual Estimates of Revenue, and shall be shown in totals under the several sub-heads, and carried out in a grand total; collections on account of loans, funds, or special accounts must be carried out in separate totals.
- (b) When any moneys are received for the sale of public property, the said Statements shall be accompanied with account sales and other documents relating to the sale. (See clause 60.)
- (c) When moneys are received in satisfaction of surcharges or to be credited to advances or in reduction of expenditure, the Statements shall be accompanied with Form **D** annexed, duly completed. Should the officer making the payment be a Collector of Imposts he may, if more convenient, inscribe the required particulars upon Forms **A** or **C**, in which case Form **D** need not be used.
- (d) The Revenue Statements shall be so prepared as to insure ready identification of the particulars therein given with those upon the Land Sales Reports, the Returns known as "The Red-faced Returns," or any other Returns or Statements which have now or may hereafter be required to be furnished for verification with the Statement of Collections. (See clause 19.)
- (e) Generally the said Statements shall in every case set forth or be accompanied with all requisite particulars for showing the correctness of the sums collected and the sources whence they were derived; and should they be paid in under a surcharge or an inspection report of the Audit Commissioner, a note is to be made on the Statement which will connect the collection with the query or the report concerned.

11. In cases where a deduction from collections is made, the full particulars thereof shall be given, the authority under which the deduction is made shall be quoted, and the acquittance for the amount deducted shall be furnished.

12. When no collections payable to a Receiver are made by a Collector for the period for which he has to make payment of his collections, the Statement shall nevertheless be transmitted to the Receiver at the proper time, with the word "Nil" written across the face of it.

13. When no money is collected during any month, the Collector shall nevertheless furnish the "Declared Return" at the proper time to the Commissioners of Audit, in the form prescribed by section 21 of the *Audit Act* 1890 with the word "Nil" written across the face of it.

14. When moneys are tendered to a Collector of Imposts or Receiver of Revenue, if he should be in doubt as to the manner in which they or any part of them should be credited, or as to whether they are properly payable to him, or if he should observe any irregularity in relation to them of a character to require explanation, he may receive the moneys, giving a properly qualified receipt, place the amount in his Statement of Collections to the credit of "Suspense Account," and take immediate steps to obtain and transmit to the Treasurer such further information as will enable him to transfer the amount in the Treasury books to the proper head of account.

15. Should a Receiver observe that a Statement of Collections furnished by any Collector is defective or not prepared in a proper manner, he shall note the irregularity at the foot of the document for the Treasurer's information, and call upon the Collector to forward an amended Statement.

V.—LICENCES AND RETURNS.

16. Receivers of Revenue, Collectors of Imposts, and other persons duly authorized to issue licences and miners' rights shall issue such licences and rights only from books of forms to be supplied for the purpose, and in no case may an acknowledgment for the money received be given in lieu of any such licence or right. Full particulars of the licence or right issued shall be entered upon the counterpart of the form, and the counterpart shall be initialed by the Collector and carefully preserved for reference and audit.

- (a) Receivers of Revenue and Collectors of Imposts shall in no case, where money is tendered to them in their official capacity, issue manuscript receipts or acknowledgments for such moneys, but shall make use of printed forms of acknowledgment, upon the butts of which full particulars of the money received must be entered, the butts to be initialed by the Receiver or Collector and submitted for examination to the Inspecting Commissioner of Audit.
- (b) Receivers of Revenue, Collectors of Imposts, and other duly authorized officers, shall obtain all books containing such printed forms of receipt or acknowledgment from the Treasury, by requisition through the permanent head of their respective departments. As regards those receipt books which are known not to be kept in stock at the Treasury, requisitions for supplies thereof must be forwarded in sufficient time to allow of the forms being printed.

17. The Land Officer conducting a Government land sale will be furnished with three forms of Land Sale Report in the Form **E** annexed, containing the particulars of the land to be sold. In these he shall cause to be set forth, immediately after the sale, the particulars of the sale as indicated in the form, and after the amounts set out in the report are verified by the Receiver of Revenue, he shall forthwith transmit the reports—one to the Audit Office, one to the Department of Lands and Survey, and one to the Receiver and Paymaster to whom the balance of purchase money is made payable.

18. The Land Sale Report furnished to the Receiver and Paymaster shall be retained by him, and completed by the entry of the instalments of the purchase money, when paid, and of the interest due thereupon, in the columns provided for the purpose.

