PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis'
Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the
Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and
Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United
Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished
Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and
Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and
its Dependencies, &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service

Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in
the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III.,
section 20, I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the
Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday throughout the Borough of Rutherglen, and as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Dimboola;

MONDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF OUTOBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday at Bendigo and Eaglehawk, and throughout the North-East Riding of the Shire of Marong;

Tuesday, the 13th day of October instant, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Euroa;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Wunghnu;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT. to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Port Fairy;

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Murchison;

Wednesday, the 21st day of October instant,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Majorca and the Shire of Swan Hill*, and as a Bank Holiday at Kaniva, Kerang, and Talbot;

THURSDAY, THE 22ND DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Rutherglen and the Shire of Warmambool, and as a Bank Holi-day at Aliansford and Warmambool;

WEDNESDAY, THE 28TH DAY OF OCTOBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Majorca and the Shire of Bet Bet, and as a Bank Holiday at Carisbrook, Kaniva, and Maryborough.
