TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES TO OFFICERS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

THE following copy of an Order in Council, regulating the Payment of Travelling Allowances to Officers in the Public Service, is published for general information.

REGULATIONS FOR TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES OF OFFICERS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

WHERAS by section 123 of the Public Service Act 1830 (No. 1133) the Public Service Board is empowered to make regulations concerning the duties to be performed by officers in the Public Service; and whereas the said Board, by general regulation under the said section, did prescribe by clause 38 that officers absent on duty will receive such allowances, exclusive of the cost of travelling, as may be from time to time fixed by the Governor in Council. It is therefore submitted for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following shall be the allowances for all Departments, except as hereinafter specially provided, and that all previous regulations under this head be hereby cancelled.

All personal allowances fixed in these regulations are exclusive of the cost of travelling by the most economical means of conveyance.

The Relieving Police Magistrate, or any other Police Magistrate who is required to perform duty temporarily outside his own district, shall in addition to the foregoing be paid an allowance of Ten shillings for each full day during which such Relieving or other Police Magistrate is doing relieving duty on richarge of, or in travelling to and from the district or districts other than his own.

Such daily allowance shall not be paid for any day for which leave of absence may be granted, or for any other day which the Minister may think proper to except, nor to the Relieving Police Magistrate for rolleving duty performed in a Melbourne or suburban district.

Claims under this clause for travelling on licensing duty to an adjourned court, or other meeting of the members of the court, held at a place not being the place at which such court usually assembles, must be supported by a report from the chairman, informing the Minister of the special circumstances rendering such adjournment or meeting necessary.

10. In a mountainous district, where horses cannot be easily hired, the Minister may, if he thinks fit, authorize a commuted allowance for the keep of one or two horses.

If the Police Magistrate of such district is absent from duty either on leave or through illness, for any period over a fortnight, such portion only of such commuted allowance shall be paid as the Minister may direct.

11. When the distance travelled or the state of the roads necessitates the use of two horses, a special report of the same must accompany the account.

12. These regulations shall not apply to a Police Magistrate travelling on duty (with the consent of the Minister) for any other Department, when the expenses are paid by such other Department.

13. All questions as to the interpretation and intention of the foregoing regulations for allowances of Police Magistrates shall be decided by the Minister of Justice.

Officers of Crown Solicitor's Branch

14. Officers in the Crown Solicitor's branch of the Attorney-General's Department, when travelling on circuit duty in connexion with the Supreme Court, will receive allowances according to the following scale:—

2nd and 3rd class officers, One pound per diem.
4th and 5th class officers, Fifteen shillings per diem.

Clerks of Courts (Relieving).

15. Not more than two Inspecting and Relieving Clerks of Courts of the third class shall be paid an allowance of Ten shillings per diem when on duty outside Melbourne and suburbs.

16. In any case where an officer receiving an allowance whilst absent from his station has to visit an out-station, he shall be entitled to draw an additional allowance, as fixed by these regulations, for such visit.

III. SPECIAL ALLOWANCES.

- 21. The rates set forth in these regulations shall not apply to officers who are paid travelling allowances by an annual sum or commuted allowance.
- commuted allowance.

 22. The permanent head of any Department may submit for the consideration of the Public Service Board a recommendation for an increase or decrease of the allowances fixed herein to any officer of his Department who may be engaged in the discharge of special duties, and if such recommendation be approved by the Board, payment of the increased rate or amount may be authorized by an Order in Council.
- 23. The actual expense incurred by officers of the First Division or by officers on specially important duties in the hire of a private apartment, to be also allowed, in such cases as the Minister, on the recommendation of the permanent head, shall determine.

IV. TRANSFERS AND EXCHANGES.

- 24. Travelling expenses of officers, their wives and children, and the reasonable cost of removing furniture, will be allowed on such officers being transferred, without promotion or increase of pay, but not by way of punishment, from one station to another by the Department.
- 25. Except as hereinafter provided, when an officer obtains promotion by such transfer travelling expenses shall not be
- 26. In any case where an officer is transferred with promotion 20. If any case where an other is transferred with promotion, and the increment of salary for the first year is less than the cost of removal to his new station, he may be granted such reasonable sum for expenses as the Public Service Board, on the recommendation of the permanent head, may approve.
- 27. Travelling expenses in connexion with any exchanges of officers at their own request, and not incurred through departmental exigencies, to be borne by the officers themselves.

V. COACH FARES, HORSE HIRE, ETC., REFUND OF.

28. Claims of all officers for refund of money paid for coach fares (unless there be a published and regular rate of such fares), for horse or buggy hire, for livery of horses, or for purchase of forage for the night must in every case where practicable be supported by vouchers.