19. Every Collector of Imposts shall transmit, with his Statement of Collections, the "Red-faced Return" in all cases where Land Revenue or revenue in connexion therewith has been collected, and such other Returns or Statements as are now or hereafter may be required for the verification of his collections. The Red-faced Return shall be prepared in the manner indicated in the Form **F** annexed, and be for the same period as the Statement of Collections.

20. Every Receiver of Revenue shall forward day by day to the Treasury, with his Statement of Collections, his Red-faced Return (if any), and also the Red-faced Returns received by him from other Collectors, and any other Statements required to be furnished by him or received by him, to be forwarded to the Treasury for verification.

21. The Red-faced Returns, and other documents received for verification at the Treasury, shall, immediately after the Accountant to the Treasury, or other duly authorized officer, has ascertained that the moneys therein set forth have been duly credited to the Public Account and has certified to that effect, be transmitted to the proper department.

VI.—EXPENDITURE AND DISBURSEMENTS.

LIMITATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

22. Attention is drawn to section 33 of the *Audit Act* 1890, which directs "that no sum or sums of money which is, are, or shall be appropriated from the Consolidated Revenue for the service of any financial year shall be issued and applied except for such services and purposes as shall come in course of payment during the year for which such appropriation is or shall be made, provided that for any of the 'services and purposes' as aforesaid as shall remain unpaid at the end of the said financial year accounts may be rendered not later than the thirty-first day of August

“in each and every year, and payment shall be deemed to have been made within the said financial year.”

VARIATION OF AMOUNTS OF ITEMS OF A SUBDIVISION IN THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ACT.

23. Every order made under section 32 of the *Audit Act* 1890 shall be notified to the Treasurer and the Commissioners of Audit in the Form **I** annexed.

AUTHORITY FOR EXPENDITURE.

24. Any liability incurred in pursuance of any law or order of the Governor in Council, or under a contract entered into by the Government and duly gazetted as hereinafter directed (clause 26), and any other expenditure sanctioned in writing by the proper Minister of the Crown, may if there are funds legally available therefor be defrayed upon the certificate of the officers appointed, or who may be hereafter appointed, under clause 28, by the Governor in Council, to certify to the accounts of their respective departments.

Nothing contained in this Regulation shall warrant any officer to incur any liability or defray any expenditure contrary to any law, Order in Council, contract, Ministerial or other authority governing such expenditure, or without having first obtained the necessary sanction in manner herein laid down.

25. Notice of all appointments and promotions in the Government service, the rates of remuneration to be given, and the transfer of officers from one situation to another shall be communicated to the Commissioners of Audit by the responsible Minister in the Form **W** annexed. Advices in the same form shall be forwarded to the Treasurer of the appointment of all persons to offices in connexion with which security has been directed to be given by Order in Council or is required by the provisions of section 4 of the *Audit Act* 1890. In all cases where it is proposed to change any officer who has been appointed or acts as a Collector of Imposts the Treasurer is to be specially advised. All authorities for pensions, superannuation, and retiring allowances shall be forwarded to the Treasurer, and be by him referred to the Commissioners of Audit for notation. All copies of Orders in Council furnished to the Treasury in support of any account are to be certified by the Head of the Department in which obtained.

26. All contracts entered into on behalf of the Government and all Orders in Council authorizing the construction of any public works without contract, or any purchases the amount of which exceeds One hundred pounds without Tenders being previously publicly invited, shall be published in abstract in the *Government Gazette* as early as practicable.

26a. Tenders shall be publicly invited and contracts taken for all works, and for the supply of all goods, tools, materials, machinery, &c., the estimated cost of which shall exceed One hundred pounds, unless the expenditure be specially authorized by the Governor in Council subject to the following exemptions :—

The Railway Department as regards the whole of this Regulation, with the exception of works of construction.

The Water Supply Department as regards expenditure on works ; and

The Water Supply Branch of the Public Works Department, also as regards expenditure on works.

The Public Health Department as regards infectious and contagious diseases, and other matters of urgency under the Health Act.

27. To enable the Treasurer to calculate the amount of moneys likely to become due and payable in each month, in accordance with section 28 of the *Audit Act* 1890, the Treasurer may, if he think fit, require any Minister to furnish a statement in the Form **M** annexed.

28. Accounts for expenditure for the several departments and services shall be certified by officers who shall be from time to time appointed at the instance of the Treasurer by the Governor in Council.

PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS.

29. Claims against the Public Account will be paid at the Treasury pay offices; and, in certain cases by Heads of Departments or other officers, from advances to be made to them as hereinafter provided.

