PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Borough of Rutherglen;

TUESDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Rutherglen;

TUESDAY, THE 15TH, AND FRIDAY, THE 18TH DAYS OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the United Shire of Beechworth;

WEDNESDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bet Bet, the Central Riding of the Shire of St. Arnaud, the Shire of Wimmera, and at Sheep Hills and Warracknabeal;

THURSDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Portland and the Shire of Winchelsea;

THURSDAY, THE 17TH, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 30TH DAYS OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Dundas;

FRIDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Southern Riding of the Shire of Yarrowonga and at Echuca and Mooroopna;

TUESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Benalla and at Charlton, and as a Bank Holiday at Dookie;

TUESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, AND
TUESDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT,

to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the North-West and South-West Ridings of the Shire of Yarrowonga;

TUESDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, AND
THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT,

to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Shepparton;

WEDNESDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday at Nagambie;

THURSDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday at Sale;

WEDNESDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Inglewood and Portland, the Shire of Warrnambool, the North Riding of the Shire of Huntly, and the Central and Western Ridings of the Shire of Waranga, and as a Bank Holiday at Bridgewater, Inglewood, Natimuk, and Portland;

THURSDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Yarrowonga;

THURSDAY, THE 1ST, AND THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAYS OF OCTOBER NEXT,

to be observed as Bank Holidays at Nathalia;

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Huntly;

THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Rodney.