VI. REDUCTION OF RATES.

29. The rates set forth in these regulations are fixed for a whole day of 24 hours, but when the service required does not occupy a whole day in its performance, the permanent head may direct payment of such smaller allowance as he shall consider

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE "TRADE MARKS ACT 1890."

THE following Instructions are published for the information and guidance of Officers of Customs:—

INSTRUCTIONS TO OFFICERS.

1. It will be observed that the above Regulations do two

1. It will be observed that one above the strings:

(1) They direct that goods prohibited by the Act which are detected by the officers upon examination (that is to say upon ordinary examination for revenue purposes), are to be detained without previous information.

(2) They provide what is to be done in cases where prohibited importation, and the ground of such prohibition, are matters not of detection in the ordinary way, but of information by an informatic.

2. Collectors will require guidance as to what goods, in the opinion of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, the officers ought to detect, as mentioned in sub-paragraph (1); and as to the action to be taken by officers after information, as mentioned in sub-paragraph (2).

sub-paragraph (2).

3. The Act extends so largely the area of prohibited goods for the benefit not only of Victorian subjects, but also of the subjects and citizens of foreign states, that as to a considerable proportion of goods liable to prohibition on importation, the officers cannot be expected to act without some guidance by information. It must not be, however, held or worked so as in any way to diminish the care at present taken by the officers in respect to "Victorian marks" involving names of Victorian places or indications of Victorian manufacture, and to this extent at least the officers must continue to act without previous information.

4. Collectors will because that names or trade musts of Vic

4. Collectors will observe that names or trade marks of Vic-4. Collectors will observe that names or trade marks of Victorian manufacturers, dealers, or traders on imported foreign goods (section 17, sentence beginning "All goods manufactured at any place outside Victoria") are to be only admissible if distinctly qualified, not merely as heretofore by words showing manufacture abroad, but by a definite indication of the country in which the goods were made or produced; and this same principle is contained even more emphatically in section 19 of the Act as regards lawful and general "trade descriptions" which include the name of a place or country.

5. The goods, therefore, which it is distinctly expected the officers themselves shall detect upon ordinary examination, and without previous information, will be as follows, viz.:—

Class (a).—Goods of foreign manufacture, by whomsoever imported, having applied to them either a name or trade mark which is or purports to be the name or trade mark which is or purports to be the name or trade of a manufacturer, dealer, or trader in Victoria; or a trade description which indicates particular class or method of manufacture, and includes the name of a place in or a part of Victoria, and is thereby calculated to mislead as to the place of the manufacture or production of goods which have not been manufacture or production of goods which have not been manufactured or produced in Victoria; unless such name, mark, or description is accompanied by a definite indication of the place or country in which the goods were made or produced, that is to say, an addition immediately before or after the said name, mark, or description, in an equally conspicuous manner therewith, of the name of the place or country in which the goods were actually made or produced with, in the case of a trade description including name of place, a statement that they were made or produced there.

Class (b).—Goods of foreign manufacture, by whomsoever im-

produced there.

Class (b).—Goods of foreign manufacture, by whomsoever imported, having applied to them any description, figures, words, or maks, or arrangement or combination thereof, so as to constitute by being or including either expressly or by reference the name of a place in or a part of Victoria, or in any other way a statement or other indication direct or indirect that the goods were made or produced in Victoria.

6. On the above classification collectors will note this paragraph

6. On the above classification collectors will note this paragraph and the paragraphs to 9 inclusive.

It will obviously not be in the power of the officers, nor are they expected to decide whether goods falling within class (a) were actually made or produced in the country from which they come; but, in practice, it will be sufficient if the officers satisfy themselves that the name of some foreign country or of some place of a foreign country is applied to the goods in a manner equally indelible or irremovable, and equally conspicuous with the name or trade mark itself, and in close proximity to it.

or trade mark itself, and in close proximity to it.

7. The word "purports," also in (a), is to be understood as referring to any name or names reasonably suggesting a Victorian manufacturer, dealer, or trader, without regard to the fact of whether the name is or is not known to the officer; or, as referring to a trade mark not being merely matter of decoration or ornament, which reasonably suggests itself as Victorian by containing some wording or national devices or figures distinctly indicating Victorian manufacture.

8. The words "a trade description which indicates a particular class or method of manufacture, and includes the name of a place in or a part of Victoria, and is thereby calculated to mislead" mean such terms as "Geelong tweeds" and the like, which, although they might be held to be merely phrases descriptive of method of manufacture, are yet calculated to mislead as to place of origin.