30. Accounts for payment at the several pay offices shall be forwarded by the proper officer direct to the Treasury, and shall under no circumstances be handed to the claimant for presentation or transmission.

31. The actual payment of an account and the signature to the acquittance shall be verified, whenever practicable, by the signature of a witness other than the payor; the "mark" of a person unable to write shall invariably be so verified, such verification not to be by the certifying officer.

32. Payment to others than principals may be made :—

- (a.) To holders of one or other of the Forms **G** and **H** annexed, signed by the person who signed the certified account as claimant, and such order shall be attached to the account after payment, but no such payment shall be made by the Paymaster or payor to himself upon either form of order.

Nevertheless payment of salaries, wages, and fixed allowances may not be made to others than principals, except in cases where the acquittance of the principal cannot be obtained, owing to his absence on leave or through sickness, or some other unavoidable cause. In all such cases the order for payment to the agent must be initialled by the permanent Head of the Department to which the officer signing it belongs; but this Regulation is not to apply to orders which may be given by—

- (1) The subordinate Teachers of the Education Department in favour of the Head Teachers of their respective schools.
- (2) Mining Registrars.
- (3) Electoral Registrars.
- (4) Deputy Registrars of Births and Deaths.
- (5) Pensioners.
- (6) Diamond drill employes.
- (7) Issuers of Miners' Rights, &c.
- (8) Public Vaccinators.

Accounts for services in connexion with the Education Department may be paid upon orders in the following form, provided that the order is printed on the back of the account to which it relates, viz. :—

"I, the undersigned, beg to request that the sum payable to me in respect of the account on which this order is indorsed be paid to Mr. _____ (whose signature appears in the margin), whom I hereby authorize on my behalf to receive and give a receipt for the amount due to me upon such account.

Signed,

Claimant.

- (b) To holders of a power of attorney, on production of the power or a copy certified by the Registrar-General, and after registration of the same, first by the Head of the Department concerned, secondly by the Receiver and Paymaster, and lastly by the Commissioners of Audit respectively. In the case, however, of powers of attorney made for the sole purpose of collecting refunds, drawbacks, &c., from the Collector of Customs, registration need be effected only at the Customs Department and the Audit Office.

- (c) To executors and administrators, on production of probate of will or letters of administration, and after registration of the documents as above directed.
- (d) Upon such other conditions as the Treasurer may in each case sanction in writing.

33. Every Paymaster or other officer, before making payment under any of the instruments named, shall satisfy himself as to the identity of the person claiming thereunder, and that the power of attorney has not been revoked; and before making the first payment to a claimant under power of attorney, probate of will, or letters of administration, shall register the documents in a book in the Form **R** annexed, state on the documents that they have been exhibited and noted, and obtain and witness the signature of the claimant.

34. Heads of Departments, Accountants, and other officers in the Government service shall not, without the special permission of the Minister, act as agents or attorneys for the receipt of moneys due for services rendered for their respective departments.

ADVANCES.

35. Heads of Departments and other officers authorized by the proper Minister may be supplied by the Treasurer, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, with funds, by way of advance, to enable them to defray salaries, allowances, wages, departmental contingencies, and other expenditure which it may be deemed desirable to defray by such means.

36. Advances to Receivers and Paymasters are available only for the purpose of making payments properly payable by them in such capacity for the public service.

37. At the commencement of the financial year, or earlier, if funds are legally available, schedules in the Form **L** annexed, and under the signature of the responsible Minister, shall be transmitted to the Treasurer, setting forth the amount required by each Head of Department or other duly authorized officer as an "Annual Advance;" and the amount may, with the consent of the Treasurer, be advanced to the officer authorized to receive the same.

38. If the exigencies of the service demand it, special advances may be made, with the consent of the Treasurer, upon an application approved by the responsible Minister in the Form **L a** annexed. Such application shall specify the name of the officer who is to be intrusted with the advance, and the special grounds upon which the application is made.

39. Officers who receive annual or special advances shall, in order to maintain themselves in funds for the purposes of their respective departments or services during the financial year, apply to the Treasurer, as often as may be necessary, for a reimbursement of the amount paid out of such advances; but no account shall be withheld from the Treasury for a longer period than one month after payment. The application for reimbursement shall be made in the Form **L b** annexed, and shall be accompanied with vouchers for the payments made, completed in every respect in accordance with these Regulations.

