ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to alter Trusts and Limitations in respect of portion of the lands in the City of Melbourne, generally known as St. James' Church Lands, and for other purposes."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million thirteen thousand two hundred and thirty-two pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one and ninety-two."

"An Act to enable the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portland to sell and convey certain lands at Portland, and to apply the proceeds of such sale towards the cost of erecting a Town Hall and Municipal Offices elsewhere within the said borough."

PROCLAMATION

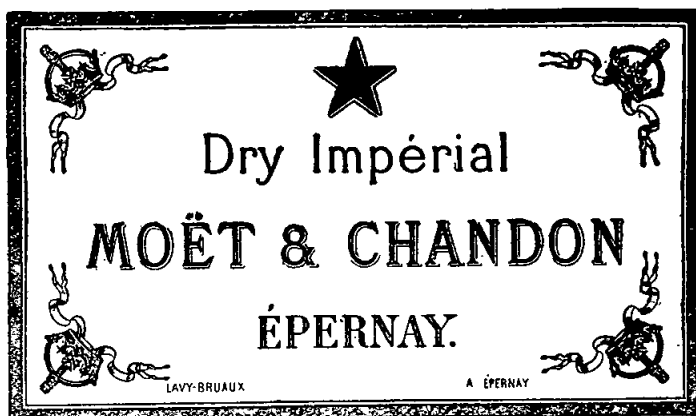

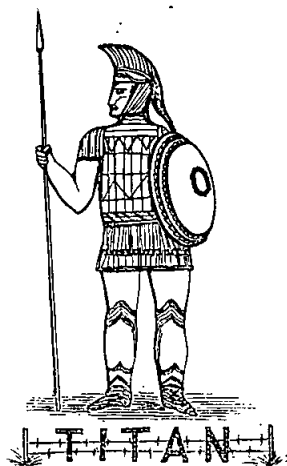

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. VIII. of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforsaid bearing date the 16th day of October, 1890, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:-

VIII.—TEMPORARY UNCLASSIFIED SCHOOLS.

1. In thinly-peopled districts, a temporary unclassified school may be established in any locality where it is probable that an average attendance of eight scholars will be maintained; provided that there is no existing State school at which such scholars could attend, and provided that suitable premises can be obtained at a reasonable rental, but not exceeding Seven pounds ten shillings (£7 10s.) per annum.

2. The buildings which may be used or erected for temporary unclassified schools shall be such as contain not less than 80 cubic feet of space for every child in average attendance, and have sufficient means of warming, light, and ventilation, and shall be approved by the Minister.

3. Any temporary unclassified school which has not for six consecutive months maintained an average attendance of eight children may be closed.

4. If the average attendance at any temporary unclassified school for six consecutive months has been twenty or more, the Minister will direct that it become a classified school; provided

that it appears, from the number of children attending, that such average attendance is likely to be maintained, and that suitable school accommodation for the attendance is available.

5. When the average attendance at any classified State school for six consecutive months has been less than twenty, and is likely so to continue, and it is not desirable or practicable to make it a classified part-time school, the Minister will notify to the classifiers that it is his intention to make such school a temporary unclassified school, and such order will take effect forthwith if there be no teacher in charge of the school, and if there be a teacher from the date of his transfer to a classified school, or of his electing to remain in the school.

6. A register of the names of qualified persons who are applicants for such schools will be kept, in which the names will be entered in order of precedence, according to qualification and date of application.

7. As vacancies occur in temporary unclassified schools, the Minister will from time to time appoint persons whose names are entered in this register.

8. All such appointments will be temporary, and may be terminated by three months' notice on the part of either the Minister or the teacher, or by the Minister without notice in case of misconduct, inefficiency, or neglect of duty by the teacher.

9. The fixed salaries of teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be at the rate of £75 per annum for males, and £60 per annum for females, and, in addition, a sum equal to one-half the amount of the fixed salary will be obtainable by way of results, to be determined as in the case of classified schools.