9. Class (b) refers to and includes such inscriptions as "present from such and such a place" and the like; or, even without a name, any phrases, words, languages, or devices which state or indicate, directly or indirectly, make or production in Victoria; and the words "by reference" mean that "Victorian," for instance, is equivalent to "of Victoria." Any goods bearing such marks will be detained, and collectors will refer the matter to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

10. Passing from the goods thus specially mentioned, those generally prohibited by the Act to be imported may be summarized as follows:—

rized as follows:—

Head (1).—Goods whether of manufacture outside the colony or Victorian goods brought back, having a false trade description as to name or initials or a forged trade mark applied to them.

Head (2).—Like goods having applied to them a false trade description as to the place or country in which they were made or produced; or as to number, quantity, measure, gauge, or weight, mode of manufacture or production, or material of which composed; or as to the goods being the subject of any existing patent, privilege, or copyright.

groups being the surject of any existing pixelity pixelity pixelity.

A false trade description is a description or indication, whether original or by addition, effacement, or otherwise, and whether by figures, words, or marks, or any arrangement or combination thereof, directly or indirectly false in a material respect.

thereof, directly or indirectly false in a material respect.

11. With regard to head (1).—This is the protection of a manufacturer, dealer, or trader against the fraudulent or unfair use of his name or trade mark by any other person. It would not be possible for officers to enter into the examination of all names and marks in respect to their use as between various importers. At the same time a manufacturer, dealer, or trader who has reason to believe that his name or trade mark is one not unlikely to be imitated so as to constitute a false trade description or forged trade mark, is entitled to ask that, without the requirement of special information, such description or mark may, upon any importation, be stopped.

12. For this purpose, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs sanctions the system of registration of names or marks in a way similar to that which has hitherto existed; and a manufacturer, similar to that which has hitherto existed; and a manufacturer, dealer, or trader may register his name or mark at such port or ports as he desires. In respect of names or marks so registered it will be the duty of the officers, at the particular port or ports, to prevent the delivery of goods to which such names or marks are applied, unless the delivery is authorized by the registered proprietor. Apart from names or marks as to which such registration exists, the officers are not expected to exam us goods with reference to head (1).

with reference to head (1).

13. Any manufacturer, dealer, or trader, whether Victorian or foreign, may register his name or mark; but collectors may refuse registration to any name or mark which they consider to be of a character too indefinite or indistinct for officers to recognise, referring to the Secretary for Trade and Customs in any case of doubt. An applicant for registration must prove his proprietorship of the name or mark by declaration; and if, in order to avoid delay, he desires to do so, he may appoint an agent to give authority for delivery of his goods, and prove (also by declaration) the appointment of such agent.

14. Collectors must understand very distinctly that the use by

declaration) the appointment of such agent.

14. Collectors must understand very distinctly that the use by the Victorian manufacturer, dealer, or trader of even his own name on foreign goods, and the use by any manufacturer, dealer, or trader on like goods, of words, figures, or marks of any kind stating or indicating, directly or indirectly, make or production in Victoria, are prohibited, unless the qualifying conditions specified in paragraph 5 are compiled with. Collectors must therefore clearly explain to every person registering a name or mark which involves any such statement or indication, as will probably often be the case, that, while the name or mark will be guarded by such registration, it will not be rendered admissible unless duly qualified as the law may require in every case. The register at the port under the law now expiring will cease to be operative with the expiry of that law.

15. As regards head (2).—If (apart from the goods specially

operative with the expiry of that law.

15. As regards head (2).—If (apart from the goods specially mentioned in paragraph 5, and notwithstanding that classification) the officers should in any case upon the ordinary examination for rovenue purposes, detect anything constituting an infringement of any of the prohibitions of the Act as thus set forth, collectors will detain such goods, and refer the matter to the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

16. Such detection by officers may happen, for instance, as to number, quantity, measure, gauge, or weight; while, on the other hand, as to mode or material of manufacture as to any patent, privilege, or copyright, or foreign trade marks, the officers, upon ordinary examination, may probably, in the absence of special knowledge, fail in detecting false descriptions or forged trade marks.

17. Falso descriptions as to place of origin affecting the interests of "British Possessions" or "Foreign States" are matters which, unaided by information, officers will not generally be expected to trace; but wherever they observe goods conspicuously known as the usual product of a particular place or country, and marked with that name, shipped from a port in another country altogether, as for instance, wine marked "Xeres" or "Spanish," from Belgium, or cigars marked "Havana," from Germany, such goods may, in the absence of proof of make or produce at the place or in the country named on them, be properly detained.

