REGULATION.

WHEREAS by the *Public Service Act 1890*, section 68, it is enacted that the Classifiers may from time to time make and repeal, alter, and amend Regulations, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council, for the following among other purposes:—

(1) For determining the conditions to be fulfilled by candidates for the position of Pupil Teacher.
And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and amend the conditions to be fulfilled by candidates for the position of Pupil Teacher:

Now therefore we, the undersigned, being the Members constituting the Committee of Classifiers, in pursuance of the said powers, do hereby rescind Regulation 1, Pupil Teachers, and, in lieu thereof, make and declare the Regulation following, which shall have full force and effect as soon as approved by the Governor in Council:—

Pupil-teachers.

(1) Candidates for appointment as Pupil Teachers must be not less than fourteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed fully in such of the subjects prescribed for the Fourth Class or some higher class in the course of Free Instruction Regulation 1 as are examined in individually; or (2) must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne.

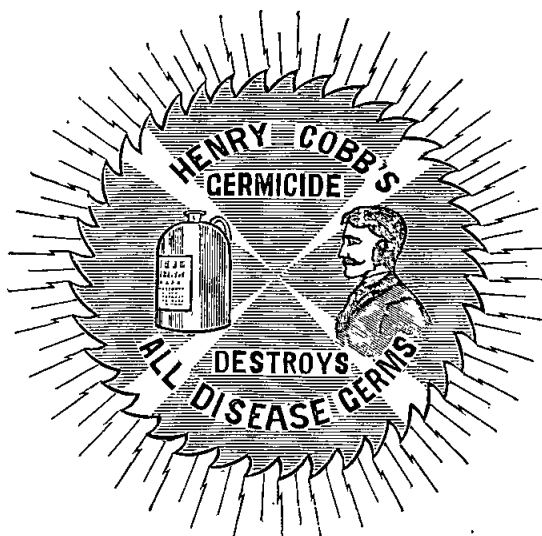

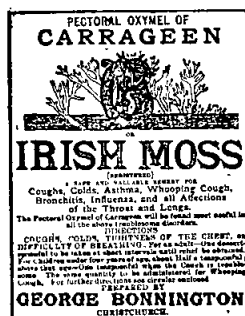

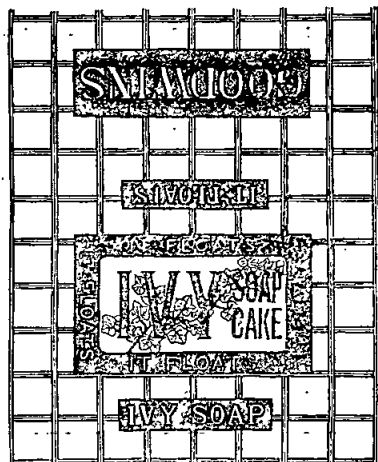

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 88.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Railways Act 1890*, do hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed:—

FARES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

1. The price of Quarterly Building Tickets, Melbourne to Macedon, to be £6 6s.
2. Commercial Travellers holding Annual Tickets between Melbourne and Ballarat to be charged £3 per cwt. per annum for excess samples.
3. Stereotype Plates for newspapers to be charged same rates as newspapers.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS:—

