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MAIL SHIPS ACT 1891.

[54 & 55 VICT. CH. 31.]

**T**HE following Act of the Imperial Parliament is published for general information.

An Act to enable Her Majesty in Council to carry into effect Conventions which may be made with Foreign Countries respecting Ships engaged in Postal Service.

[21st July, 1891.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1.—(1) Where Her Majesty the Queen has made a Convention with a Foreign State respecting the postal service between such Foreign State and the United Kingdom, or respecting the privileges of mail ships, that is to say, ships engaged in any postal service of such Foreign State or of any part of Her Majesty's dominions, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to order that this Act shall, and this Act shall accordingly, subject to any conditions, exceptions, and qualifications contained in the Order, apply, during the continuance of the Order, as regards such Convention and Foreign State, and the postal service and mail ships described in the Convention ; and where by virtue of any such Order this Act or any section thereof applies as regards any Convention, Foreign State, postal service, or mail ship, the same is in this Act referred to as a Convention, Foreign State, postal service, or mail ship to which this Act or section applies.

(2) The Order shall recite or embody the terms of the Convention, and may be varied or revoked by Order in Council, but shall not continue in force for any longer period than the Convention.

(3) Every Order in Council under this Act shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament forthwith after it is made, or, if Parliament be not then sitting, after the then next meeting of Parliament, and shall also be notified in the *London Gazette* and published under the authority of Her Majesty's Stationery Office.

2.—(1) Where this section applies to a Convention with a Foreign State, the master of a British mail ship to which this section applies when carrying mails to or from any port of the Foreign State, and the master of a mail ship of the Foreign State to which this section applies when carrying mails to or from any port of the United Kingdom, shall not, nor shall any person

on board the ship, whether a passenger or belonging to the ship or any other person, convey in the ship for delivery to another person in the Foreign State or United Kingdom, as the case may be, any letter other than the letters contained in mail bags intrusted to the master by a postal officer of the United Kingdom or of any Foreign State, or than the despatches sent by the Government either of the United Kingdom or of any Foreign State.

(2) If a person on board such ship acts in contravention of this section, or refuses or fails on demand to give up to a postal officer, or, if such person is not the master, to the master, any letter so conveyed by him, he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

(3) It shall be the duty of the master of the ship to secure the observance of this section by all persons on board the ship, and to inform the proper authorities at the port at which the ship arrives of any breach of this section by any of those persons, and if he wilfully fails to perform that duty he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

(4) Provided that a person shall not be liable under this section to a fine for any offence for which he has been punished by the law of the Foreign State.

(5) Nothing in this section shall apply to any letters which if sent from the United Kingdom would be exempted from the exclusive privilege of the Postmaster-General under the Act of the session of the seventh year of King William the Fourth and the first of Her present Majesty, chapter thirty-three, intituled "An Act for the management of the Post Office."

Regulation as  
to giving of

3.—(1) Where the owner of any ships, British or foreign, applies to the High Court in England, and

- (a) produces a certificate of a Secretary of State that such owner is subsidized for the execution of any postal service within the meaning of a Convention with a Foreign State to which this Act applies, by reason of receiving from the Foreign State, or from the Government of the United Kingdom or of a British possession, a *bonâ fide* subsidy for the postal service mentioned in the certificate, and
- (b) produces sufficient evidence of the nature of the said service and the number of and the prescribed particulars respecting the ships engaged therein, and
- (c) gives notice of the application to the Board of Trade,

the High Court, after hearing the owner, and the Board of Trade if they wish to be heard, shall fix the nature and amount of the security which the owner ought to place under the control of the court for the purposes of this Act as respects the ships engaged in that postal service, and fix the maximum number and tonnage of the ships to which the security is to apply.

(2) The security shall be the bond of the owner guaranteed either—

- (a) by the personal security of a surety, accompanied by an adequate real security given by the surety; or,
- (b) by the payment or transfer into court of cash, or of securities of the Government of the United Kingdom.

(3) If the owner gives such security to the satisfaction of the High Court, then so long as the security is maintained and is sufficient to the satisfaction of the Court, and the number and tonnage of the ships for the time being actually engaged in carrying mails for the postal service in respect of which the security is given does not exceed the number and tonnage of the ships to which the security applies, the ships actually engaged in carrying mails for the said service shall be deemed to be exempted mail ships, and be entitled to the exemptions and privileges given by this Act to exempted mail ships; and the Board of Trade shall give the prescribed notices for informing the arresting authorities that the ships actually engaged in carrying the mails for the said postal service are exempted mail ships.