18. Some directions (hevond what is shown in the Reculations)

18. Some directions (beyond what is shown in the Regulations) are desirable as to the collectors' action upon "information," and they will observe that there are two stages of procedure in this, viz., one up to and including the arrival and examination or identification of the goods, and the other after the examination or identification

or identification.

19. With regard to the first stage—the two points for consideration are whether any, and, if so, what special examination of the goods should be made, and what deposit should be taken to cover the expense of such examination if it is made.

20. The character and extent of examination will require careful discretion on the part of the collectors, and will depend on the manner in which the goods are alleged in the notice to infringe the Act. An indication has been given above as to what

the Commissioner of Trade and Customs considers that officers can detect and what they cannot upon ordinary examination, and this will furnish a guide as to what they may be able to trace upon fuller examination after information.

21. Wherever, in accordance with such indication, collectors are of opinion that the officers could not, even on fuller examination, discover whether the goods infringe the Act, they need not order a special examination, and consequently will not require any deposit in respect of such examination, but may at once order detention of the goods as if the officer had seen cause to detain them, and proceed to require security in conformity with directions given in paragraph 28 of this Order.

22. Wherever, on the other hand, collectors are of opinion that 22. Wherever, on the other hand, collectors are of opinion that a fuller examination than that ordinarily directed for revenue purposes may reasonably enable the officers to discover whether or not there is the infringement alleged, as, for instance, by careful weighing, measuring, counting, or gauging, they will direct that such an examination shall take place, examining as to free goods, for this purpose, not less than twice the usual number of packages, and in the case of goods imported in bulk, such as machinery and the like, treating each piece imported as a package.

such as macninery and the state of the same as package.

23. Assuming examination to be ordered by collectors in accordance with the lines above indicated, they will take, as a deposit to cover the additional expense of this examination, such sum as they may think necessary, having regard to the nature of the goods and to the number of packages which, according to the informant's knowledge, will have been stated in the notice.

the informant's knowledge, will have been stated in the notice.

24. The case of false description as to place of origin affecting the interests of "British Possessions" or "Foreign States" is here again one for special mention. As above stated it is one which, as a rule, officers cannot be expected to detect without information; but, for an officer examining upo information, the following rules may be laid down, viz.:—If it is ascertained that the name of place or country complained of is not applied to the goods at all, or, if applied, is accompanied by a definite indication or addition, as contemplated by the Act, of make or production elsewhere, the officer may be satisfied that there is no ground-existing to justify the notice received; but if the name complained of is found to be applied to the goods, and is the name of a country, or of a place in a country not the country of the port of shipment, the officer may, in the absence of proof of make or produce at the place or in the country named on them, be satisfied that the alleged infringement clearly exists.

25. In the case of a notice alleging the application of a forged

be satisfied that the alleged infringement death exacts.

25. In the case of a notice alleging the application of a forged trade mark where the mark is one protected in a British possession or foreign state, such a notice will only be good, and need only be accepted if it relates to possessions or states included in the definition of trade marks.

26. As to transhipment and transit goods, where information and "notice" relate to these goods, collectors will deal with them exactly as if they were goods for home use. Apart from information collectors will not, as regards the ordinary examination of tion collectors will not, as regards the ordinary examination at such goods for revenue purposes, examine more packages than at present; but the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, in addition to the existing rules as to transhipment and transit goods, directs that, as to all such goods, no marks of any kind or description shall be allowed to be applied to them in this colony, and collectors will see that this is strictly carried out in their

and collectors will see that this is strictly carried out in their port.

27. As to goods examined upon information generally, collectors will be guided by the following rules:—If, upon examination, the officer is satisfied that there is no ground existing to justify the notice received, he will pass the goods; if he is satisfied that the alleged infringoment clearly exists, he will detain the goods as in a case of detention upon ordinary examination; but in cases where the officer is not so satisfied, and in cases where collectors may have considered that official examination cannot test the point, they will order the detention of the goods at the risk of the informant and thus arrive at the second stage of the procedure upon information, viz., the taking of security.

28. Collectors will observe that (except in cases where the informant prefers to give a bond, and where time allows such a step to be taken before the goods arrive and are examined), there are two things to be done in taking security—first, to take an advalorem money deposit to cover the possibility of the bond not being completed, and secondly, to see that the bond is completed, after which they will return the deposit. The amount of both the deposit and the bond will depend on the value of the goods.

29. The form of notice given in the schedule to the regula-

29. The form of notice given in the schedule to the regulations requires a statement of the names of persons proposed as sureties. As to the sufficiency of these, collectors will make inquiries in the usual way, and have the bond completed as in other transactions.
30. The security having once been taken, the goods will,

without further special examination, remain in charge, and the regulations contain definite provisions as to when, in the various contingencies that may arise, the security may be delivered up.

contingencies that may arise, the security may be delivered up.