4. Out of the through rates for carriage of Fruit between Melbourne and Adelaide the proportion due to the Victorian Railways shall be as follows:—Ten cwt. lots, £1 2s. 6d.; Six ton lots, 19s.
5. Bullion between Middle Footscray and Port Melbourne to be charged 5s. per ton. Insurance 6d. per ton.
6. Colonial-made Pickles to be charged Miscellaneous Class Rates, minimum one ton, at owner's risk. Form 86c to be used.
7. Harvesters to be charged and carried under Special B Class Rates and Conditions. Owner's risk.
8. Special Trains for Wool, Melbourne to Williamstown, to be charged £2 10s. per train in addition to the ordinary freight on the Wool.
9. Waste Paper for Paper-making to be carried at Special A Class Rates, minimum two tons, owner's risk; and Straw-board, manufactured in the Colony, to be charged Miscellaneous Class, minimum five tons. Owner's risk.
10. Empty Cartridge Cases returned to the Colonial Ammunition Company, Footscray, to be charged 1d. each for any distance. Owner's risk.
11. Twisted Grass Rope, in less than truck loads, to be charged Special B Rates, 1st Class minimums, otherwise Straw Rates. Owner's risk.
12. Tanks filled with Malt, Tanks to be charged 4th Class; and the Malt, Agricultural Produce Rates and Conditions. Owner's risk.
13. The charge for Stevedoring Bricks at Echuca Wharf to be 2s. 6d. per ton.
14. Iron Ore, Victorian, to be charged Firewood Rates, minimum six tons per truck. Owner's risk.
15. The Rates for Firewood, Timber, and other Goods to and from Arden-street will be the same as to and from Melbourne.
16. Clause 10 of By-law 62 is hereby repealed.
17. Paper Boxes, folded, packed in cases, 2nd Class Rates.
18. Aerated Flour, in five ton lots, Special B Rates. Owner's risk.

19. REBATES ON GOODS FOR RIVERINA.

(a) Goods forwarded from Melbourne, Williamstown, or Port Melbourne to Echuca, Swan Hill, Wodonga, Wahgunyah, Rutherglen, Chiltern, Yarrawonga, or Cobram, and conveyed thence by river, rail, or teams to any station on the Murray below the Murrumbidgee Junction, or to any station on the Murrumbidgee River or its tributaries, or to a destination north of, or intersected by, an imaginary line drawn straight from Jingellie on the Murray to Gerogery on the New South Wales line; thence to the south-east corner of Corree Station, the following stations forming the Southern boundary:—Table Top, Gerogery, Burgunderi, Burrumbuttock, Goombargama, Mahonga, Coreen, Wongamong, Narrow Plains, Barrigan-Momalong, and Booroobarilly; thence in a northerly direction to Burrabogie blocks, to include in that line Corree, Moonbria, Steam Plains, Willurah, Warwillah, Wargam, and Nyanga Stations; thence in a westerly direction along the south boundary of the River back-blocks to the intersection of the Murrumbidgee River at Balranald, will be allowed the undermentioned rebates, on production of certified bills of lading or certificates, or such other proof as the Commissioners may deem sufficient that they have been duly received at their destination.

(b) The ordinary rates will be charged in the first instance, and rebates allowed on production of rebate sheets, accompanied by bills of lading or certificates as above mentioned.

AMENDED REGULATIONS FOR THE COLLECTION OF FEES IN THE OFFICES OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL AND REGISTRAR OF TITLES UNDER THE "STAMPS ACT 1890."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the seventeenth day of August, 1891.

WHEREAS it is provided by the *Stamps Act 1890* that the Governor in Council may from time to time add to, alter, amend, or repeal regulations for carrying out all or any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, doth hereby make the following amended Regulations (that is to say):—

1. *Repeal of previous regulations.*—These regulations shall come into operation on the first day of October now next ensuing, on which date all regulations theretofore in force, made under the *Stamps Act 1890*, shall cease to be of any force or effect, and from which date the same are hereby repealed.

2. *Certain officers to assist Collector of Imposts.*—In the collection of moneys the Collector of Imposts will be informed, in the manner hereinafter mentioned, by the officers whose duty it is to receive or issue any papers or documents or to permit searches in respect of which any fees are chargeable, of the amount of such fees.

3. *To whom person paying fee is to apply.*—Any person about to pay any fee at the offices of the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles (such person being hereinafter in these regulations termed an "applicant") must apply to the officers whose duty it is to receive or issue the papers or documents or to permit the searches on which such fee is payable.

4. *Officers to be furnished with books of requisition forms.*—All such officers as in the last preceding regulation mentioned will be supplied with books of requisition forms, and such forms shall be in the form set out in the First and Second Schedules hereto, and shall be in duplicate and numbered consecutively in arithmetical progression, both the butt and its duplicate being numbered with the same number.