10. Teachers of temporary unclassified schools will be paid maintenance allowance for performing the services in connexion with the school buildings, &c., for which teachers of classified schools are paid a maintenance allowance.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1830*, make the regulation following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, at a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement by the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
- (4) Any person who may or shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1892, commencing from the 1st January, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable in one payment on 1st July, 1892.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st day of January and the 1st day of July.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The 12.30 and 1.10 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge station will only stop at Hawksburn and Armadale, and will run past Caulfield. The 1.30 and 1.45 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge station will only stop at Hawksburn, Toorak, Armadale, and Malvern, and will run past Caulfield. The 12.45, 1.17, and 2 p.m. trains from Prince's-bridge station and the 1.13, 1.55, and 2.27 p.m. trains from Caulfield will not run. The 1 p.m. train from Prince's-bridge station will only stop at Toorak and Malvern, and will run past Caulfield. The 3.10 p.m. train from Prince's-bridge station, and the 4.20 p.m. train from Mordialloc, will not run. Passengers from roadside stations on the Oakleigh line for the Mordialloc line can travel free to Prince's-bridge station by the 12.8 or 1.20 p.m. Oakleigh line trains, then by the 1.10 or 2.15 p.m. trains.

Bairnsdale Train.—The 5.50 a.m. express train from Bairnsdale will stop at Caulfield to set down passengers. The 5.40 p.m. express train from Prince's-bridge station will pick up passengers at Caulfield for stations on the Gippsland line at which the train stops.

Caulfield, &c.—The 3.53 p.m. train from Officer, the 5.20 and 5.57 p.m. trains from Oakleigh, and the 4.50 p.m. train from Frankston will only stop between Rosstown and Prince's-bridge stations at Hawksburn. Passengers by these trains to Caulfield, Malvern, Armadale, Toorak, South Yarra, or Richmond will be allowed to travel to Prince's-bridge station free, and return to their destinations by the ordinary trains. None of the Mordialloc, Frankston, or Oakleigh line trains timed to leave Prince's-bridge station between the hours of 11.15 a.m. and 2.50 p.m. will, on the outward journey, set down passengers at Caulfield. Caulfield periodical ticket-holders and those who hold remaining halves of return tickets issued at Caulfield will be allowed to travel from Flinders-street or Prince's-bridge stations by the race specials without extra payment. 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CENSUS OF VICTORIA, 1891.—CORRECTED RETURNS.

THE figures embodied in the following tables are the result of a tabulation direct from the Householders' Schedules, and may be accepted as final.

The population as now given exceeds by 3,133—viz., 1,225 males, and 1,908 females—and the inhabited dwellings exceed by 1,189 the totals published in the approximate tables published on the 23rd May last, which were compiled from the Enumerators' summaries.

An estimate of the population made up from the Census Returns of 1881 added to the excess of births over deaths, and of arrivals over departures by sea which occurred between the period of that Census and of the Census of 1891 would give the following numbers:—Males, 652,306; females, 555,086; total, 1,207,392; or males, 53,982; females, 13,095; total, 66,987 more than the actual numbers returned at the latter Census.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Made by the Trustees of the Krambruk Public Cemetery, in accordance with the Cemetery Act, for the general management thereof.

1. All charges for interment must be paid when order for interment is given.
2. Orders for interments shall be given to the secretary at least 24 hours previous to burial.
3. The time fixed for funeral to take place shall be the time at which the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
4. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m.
5. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been lodged with the secretary, together with the name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased.
6. Every grave shall be 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults shall be interred in each unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
7. Before a private grave shall be re-opened the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.
8. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited with the secretary a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and, in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.
9. No fence shall exceed 4 feet in height, including the coping, and shall be subject to the approval of the trustees previous to erection.
10. No servant or person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
11. No dogs, horses, nor carts will be allowed to enter the cemetery without special permission.
12. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.

13. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery without the authority of the trustees.

14. The certificate of title to allotments to be signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary.

DANDENONG GENERAL CEMETERY. — REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Dandenong General Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

DANDENONG GENERAL CEMETERY.

Rules and Regulations.

In pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Dandenong General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published previously in the *Government Gazette*, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the Act, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial, in the form specified in Schedule A.

3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars, for approval.

4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.

5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the secretary, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a metal plate with the distinguishing number of the order for burial stamped thereon.