40. Advances shall be adjusted by transmitting, under Form **L c** annexed, to the Treasury vouchers completed in every respect in accordance with these Regulations, and by repaying the amount unexpended (if any) into the Treasury. Special advances shall be adjusted on or before the date mentioned in the applications upon which they are made; and annual advances within fourteen days after the close of the financial year, or earlier if required.

41. No officer, other than a Receiver and Paymaster, shall use his advance for the payment of any services other than those connected with the department to which he is attached.

VII.—PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS.

42. The forms of accounts to be used shall be those herein prescribed or forms to the like effect, and any forms of account at present employed which are not inconsistent with these Regulations. No alteration in any such form of account shall be made without the consent of the Treasurer, and every alteration approved by the Treasurer shall be notified by him to the Commissioners of Audit.

43. Heads of Departments and other persons intrusted with the expenditure of public moneys shall be careful to see—

- (a) That the accounts they pay or pass for payment are in due form, are duly vouched, and not vitiated by erasures, interlineations, or in any other manner, and that the writing be in ink.
- (b) That they set forth the exact dates or periods and rates of service or supply, and the names of the places in respect of which the expenditure was incurred.
- (c) That the particulars of the claims are stated in such a manner as will admit of the calculations being readily checked.
- (d) That they are signed opposite the total amount by the proper claimant or by an agent acting under power of attorney on his behalf, or in the case of a registered company under the *Companies Act 1890*, by a duly accredited person on behalf of the company.
- (e) That the mark of any claimant unable to write is properly vouched for.
- (f) That, if not payable at the Treasury, Melbourne, they set forth the country pay office to which they are to be transmitted for payment.
- (g) That they are made out in the name of the claimant, legibly written in the proper place.
- (h) That the proper financial year, the department, head of service, vote, appropriation, loans, funds, or accounts to which they are chargeable, are correctly filled in.
- (i) That the amount of the claim is written in words at length opposite to the total.
- (j) That reference is made to the gazetted contract, approved requisition, agreement, or other authority governing the expenditure.
- (k) That blank spaces between the words expressing the total amount of the claim are filled up by drawing a line across them; and finally,
- (l) That they are duly certified.

44. In stating periods, the first and last days shall be invariably included in the calculation, and in preparing accounts for salaries, wages, and allowances one month's pay at an annual rate shall be calculated at one-twelfth part of such annual rate. Salary for a portion of a month is to be computed by multiplying the amount of the salary for the month by the number of days comprised in the broken period for which payment is to be made, and dividing by the number of days in the month. Daily wages, excepting in cases where the payment is to be made for working days, are to be calculated at per week of seven days.

45. Accounts for service of a year prior to the last financial year when to be charged to a vote of the current year for a similar service shall bear an indorsement by the Head of the Department of the circumstances which have occasioned the delay in rendering the accounts.

46. Every account passed for payment which is defective in any material particulars shall be accompanied with a statement of the grounds on which credit is claimed for the amount represented by such defective account.

47. Duplicate accounts must not be certified to, nor even be prepared, except when the original account has been lost or mislaid.

In case it shall become necessary to certify a "duplicate" account, the certifying officer shall explain on the back thereof the reason of the non-production of the original, and shall certify, after due inquiry, that the claim has not been paid or *passed for payment*. Such duplicate account shall have the words "duplicate, *see indorsement*" written in red ink across the face of it, and shall be payable to the claimant only through the Treasury.

48. Accounts for single salaries or contingencies shall be prepared in the Forms **L 1a** or **L 2** annexed.

49. With a view to diminish the number of accounts, Government officers having claims for salaries and allowances, which relate to one and the same department and are due at the same time, may include such claims in one account in the Forms **L 1** or **L 3** annexed, provided that the items in the accounts are classified in accordance with the terms of appropriation, funds, or accounts to which the claims are severally chargeable.

49A. When two or more accounts are rendered to a department by the same claimant they are to be summarized upon one form (**L 2**), so as to admit of one posting and of one cheque being drawn, and one receipt being given; the summary to show the charges under respective heads, and to be signed by the certifying officer, who will also certify the original accounts, which are to be attached, and to have the words "Sub-voucher" written across them.

50. Petty expenditure not requiring minute description, such as cab hire, railway or tram fare, and such like, should, as far as practicable, be included in one account in the Form **L 4** annexed; and when not exceeding Five shillings in any one payment, may be passed upon the certificate of the Head of Department without further acquittance.

51. Accounts for refunds from revenue other than Customs refunds and drawbacks shall be prepared upon the Form **L 5** annexed, and the directions given on the form are to be strictly followed. Accounts for payments from the Trust Funds must give reference to the credit, and shall be in such form as the Treasurer shall direct.

