*Strait Madoera. Non-existence of Sunken Rock southward of Sapodi Island.*

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 21 of 1890, notice is hereby given that the commander of H. M. ## COLZA OIL FOR USE IN LIGHT-HOUSES.

## PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE CITY OF HAWTHORN.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 358) it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Hawthorn has requested that the streets hereinafter mentioned, acquired by said Council for the purpose of making streets in the said city, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands acquired or used for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Hawthorn aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

The births of 1,430 children, viz., 730 boys and 700 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. In the month of November, 1,249 births were registered, or 181 less than in the month under review. The births were 473 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 160 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 763, viz., 430 of males and 333 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 667, or 87 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in November by 182, and exceeded the average of December during the previous ten years by 10. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 236.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.12, and of deaths registered 1.66.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88.9° on the 5th, and the lowest was 42.7° on the 17th. The mean temperature of the month (61.9°) was two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (34.3°) took place on the 5th, and the least (3.0°) on the 7th. The mean daily range was 18.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.231 inches on the 3rd, and the lowest was 29.340 inches on the 29th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.868 inches) differed from the average by a small fraction only.

Rain fell on 10 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.40 inches. The average rainfall in December during the previous ten years was 2.65 inches, or 1½ inches more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, as against 54 per cent. in December, 1889; 56 per cent. in December, 1888; 55 per cent. in December, 1887; 50 per cent. in December, 1886; 53 per cent. in December, 1885; 46 per cent. in December, 1884; 46 per cent. in December, 1883; 48 per cent. in December, 1882; 51 per cent. in December, 1881; and 42 per cent. in December, 1880.

Thirty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a female, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; an engineer and two labourers, each aged 75, of heart disease; a male of occupation unknown, aged 75, of nephritis; a female, aged 75, was drowned in the River Yarra; a female, aged 76, died of dysentery; a coffee-stall keeper, aged 76, of heart disease; a clerk, aged 76, of disease of the lungs; a gardener, aged 77, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 78, of cancer; a female, aged 81, of effusion on the brain; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 83, of dilatation of the heart; a labourer, aged 83, from the effects of a fracture of the left hip; a farmer, aged 84, of apoplexy; a female servant, aged 84, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 85, of diarrhoea; a tailor, aged 85, of rheumatism; a female, aged 85, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 85, of strangulated hernia; a widow, aged 86, of enteritis; a

female, aged 88, of disease of the brain; a female, a dairyman, and a labourer, each aged 77, a plasterer and a salesman, each aged 78, a gentleman, a carpenter, a labourer, and a female, each aged 79, a housewife, aged 80, a widow, aged 86, a butcher, aged 88, and two gentlemen, aged 92 and 96 respectively, of old age.

Forty violent deaths took place during the month, of which 34 were set down to accident, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jeweller, aged 28, was passed over by a railway train; two carters, aged 39 and 46 respectively, were killed by vehicles; a seaman, aged 24, a joiner, aged 28, and two labourers, aged 55 and 56 respectively, died of injuries consequent on falls; a publican, aged 55, died of the result of a compound fracture of the ankle; a labourer, aged 83, of a fracture of the left hip—how caused not stated; a labourer, aged 22, was killed by a fall of earth; a female, aged 30, by the fall of a fence; an engineer, aged 37, by an electric shock received whilst handling a switch improperly; a butcher, aged 35, died of traumatic tetanus, consequent on a cart passing over him; a boy, aged 12, of burns; a female child, aged 3, was poisoned with sulphuric acid; a bank clerk, aged 25, by taking an overdose of chlorodyne; a male of occupation unknown, aged 55, by strychnine; a housekeeper, aged 34, a financial agent, aged 35, a male of occupation unknown, aged 38, a shipwright, aged 46, a male of occupation unknown, aged 50, and two females, aged 60 and 75 respectively, were drowned in the River Yarra; a cashier, aged 14, and a clerk, aged 17, in the Saltwater River; a wood carter, aged 69, in the City Baths; a gardener, aged 35, in Hobson's Bay; a french polisher, aged 20, whilst bathing; a male and a female infant were overlain; a male child, aged 5 weeks, was suffocated in a manner not stated; and two male infants died of hæmorrhage of the umbilical cord. The suicidal deaths were those of a farmer, aged 71, who shot himself; a miner, aged 56, who poisoned himself; a female, aged 50, who drowned herself; a labourer, aged 31, an engineer, aged 39, and a baker, aged 58, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirty-seven deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne Hospital, 20 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 7 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 10 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 13 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 3 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Blind Asylum, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Infant Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 335, of which 182, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 153, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 270 were under one year of age, 40 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 428. Of these, 248, or 58 per cent., were males, and 180, or 42 per cent., were females; 25 were between five and ten, 10 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 38 were between twenty-five and thirty, 40 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 35 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 28 were between seventy and seventy-five, 20 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 18 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases were more than twice as numerous in December as in November, the numbers being 106 against 52. The chief increase was in diarrhoeal diseases, which caused 64 deaths against 19. Deaths from typhoid fever also increased from 4 to 13, but deaths from diphtheria fell from 18 to 15. In addition to the deaths from diphtheria, 3 deaths were set down to diphtheritic croup in December as against 5 such deaths in November, 2 in October, 3 in September, and 7 in August.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of 1890 and of the previous two years:—