5. *Applicant to fill up requisition form.*—Every applicant must fill up a form in the butt of the book of the officer to whom he applies, by inserting therein the number, description, and amount of the fees required to be paid, and shall sign his name in such butt.

Officer to stamp requisition form and duplicate, also papers and documents with amount payable.—After an officer has ascertained that the papers or documents upon which such fees are required to be paid are regular and can be received, and what is the amount payable thereon (or in case of a requisition for a search what is the amount payable for such search) he shall stamp the requisition or butt and the duplicate with the total amount of the fees payable, and such officer shall also stamp each paper or document with the amount of the fees appearing from such requisition or butt and from such duplicate to be payable thereon.

6. *Where forms of requisition for searches to be obtained.*—Forms of requisition for searches which require to be made in the offices of the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles shall be obtainable only from an officer specially authorized to issue search requisitions, and from no other officer.

7. *As to payment of fees and acknowledgment of receipt.*—After the requisition or butt and the duplicate have been stamped by an officer as aforesaid the applicant must take such duplicate with the papers or documents (if any) referred to therein to the Collector of Imposts, and pay to him the amount of the fees stamped thereon by such first-mentioned officer, and the Collector of Imposts shall impress such papers or documents (if any) with his receipt for the amount of the fees payable thereon respectively.

8. *Officers receiving or issuing documents or permitting searches to see proper fees have been paid.*—All officers who receive or issue papers or documents or permit searches in respect of which any fee is payable shall, before receiving or issuing such papers or documents or permitting such searches, ascertain that the correct amount as stamped on the requisition or butt and duplicate by an officer has been duly paid and a receipt therefor given.

Also to see receipt has been impressed on documents.—Such officers shall also see that the receipt of the Collector of Imposts for the amount payable upon each such paper or document is impressed thereon in every case in which the fees payable thereon would but for the provisions of the *Stamps Act 1890* have been denoted by stamps.

9. *As to checking accounts.*—The collector's cash book shall be checked daily against the requisitions in the hands of the officers who issue them in respect of the business of each day, and in carrying out this regulation such officers shall prepare from the butts of their respective requisition books daily statements of the several fees stamped by them under these regulations, and shall forward such statements duly signed by them to the Collector of Imposts immediately after the close of each day's business, and the Collector of Imposts shall compare the same with the duplicate requisitions in his possession and verify the entries in his cash book therewith.

10. *Officer not to act as agent for others.*—No officers of the Departments of the Registrar-General or Registrar of Titles shall transact business with the department as agent for another person.

11. *What officers may act for Collector of Imposts.*—In his duty of collecting fees and impressing papers and documents the Collector of Imposts will be assisted by such officers as may be specially authorized in that behalf. No other officer or person will be allowed on any pretence to collect moneys payable to the Collector of Imposts under these regulations or to impress papers or documents.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the Education Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, from time to time, make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. X. (Scholarships) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid by Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of October, 1890, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:—

X.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

The Minister of Public Instruction will annually award Scholarships to one hundred pupils of State Schools in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned :—

1. Scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations held during the last three months of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the Sixth Class of his school from at least the first day of July immediately preceding, and shall have produced a certificate of birth showing that he will not have completed his fourteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State School.

2. The subjects for examination will be :—

Spelling from dictation,
Composition,
Penmanship,
Arithmetic,
Grammar,
Geography,
History,
Elementary Science,

As far as prescribed in Regulation I.

3. Each Scholarship will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for three years, upon the following conditions :—

(a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the Scholarship, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools:—Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, or Wesley College, all of Melbourne; or in the Church of England Grammar School, of Geelong; or in one of such other schools as may be approved of by the Minister; or in one of the Schools of Mines at Ballarat, Sandhurst, or Geelong; or in an Agricultural College.

(b) That the scholar show progress, as required in clause 8.

(c) That he shall continue to attend one of the above schools, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same.