52. Officers are **STRICTLY FORBIDDEN** to obtain signatures to blank forms of account, or to orders for payment, or to acquittances which are not duly and properly filled in. Accounts claiming instalment of grant in aid of charitable institutions may, however, be rendered by the institutions with the amounts left blank, to be inserted in the Treasury.

53. All persons in the Government service are enjoined to afford every facility to claimants to enable them to prepare their accounts correctly.

VIII.—BOOKS.

54. Every Collector of Imposts shall keep a Collector's Cash Book in the Form **N** annexed, in which he shall enter daily on the one side the amount of his collections during the day, and on the other the periodical disposal thereof.

55. Every Receiver of Revenue shall keep a "Receiver's" Cash Book in the Form **O** annexed, in which he shall enter daily on the one side the total amount received by him from each Collector, and the total amount of his own collections, and on the other the disposal thereof.

56. Every Receiver of Revenue shall keep a list of all Collectors of Imposts whose collections shall have been made payable into his hands, and shall report to the Treasurer every case in which any such Collector fails, within three days after the date appointed for the payment of his collections, either to pay over his collections or to transmit his Revenue Statement.

57. Every Receiver and Paymaster shall keep the following books, namely:—

- (a) A Register of all orders on the Public Account which may be transmitted to him under section 30 of Audit Act, and of the cheques paid under such orders; and such book shall be in the Form **P** annexed.
- (b) A Register of accounts, in which he shall enter all accounts which he certifies for refunds either from revenue or trust funds, and such register shall be in the Form **Q** annexed.
- (c) A Register in Form **R** annexed for recording powers of attorney, probates, and letters of administration under which claims are made upon the Treasury, or upon which deeds are delivered.

58. Every person intrusted with the disbursement of public moneys shall keep a Cash Book in Form **S** annexed, in which shall be entered all cash transactions in connexion therewith.

59. Each Head of Department shall keep, or cause to be kept, clear and accurate records of expenditure out of each item of appropriation or funds placed under his control; also a register of all salaries, wages and allowances of his department in the Form **T** annexed, or other suitable form approved of by the Treasurer; and a register opened alphabetically for the entry and course of every official account relating either to revenue or expenditure, and such register shall be in Form **U** annexed.

IX.—MISCELLANEOUS.

60. When any officer in the Government service has been directed to sell or dispose of any public property, the Minister giving the direction, shall notify in the Form K annexed, to the Treasurer the name and station of the officer directed to sell, and the particulars of the property to be sold. The Treasurer after having traced the proceeds into the Public Account, shall transmit such notifications to the Commissioners of Audit.

61. All fines imposed in any department, upon persons employed in the Public Service, whether recovered by direct fine or mulct, shall be paid into the Treasury in cash, and the particulars accompanying the payment, shall clearly set forth the reasons for which the penalty was inflicted. Notice of all such fines shall be made to the Treasurer, who, having traced the amount into the Public Account, shall transmit the notification to the Commissioners of Audit.

62. Special instructions will be given by the Treasurer to all officers who may be intrusted with special duties in respect of which the Regulations herein contained may be insufficient or inapplicable.

63. No forms of account except those printed at the Government Printing Office shall be used for claims on the Public Account.

64. When any money shall come into the possession or control of any person in the Public Service under any Act, or by virtue of his office or employment or of any legal process, such person shall pay all such moneys into such bank at such place and in such manner as the Treasurer shall from time to time appoint.

65. Every Receiver of Revenue, Collector of Imposts, and other person who may be intrusted with the collection of public revenue, or other moneys, or with the custody of public property, on being relieved of his trust, either permanently or temporarily, shall make up to date and duly transmit all returns and statements required from him under the Audit Act, or under these or other Regulations. He shall also hand over to the relieving officer all cash in hand, licence forms, books, and stores and furniture in his charge belonging to the Government, with a return of the same signed by himself; and a copy of so much of the said return as relates to cash, licence forms, and miners' rights, signed by himself and by the relieving officer, shall be forwarded to the Treasurer, who will transmit it to the Commissioners of Audit.

66. The account books and forms of account for the service generally shall harmonize with and be considered subsidiary to the system of Treasury accounts; and with the view of securing this uniformity, the Accountant to the Treasury shall from time to time inspect the account books and forms of the various branches of the service and report to the Treasurer the result of such inspection.