SECTION V.—WORKING PAY.

1. *Definition.*—Working pay shall be the remuneration to working parties detailed, with the sanction of the Commandant, for the performance of work according to the regulations herein-after laid down.

2. *Work on active service.*—When on active service in the field, working pay shall only be issued to troops when employed on works of a special character.

3. The rate of working pay shall be—

For warrant officers ...	s. d.
For N.C. officers and men ...	3 0 a day.
	1 0 a day.

But when the party is employed for less than four hours only half rates shall be issued.

4. Working pay shall only be paid to parties employed on the following works:—

- (a) Making up ammunition at the Maribyrnong magazine.
- (b) Receiving, storing, packing, issuing, or cleaning stores at the ordnance stores.
- (c) White-washing buildings on requisition of commissariat officer in charge of barracks.
- (d) Original construction of ranges and butts, drill, or exercise ground.
- (e) *Special.*—Removing guns of 12 tons and upwards, their carriages and platforms, for a distance exceeding 300 yards, to or from an emplacement in any other manner than by water, or by horses along a line of road.

(f) Removing heavy warlike stores or guns of under 12 tons, for a distance exceeding one statute mile, in any other manner than by water, or by horses along a line of road.

(g) Removing guns or warlike stores by horses along a line of road, provided the distance going and returning, including the march from stables, is not less than ten miles.

(h) Scraping or painting shop, shell, carriages, platforms, or miscellaneous stores in ordnance stores.

(i) Examining guns in ordnance stores.

(j) Embarking or disembarking guns or warlike stores which are not in Artillery charge.

5. *Water or night-work.*—When working parties are employed in water or in works of emergency at night, they shall, for the time of such special employment, receive, at the discretion of the Commandant, an addition of one-half to the ordinary rates of working pay.

6. *Emptying stagnant wells, &c.*—Soldiers should not be employed emptying stagnant wells or cesspools if civil labour can be obtained, but if necessarily employed, they shall be paid at such rates, not exceeding twice the rate of working pay, as may be approved by the Commandant.

7. *Reckoning of hours, marches.*—The working hours shall be counted from the time the party parades at the place at which their attendance is required; but when the aggregate distance which a working party may have to march to and from the works exceeds three miles, working pay may, under the sanction of the Commandant, be issued for the time necessarily occupied in marching the distance in excess of three miles.

8. *Proportions.*—Non-commissioned officers may be employed in the proportion of one non-commissioned officer to every ten men or less to superintend working parties.

9. *Negligence; stoppages.*—If a non-commissioned officer or soldier misconducts himself, or is negligent or inefficient while employed with a working party, the Commandant may stop the whole or any portion of the man's pay for the days on which he misconducts himself, or is negligent or inefficient.

10. "Working pay" shall be issued to officers when employed in superintending working parties for which the issue of working is authorized.

11. The rate of "working pay" for officers shall be Five shillings a day, but when the party is employed for less than 4 hours, only half rate shall be issued, but he shall have no claim for "working pay" for more than one day in the event of the working party being employed beyond the working hours.

