TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

WHEREAS by section 123 of the *Public Service Act 1890* (No. 1133) the Public Service Board is empowered to make regulations concerning the duties to be performed by officers in the Public Service, and whereas the said Board, by General Regulation under the said section, did prescribe by clause 38 that officers absent on duty will receive such allowances, exclusive of the cost of travelling, as may be from time to time fixed by the Governor in Council; it is therefore submitted for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following addition be made to the Order in Council of the 10th August, 1891:—

ISSUE OF GOVERNMENT RAIN-GAUGES.

WITH the view of obtaining exact information concerning the rainfall in the various watersheds and other districts throughout the colony, arrangements have been made by the Government, through the Observatory Department, to lend rain-gauges to persons who are willing to take charge of them, and who will undertake to regularly observe and record the rainfall according to instructions supplied, and furnish copies of these records regularly and punctually each month.

To avoid unnecessary multiplication of rain-gauges in any one district or locality, it has been decided that, except under very special circumstances, no Government gauge will be issued for any locality within ten miles radius of an already established Government gauge.

The gauges will be forwarded to observers free of cost, and will remain the property of the Government.

Prior to the supply of a rain-gauge to any person volunteering to take charge of one, such person will be required to sign an undertaking, of which the following is a copy:—

I, _____, of _____, hereby undertake the care and charge of a rain-gauge, the property of the Government of Victoria, and to furnish to the Observatory, Melbourne, before the 10th of every month, a true and faithful account of the amount of rainfall for the previous month, as measured by such gauge each morning at 9 o'clock; and I also undertake, in case of my wishing or being obliged to relinquish the above charge at any time, from any cause whatever, to give one month's notice of the same to the Government Astronomer, and use my best efforts to obtain another observer, so as to maintain an uninterrupted record of the rainfall in this locality.

Persons undertaking charge of rain-gauges, who may fail to carry out the necessary conditions, will be duly notified of such default, and should they continue to neglect the regular record and transmission of the same to the Observatory, Melbourne, the rain-gauge will be taken out of their charge.

Rainfall observers complying with the conditions will be supplied with a copy of the Monthly Rainfall Record of Victoria immediately on publication.

The births of 1,534 children, viz., 796 boys and 738 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. In the month of August, 1,674 births were registered, or 140 more than in the month under review. The births were 389 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 80 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 897, viz., 509 of males and 388 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 637, or 71 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in August by 209, and exceeded the average of September during the previous ten years by 353; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by 244 only.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.12, and of deaths registered 1.83. The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 77.1° on the 30th, and the lowest was 35.9° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (54.5°) was the same as in the corresponding month of the previous year, and was nearly a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (31.3°) took place on the 26th, and the least (7.5°) on the 18th. The mean daily range was 17.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.474 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.522 inches on the 9th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.029 inches) was the highest, with one exception (September, 1888), during the last eleven years, and was about a tenth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.73 inches. The average rainfall in September during the previous ten years was 1.73 inches, or about three-fifths of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month. Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 33 per cent. to that mortality, as against 35 per cent. in September, 1890; 34 per cent. in September, 1883; 29 per cent. in September, 1888; 28 per cent. in September, 1887; 34 per cent. in September, 1886; and 27 per cent. in September, 1885.

Seventy-seven deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a carpenter, aged 75, died of influenza; a commercial traveller, and a bookbinder, each aged 75, of diabetes; a valet, aged 75, of cerebral embolism; a gentleman and a labourer, each aged 75, of bronchitis; a mariner, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of congestion of the lungs; a female, aged 76, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 76, of heart disease; a rope-maker and a female, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a housekeeper, aged 76, of inflammation of the lungs; a blacksmith, aged 76, of congestion of the lungs; a widow, aged 77, of influenza; a farmer, aged 77, of gout; a carpenter, aged 77, of syncope; a miner and a widow, each aged 77, of bronchitis; a rate collector, aged 78, of rheumatic gout; a female, aged 78, of cerebral effusion; a housewife and a female, each aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 79, of influenza; a gentleman, aged 79, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 79, of valvular disease of the heart; a labourer, aged 79, of heart disease; a fisherman, aged 79, of bronchitis; a widow, aged 80, of influenza; a female servant, aged 80, of rheumatic gout; a widow, aged 80, of softening of the brain; a labourer, aged 80, of brain disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of cerebral hemorrhage; a female, aged 81, of influenza; a labourer, aged 81, of apoplexy; a miner, aged 81, of valvular disease of the heart; a baker and a housewife, each aged 83, and a female, aged 84, of bronchitis; a tinsmith, aged 84, of a carbuncle; a female, aged 84, of burns;