67. All officers are required to acquaint themselves with these Regulations. Officers at the head of the various branches of each department are directed to send in requisitions for copies of these Regulations for the use of all officers under their control; and they are hereby required and enjoined to keep posted, for ready reference, a copy of these Regulations in all offices and rooms to which the officers commonly have access, or in which they perform their duties.

REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

REGULATIONS.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust for domestic purposes only, that is to say:—

For all lands and tenements within the Trust area, of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of more than Twenty pounds sterling annual valuation, an amount equal to One shilling in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

That the above-mentioned rate is made for one year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891, and ending on the 31st December, 1891, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1891. Such person as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, and receive, and collect, and recover the said rate.

BENALLA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Chairman and Commissioners of the Benalla Waterworks Trust make the following Regulations:—

MANAGEMENT AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

1. The ordinary meetings of the Trust shall be held every fourth Monday at Ten o'clock a.m., at the Municipal Chambers, Benalla.

2. The business of the Trust at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors.

3. The first business of all meetings of the Trust shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, after confirmation; such minutes shall be signed by the chairman.

4. At the ordinary meetings of the Trust, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz.:—

- (1) Reading and ordering on correspondence.
- (2) Reading and considering petitions.
- (3) Reading and ordering on reports.
- (4) Orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the chairman may bring before the meeting.
- (5) Motions of which notice shall have been given in writing.
- (6) Examination and passing of accounts.
- (7) General business.
- (8) Notices of motion.

5. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the commissioner who gave notice thereof, or some other commissioner duly authorized by him in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same. Notices of motion not so proceeded with shall be considered as having lapsed.

6. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for that occasion be a member of such committee.

7. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it has been seconded, and one amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost any other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

8. No person not being a commissioner shall be permitted to address the Trust without the consent of the majority of the Trust then present.

9. Every commissioner, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

10. The ruling of the chairman shall be final on all points of order or practice, and shall be given without comment or argument.

11. Any commissioner may require the secretary to take down the particular words used by a commissioner on the same being uttered.

12. No commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, except in reply or personal explanation.

13. Any commissioner who shall refuse to obey when called to order by the chairman, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, and shall refuse to withdraw such expression when required to do so by the chairman, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.

14. The voting in every case shall be by show of hands for and against the motion or amendment.

15. No motion the effect of which shall be to rescind a former resolution of the Trust shall be entertained, unless notice thereof in writing be given at a preceding meeting, and a call of the Trust made for the purpose.

No. 1.—JANUARY 2, 1891.—3.

16. It shall be competent for the majority of the Trust to suspend at any meeting one or more of the regulations for the management and conduct of business, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted.

17. The secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the Trust, and shall be empowered to affix the same to any corporate document requiring such affixture.

18. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until fourteen clear days' notice shall have been given by advertisement in some newspaper or newspapers approved of by the Trust, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

Interpretation clause.—The word "chairman" shall, in all cases, signify the permanent chairman of the Trust, or, in his absence, any commissioner appointed to preside at any meeting of the Trust; the term "Trust" shall, in all cases, signify a quorum of the Trust.

THE Commissioners of the Benalla Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1. For water supplied from the works of the Trust by measure, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes solely, twenty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. The said charges shall be payable half-yearly, on the 1st January and 1st July, or at such time or times as the Trust may deem fit.

4. Every person who shall have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter capable of registering at least 100,000 gallons to be approved of by the Trust, and maintain the same in good working condition to the satisfaction of the Trust; and in the event of any repairs thereto being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given by such person to the Trust. If any person who has provided any meter as aforesaid shall fail to give the notice hereinbefore mentioned of any repairs required for such meter, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

5. No person shall remove or alter the position of any meter when fixed without the written consent of the duly authorized officer of the Trust. If any person remove or alter the position of any meter without the written consent aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

6. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering footpaths or gardens, or stables or stalls, or trees or plants, or washing house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

7. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

8. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, or private or public service tap, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

9. If any person shall waste water of the Trust, by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

10. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every such breach.

11. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Any person guilty of a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling for every such breach.

12. The Commissioners of the Trust reserve the right of cutting off any supply of water other than that for domestic purposes.

13. Any person found bathing in or otherwise polluting the waters of the Broken River, between the junction of the Holland's branch with such river and the pumping station of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

14. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply such person with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

15. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with the said regulations and not otherwise.

16. The officers of the Trust may at all reasonable hours enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveyance, reception or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or examination, the Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

17. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Benalla Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Benalla Waterworks Trust this 17th day of November, 1890.