8. That every grave be at least 6 feet deep for an adult, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of coffin to the original surface of the ground. After such interment, two infants shall be deemed equal to an adult.

9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from the deputy-registrar of deaths or a coroner, and such certificate shall be delivered to the secretary before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days, September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from Two p.m. to Five p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle, except the hearse and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than a walking pace within the cemetery.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof, and pay such fee as may from time to time be chargeable by the trustees.

18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, without the permission of the trustees, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundation (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Cairn, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed, shall be removed at once by the person erecting the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter, and no vehicle shall be permitted to leave the main carriage way.

21. That no tree or shrub shall be planted in any position of the cemetery except approved by the trustees.

22. That no wooden fence shall be allowed to exceed 2ft. 6in. in height, and all posts in the ground to be sawn redgum.

23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained if found necessary. The coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the secretary, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with dispatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance shall be open daily from Six a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Seven p.m. during the other months of the year.

27. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

30. That no person shall be allowed to take any flowers or plants out of the cemetery.

31. That the secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control under the trustees over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

32. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

33. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

34. That licences to grave dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule B.

35. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.

36. That any application for ground exceeding 12 feet in width shall be reserved for special decision of the trustees.

37. That any public grave may be converted into a private grave on application to trustees and on payment of fees or balance of fees.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1869* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the Proclamations hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby revoke the Proclamations hereinafter set forth, so far only as the same affect the digging and removal of loose stone from the land in the parish of Bellarine, lying between high and low water marks, in Port Phillip Bay, that is to say:—

1. Proclamation bearing date the 13th July, 1874, prohibiting the cutting, digging, or removal of live or dead timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were permanently reserved around any lakes, lagoons, rivers, creeks, bays, or fronting the Southern Ocean or Bass' Straits.

SHIRE OF KYNETON.**BY-LAW No. XVII.**

A By-law of the Shire of Kyneton, made under section 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 17, for regulating the Kyneton Shire Cattle Market and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or in the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and hours during each day on which the market shall be held, and for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the shire, and for the fixing the dues to be paid for such licences.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Kyneton order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 10 of the Shire of Kyneton, providing for the regulation and government of the Kyneton Shire Cattle Market, for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the shire, and for fixing the dues to be paid for such licence heretofore existing, be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. The President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire doth further order as follows:—That By-law No. 17 shall be in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

3. That the cattle market shall be open daily for the reception and delivery and sale of cattle and other live stock on every lawful day until seven o'clock p.m.

Licensing of Yards and Premises.

4. That the council may, on application in writing by the owner or occupier of any yard or premises within the shire which shall in the opinion of the council be suitable and efficient as a place for the sale of cattle, license any such yard or premises for such time and upon such terms as the council may think fit as a place for the sale of cattle, provided that the inspector shall have the same powers with regard to any such yard or premises as are hereby vested in him with regard to the market.

Amount of Dues to be paid for such Licence.

5. That the sum of Two shillings and sixpence per annum shall be amount to be paid for such yard or premises so licensed, and shall be paid by the person applying for such licence before the same is granted.

6. That the word "inspector" shall mean the collector or person appointed to collect the stallages, rents, or tolls authorized by the *Local Government Act 1890*, and shall include the assistants of the inspector.

Appointment and Duties of Inspector.

7. That there shall be appointed for such cattle market an inspector thereof, whose duties shall be as follow:—

(i.) To see that this by-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* relating to markets are duly observed.

(ii.) To demand and receive all market tolls and dues.

(iii.) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of parties bringing stock to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market before five o'clock p.m.

(iv.) To preserve order and cleanliness within such market, and to remove or cause to be removed therefrom any person creating a riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing or using any gross or indecent language, or being guilty of gross or indecent conduct therein; and, if directed, to take legal proceedings against such person.

(v.) Notwithstanding anything herein contained as to hours during which the market shall be open, the market inspector shall at all times give such facilities for the reception and delivery of stock as may in any case be actually necessary.

8. That no person shall release any stock from the market, or shall remove the same from one part of the market to another, without the authority of the inspector.