(4) Notice of every application respecting any security given in pursuance of this section shall be given to the Board of Trade.

(5) If at any time it appears to the Board of Trade that a security given as respects ships engaged in any postal service is from any cause (whether pending claims, variation of the conditions of the service, or otherwise) insufficient, the Board of Trade shall apply to the High Court, and that court, if satisfied of such insufficiency, shall require the security to be made sufficient to the satisfaction of the court within a reasonable time, and direct that in default the ships engaged in the postal service shall cease to be exempted mail ships, and that the Board of Trade shall give the prescribed notices for informing the arresting authorities of such cessation.

(6) The amount and nature of the security may be varied and the whole security may be withdrawn, and the income of the security may be disposed of, by order of the High Court from time to time on such application either of the ship-owners, or of the Board of Trade, or of any person appearing to be interested, and in such manner, and after such notice, and upon such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by rules of court, or, so far as the rules do not extend, as the Court may think just.

(7) Provided that before the security is actually withdrawn, the High Court shall be satisfied—

- (a) that the prescribed notice of the order for withdrawal has been given to the arresting authorities; and
- (b) that there is no pending claim for the purposes of which the security may be required;

and upon the prescribed notice of the order for withdrawal being given to an arresting authority, the ships shall, as respects that authority, cease, after the date specified in the notice, to be exempted ships.

(8) Rules of court may be made for carrying this section into effect, and in particular for regulating the nature, amount, and value of the security to be given, and the mode of giving security, and of giving notices to the arresting authorities, and for providing for the evidence of the exemption of ships under this section, and for the information to be given from time to time to the High Court respecting the ships to which the security applies, and for the jurisdiction of the High Court under this Act being exercised in chambers.

4.—(1) Where this section applies to a Convention with a Foreign State, and an exempted mail ship to which this section applies is in a port in the United Kingdom, no person shall be arrested without warrant on board such ship, and before any process civil or criminal authorizing the arrest of any person who is on board such ship is executed against that person the following provisions of this section shall be observed, that is to say :—

Arrest and execution of process on board exempted mail ships.

- (a) Written notice of the intention to arrest a person who is, or is suspected to be, on board the ship, stating the hour at which, if necessary, the ship will be searched, shall, if it is a ship of a Foreign State and there is at the port a consulate of that State, be left at the consulate, addressed to the consular officer :
- (b) it shall be the duty of the master upon demand, if the said person is on board his ship, to enable the proper officer to arrest him :
- (c) If the officer is unable to arrest the said person he may, but if it is a foreign ship only after the expiration of such time after notice was left at the consulate as is specified in the convention, search the ship for such person, and if he is found may arrest him.

(2) The ship may be delayed for the purposes of this section for the time specified in the Convention, but not for any longer time.

(3) If the master of a ship refuses to permit a search of the ship in accordance with this section, any officer of Customs may detain the ship, and such master shall be liable to a fine of Five hundred pounds.

(4) This section shall apply to the arrest of the master in like manner as in the case of any other person.

5.—(1) An exempted mail ship to which this section applies shall not, subject as in this Act mentioned, be liable to be arrested or detained by any arresting authority either for the purpose of founding jurisdiction in any Court of Admiralty, or of enforcing the payment of any damages, fine, debt, or other claim or sum, or enforcing any forfeiture, whether arising from the misconduct of the master or any of the crew or otherwise, but every court of the United Kingdom by the process of which the ship could have been under the circumstances arrested or detained, shall have the same jurisdiction as if the ship had been so arrested or detained, and any legal proceeding in relation to any such matter as aforesaid may be commenced by such service in the United Kingdom of any writ or process as may be prescribed by rules of court, and the High Court, on application, shall, in accordance with rules of court, cause the security to be applied in discharge of any such damages, fine, debt, claim, sum, or forfeiture.

Exemption from seizure of exempted mail ship.

(2) Provided that nothing in this section shall render invalid the arrest or detention of a ship before the prescribed notice has been given to the arresting authority, but such authority, on proof that the ship is an exempted mail ship, shall release the ship. Where the Commissioners of Customs, in pursuance of any Act or as a condition of waiving any forfeiture, require a deposit to be made by any exempted mail ship to which this section applies, the amount of such deposit shall, on notice from the Commissioners of Customs, and without any further proceeding, be set apart out of the security as money belonging to the said commissioners, and shall be paid and applied as they direct, and any rules of court relating to such notice, payment, or application shall be made with the consent of the Treasury.

