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TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND TONGA.

MY LORD,—Herewith I have the honour to enclose, for the information of Your Excellency's Government, copies of a printed paper setting forth the provisions of the Treaty between Great Britain and Tonga as amended by agreement signed on the 2nd June last.

The practical effect of the amendment is to alter the original text so as to now confer on the High Commissioner's Court exclusive jurisdiction over British subjects for offences against British law.

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN AND THE KING OF TONGA.

High Commissioner's Office, Western Pacific,
Suva, Fiji, 17th July, 1891.

The Treaty of Friendship, &c., between Her Majesty the Queen and His Majesty the King of Tonga, of the 29th November, 1879, having been simplified and amended by the Agreement of the 2nd June, 1891, its provisions, as amended, are published for general information.

Article I.

There shall be perpetual peace and friendship between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, her heirs and successors, and His Majesty the King of Tonga, his heirs and successors, and between their respective dominions and subjects.

Article II.

His Majesty the King of Tonga engages to grant to no other Sovereign or State any rights, powers, authority, or privileges in Tonga in excess of those accorded to Her Britannic Majesty.

The subjects of Her Britannic Majesty shall always enjoy in Tonga, and Tongan subjects shall always enjoy in the territories of Her Britannic Majesty, whatever rights, privileges, and immunities they now possess, or which are now accorded to the

subjects of the most favoured nation; and no rights, privileges, or immunities shall be granted hereafter in Tonga to the subjects of any foreign State which shall not equally and unconditionally be granted to the subjects of Her Britannic Majesty.

Article III.

(a) If any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in Tonga is charged with a criminal offence cognisable by British Law, such charge may be tried by the Court of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific Islands.

(b) If any subject of Her Britannic Majesty is charged with the violation of any Law or Regulation in Tonga relating to Customs, Taxation, Public Health, or Local Police, not cognisable as an offence against British Law, he shall be amenable to the jurisdiction of the Tongan Courts, the proceedings of which shall be conducted in public, and the records of which shall be public and accessible.

(c) Every civil suit which may be brought in Tonga against any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in Tonga shall be brought before and tried by the Court of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner.

(d) Every summons or warrant to appear as a witness before the Court of Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner, issued in accordance with British Law, and directed to a Tongan subject, shall, if possible, be indorsed by a Judge of the Supreme Court of Tonga, and, when so indorsed, shall have the same authority, and may be enforced in like manner, as if issued by the Supreme Court of Tonga; but, where it shall be made to appear to the Court that the delay required to procure such indorsement might lead to the escape or removal of a material witness, such summons or warrant may be issued by the Court without such indorsement, and shall have the same authority, and may be enforced in like manner, as if such summons or warrant had been directed to a subject of Her Britannic Majesty.

(e) The expression "British Law" in this Article includes any Regulations made and issued by Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific Islands for the government of British subjects within his jurisdiction; and the Court of Her Majesty's High Commissioner shall include any British Court or Officer for the time being authorized to exercise jurisdiction in the Western Pacific.

Article IV.

Her Britannic Majesty agrees to surrender to His Majesty the King of Tonga any Tongan subject who, being accused or convicted of any of the undermentioned crimes, committed in the territory of the King of Tonga, shall be found within the territory of Her Britannic Majesty.

The crimes for which such surrender may be granted are the following:—

Murder, or attempt to murder;
Embezzlement or Larceny;
Fraudulent bankruptcy;
Forgery.

Her Britannic Majesty may, however, at any time put an end to this Article by giving notice to that effect to His Majesty the King of Tonga. The Article shall, however, remain in force for six months after notice of its termination.

It is agreed that the arrangement contained in this Article shall be subject to the restrictions on the surrender of fugitive criminals contained in the Acts respecting extradition which are in force in the dominions of Her Britannic Majesty, and the procedure to be adopted with respect to the surrender of such criminals shall be in conformity with the provisions of the said Acts.

GRANT OF £250 AS A REWARD FOR AN IMPROVED
MACHINE FOR DIGGING POTATOES.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the grant of Two hundred and fifty pounds as a reward for an improved machine for digging potatoes.

1. A sum not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved machine for digging potatoes.

2. The reward shall be payable only to the inventor, or his agent, of such machine as shall more efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform the work of digging, lifting from the ground without bruising or cutting, and place in rows or heaps, potatoes ready for bagging.