If no report or an unfavorable report be received; or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

4. No Scholarship will be awarded to any candidate who fails to obtain a satisfactory proportion of the total number of marks.

5. Where a scholar does not reside within three miles of an approved place of education, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may commute the Scholarship for one of Forty pounds, tenable for a year.

6. Students who gained Scholarships at the examination held in December, 1889, and whose Scholarships have been commuted, will be examined in December, 1891, when the best fifteen will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months.

7. Students who gained Scholarships at the examination held in December, 1890, and whose Scholarships have been commuted, will be examined in December, 1891, when the best thirty will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. Holders of such renewed Scholarships will be again examined in December, 1892, when the best fifteen will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. But no commuted Scholarship shall be renewed to any competitor who fails to obtain at least 30 per cent. of the maximum number of marks obtainable.

8. Holders of Scholarships gained subsequently to December, 1890, will be required to attend an examination, to be held by the Department at the end of the first and second years of their tenure, and those who fail to pass satisfactorily will have their Scholarships withdrawn.

9. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other thing enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion, and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the ship *Loch Tay* has arrived in Victorian waters with persons suffering from Small-pox on board: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Order direct that the said ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast head: And I do further direct that while the said ship is so detained in quarantine no person whatever, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, except to the Quarantine Station, and then only under the supervision and with the permission of the Health Officer at the said Station, and except that her cargo or any part thereof, after disinfection under the supervision of and to the satisfaction of the said Health Officer, may, with his permission, be discharged into lighters to be afterwards conveyed to shore, under such precautions as the Health Officer shall direct: And that provisions, disinfectants, and letters may be slung or hoisted on board the said ship; but no person engaged in such slinging or hoisting shall go on board the said ship or approach her nearer than may be absolutely necessary: And further that no person shall board or approach the said ship, nor shall any one remain in her vicinity except only persons detained in quarantine and engaged under the direction of the Health Officer in removing any articles to the Quarantine Station, or in disinfecting the ship and cargo, or in removing into lighters any portion of her cargo as aforesaid: And I do further direct that the passengers and crew landed, or when landed from the said ship at the Quarantine Station, and all nurses and attendants employed at the said station, shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

(d) When an officer does not keep a horse as a charger, he will be allowed to draw the actual amount of horse hire, not exceeding fifteen shillings (15s.) for every day upon which he has to perform mounted duty.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay, for the year 1891, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, within the urban district of the said Trust:

1. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value, or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.
3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables the charge shall be Ten shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1891.
5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST. REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following regulation:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
2. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Seventeen pounds annual value, one half-inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Seventeen pounds annual value, three-quarter inch diameter: for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may authorize in each case.
3. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.
4. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of meter.
5. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.
6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.
7. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main the property of the Trust.

The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY TRUSTEES, 3RD JULY, 1891.

1. The rules and regulations, numbered 1 to 14, shall be the rules and regulations of the Merton General Cemetery, and, after the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, all rules and regulations and scales of fees heretofore made shall be rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form Schedule A obtained, and the fees, where not remitted, paid.

4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.

5. A Burial Right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. Any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for the special decision of the trustees.

7. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.

8. Every grave, vault, tombstone, or other erection shall be maintained and kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

9. Any grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees provided for herein.

10. Every grave shall be 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

11. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

12. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been a certificate obtained from a registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace, and, in case of re-interment, verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and deposited with the Trust.

13. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

14. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All the charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Order for interment to be given at the office of the trustees on the previous day, when a form of instruction must be filled up and given to the sexton.

4. The trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under the direction of the surveyor or other officer, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

5. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.

7. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

8. No interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

10. No burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar of deaths, coroner, or justice of the peace. Such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.

11. Any public grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees, as per scale of charges.

12. In the case of it being desired to exhume any body, the same shall only be done on the production, at the office of the trustees, of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and at such hours and on the payment of such charges as the trustees may determine.

13. In case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery or burial ground, a verified copy of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf must be produced at the office of the trustees, and the usual fees paid before such re-interment.

14. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

15. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

16. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there are liable to be destroyed.

17. No person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

18. No person other than the owner or his agent, duly authorized in writing, shall be permitted to interfere in any way whatever with a grave or enclosure, unless by special direction of the trustees.

19. The secretary or other officer so directed shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

20. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

21. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected there; and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

22. The ground will be open daily from sunrise to sunset.

23. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

24. The rules and regulations shall commence and take effect on and after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

CITY OF BALLAARAT.

REGULATION No. 13.

Regulation of the Council of the City of Ballaarat, made under the *Local Government Act 1890*, repealing so much of the Regulation No. 17 of the Council of the City of Ballaarat as appoints the general hackney carriage stand at railway station, and being subdivision 10 in said Regulation, and fixing by amended description the stand at railway station. And also repealing subdivision 24, fixing a joint hackney and borough stage carriage stand at Lake Wendouree, and appointing another stand in lieu thereof.

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Ballaarat do make the regulation following:—

That so much of Regulation No. 17 of the said City of Ballaarat as defines the hackney carriage railway station stand, and numbered 10 in said regulation, shall be and is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be substituted:—

10A. *General Hackney Carriage Stand at Railway Station*.—Hackney carriages plying for hire outside railway reserve shall draw up in a line on the south side of Ararat-street facing east; the two leading vehicles or first two in the cab-stand facing the station to cross over, and the first vehicle to stand at the south-east corner of level crossing, and the second vehicle to stand opposite the building known as "Reid's Coffee Palace."

24A. *Lake Wendouree*.—That so much of the said regulation as appoints the joint hackney and borough stage carriage stand for Lake Wendouree, and being subdivision No. 24 of that regulation, shall be and is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following stand shall be substituted:—

24A. That carriages and vehicles plying for hire to and from Lake Wendouree shall immediately after they have discharged their loads draw up in a line and form a rank alongside the fence opposite Fry's Mill. The first and second vehicle or carriage in such rank to cross over and stand at the north-east of the parade, in front of Taylor's Hotel, and as these are loaded the next two in succession in such rank shall take their place.

BY-LAW No. 1.

Of the Union of the Borough of Portland, the Borough of Hamilton, the Shire of Portland, and the Shire of Glenelg under the *Weights and Measures Act 1890*.

BE it enacted that the United Councils of the Boroughs of Portland and Hamilton and the Shires of Portland and Glenelg, in accordance with the provisions of the *Weights and Measures Act 1890*, ordain the following, that is to say:—

1. The Union shall be named the "Western Union," and shall embrace the whole of the municipalities of Portland Borough, Portland Shire, Hamilton Borough, and Glenelg Shire, as such may be defined from time to time.

2. The following fees shall be charged, received, and taken by the inspectors of weights and measures appointed from time to time by the aforesaid Union, that is to say:—

For each half-hundredweight	... Sixpence.
For each quarter-hundredweight	... Fourpence.
For each stone	... Threepence.
For each under one stone	... Twopence.
For examining and comparing balances, beams, steelyards, and weighbridges:—	
For each under one hundredweight	... One shilling.
For each hundredweight, from one up to ten	... Ninepence.
For each additional hundredweight over ten	... Sixpence.

A charge of Five shillings per ton to be charged in addition in cases where carriage of weights over five tons is necessitated.

The first-mentioned fees apply to examinations and comparisons performed at the office of the inspectors, and when any weights or measures, or any balance, beam, steelyard, or other weighing machine (except weighbridges) be compared, examined, or stamped on the premises of the owner, provided the same is done at the request of the owner, the fees will be in accordance with the above scale of charges, with one-half additional added thereto; provided also that the premises of such owner are situated within a radius of two miles from the site of the municipal office of the municipality in which such owners' premises are situate. If beyond that distance, mileage at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per mile shall be charged, provided any two or more persons residing at a distance make application at the same time requesting the services of the inspector; the mileage fee in such cases shall be fairly divided amongst those making the application.