9. That every person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon; and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

10. That certain pens in the market shall be set apart for the reception of cattle for sale otherwise than by auction. Such pens shall be known as the private pens, and no cattle placed in the private pens shall be offered by auction until after the conclusion of the sales by auction of all similar stock on the day on which such cattle are entered for sale.

11. That certain pens, beginning at No. 1, shall be set apart for the reception of horned cattle of all denominations for sale by auction.

12. That the inspector or his assistants shall inquire of every person in charge of cattle brought to the market for sale whether such cattle are for sale by auction or not, and in case of a negative answer shall place such cattle in the private pens.

13. That all cattle brought to the market for sale shall be placed in pens, and that no person shall be permitted to remove cattle from one pen to another except with the consent of the inspector. That in case of any dispute arising as to overcrowding of pens, or as to priority of occupancy, the inspector shall alone be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. That the inspector shall have power to remove, or order to be removed, cattle from one pen to another, and that any orders he gives in that respect shall be promptly carried out, on pain of removal of the owner and cattle from the market.

14. That the whole of cattle other than the pens of cattle for private sale shall be offered by the auctioneers in numerical order beginning at the lowest number, and that no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than four minutes in offering any one pen of cattle for sale.

15. That all auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than five minutes in offering any horse by auction while any other auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers; and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction, the inspector's decision shall be final. In case of any auctioneer wilfully infringing or attempting to infringe this rule, he shall be debarred from offering any other horses by auction until after all the other auctioneers have finished offering the horse stock in their hands for sale by auction.

16. That all horses for sale by auction shall be paraded in a race or ring in front of a rostrum to be erected.

17. That no auctioneer shall be allowed to offer for sale or dispose of by auction any horses, cattle, or sheep, or so exercise his vocation in the market after the last pen of cattle yarded in his name shall be disposed of, and in no case for more than one hour at any one time, and on the disposal of such last pen of cattle, or if the same are not disposed of, then at the expiration of such an hour the next auctioneer in due order shall have the right to proceed to offer for sale and dispose of stock in his hands, and the retiring auctioneer shall wait his next regular turn for selling before he shall again offer or dispose of any horses, cattle, or sheep remaining unsold in his hands, so that no auctioneer shall have the right to sell or offer for sale in the market for more than an hour at any one time.

18. That no cattle, sheep, or horses which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneer in whose hands they were placed for sale.

19. That the sales by auction on fair days in the said market shall commence not later than the time hereinafter mentioned:—

Of sheep and lambs	...	Ten o'clock a.m.
Of horned cattle	...	On conclusion of sheep sales.
Of horses	...	Three o'clock p.m.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BY-LAW No. 13.

A By-law of the Shire of Hampden, made under Section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 13.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden order as follows:—

No. 13.

Adoption of the various provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1890*, namely:—

PART I.—STREETS AND FOOTWAYS.

(1) *Porticoes and Projections.*

1. The word portico shall mean and include every awning, portico, porch, verandah, shed, shade, or covering upon or across any public footway for the purpose of shade or shelter, together with the supports other than the building against which it is of such portico.

2. *Erection of porticoes.*—Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained it shall be lawful for the owner of any house or building abutting upon any public footway to erect or place against or in front of such building and upon or across such footway such portico as such owner may see fit.

3. *Height, &c., of porticoes.*—Every such portico shall be supported by upright pillars or supports fixed on the outer line or kerb of the footway, and shall be in every part thereof of such height from the ground not less than 7 feet, and with the pillars or supports thereof shall be of such shape, figure, dimensions, and materials respectively as have been appointed as herein provided.

4. *Regulations relating to porticoes.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the height from the ground of such porticoes as aforesaid.

For appointing the shape, figure, dimensions, and materials of such porticoes.

And there shall be deposited at the office of the council a plan and specification of such portico as may be appointed in any such regulation, and such plan and specification shall be referred to in such regulation, and shall be open for inspection by any ratepayer or person interested at all reasonable times without fee or reward.