3. Such machine must be an improvement on any machine for the same purpose which has been used in Australia.

4. One or more trials shall be made of the machine at such place or places, and at such times as the Minister may direct.

5. All costs and expenses of forwarding, attendance, and working the machines at the times to be appointed, shall be paid by the persons entering the machines for competition.

6. The Minister of Agriculture may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the competing machines.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not exceed Two hundred and fifty pounds (£250), to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful machine or machines, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

8. Persons intending to compete must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture not later than the 30th November, 1891.

GRANT OF £300 FOR INVENTION OF A CHEAP MEANS OF COOLING A CHAMBER FOR THE PRESERVATION OF DAIRY PRODUCE. — REGULATIONS.

1. A SUM not exceeding Two hundred pounds (£200) may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, produce an improved cheap machine, or other appliances, for cooling a chamber 20 feet square, for the preservation of milk, cream, and butter. Such machine, or other appliances, to be suitable for use in butter factories or creameries during hot weather.

2. The reward shall be payable to the inventor, or his agent, of such machinery or appliances as shall efficiently, cheaply, and rapidly perform what is required, viz.:—Reduction of the temperature to 40° Fahr. in a chamber of the above dimensions, for not less than eight hours at a time, without the aid of machinery or other appliances, when the temperature outside is not less than 80° Fahr. in the shade.

3. A sum not exceeding One hundred pounds may be paid to any person or company who shall, in the opinion of the Minister of Agriculture, devise a cheap and effective method of building, cooling, and ventilating a farm dairy, of not less than 10 feet square, without the aid of machinery, ice, or chemicals, to a temperature not higher than 55° Fahr., when the temperature outside is not less than 80° Fahr. in the shade.

4. All competitors shall, if required, cause to be constructed, at their expense, a chamber within which such trials as may be considered necessary shall be made.

5. The Minister of Agriculture may appoint two or more judges to report upon the merits of the inventions.

6. All costs and expenses, other than those of the judges, connected with trials shall be paid by the persons competing.

7. The judges may recommend payment of an amount or amounts, the total of which shall not, in the first section, exceed £200, or in the second section £100, to the inventor or inventors, or his or their agent or agents, of the successful appliances, such amount or amounts to be apportioned according to the value to the colony of the said invention or inventions.

8. Persons intending to compete must give notice, in writing, of their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, accompanied by a plan and description of their proposed methods, not later than the 30th November, 1891.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1891.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1891 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following regulation:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Seventeen pounds annual value, one half-inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Seventeen pounds annual value, three-quarter inch diameter: for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may authorize in each case.

3. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement, who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

4. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of meter.

5. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

6. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

7. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main the property of the Trust.

The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound.

WHEREAS by the *Explosives Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations with regard to certain matters in the said Act mentioned, and that he may by Order in Council do certain other things in the said Act mentioned:

Now therefore his Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, which shall specially apply to the manufacture, storage, and conveyance of the explosive known as Rackarock, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Minister may issue to such persons as he may think fit licences authorizing the manufacture by such persons of the explosive known as Rackarock.
2. The names of the ingredients to be used in the manufacture of the said explosive shall be mentioned in each licence.
3. The manufacture of the said explosive shall not be carried on underground in any mine.
4. No person or persons shall carry on the manufacture of the said explosive other than the licensee or some person or persons duly authorized in that behalf by the licensee.
5. The quantity of Rackarock to be manufactured at any one time shall not exceed such a quantity as would be required for the purposes of a mine for six working days, and, in the event of any quantity of the said explosive being stored or kept for a period of more than seven days from the date of the manufacture thereof, the licence will be liable to immediate forfeiture by the Minister.
6. The number of years for which a licence shall be granted shall in each case be decided by the Minister: Provided always that in no case shall a licence be granted for a term exceeding five years.
7. If in any matter which is not provided for by any express condition or proviso in any licence, an inspector of explosives find any store for the said explosive, or for the ingredients which, when combined, constitute the said explosive, or any part thereof, or any thing or practice therein or connected therewith, to be unnecessarily dangerous or defective, so as in his opinion to tend to endanger the public safety or the bodily safety of any person, such inspector may require the licensee to remedy the same.
8. The Minister may, either with or without notice, at any time stop the manufacture of the said explosive by any licensed person or persons, provided he deem such stoppage necessary in the interest of public safety, or may, in the said interest, direct the licensee or licensee, or his or their agent, to alter or amend the process of manufacture in such manner as he or any person duly authorized by him in that behalf may direct.
9. The Minister may, by notice in writing, declare any such licence void upon being satisfied that the manufacture of the said explosive is not being conducted in accordance with the conditions of the licence, or in accordance with the directions given in pursuance of the last preceding clause, and that the further continuance of its manufacture will imperil the public safety.
10. The fee payable for any such licence shall be One pound sterling, and such fee shall be paid to the Secretary for Trade and Customs at such time as application may be made for the issue of such licence.