6.—(1) Where the Convention with a Foreign State provides that any provisions of the Convention similar to those contained in this Act shall in any cases apply to a public ship of a Foreign State when employed as a mail ship, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty the Queen to agree that the like provisions shall apply to a public ship of Her Majesty in the like cases when employed as a mail ship, and to give effect to such agreement.

Application of Act to public ships.

(2) An Order in Council applying this Act as regards a Convention with a Foreign State may, if it seems to Her Majesty in Council to be consistent with the Convention so to do, apply this Act as regards a public ship of that Foreign State when employed as a mail ship in the cases authorized by the Convention, and this Act shall apply accordingly, as if such ship were an exempted mail ship belonging to a private owner, and any person may be arrested on board such ship accordingly.

7.—(1) Every fine under this Act, if exceeding Fifty pounds, may be recovered by action in the High Court in England or Ireland or in the Court of Session in Scotland, and the court in which it is recovered may reduce the amount of such fine, and a fine under this Act not exceeding Fifty pounds may be recovered on summary conviction, provided that every offence for which a fine exceeding Fifty pounds can be imposed under this Act may be prosecuted on summary conviction, but the fine imposed on such conviction shall not exceed Fifty pounds.

Legal proceedings.

(2) In the case of a summary conviction, any person who thinks himself aggrieved by such conviction may appeal to quarter sessions. In Scotland such person may appeal in manner provided by the Summary Prosecutions Appeals (Scotland) Act, 1875.

(3) Service of any summons or other matter in any legal proceeding under this Act shall be good service if made by leaving the summons for the person to be served on board the ship to which he belongs with the person being or appearing to be master of the ship.

(4) If a fine under this Act imposed on the master of a ship is not paid, and cannot be recovered out of any security given in pursuance of this Act, the court may, in addition to any other power for enforcing payment of the fine, direct the amount to be levied by distress or pointing and sale of the ship, her tackle, furniture, or apparel. An officer of Customs in detaining a ship or releasing a ship after detention in pursuance of this Act shall act upon such requisition or authority and under such regulations as the Commissioners of Customs may make with the consent of the Treasury.

Application of Act to British Possessions.

8.—(1) An Order in Council may for the purpose of a Convention with a Foreign State apply this Act, subject to any exceptions or modifications not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, to any British Possession, and this Act when so applied shall, subject to those exceptions and modifications, and subject as hereinafter mentioned, have effect as if it were re-enacted with the substitution of such British Possession for the United Kingdom ;

Provided that before it is applied to any British Possession named in the schedule to this Act the Government of such Possession shall have adhered to the Convention.

(2) Where this Act applies to a British Possession, it shall not be necessary for the owner of any mail ship to give security in any court in that Possession, and the provisions of this Act with respect to the jurisdiction of any court of the United Kingdom, other than any jurisdiction relating to the application of the security, shall apply as if a court in the British Possession were substituted for a court of the United Kingdom.

(3) It shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make rules for carrying into effect, as respects British Possessions, the provisions of this Act with respect to the security given by mail ships, and in particular with respect to the commencement of a legal proceeding by service of a writ or process in the Possession, and to the notices to be given to arresting authorities in the Possession, and the evidence to be receivable by such authorities of the security having been given or withdrawn, and the application of the security in discharge of any damages, fine, debt, claim, sum, or forfeiture, where the same are or is recovered or payable either in the British Possession, or under proceedings pending concurrently in that British Possession and in any other British Possession or the United Kingdom.

(4) If by any law made either before or after the passing of this Act by the Legislature of any British Possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession any Convention to which this Act applies, Her Majesty in Council may suspend the operation within such Possession of this Act or of any part thereof so far as it relates to such Convention, and so long as such law continues in force there, or direct that such law or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession with or without modifications and alterations as if it were part of this Act.

Definitions.

9. In this Act—

The expression "mail bag" means a mail of letters, or a box, or parcel, or any other envelope in which post letters within the meaning of the Acts relating to the Post Office, are conveyed ;

The expression "subsidy" includes a payment for the performance of a contract ;

The expression "master of a ship" includes any person in charge of a ship, whether commander, mate, or any other person ;

The expression "ship of a Foreign State" means a ship entitled to sail under the flag of a Foreign State ;

The expression "arresting authority" means any court, authority, or officer having power to arrest or detain a ship, or to arrest a person on board a ship, or to order such arrest or detention, or to order the execution of any process, civil or criminal, for the arrest of a person on board any ship ;

The expression "postal officer" means any person employed in the business of the Post Office of the United Kingdom or a British Possession or Foreign State, as the case may be, whether employed by the Postmaster-General, or the chief of the Post Office of the British Possession, or the chief of the Post Office of the Foreign State, or by any person under him, or on behalf of any such Post Office.