5. *Porticoes erected contrary to by-laws or regulations.—Projections and obstructions.*—If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico has been erected or placed against or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway, contrary to some by-law lawfully in force in that behalf, or if after such coming into operation any portico has been erected or placed against or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway, otherwise than as has been appointed by some regulation to be made hereunder or if any projecting window, balcony, step, cellar, door, or window, or steps leading into any cellar or otherwise, lamp, lamp-post, lamp-iron, sign, sign-post, sign-iron, show-board, window shutters, wall, gate, fence, or opening or any other projection or obstruction placed or made against or in front of any building after the coming into operation of this subdivision therein is an annoyance in consequence of the same projecting into or being made in or upon or endangering or rendering less commodious the passage along any footway or street, it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to the owner or occupier of such building to remove or to alter, so as to conform to such regulation, such portico, or to remove or, in such manner as the council by such notice require, to alter such projection or obstruction, and such owner or occupier shall, within fourteen days after the service of such notice upon him, remove or, in manner aforesaid respectively, alter such portico or such projection or obstruction as aforesaid respectively; and if the owner or occupier of any such building neglect or refuse for fourteen days after such notice so served to remove such portico or such projection or obstruction, or to alter the same in manner aforesaid respectively, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding forty shillings for every day during which such projection or obstruction continues after the expiration of fourteen days from the time when he may be convicted of any such offence contrary to the provisions of this section.

6. *Porticoes erected without violation of previous by-laws.—Projections and obstructions.—Proviso.*—If before the coming into operation of this subdivision any portico has been erected or placed without violation of any by-law for the time being lawfully in force against or in front of any building, and upon or across any public footway laid out as such hereunder or otherwise, and such portico is not in conformity with some regulation for the time being in force hereunder, or if any such projection or obstruction, as in the last preceding section mentioned, which has been placed or made against or in front of any building before such coming into operation as aforesaid is an annoyance, as in the said section mentioned, it shall be lawful for the council to cause such portico to be removed or altered so as to conform to such regulation, or (as the case may be) such projection or obstruction to be removed or altered as they see fit. Provided that the council shall give notice of every such intended removal or alteration to the owner or occupier against or in front of whose building such portico, projection, or obstruction may be seven days before such removal or alteration is commenced, and shall make reasonable compensation, to be ascertained and ordered, if the parties differ, by two justices, to every person who may incur any loss or damage by such removal or alteration, except in cases where the portico, projection, or obstruction has been erected, placed, or made without lawful right, or may be removable under some other Act or law, in which case no compensation shall be made hereunder.

7. *Repair, &c., of porticoes.*—Every owner or occupier of any building against or in front of which there is any portico shall keep the same clean and in good repair; and it shall be lawful for the council to give notice to any such owner or occupier to

clean or repair such portion, if and as the same may require; and every owner or occupier who neglects or refuses within seven days after the service of such notice to effect such cleaning and repair shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he shall fail to effect the same.

(3.) *Spouts and Drains from Houses, &c.*

12. *Spouts, &c.—Drains.*—The owner or occupier of every house or building in, adjoining, or near to any street or road, within seven days next after service of a notice by the council for that purpose, shall put up a shoot or trough of the whole length of such house or building, and shall connect the same either with a similar shoot on the adjoining house or building or with a pipe or trunk to be fixed to the front or side of such first-mentioned house or building, from the roof to the ground, to carry the water from the roof thereof in such manner that the water from such house or the shoot or trunk fixed thereto, or from any portico or projection therefrom, will not fall upon the persons passing along the street or road, or flow over the footway, but so that no such pipe or trunk be an obstruction to the safe and convenient passage along the footway, and shall construct or lay from and in continuation of such pipe or trunk to the water channel a gutter, herein called channel, at the outer edge of the footway, and through, under, and traversely to the footway, such covered drain or trunk for carrying such water to such channel as may be authorized or directed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall thereafter keep in good condition every such shoot, trough, pipe, drain, and trunk, and every such drain or trunk shall be constructed, laid, and repaired subject to the inspection of such officer as the council appoint in that behalf; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day that he so makes default.

13. *Drains for discharge of surface water from land.*—Every owner or occupier of land in, adjoining, to or near any street or road, if such land is so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall, within seven days next after the service of notice by the council for that purpose, construct and lay from such point upon such land being near to the footway as is specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise, and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway, to the said channel, and through, under, and traversely to the footway, and keep in good condition such covered drain or trunk as and subject to the like inspection as in the last preceding section mentioned respectively; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day during which he makes default.