11. The conveyance of Rackarock in any vehicle or boat, in or upon any public thoroughfare, river, harbour, or public place within Victoria, is hereby prohibited.

12. The Explosives Regulations and Orders 1891, made by Order dated the 13th day of January, 1891, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th day of January, 1891, shall not be deemed to apply to Rackarock.

MAGAZINES.

WHEREAS by section 16 of the *Explosives Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations, and rescind the same, providing for the storage of the several substances included in the interpretation of the word "explosive" in Part I. of the said Act in separate magazines, and prohibiting any of such substances being stored in the same magazine with any other of such substances, and prescribing the quantities and kinds of packages in which the several kinds of explosives may be received at and removed from any magazine: Now therefore the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations for Powder Magazines, viz.:-

1. The magazine or any part thereof may not be used for any purpose not in accordance with the following regulations.
2. These regulations must be duly observed by all persons employed within the precincts of the magazine, and the keeping of, or any process in, or work connected with, the keeping of gunpowder may not be carried on except in accordance therewith.
3. The interior of every building forming portion of the magazine in which gunpowder is kept, and the benches, shelves, and fittings in such building, shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, and also to prevent any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance from coming into contact with the gunpowder in such building, and such interior, benches, shelves, and fittings shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean.
4. Every building in the magazine shall have attached thereto a sufficient lightning conductor, unless, by reason of the construction by excavation or the position of such building, or otherwise, a conductor is considered unnecessary by the Inspector of Explosives.
5. Before repairs are done to or in any room or other part of the magazine, that room or part shall, so far as practicable, be cleaned by the removal of all gunpowder, and the thorough washing out of such room or part.
6. There shall be constantly kept affixed to every building in the magazine, either outside or inside, in such manner as to be easily read, a statement showing the quantities of gunpowder allowed to be stored in such building, and a copy of these regulations and such portions of the *Explosives Act* as the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may from time to time direct.
7. Any carriage, vessel, or other vehicle in which gunpowder is conveyed from one building to another in the magazine, or from any such building to any place outside the magazine, shall be constructed without any exposed iron or steel in the interior thereof, and nothing else but gunpowder shall be carried therein, and shall be closed or otherwise properly covered over, and the gunpowder shall be so conveyed with all due diligence, and with such precautions and in such manner as will sufficiently guard against any accidental ignition.
8. In all cases where the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may think it necessary, and shall, by writing under his hand so require, the premises in which gunpowder is stored must be vigilantly guarded by day and night.
9. Every building in the magazine must be closed during thunderstorms.
10. No person under the age of sixteen years shall be employed in or enter the magazine, except in the presence and under the supervision of the keeper of such magazine or his deputy.
11. No person except those employed in the magazine will be permitted to pass the entrance barriers without a permit and except in the presence of the keeper, who will be held responsible that all persons who enter the magazine shall comply with the precautions herein detailed.
12. The lighting of fires or smoking is entirely prohibited in or near any of the buildings of the magazine. Any person employed on the premises infringing this regulation, or entering or attempting to enter with tobacco, pipes, lucifer matches, keys, or iron or steel articles, or with any combustible in his possession, or any person showing the least appearance of intoxication, will be immediately suspended, or put off duty, and such circumstance must be at once reported to the Secretary for Trade and Customs.
13. No cultivation is to be permitted inside the magazine enclosure, nor are any animals to be admitted thereto during the hours in which the magazine is open.

14. All persons employed in the magazine must, before entering the magazine, change their outer clothes and boots for the special clothing and shoes provided for them.

15. The floors and platforms of the magazine must be kept scrupulously clean.

16. No person whatever is to be permitted to walk upon any clean floors or platforms to which the previous clause applies, unless wearing the special shoes above referred to; nor, while wearing those shoes, is any person to walk anywhere except upon the clean floors and platforms.

17. Wherever powder is to be moved hides or other soft material must be laid down to protect the floor or carriage on which such powder is placed or carried, and these should be frequently dusted.