Short title.

10. This Act may be cited as the *Mail Ships Act 1891*.

11. Victorian Ambulance Corps.
12. Victorian Mounted Rifles.
13. Victorian Rangers.

## EXTRACTS FROM THE GENERAL RULES AND ORDERS FOR ALL PORTS AND HARBORS IN VICTORIA, 1890-91.

Section 83. No vessel having more than 20lbs. of explosives on board arriving in or off, or being or remaining in any of the undermentioned ports or harbors of Victoria, shall be permitted to anchor within the limits hereinafter specified, viz:—

Port of Port Phillip.—Within three-quarters of a mile of Gellibrand's Point, nor to the northward of the line bearing E. from the Gellibrand lightship.

Port of Geelong (Inner Harbor).—Within three-quarters of a mile from Limeburner's Point, nor to the westward of a line bearing N.N.W. from the powder magazine.

Port of Geelong (Outer Harbor).—Within two miles of the shore, nor to the northward of a line bearing E. from Point Henry.

Port of Portland Bay.—Within three-quarters of a mile of the shore, nor to the northward of a line bearing E. from Observatory Point.

Port of Port Fairy.—Within three-quarters of a mile of the shore, nor to the westward of a line bearing N.N.E. from the lighthouse.

Port of Warrnambool.—Within half-a-mile of the shore, nor to the westward of a line bearing S.S.W. from the Beach lighthouse.

Port of Port Albert.—Within two miles of the wharfs, nor to the northward of Sandy Island.

Port of Corner Inlet.—Within one mile of any wharf, nor outside the limits of Franklin Channel.

The bearings are magnetic.

## EXTRACT FROM THE "MARINE ACT 1890."

## Part 2, Section 19.

If the master of any ship or any person under his command or on board such ship, or if any pilot or other person shall fail or neglect to observe all or any of the rules or regulations to be framed as aforesaid, or shall do or commit anything contrary to the true intent or plain meaning thereof, such master for every such offence committed either by himself or such person under his command or on board such ship, and such pilot or other person for any such offence committed by himself shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding One hundred pounds.

<sup>1</sup> The words "other person" include any person.

## EXTRACTS FROM THE "EXPLOSIVES ACT 1890."

## Part 2, Section 55.

The Governor in Council may prescribe the limits within which no ship or vessel having more than 20lbs. of gunpowder on board arriving in or off any of the ports or harbors of Victoria shall be permitted to anchor. And if the master of any such ship or vessel shall anchor within the limits so prescribed before all such gunpowder shall have been landed, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds for every barrel or package of gunpowder which shall not have been so landed previously to anchoring within such limits.

## Part 1, Section 3.

"Explosive"—

(a) Means "gunpowder," "nitro-glycerine," gun cotton, fulminate of any metal, coloured fires, and every other substance whatever similar to those above-mentioned or not used or manufactured with a view to produce a practical effect by explosion, or a pyrotechnic effect; and

(b) Includes fog-signals, fireworks, fuses, except safety fuses, rockets, percussion caps, detonators, cartridges, ammunition of all descriptions, and every adaptation or preparation of an explosive as above defined.

"Gunpowder" includes all powders composed of nitrates, carbon, and sulphur.

"Nitro-glycerine" includes all compounds or mixtures containing nitro-glycerine.

"Master" includes every person (except a pilot having command or charge of a ship, and in reference to any boat belonging to a ship means the master of the ship, and when used in reference to any other boat includes every person having command or charge of such boat.

"Ship" includes every description of vessel used in sea navigation, whether propelled by oars or otherwise.

No. 1095) it is amongst other things enacted that the period of the year during which the said Act shall be in operation as regards all or any of the birds and other animals mentioned in the Third Schedule shall be the period set opposite the name of each such bird or animal in the said schedule in each year or such other period as the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Government Gazette from time to time direct: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby direct that the period of the year during which the Game Act 1890 aforesaid shall be in operation as regards Bronzed-winged or other Wild Pigeons shall be from the first day of August in each year till the last day of February following, in lieu of the period set opposite the name of such birds in the Third Schedule to the said Act.

