PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THURSDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Horsham and the Shire of Wimmera;

THURSDAY, THE 24TH, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 30TH DAYS OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Arapiles;

FRIDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Wedderburn;

FRIDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, THURSDAY, THE 1ST, AND FRIDAY, THE 9TH DAYS OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as Bank Holidays at Telford;

SATURDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday in Melbourne and Suburbs;

TUESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at St. James;

TUESDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, FRIDAY, THE 9TH, AND FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAYS OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Benalla;

WEDNESDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Boroughs of Horsham, Korait, and Port Fairy, the Shires of Glenelg, Minhamite, Mount Rouse, and Portland, and at Hamilton, and as a Bank Holiday at Port Fairy;