18. The door mats are for use solely outside the barriers of the magazine; they should therefore be placed at the entrance in the most convenient places for use, and sheltered from the weather. They should frequently be taken up and shaken at a distance from the barriers to prevent any accumulation of mud or grit.

19. No package containing gunpowder or cartridges shall be opened in any buildings except the laboratory, or the examining shed provided for the purpose.

20. Great care is to be taken that all doors and shutters are kept closed unless it be considered necessary to open them for ventilation, or to carry on such operations as may be required in accordance with these regulations. When practicable, the entrance door or gate is to be closed before the magazine door is opened.

21. Whenever the magazine doors or windows are open, a responsible person must always be left in charge of the building.

22. Any defects in, or necessary repairs required to, either the interior or exterior of the buildings must be promptly reported.

23. Inventory boards, showing the contents of the magazine, must be hung in conspicuous positions.

24. The keys of the buildings must be labelled and deposited in a secure place when not in use.

25. The keeper must examine every package externally on its arrival at the magazine, to ascertain that it is perfectly closed in a double package, and to discover if its exterior presents any objectionable substances, such as iron or grit. If necessary, the powder should be shifted, and a defective package must not be admitted into the magazine.

26. All packages must have the contents properly marked thereon, and must be so stacked that the marking will be seen as far as practicable.

27. Empty cases and barrels must not be allowed to be placed in any magazine in which gunpowder or cartridges are stored.

28. Packages must be securely stacked in the several bays, and a clear space left between them and the walls, to allow of the free circulation of air, and prevent injury from damp.

29. Filled cartridges must be kept separate from loose powder.

30. Notubes, detonators, fuzes, quick or slow matches, lights, rockets, fireworks, primers, or similar stores, may be kept in any powder magazine, nor admitted within the enclosure of such magazine.

31. Packages of small-arm ammunition, or other cartridges or charges which contain their own means of ignition, or which are packed with their proportion of percussion caps, must on no account be stored in the same building as gunpowder, whether the latter is in barrels or made up into cartridges.

32. No gun-cotton, either wet or dry, nor any explosive other than gunpowder, may be stored in the magazine.

33. Oiled rags, cotton waste, cartridge clippings, oakum, or cloths for cleaning must not be kept in the magazine, ammunition stores, or their passages.

34. Gunpowder which has been wetted or otherwise damaged must not be placed in the magazine.

35. No implements of iron or steel may be used in the magazine or laboratory, and the use of iron or steel in any form is strictly forbidden in the construction of packages intended for explosives. Any exception to this rule must be specially authorized. The hoops of powder barrels must be secured with copper rivets only.

36. In heading and unheading gunpowder barrels, the person employed for the work must never use the bare adze against the copper hoops, but must invariably apply the metal driver.

37. Should it be necessary to break bulk or to shift gunpowder from defective packages, care must be taken to copy the original marking on the new packages, adding the date of shifting.

38. Barrels or cases of gunpowder must not be rolled or slid, but must always be carried by hand or on trucks or barrows.

39. A competent person shall be in charge of the fire-engine house (if any), and should know perfectly the arrangement of its contents, and the whereabouts of each article, so as to be able to find it at once in the darkest night.

40. Water for the extinction of fire must, at all times, be ready for immediate use.

41. The keeper of the magazine and every person in or about the same must take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the magazine, or to the gunpowder therein, and must abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work in the magazine.

42. All persons employed in or about the magazine must unhesitatingly obey the instructions of the keeper. If any person feel aggrieved at any such instructions, he may afterwards forward a complaint to the Secretary for Trade and Customs.

43. The above regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 13th day of January, 1891, and to have taken effect and come into operation on and from that date.

WHEREAS by the *Explosives Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to the carriage of explosives: And whereas it is by the same Act also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by order prohibit, either absolutely or subject to conditions or restrictions, the conveyance of any explosive when, in the judgment of the Governor in Council, it is expedient for the public safety to make such order: And whereas under the authority of the said Act certain regulations and orders relating to the carriage and conveyance of explosives have been made and are still in force: Now therefore the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following regulations, and doth order as follows, that is to say:—

To division F, subdivision III, of clause 58 of the *Explosives Regulations and Orders 1891*, there shall be appended the following proviso, and the same shall be read with, and as part of, such *Explosives Regulations and Orders* for all purposes whatsoever:

Provided that in the case of detonators the following general rules shall be observed, in addition to all other general rules, relating to the packing for conveyance of explosives of the 3rd division of the 6th (ammunition) class:—