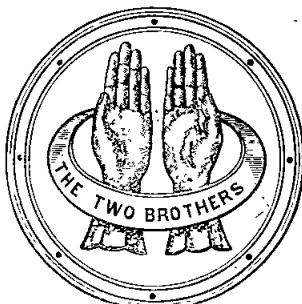

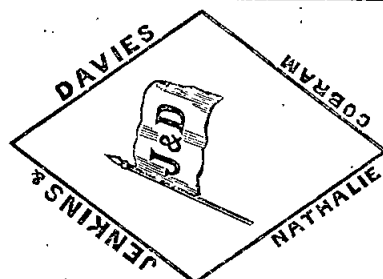

AMENDMENT OF "THE EXPLOSIVES REGULATIONS AND ORDERS 1891."

WHEREAS by the *Explosives Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to the storage and sale of explosives: And whereas, under the authority of the said Act, certain regulations and orders relating to the storage and sale of explosives have been made and are still in force: Now therefore the Governor of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the following regulations, and doth order as follows, that is to say:—

(a) To clause 10 of the Explosives Regulations and Orders 1891, there shall be appended the following proviso, and the same shall be read with, and as part of, such Explosives Regulations and Orders for all purposes whatsoever:—

"Provided that in the case of small magazines, in which a quantity of explosive, not exceeding in weight one (1) ton, is desired to be kept, it shall not be necessary to apply to the council of the municipality or shire in whose district the proposed magazine will be situated for their assent to the issue of the proposed licence."

(b) To subdivision (b) of clause 50 of the Explosives Regulations and Orders 1891, there shall be appended the following proviso, and the same shall be read with, and as part of, such Explosives Regulations and Orders for all purposes whatsoever:—

"Provided that this subdivision shall not prohibit the selling of any explosive of the 7th (firework) class to any child apparently under the age of 16 years."

(c) Subdivision (j) (ii.) of clause 50 of the Explosives Regulations and Orders 1891 is hereby repealed, and, in lieu thereof, there shall be inserted the following:—

"(ii.) One hundred pounds of gunpowder, or in lieu of each pound of gunpowder 1 lb. of fireworks or ¼ lb. of explosives other than gunpowder or fireworks."

And whereas it is anticipated that the moneys receivable by the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust during the current year will not, without a rate, be sufficient to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the said Trust of the current year 1891. And it is therefore necessary to make a rate to meet, as well the said deficiency in the revenue of the year 1890, as the estimated expenditure and liabilities of the current year 1891, such rate to be applied to the several purposes authorized in the *Water Act 1890*.

Now therefore the Commissioners of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers for the said purposes, as authorized by the said *Water Act 1890*, do, upon this 12th day of September, 1891, make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

1. The rates hereafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of houses and tenements within the district of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall pay in respect of the term of one year from the 1st day of January, 1891, to the 31st December, 1891. Such rate to be payable on or before the 1st day of December, 1891.

2. On every house, land, or tenement within the said district, above the annual value of Five pounds, according to the municipal value of such house, land, and tenement during the said year the sum of One shilling in the £1 of such valuation.

3. On every house, land, or tenement within the said district of or under the annual value of Five pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house, land, or tenement during the said year, the annual sum of Five shillings, being the minimum amount of rates fixed by the Governor in Council under the *Water Act 1890*.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

5. The foregoing regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of the said *Water Act 1890*.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BENALLA RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Richard Hoskin, Robert McBean, Willis Little, Michael Farroll, and Edwin Fitzroy Lusignan, the duly appointed trustees of the Benalla Race-course and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

##### REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the trustees. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the trustees.
7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the trustees first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports or fairs, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the trustees duly authorising the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the trustees to collect the same.
10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

12. The net proceeds of all sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

13. No person shall, after the 1st day of October, 1891, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a book-maker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

1st. That he be registered annually as a book-maker by the trustees of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Benalla Racing Club, or by those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of One pound (£1).

2nd. That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve, carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a book-maker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the trustees of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Benalla Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or steward, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

LEXTON COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management of the Lexton Common.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE LEXTON COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the Lexton Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

4. Sheep shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

5. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of October and the 1st day of April in every year:—

For every horse, Eight shillings per annum.

For every head of other cattle, Six shillings per annum.

Small cattle under six months old, the progeny of stock legally depasturing on the common, Free.

6. No bull or entire horse shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

7. Every person desiring to depasture stock on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman at the appointed branding yards on the days set apart for the reception of stock, and the managers shall, on receiving the fees payable thereon, give a receipt therefor in the prescribed form; and the herdsman shall forthwith proceed to brand such stock, and the owners or persons in charge shall render every assistance during the branding.