12. "Working pay" shall not be issued to any officer who does not remain with the working party throughout the working hours.

13. Except under special circumstances, to be approved by the Military Commandant, the number of officers employed to superintend a working party shall not exceed the proportion of one officer to 50 men.

PART III., SECTION IV.—MEDICAL STAFF.

After paragraph 6, insert—

6A. The duties of the Principal Medical Officer will be as follows:—

- (a) He will perform all the duties appertaining to the chief executive officer of the medical staff, as may be directed by the Commandant.
- (b) He will attend daily at Victoria Barracks, and have medical charge of all officers and men quartered there, and examine all recruits for the Victorian Artillery.
- (c) He will once every half-year inspect and report on all recruits who join the permanent or militia forces since his last inspection, and he will also inspect and report on all medical stores and appliances in charge of corps.
- (d) He will attend on the Imperial officers, and on such other officers as are permanently employed, provided that they reside within two miles of Victoria Barracks.
- (e) He will attend on the wives and families of such officers as live in barracks, children above fourteen years and cases of confinement excepted.
- (f) He will attend warrant and non-commissioned officers permanently employed, who are attached to headquarters or to metropolitan corps, provided that they reside at Victoria Barracks, at any of the metropolitan orderly rooms, or within a mile of such barracks or orderly rooms. He will also attend the wives and families of such warrant and non-commissioned officers, children above fourteen years and cases of confinement excepted.

Paragraph 7 is cancelled, and the following is substituted—

7. The medical officers of non-metropolitan corps will be required to give professional attendance to the warrant and non-commissioned officers permanently employed, together with their wives and families (children above fourteen years and cases of confinement excepted), who may be attached to the corps at the several stations.

PART III., SECTION IV.—MEDICAL STAFF.

In paragraph 9, after "Medical officers will receive pay as follows," insert the following:—

(a) Principal Medical Officer, for discharge of all duties, as laid down in paragraph 6A, a salary of £210 per annum.

The clauses of the same paragraph now distinguished as a, b, and c are altered to b, c, and d respectively.

And the Honorable Sir Frederick Thomas Sargood, K.C.M.G., Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make orders amongst other things to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on

the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Five hundred pounds a shire: And it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may make orders altering for the purpose of adjustment the boundaries of conterminous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: And it is further enacted that every order constituting any new municipality shall constitute the same as either a borough or a shire, and shall assign a name to such borough or shire, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist, determine whether the municipal district constituted is to be subdivided or not, and in case it is to be subdivided name and describe the subdivisions; and that every order under the provisions of Part II. of the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of St. Arnaud, praying that a certain area described in such petition, and comprising the west riding, be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Borung: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act. That of the total sum of Twenty-four thousand pounds sterling (£24,000) advanced to the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust by way of loans, the said Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust shall be liable for the sum of Seven thousand six hundred and twelve pounds two shillings and sixpence sterling (£7,612 2s. 6d.), which said sum shall be transferred from the liabilities of the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, and shall form part of the liabilities of the said Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, together with interest on the said amount from the 1st January, 1891, at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust.

And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the 11th June, 1885, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were in and by the said Order in Council defined and limited.

And whereas it is expedient to diminish the extent of the said Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that the Waterworks District of the said Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust shall be decreased by the excision therefrom of the lands comprised within the following boundaries:—

The town of Yarrowonga, county of Moira, parish of Yarrowonga: Commencing at a point on the left bank of Murray River in a line with the east side of Wood's road; bounded thence by a line, allotment 17, a line, allotments 26s and 26A, and a line bearing south to the north-east angle of allotment 54; thence by the last-mentioned allotment, allotment 53, and a line bearing west eighty-one chains; thence by allotment 28, a line, allotment 15, and a line bearing north to Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement.

#### SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING REGULATION.

REGULATION No. 2.

A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by the *Water Act 1890* the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1891, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1891, provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any such lands or tenements.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of Ninepence each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of February, 1891, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1891.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

1. All charges must be made when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect or place a monument, to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.



3. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees during the day previous to that on which it is intended to take place.

4. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug if requested, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults, or the friends of indigent or other persons who wish to dig the graves themselves, are required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.

5. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased must be stated at the time of giving the order.

7. No grave will be allowed to be re-opened for a further interment at a shorter interval than twelve years unless the grave has been originally sunk to a depth sufficient to admit of such interment.

8. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones will be kept in proper condition and repair by the trustees at the expense of the owners.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, must be submitted to the trustees for approval as required by the 18th section of the Act. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The cemetery will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. No dogs, horses, or cattle will be allowed in the cemetery, nor will smoking nor the lighting of fires be allowed therein, without the permission of the trustees.

15. The owners of any and all cattle or other animals which may be discovered or known to have been trespassing on or damaging the cemetery, or fences, or any part thereof, or any erection whatsoever within the fence, will be prosecuted according to law.

16. A plan of the cemetery, showing the position of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

2. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within such time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the Military Commandant or the officer whom he may appoint, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies, that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the deposit money.

#### SHIRE OF MALVERN.

By-Law No. 30.

A By-law of the Shire of Malvern, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 30, for regulating the proceedings of the Council and its officers, and for adoption for that purpose of some of the provisions of Part XI. of the 13th Schedule to the said *Local Government Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed, as required by the *Local Government Act 1890*.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follow, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (1.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (2.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (3.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (4.) Payments.
- (5.) Ordinary business.
- (6.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (7.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (8.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (9.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or, if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice-of-motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last-preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice-of-motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice-of-motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment or taking part in discussion thereon shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may however require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

16. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

17. The councillors in meeting of council shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, president, chairman, or councillor, as the case may require.

18. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

19. The chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

20. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

21. The chairman when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.



22. No councillor shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other councillor in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on councillors shall be deemed highly disorderly.

23. Whenever any councillor shall make use of any expression disorderly or capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor the councillor so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression and to make a satisfactory apology to the council.

24. A councillor called to order shall sit down unless permitted to explain.

25. Any councillor using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and to apologize for such conduct and refusing so to do, shall be guilty of an offence.

26. Any person not being a councillor who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the council, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

27. Any councillor not attending in compliance with an order for a call of the whole council without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof shall be guilty of an offence.

28. Any councillor may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the council applying to the question under discussion.

29. The council shall vote by show of hands, and any councillor present and not voting, not being disabled by law from so doing, shall be guilty of an offence.

30. The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the council, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative; and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

32. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

33. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

34. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

35. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

36. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

37. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

38. Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports numbered in consecutive order shall be entered in the committees' minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk when practicable shall attend all meetings of committees.

39. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or of any two members of the committee.

40. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

41. It shall be incumbent on every councillor presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

42. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

43. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

44. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

45. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

46. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

No. 10.—JANUARY 30, 1891.—4.

47. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

48. No councillor or officer of the council and no assessor or auditor of the municipality shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

49. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

50. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice if duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

51. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misdemeanour or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

##### BY-LAW No. 3.

**A** BY-LAW of the Shire of Yea, made under the 213th Section of the *Local Government Act 1874*, adopted on the 4th day of September, 1890, and confirmed on the 18th day of November, 1890, and numbered Three, for the purpose of adopting the whole of the provisions of the eleventh part of the said section.

#### PART XI.—REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS OF COUNCIL, OFFICERS, ETC.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.

2. At every meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the council at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting.

3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the council.
- (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii.) Payments.
- (iv.) Reception and reading of petitions.
- (v.) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (vi.) Ordinary business.
- (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. Whenever a division shall be demanded by any councillor, the councillors voting on the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and then those voting in the negative shall hold up their hands, and the result be declared by the chairman.

5. All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and the clerk of the municipality, unless otherwise ordered by the council.

6. All notices of motion shall be dated and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the municipal clerk at the close of the meeting of council, or if not required by law to be given at a meeting, then three clear days prior to the next meeting of council; and such clerk shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

7. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

8. No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application, until the next ordinary meeting of council after that at which it has been presented.

9. Except by leave of the council, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the municipal clerk in the notice of motion book; and if not so moved or postponed, shall be struck out.

10. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice of the same, unless by some other councillor producing written authority from him to that effect.

11. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

12. Any councillor desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

13. Any councillor desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the council thereon.

14. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the council.

15. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the council unless it be seconded, but a councillor may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the council by directing the mayor's or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

33. If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the council for discussion at a time.

35. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made.

37. Any councillor may protest against any resolution of the council, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the municipal clerk, and signed by such councillor, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting, at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the council to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the councillors present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted, on motion upon notice.

39. If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

40. Minutes of all proceedings of committees as well as of their reports numbered in consecutive order shall be entered in the committees' minute book, and being signed by the chairman of the committee shall be presented to the council; and the municipal clerk when practicable shall attend all meetings of committees.

41. The municipal clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time thereafter by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee or any two members of the committee.

42. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

44. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

45. Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every skin or sheet on which it is written.

46. Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

47. No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

48. Every councillor presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the borough, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

50. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the municipality, shall be received as a surety for any officer appointed by the council or for any work to be done for the council.

52. In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

53. All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.

54. It shall be lawful for the treasurer of the municipality from time to time, on the written order of the municipal clerk, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the council for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in any interval between two ordinary meetings of the council the sum of five pounds.

55. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks each councillor shall have a key, and of the other of which locks the key shall be kept by the municipal clerk; and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the chairman of the municipality and one other member of the council, or in the absence of such chairman, unless two councillors be present.

56. Any one or more of the rules or regulations contained in this subdivision may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the council.

57. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission, contrary to any provision contained in this subdivision, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds.

## SHIRE OF MALVERN.

## BY-LAW No. 31.

A By-law of the Shire of Malvern made under Part IV. of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 31, for the proper Management and Control of Public Gardens.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Malvern order as follows:—

## Public Gardens.

1. The gardens under the management or control of the council, and ground appertaining thereto herein called the gardens, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.
2. No person shall pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb upon or get over the fences, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.
3. No person shall carry fire-arms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wild-fowl, either in the gardens, or in or on any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as may be fixed by any regulation of the council to be made on that behalf in such water.
4. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the council, be driven through the gardens.
5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.
6. No person shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.
7. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.
8. All dogs and goats, and all poultry found within the gardens, shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation to be recovered before any justice for any damage done.
9. In addition to the provisions herein contained, it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as may seem to them fit.
10. Any person offending against this By-law, or any such regulation, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## BOROUGH OF CRESWICK.

## BY-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the Borough of Creswick, made under the provisions of sections 191 and 512 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 34, for regulating fishing in Park lake, Dean reservoir, Bragg's dam, Russell's dam, and White Hills reservoir.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Creswick order as follows:—

1. Licences in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto, giving the persons named therein permission to fish in Park lake, Dean reservoir, Bragg's dam, Russell's dam, and White Hills reservoir, may be given by the town clerk, on payment of a fee of Five shillings, such licence not to be transferable, and to expire with the season, viz., on the thirtieth day of April succeeding the date of issue.
2. Every person fishing shall, when called upon to do so by any assistant inspector of fisheries or any officer of the council, produce his licence, and failing to do so will be treated as a trespasser.
3. No person shall use any net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary, or partly stationary, in any way or manner, for the purpose of taking fish.
4. Should any person be found attempting to catch or catching fish by means of any such implement, device, or contrivance, contrary to the preceding clause, he may be prosecuted for such offence by any assistant inspector of fisheries, or by the caretaker of the Botanical reserve and Dean reservoir, or any officer of the council.
5. No person shall angle or take from said lake, dams, or reservoirs any species of fish for which a close season is prescribed by the Governor in Council under the provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1890* during the currency of such close season, or during the months of May, June, July, August, or September.
6. No person shall use ground bait of any kind for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot, or for any other purpose whatsoever.
7. No person shall remove, or take away, or procure to be removed and taken away, from the said lake, dams, or reservoirs any ova or spawn without the consent of the council being first obtained.
8. The hours during which fishing shall be permitted in said lake, dams, and reservoirs shall be from one hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset.
9. In the event of any breach of any of the clauses of this by-law by any person holding a licence, his licence shall be cancelled, and he shall be liable at the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