31. With reference to paragraph 5 (b) and to paragraph 9 above, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs is of opinion that inscriptions applied to goods by means of labels or tickets, or applied to boxes, cartoons, parcels, or other ultimate packages containing goods manifestly only for the purpose of distinguishing the goods for the convenience of dealers and shopkeepers, and not specially intended to attract the eye of the consumers, should not be practically treated as trade descriptions. Whenever the inscription consists simply of the bare name of the goods or indication of number, quantity, size, and the like, for instance—On Heisery—"Hose white cotton, size 10."

indication of number, quantity, size, and the like, for instance—On Hosiery—"Hose, white cotton, size 10," on Textile Fabrics—"No., qual., colour, desc., yards," or "No., size, quality, shade."
On Goloshes—"I doz. pairs men's, 2nd quality, No. 7," goods bearing labels, tickets, &c., of this character only are not to be detained whatever may be the language in which the inscriptions are printed or written. It is to be understood that this order does not apply to wording on the goods themselves,

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32. With reference to paragraph (b), section 15, the Trade Marks Act 1890, a name of a port or place of destination applied to mere packing cases, in which goods are clearly not intended to be sold or exposed for sale, either wholesale or retail, will not render the goods liable to detention; but where a package containing goods is not of this description, the port or place of destination should be accompanied by a definite indication of the country of origin.

33. Swedish iron bearing the words "Lancashire Swedish," or the abbreviation thereof, "Lancash. Swedish," is to be admitted into this colony without question, so far as the provisions of the Trade Marks Act 1890 are concerned. This arrangement is sanctioned upon the understanding that both words shall be inserted, and that under no circumstances will Swedish iron, marked "Lancashire" alone, be admitted into this colony.

34. The name and address of a merchant in this colony on grain sacks will be dealt with as an indication that the grain is of Victorian origin. The Commissioner has directed that, in the case of grain imported in bulk and transferred into sacks on board the importing ship, the marking of the sacks need not be qualified with a statement of the foreign origin of the grain.

35. Fackages used for the importation from any place of natural flowers, fresh fruit, vegetables, potatoes, &c., and bearing upon them marks which the officers are satisfied are merely address marks, such as "William Evans, Melbourne," Thomas Jones, Geelong," are to be treated as packing cases to which the provisions of paragraph 32 apply, and are not to be detained under the Act on account of such marks only.

36. As to refined sugar from the continent of Europe, which there is reason to believe has been allowed to be delivered, although marked in the English language without any qualifying words, contrary to the Trade Marks Act 1859, the Commissioner of Trade and Customs directs that any such sugar found described in a manner not comformable to the law be detained, and the circumstances reported to him for his direction.

Directions of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs to enable officers to deal with watch cases and watches, under the Merchandise Marks Act, the latter term, "watches," meaning, as provided by section 8 of the Act, "all that portion of a watch which is not the watch case."

37. Attention has already been called to the position in which watch cases, under this section of the Trade Marks Act 1899, stand in relation to watches; and the consequent importance of the assay mark on watch cases, which mark, by virtue of section 3 (1) of the Act, would be deemed a trade description as to place or country

 (a) Watch cases with assay marks imported alone.—If the cases are wholly unmarked, or are duly marked in accordance with the Queen's Orders in Council, or with a foreign assay mark, and there is not, in addition, any wording on that part of the case proper, or on the dome, indicating make or produce elsewhere than in the actual country of production, the goods may be delivered. If, on the other hand, there is any such wording, the goods must be detained and the matter referred to the Secretary for Trade and Customs.

 - 16. Clause 10 of By-law 62 is hereby repealed.
 - 17. Paper Boxes, folded, packed in cases, 2nd Class Rates.
 - 18. Aerated Flour, in five ton lots, Special B Rates. Owner's risk.

2. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a

rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables the charge shall be Ten shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1891.

- 2. This by-law shall come into force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in every part of the Borough of Stawell.

Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairyman, and Purveyors of Milk.

Acquisitation of Lowecepers, Dairyman, and Purveyors of Milk.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of January in every year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the town clerk an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of One pound (£1.)

All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized in writing by the chairman or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing signed by the secretary and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally, or left at his dwelling place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall ke kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

 8. All wards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding

All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime washed, as may be in any such order so directed.
- 9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council; and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of health, no longer exists. And in any such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

 12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.
- 13. In the interpretation of this by-law words imputing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.
- 14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a ponalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