14. *Regulations.*—It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For regulating the materials, and the size, the level, and the fall of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway, either absolutely or with relation to the level or fall of the footway or channel or otherwise, in like manner and so, if they please, that such size be variable within limits prescribed in the regulation according to the discretion of such officer as the council may thereby direct.

(4.) *Repair of Crossings.*

25. *Repair of crossings.*—If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepaired a sum of Forty shillings, and the council may, if they see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

(5.) *Deposit or Discharge of Rubbish, Liquid, &c., on Streets, &c.*

27. *Causing, &c., offensive liquid, &c., to flow on street, &c.*—Every person who causes or permits to run from any manufactory, or any establishment for the boiling or preparing of any animal matter, or any brewery, slaughter-house, butcher's shop, or any dunghill or other receptacle, or from any inn, into or upon any street or road, public or private, or any footway or channel, and every occupier of any land or premises who causes or permits to run from such land or premises into or upon any such street or road, footway, or channel any offensive liquid or matter shall for every day during which any such liquid or matter shall so run forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

(7.) *Lighting, &c., of Obstructions Generally.*

38. *Persons laying materials or making hole, whether by authority or not, to light &c., same.*—When any building materials, rubbish, or other things are laid, or any hole made in any street, road, or footway, whether the same be done by order or authority of the council or not, the person causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or such a hole to be made, shall at his own expense cause a sufficient light to be fixed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise while such materials or hole remain, and such person shall, at his own expense, cause such materials or other things and such hole to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such materials or other things are removed or the hole filled up or otherwise made secure; and every such person who fails so to light, fence, or enclose such materials or other things, or such hole, shall for every such offence forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Forty shillings for every day while such default is continued.

39. *Penalty in like case for non-removal.*—In no case shall any such building materials or other things, or such hole as last mentioned respectively, be allowed to remain an unnecessary

time, under a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be paid for every such offence by the person who, whether by order or authority of the council or not, causes such materials or other things to be laid, or such hole to be made; and in any such case the proof that the time has not exceeded the necessary time shall be upon the person so causing such materials or other things to be laid or causing such hole to be made.

(9.) *Obstructions, &c., to Streets, &c., by Cattle, &c.*

41. *Cattle at large on unenclosed land.*—If any cattle are found upon any land not being a common and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land or any other dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody; and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form addressed to such owner as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons stating his name had been effected, or if such owner appear then as in other cases; and the justice may order the cattle to be sold and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid if demanded within one month to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund; and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

42. *Cattle at large in streets.*—If any cattle be at any time found in any street without any person having the charge thereof the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council the amount of such penalty and costs, if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof, or such lesser amount (if any), as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly; and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient, after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid, to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same, or so much thereof as remains unpaid, shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered; and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

43. *Goats sold for trespass to be released or killed.*—If any goat has been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this by-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and is not after the expiration of twenty-four hours released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges paid by the owner thereof, any justice may, by warrant under his hand directed to any constable, authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

44. *Regulations.*—It shall be lawful for the council to make regulations from time to time for appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through the municipal district or any parts thereof by boundaries set forth in such regulation, any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria, or of any other colony to any other part, and to provide, if they see fit, in such regulation separately in respect to Sundays and week days. And if any person drives any such cattle contrary to such regulation he shall forfeit for every head of cattle so driven a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to horses driven in harness or to oxen in the yoke.

45. *Breaking-in, &c., horses in streets.*—It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street, whether public or private, or in any public place, save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorized to make, or by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle, or otherwise to test or try any horse or other animal so to obstruct or injure any street or public place; and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

PART II.—WATERWORKS, DRAINS, ETC.