Regulation for the making of a rate on all rateable property within the waterworks district of the Benalla Waterworks Trust.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual value of all the rateable property in the Benalla Waterworks District, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Benalla, is hereby made for the year 1891.

2. Such rate is made payable on the 1st day of January, 1891.

3. The minimum rate payable in respect of any property liable to be rated shall be One pound sterling, as fixed by the Governor in Council.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1891.**

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1830*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz:—

REGULATION No. 10.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay, for the year 1891, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value, or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds, and not exceeding Fourteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Ten per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above Fourteen pounds, and not exceeding Nineteen pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Eight and three-quarters (8 $\frac{3}{4}$) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement of Twenty-six pounds, and not exceeding Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds five shillings.

6. For every house or tenement of Thirty-six pounds annual municipal value, and upwards, an amount equal to Six and a quarter (6 $\frac{1}{4}$) per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Twenty pounds annual municipal value, and under, One pound sterling.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Twenty pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Five per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value, or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

10. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value, and upwards, an amount equal to five per cent. on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

11. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 8,000 gallons.

12. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement. Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 24,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

13. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

14. For water supplied to market gardens; the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre.

15. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

16. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

17. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

18. For water supplied for private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1891, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

**REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE MILLEWA
IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST AND
ITS OFFICERS.**

REGULATION of the Millewa Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in pursuance of the *Water Act 1830*, Sec. 254, made by the said Trust this 17th day of October 1890.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.

2. *Minutes of meetings to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the chairman of the meeting; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting may be read at the close of such meeting.

3. *Order of business at meeting.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of the business at any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the convenience of the Trust at any meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading copies of letters sent by authority of Trust.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.

- (v.) Payments.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice-paper thereof.

4. *Divisions.*—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any commissioner, the commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. *Addresses to the Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

6. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the secretary of the Trust before the close of the meeting of the Trust; and the secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating any subject but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. *Motions to be moved in order in the motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary of the Trust in the notice of motion book, and, if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

9. *Motion to be preceded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be preceded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. *Order, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject, unless prevented by the application of one or more clauses of these regulations.

11. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

12. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

13. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

14. *Mover of motion.*—Any commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

15. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

16. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled priority.

17. *Chairman to arise in addressing the Trust.*—The chairman shall arise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

18. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on the same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misunderstood, in which case he must strictly confine himself to an explanation, and must not introduce or discuss any fresh matter or subject.

19. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to the order or explanation in each case shall be final.

20. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

21. *Commissioner to apologize for disorderly, &c.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

22. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

23. *Commissioners twice offending liable to a penalty.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw or apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

24. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

25. *Commissioners not attending order for a call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole of the commissioners of the Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of a majority thereof, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

26. *Commissioners may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents applying to the question under discussion.

27. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of these regulations.

28. *Questions how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative; then in the negative, and the results thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

29. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover and delivered to the chairman immediately on or just before being moved and seconded.

30. *No second amendment until previous one disposed of.*—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original motion or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment has been disposed of; and if amendment or amendments be negatived the motion shall be put, but if any amendment be carried it shall take the place of the original motion, and shall be so treated.

31. *Effect of rejection of words on original motion.*—If any words of an original motion be rejected, the insertion of the other proposed words shall cause the motion so amended to become the motion before the meeting, thereupon other amendments to insert words may follow.

32. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

33. *Mover of motion to have a right to reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

34. *Motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the meeting other than the statement or explanation of the mover as to his reason for moving the adjournment; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

35. *A motion for the adjournment shall take precedence.*—Motions for adjournment of meeting shall take precedence of other motions.

36. *The previous question.*—A question may be superseded, first by a motion for the adjournment of the meeting being carried, second by the previous question, namely "That the question be now put," being proposed and negatived.

37. *The previous question affirmed.*—If the previous question be resolved in the affirmative, the previous question, namely, "That the question be now put," shall be put without any amendment or debate.

38. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as of their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary of the Trust, when practical, shall attend all the meetings of the committees.

39. *Meetings of committees.*—The secretary of the Trust shall convene all meetings of committees within ten (10) days of the first appointment of any such committee, or at any other time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two (2) members of the committee.

40. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

41. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision thereof.

42. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name to the beginning thereof.

43. *Petitions to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on each skin or sheet upon which it is written.