Thirty-nine violent deaths took place during the month, of which 32 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 6 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway guard, aged 27, a storeman, aged 31, and a railway porter, aged 44, were passed over by railway trains; a male child, aged 4, was passed over by a cart; and another, aged 5, was crushed between the wheel and the body of a lorry; a carter, aged 33, died of injuries, the result of a horse lying on him; an upholsterer, aged 15, was crushed in a lift; a quarryman, aged 23, died of internal injuries caused by a stone falling on him; a female, aged 47, of dislocation of the neck, the result of a fall; a female child, aged 2, of scalds consequent on drinking boiling tea from the spout of a teapot; a female, aged 84, of burns; a male child, aged 3, of sunstroke; a male child, aged 4, was drowned through falling into a tank of water, and a female, aged 30, in the River Yarra; four persons were "found drowned," viz., a labourer, aged 42, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 50, and a labourer, aged 55, in the River Yarra, and a labourer, aged 54, in Hobson's Bay; a female infant, aged 3 months, a seaman, aged 30, and a labourer, aged 41, were suffocated by food; six infants died of suffocation, viz., a now-born female, at birth, two females, aged 1 and 2 months respectively, by overlying; two males, aged 2 and 3 months respectively, and a female, aged 7 months, in a manner unspecified; a doctor of medicine, aged 33, was poisoned by an overdose of opium, self administered; an engineer, aged 49, died of traumatic tetanus; a watchmaker, aged 18, of incised wound of the femoral artery; a labourer, aged 46, was killed by the explosion of a charge of blasting powder; a female, aged 55, died of shock, the result of an accident, the nature of which was not stated. The homicidal death was that of a male child, aged 1 year, who died of fracture of the skull, a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a gentleman, aged 48, who shot himself; a labourer, aged 57, who stabbed himself; an instrument-maker, aged 40, who poisoned himself with prussic acid; a widow, aged 63, who drowned herself; a labourer, aged 31, and a carpenter, aged 53, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirty-eight deaths, or 15 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 54 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 14 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 14 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol; 3 in the Protestant Refuge, and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 293, of which 173, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 120, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 189 were under one year of age, 54 were between one and two, 22 were between two and three, 16 were between three and four, and 12 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 604. Of these, 336, or 56 per cent., were males, and 268, or 44 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 35 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 35 were between forty and forty-five, 44 were between forty-five and fifty, 36 were between fifty and fifty-five, 57 were between fifty-five and sixty, 69 were between sixty and sixty-five, 59 were between sixty-five and seventy, 52 were between seventy and seventy-five, 39 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 38 were upwards of eighty.

In September, as compared with August, 90 deaths were set down to influenza, against 3; 226 to chest and throat diseases, against 162; 15 to whooping cough, against 13; and 6 to typhoid fever, against 2. Only 10 deaths were set down to diphtheria, against 13, but as the deaths from diphtheritic croup in these months numbered 6 and 3, deaths from the two complaints combined number 16 in each month. Twelve deaths in September were set down to the consequences of childbirth. Thus one death of a mother occurred in that month to every 128 births registered.

The following is a statement of the number of deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first nine months of 1891 and the two previous years:—

WHEREAS by section 414 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, on the application of any Trust or any other body or persons authorized by the now in part recited Act to construct waterworks, and after any such Trust, body, or persons has or have, by Order in Council, been duly appointed or authorized to make additional orders relating to such Trust, body, or persons not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act; but that no such additional order shall in any manner whatever lessen or diminish any liability or obligation previously incurred or imposed upon any such Trust, or body, or persons, and that the Governor in Council may in such additional Orders in Council among other things—

Make any order which might have been made in the Order in Council originally appointing or authorizing such Trust, body, or persons;

Repeal any of the provisions of any previous Order in Council relating to such Trust, body, or persons;

And whereas by a certain Order in Council dated the 1st day of November, 1888, the Governor in Council granted certain rights to the waters of the Werribee River to the Werribee Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, particulars of which rights are set out in clause 5 thereof:

And whereas it is desired to amend the said Trust's water-right:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth order as follow:—

That clause 5 of the Order in Council aforementioned, shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be and be deemed to be and may be cited as clause 5 of the said Order in Council:—

(5) The source from which the Trust is to obtain its supply shall be the Werribee River. The quantity of water which the said Trust shall be entitled to take, after allowing not less than one-fifth of the total natural volume of the river, and not less than forty cubic feet per minute at all times to pass their off-take, shall be three hundred cubic feet per minute during the months of May to September inclusive, and four hundred cubic feet per minute during the months of October to April inclusive, in each year.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ELMORE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1892.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be made.

6. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WE, William John Waddell, of Donald, merchant, George Frederick Oakley, of Donald, solicitor, Edward William Cartman Towers, of Donald, commission agent, William Henry Lewis, of Donald, soda-water manufacturer, Henry August Meyer, of Donald, butcher, Edward Felix Danaher, of Donald, auctioneer, and Patrick Joseph Hoban, of Donald, licensed victualler, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the 8th day of December, 1890, as a Site for Public Recreation in the parish of Banyenong, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, or ride or drive over the reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