8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing on the common.

9. No person shall remove from the common any stock legally depasturing thereon without first giving notice thereof to the herdsman.

Any person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

THE CONDAH SWAMP COMMON, proclaimed on the 27th May, 1872, is hereby abolished.—(91. B.62142.)

THE JERICO AND JORDAN'S GOLD-FIELD COMMON, proclaimed on the 23th January, 1861, is hereby abolished.—(91. B.60815.)

**SHEPPARTON RACE-COURSE AND PUBLIC RECREATION RESERVE.**

**REGULATIONS.**

WE, William Clydesdale, George McCracken, William Grant, Thos. Daish, and William Maher, the duly appointed trustees of the Shepparton Race-course and Recreation Reserve, to whom a Crown Grant has been issued in respect thereof, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of toll, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Governor in Council for approval.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge except as hereinafter provided.
2. The division into which the reserve, with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon, is parcelled out and known, are as follow:—
  - (1) The lawn, the grand stand, the saddling paddock, and approaches.
  - (2) The weighing yard, the stewards' room, the committee room, the judge's box, and approaches.
  - (3) The inner inclosure.
  - (4) The outer inclosure.
  - (5) The flat inclosure.
  - (6) The training ground and approaches.

3. Subject to the provisions of the eighth regulations, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the sixth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses, shall, upon the production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders as the trustees of the reserve, the committee or stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, and those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards may from time to time give, as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

4. No person, except the judge and timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the steward's room except the stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, and such persons as they may invite.

5. No person shall enter the weighing yard, or the approach thereto, except the trustees of the reserve and the stewards, and committee of the Shepparton Turf Club, and those authorized by such trustees, stewards, or committee; the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

6. No person shall enter the committee room, or the several approaches thereto, except the trustees of the reserve, the committee and stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, their respective officers, and such other persons as the trustees of the reserve and committee or stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards may invite to do so.

7. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these regulations, shall enter upon the reserve, or any division or part thereof, unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

8. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the trustees of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonourable conduct in connexion with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee or stewards to be a defaulter, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof.

9. Every member of the Shepparton Turf Club, and every person paying for admission to the first, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce or (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other persons having authority from the trustees of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards to demand the production or surrender of the same.

10. No person shall remain in the reserve, or any division or part thereof, except the sixth division, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

11. Persons renting or hiring for any race meeting the grand stand, or any portion thereof, respectively, or any booth upon reserve, shall abide by any order given by the trustees thereof, the committee and stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club, and those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards in reference to the reserve, and the buildings and other erections thereon.

12. No person shall take any dog into the reserve or into any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon.

13. Any person committing in the reserve or in any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased, or is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

- (1) Assaulting any other person.
- (2) Being drunk.
- (3) Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course or any part of it during a race-meeting, or when the horses are preparing or are prepared to start or are running for any race.
- (4) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (5) Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
- (6) Behaving improperly or riotously.
- (7) Being found in first, third, fourth, fifth, or sixth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand, or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the trustees of the reserve, the committee, or stewards, of the Shepparton Turf Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, to demand production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such divisions, unless the person so found, shall forthwith satisfy the trustees, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.

- (8) Obtaining admission to the reserve or any division or part thereof when disentitled to such admission under these Regulations.

- (9) Remaining in the reserve in any division or part thereof after having been warned off any part of the reserve.

14. The following are the scale of tolls and charges which shall be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the reserve and buildings thereon respectively:—

- For the admission of each person to the first division such a sum as the trustees of the reserve shall determine, not exceeding 5s.
- For the admission of each person to the third division, 1s.
- For the admission of each person to the fourth division, 1s.
- For the admission of each person to the fifth division, 1s.
- For the admission of each horse to the sixth division (for training and exercising), £2 2s. per annum.
- For the admission of horses and vehicles to third and fourth divisions, 1s. per horse, 1s. 6d. for each horse and buggy, and 6d. each additional horse.

Provided that the trustees of the reserve or the committee or stewards of the Shepparton Turf Club may exempt any member of a racing club wholly or partially from the payment of all or any such charges or fees, and the money so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied in the permanent improvement of the reserve for racing and recreation purposes, or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, and in prizes for any race, or for the owner of any horse engaged in any race, or in such other manner in or upon the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same convenient and useful for racing and recreation purposes.

15.