44. *To be signed by petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names in their own proper handwriting, or their marks duly attested, and by no other person for them, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

45. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, or affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

46. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

47. *Appointments, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven (7) clear days' public notices shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the district, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

48. *No commissioner to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done by the Trust.

49. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same, unless otherwise expressly ordered by the Trust.

50. *Plans for work to be open for inspection.*—All plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Trust at least six (6) days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any person interested during that time.

51. *Corporate seal.*—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept by the secretary of the Trust. The corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document, unless the chairman of the Trust and one other member of the Trust, or in the absence of such chairman, unless two commissioners be present to attest the same.

52. *Suspension of regulations.*—Any one or more of these regulations may be suspended for a special purpose on motion, upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by an unanimous vote of the Trust.

53. *Penalties.*—If any person shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.
RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 33.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1891 on all rateable property in that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, of which notice has been given that the same has been supplied with water, under the provisions of the *Victorian Water Act*, and which notice was published in the *Government Gazette* of 12th March, 1886, wherein the portion of the district so described as supplied with water is as follows, that is to say—The whole of the area of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, except in the parishes of Hindmarsh, Jeop, Jeparit, Batyik, Tarranyrk, Willenabrina, Yellangip, Katyil, and Dimboola.

Whereas the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 8th day of December, 1890, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Wimmera United Waterworks District into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions, viz:—The Shire of St. Arnaud Division, the Shire of Kara Kara Division, the Shire of Dunmunkle Division, and the Shire of Stawell Division; and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such said several divisions, and that the proportion in which such several divisions shall be rated respectively one to another shall be as follows, that is to say, that the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said several divisions shall be—Shire of St. Arnaud Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Kara Kara Division, Nineteen pence; Shire of Dunmunkle Division, Twenty-four pence; Shire of Stawell Division, Fifteen pence.

And whereas the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, by proclamation dated 28th June 1886, proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Murtoa and Warracknabeal to be respectively Urban districts under the provisions of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883* (No. 778).

And whereas by further proclamation, dated the 20th December, 1887, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria proclaimed certain areas in and around the townships of Donald and Dimboola to be respectively Urban districts under the provisions of *The Water Conservation Act 1887* (No. 946).

And whereas the Governor in Council, by an Order dated the 13th day of December, 1886, diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom the territory described above as the Shire of Wimmera Division.

And whereas His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, by an Order dated the 26th day of August, 1889, further diminished the extent of the said Wimmera United Waterworks District by excising therefrom such portions of the said district as were within the Shire of Dimboola and to the westward of the Yarrambiack Creek, excepting the site of the Longernong Weir and the portion of the reserve within two chains thereof:—

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, excepting in the said Urban Districts of Murtoa, Warracknabeal, and Donald, according to the valuation for the time being on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of St. Arnaud, Kara Kara, Dunmunkle, and Stawell respectively, that is to say:—On rateable property within the Shire of St. Arnaud Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Kara Kara Division, a rate of Nineteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dunmunkle Division, a rate of Twenty-four pence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Stawell Division, a rate of Fifteen pence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1891, commencing on the 1st January, 1891, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1891, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1891.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 33, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 16th day of December, 1890.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be returned on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be endorsed to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1891, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Friday, 23rd January, 1891.

Note.—The fee for the period from 1st February, 1891, to 31st December, 1891, and fee of Five shillings for licence, must accompany each tender.

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Noon of Friday, 23rd January, 1891, for the occupation for Grazing purposes only of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 123 of the *Land Act 1890* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such special conditions and payments in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

Under section 7 of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*, all licensees under the section for which these licences will issue are liable for the destruction of rabbits within the boundaries of their licences.

Conditions:

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Act 1890*, except under the 123rd section thereof, under which the licence is issued, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1890*, or for mining purposes.

2. In case the said land, or any part or parts thereof, shall be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than the return of such portion of his licence-fee paid by him as the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering Division II. of the *Land Act 1890* may think fit. This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and, immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same, without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

4. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.

5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate, or to fence any portion thereof.

6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

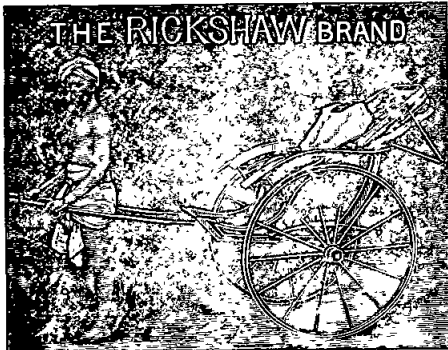