1. *Polluting water reservoirs, &c.*—Whosoever bathes in any stream, reservoir, conduit, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council, or washes, cleanses, throws, or causes to enter therein any animal, whether alive or dead, or any rubbish, filth, stuff, or thing of any kind whatsoever, or causes, or permits, or suffers to run or be brought therein the water of any sink, sewer, drain, engine, or boiler, or other filthy, unwholesome, or impure water, or does anything whatsoever whereby any water or waterworks belonging to the council or under their management or control shall be fouled, obstructed, or damaged, shall, for every such offence, forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for each day while such offence is continued after written notice in that behalf.

2. *Wilful waste of water.*—Whosoever being supplied with water by the council from any waterworks of or belonging to or under the control or management of the council, or having access to any such waterworks for the taking of water therefrom, wilfully or negligently suffers any water to run to waste from any pipe or conduit from or by which he is so supplied or to which he has such access, shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

3. *Damming up water without consent.*—Whosoever, without the consent in writing of the council, constructs or places any dam or embankment in or across any river, creek, or natural watercourse, or permanently obstructs the same in any way shall on conviction forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Five pounds for every day after such conviction during which such dam or embankment or any part thereof continues.

4. *Diverting water from reservoirs of council in certain cases.*—In any case in which the council has the exclusive right of collecting for the supply of any reservoir or waterworks belonging to the council or under their management or control the storm-water having fallen on any gathering ground, whosoever by any means whatsoever diverts any such water from the course of its natural flow, so that the same may tend to flow elsewhere than to such reservoir or waterworks or some watercourse leading thereto, or flow to the same respectively in a foul state shall forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, and a further sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every day after such conviction during which such water so tends to flow or flows as the case may be.

5. *Shooting or fishing in or near reservoir.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for prohibiting or regulating the shooting of waterfowl and the taking of fish upon or in or within one-quarter of a mile of any stream, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to or under the management or control of the council; and every person who offends contrary to any such regulations shall on conviction forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

6. *Obstructing, &c., culverts, &c.*—Whosoever obstructs or damages any culvert, sewer, or drain belonging to or under the control of the council shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay to the council, by way of compensation, for any such damage such further sum not exceeding Ten pounds as the convicting justice may order.

PART IV.

(2) Public Gardens.

3. The gardens under the management or control of the council, and ground appertaining thereto, herein called the gardens, shall be open from sunrise to sunset on each day of the week.

4. No person shall pluck any of the flowers, or walk on the beds or borders, or climb upon or get over the fences, or remove any of the tallies, or disturb, damage, or destroy any property or thing in the gardens.

5. No person shall carry firearms through the gardens, or shoot, snare, or destroy any wildfowl either in the gardens or in or on any water adjacent thereto, or bathe within such distance from such gardens as may be fixed by any regulation of the council to be made on that behalf in such water.

6. No cart or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goods shall, without the authority of the proper officer of the council, be driven through the gardens.

7. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from the gardens to any person, unless in exchange, or for public institutions, or for benevolent purposes.

8. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or labourers by conversation or otherwise.

9. Children under the age of ten years, not being under the control of some competent person, shall be removed from the gardens.

10. All dogs, goats, and all poultry found within the gardens shall be destroyed, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any justice, for any damage done.

11. In addition to the provisions herein contained it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make such regulations for the proper maintenance and management of the gardens as may seem to them fit.

12. Any person offending against this by-law or any such regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

PART VIII.—NUISANCES, ETC.

(1) Nuisances of various kinds.

1. *Keeper of goats to register name and address.*—Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. *Goats to be presumed to be kept by persons named on collar.*—If any goat be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. *Place for custody of goats seized hereunder.*—The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purposes of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure has been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. *Goats at large may be seized.*—Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. *Notice of seizure to registered owner.*—Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district, registered as aforesaid, is seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. *Goats seized may be destroyed after certain time.*—Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which has not upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid, may, by the proper officer of the council, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which has on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may, by the said officer, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. *Owner may apply to a justice to have goat restored.*—But the restoration shall be conclusive as to his liabilities as owner.—The owner of any goat which has been seized as aforesaid may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. *Owners of all goats found at large to be liable to penalty.*—The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

9. *Regulation as to keeping swine.*—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing by limits to be set forth therein portions of the municipal district in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine; and if any person keep any swine within any such prescribed limits he shall forfeit for every day during which he shall so offend a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