- (a) The detonators, and the spaces between the detonators, and the spaces between the sides of the inner package and the detonators therein, shall all be filled, as far as practicable, with fine sawdust or other similar material; a layer of cotton wool, or other soft elastic material, shall be placed between each end of each detonator and the interior of the inner package in which the same is placed, in such manner and so secured that both ends of each detonator will rest upon the cotton wool or other material used in place of cotton wool. Every inner package, if of metal, must be lined throughout with paper or other soft material.
- (b) When the number of detonators to be packed for conveyance exceeds in all one thousand, or when a greater number than one thousand has, subject to any special conditions, been approved by a Government inspector (which he is hereby authorized to do), then, if the number of detonators to be packed for conveyance exceeds the number so approved, all the inner packages containing detonators shall be placed inside a substantial case of wood or metal, made and closed so as to prevent any of the inner packages escaping therefrom, and such case shall be placed inside the outer package required in the case of explosives of the 3rd division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class packed for conveyance, and so secured as to leave a clear space of not less than three inches between every part of the interior of such outer package and such inner case, and such clear space may be either filled with sawdust or with straw, or other soft or elastic substance, or may contain a light framework of wood, or wooden battens, so arranged as to keep such case in such position as aforesaid with respect to the outer package.
- (c) The conveyance of detonators is hereby prohibited, except the same take place subject to the foregoing conditions and restrictions.

SHIRES OF WARRAGUL AND BULN BULN.

PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, sec. 43) the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 41st section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the shire of Warragul described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said shire of Warragul and annexed to the shire of Buln Buln.

Area described in petition:

Commencing at a point on Lardner's Track opposite the north-east corner of allotment 95, parish of Drouin West; thence southwards by that track to its intersection with a road on the east of allotment 3, parish of Poowong East; thence southwards, eastwards, and southwards by that road to the south-east corner of M. C. Möller's allotment; thence east and south by a road to the south-east corner of M. C. L. Hansen's allotment on the boundary between the shires of Warragul and Buln Buln; thence by that boundary westerly, northerly, north-easterly, and easterly to the commencing point.

Petitioners state "that the entire traffic to and from the area proposed to be severed passes over the roads of the Buln Buln shire, owing to the fact of the roads leading to the railway at Drouin being shorter and easier grades than those leading to the railway at Warragul, and that the journey from Drouin to Melbourne is shorter by five miles than that from Warragul; that

the roads leading to Drouin are in a neglected and positively dangerous condition, and will not be improved while those using them pay their rates to a council which has no control over the roads; that Drouin is the natural outlet and approach for the territory; that they are dissatisfied with the small amount of money spent in the area since its annexation to Warragul shire; that the promise of a tranway to Warragul has not been kept; that the area as part of the South Riding of Warragul shire is unable to obtain fair representation, and in consequence is neglected.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to exercise the powers conferred by the 14th section of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and cause that portion of the shire of Warragul above described to be severed from the shire of Warragul and annexed to the shire of Buln Buln.

MOE GENERAL CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES, 20TH JULY, 1891.

(In pursuance of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.)

1. The rules and regulations, numbered 1 to 16, shall be the rules and regulations of the Moe General Cemetery.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been made, name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased given at the office of the Trust, an order in the form of Schedule A obtained, and the fees (where not remitted) paid.

4. The fees mentioned in Schedule B shall be the fees payable under the Act, and shall be paid at time of making application for any order.

5. A burial right, Schedule C, shall give the holder and his representatives for ever the exclusive right of burial in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

6. A permit, Schedule D, will on application of the holder of a burial right and deposit of a plan, design, or drawing of the proposed erection, or a copy of the proposed inscription or epitaph thereon, be granted to construct a vault or grave and to erect a monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection thereon, if approved by the trustees, and subject to such terms and conditions as they may see fit to impose.

7. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct same, subject to the approval of the trustees; every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

8. Every grave shall be 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, shall be interred in each, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

9. Notice of any burial shall be given at the cemetery eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial.

10. Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give same shall be given.

11. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited at the Trust office a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and, in case of re-interment on removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

12. The hours for burial unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. and from Two to Five p.m.

13. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless by authority of the trustees first had and obtained.

15. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily throughout the year.

16. Any workman employed in the cemetery, though not in the employment of the trustees, shall be required to comply with such general directions of the trustees or their secretary as may be necessary for the control and good order of the cemetery.
