GENERAL ELECTION 1892.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that the General Rolls of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 1st December prox., and that persons who have not already enrolled may do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

2. The rolls so prepared, as far as relates to the Legislative Assembly, will be used at the general election which will, in the ordinary course, take place about the month of April, 1892.

3. The Electoral Registrars and Deputy Electoral Registrars will keep open their offices for the issue of Rights until Ten o'clock p.m. on two nights in each week during the whole of November (see advertisements in newspapers), and on every night (except Sunday) during the last ten days of the month.

4. Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

5. Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

6. Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

7. No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of an Electoral District may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

PART III.—SECTION VIII.—LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

Para. 1 is cancelled, and the following substituted:—

Para. 1. Leave of absence, not exceeding one month, may be granted by Commanding Officers to Officers under their command (those permanently employed excepted). A sufficient number of Officers must, however be available for duty with their Corps.

Para. 2. Leave of absence, not exceeding three months, may be granted by Commanding Officers to Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Men under their command (those permanently employed excepted).

Para. 3. Commanding Officers may delegate the power to Officers Commanding Troops, Batteries, or Companies to grant to Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and Men of such Troops, Batteries, or Companies (those permanently employed excepted) leave for one month; but leave for the current month will not be granted without reference to Head Quarters, unless such application has been received not later than the 10th of such month.

Para. 4. Applications for leave beyond the periods mentioned in paras. 1 and 2 must be made to the Commandant through the proper channel.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been

substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan may be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a waterworks district;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the Kilmore Riding of the Shire of Kilmore, for a loan of Sixteen thousand pounds sterling (£16,000) to carry out certain works for supplying water to the townships of Kilmore and Wandong as well as the Wallan Wallan Railway Station; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The construction of the said waterworks.

(2) The Councillors for the Kilmore Riding of the Shire of Kilmore and three other persons to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Sixteen thousand pounds sterling (£16,000), for the purpose of carrying out approved works, and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion 1.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 51, section B, parish of Bylands; thence west fifty-six chains; thence north to Foot-street; thence east nine chains along Foot-street to the western angle of section 33, township of Kilmore; thence north-westerly along a road to a north and south road on the western boundary of section 27; thence northerly by that road sixteen chains; thence east by a road fifteen chains; thence north by a road five chains to a creek; thence north-westerly by that creek to an east and west road; thence easterly twenty-three chains; thence south-easterly forty-eight chains to the eastern angle of section 24, all in the township of Kilmore; thence south to the commencing point.

Portion 2 (Wandong).—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section C, parish of Bylands; thence easterly along the northern boundary of allotment 1 to a creek; thence south-easterly by that creek to the north-eastern angle of allotment 2; thence south thirty-one chains to a point due east of the south boundary of allotment 9A; thence west to a point on the south boundary of allotment 9A five chains west from the south-east angle; thence north to the North-Eastern Railway; thence south-easterly by that railway and a line to the commencing point.

(5) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of an oftake on the Hazel Creek and channel thence to Myrtle Creek, an oftake therefrom and pipe mains thence to Wandong, Kilmore, and Wallan Wallan Reservoir, one pipe-head tank, two service basins, and pipe reticulation of Wandong and Kilmore.

(6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Kilmore Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1892, which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the water supply district:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings (2s.) in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound (£1) per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and the 1st July, 1892.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, empowered by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following Regulation:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take away such water from his premises, sell the same, or allow any other person to take, use, or carry away such water, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person who wilfully or carelessly breaks, injures, or opens any lock, stop-valve, fire-plug, cock, or pipe, or in any way interferes or tampers with the works of the Trust, not being duly authorized so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who allows the service-pipe or taps belonging to such person to be out of repair, whereby such water is wasted, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any person making use of the water belonging to the Trust, and not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty for each such offence not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe, service-pipe, tap, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, tap, or fitting, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any such licence is granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence.

7. The Trust may, between the hours of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, by its officers, enter any house or place where water is supplied to inspect all fittings, and to see whether there is any waste or misuse of water; and should admittance to the premises be refused, the supply of water thereto may be immediately turned off.

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION, 1892.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1892, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Fifteen pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound upon such municipal value.

3. For every house or tenement above Fifteen pounds and under Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Three shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be Ten thousand gallons.

7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for each additional chain.

8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building, or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed, and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.

10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.

11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1892: Provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be payable in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

CITY OF PRAHRAN.

BY-LAW No. 100.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, made under the "Health Act 1890."

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890* the Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Prahran, do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

1. By-law No. 97, made and passed by the Local Board of Health in and for the City of Prahran, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement or premises within the city of Prahran shall cause to be provided and kept therein a covered receptacle not exceeding 4 cubic feet in contents, so that the same may, with the contents thereof when full, be readily and conveniently movable by the public scavenger for the purpose hereinafter mentioned, and shall cause all dust, ashes, rubbish, or other house refuse produced, collected, or accumulated on any such premises to be from time to time placed in such receptacle, which receptacle shall be kept constantly covered, except at such times as the same may be or shall be opened for the deposit therein of dust, ashes, rubbish, or house refuse as aforesaid; and such receptacle shall be placed, at such times as are hereinafter mentioned in this by-law, in the yard of such tenement or premises, and close to the entrance thereof, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be readily and conveniently discharged and removed by the public scavengers or other person or persons authorized or appointed to collect and remove the same by the council of the said city. The occupier of every house, building, or other tenement or premises within the said city shall cause the receptacle hereinbefore mentioned to be placed as aforesaid between the hours of Seven a.m. and Three p.m. on days set forth in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The occupier of any house, building, or other tenement or premises within the city of Prahran shall cause the yard or ground adjacent or belonging thereto be kept in a cleanly condition, and so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish, filth, and refuse matter on such premises to be collected in one place in such yard or ground at a distance of not less than 4 feet from any street or tenement, and to be kept there in an inoffensive condition, and so that the same shall not be productive of any nuisance, and shall cause all such rubbish, filth, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard, ground, or premises, as often as it shall amount to a quantity equal to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such rubbish, filth, or other refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council of the said city may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

4. The occupier of any land within the city of Prahran on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health; and shall cause all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be collected in one place in the yard of such premises at a distance of not less than 4 feet from any street or tenement, and to be there kept in an inoffensive condition and so as not to be productive of any nuisance; and shall cause such dung, soil, or other manure to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so collected or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, the same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

5. On and after the 1st day of April, 1891, the ordinary system in use up to that date of removal of night-soil from privy pans within the city shall be abolished, and from and after the 1st day of April, 1891, every closet within the said city shall be furnished with a double pan service.

6. The pan or pans in use in each tenement in the several blocks of the city (as the same are respectively set forth in Schedule No. 2 to this by-law) shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and removed between the hours and upon the nights respectively set out in such schedule, and a pan or pans cleansed by superheated steam or some equally efficient means approved by the council shall be left in the place of the pan or pans so removed as aforesaid.

7. Notwithstanding the provisions of any of the foregoing by-laws the occupier of every house, building, or tenement within the city of Prahran shall cause every privy cesspool thereon to be emptied and cleansed from time to time, as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 6 inches from the top of the wall, sides, or lining of such cesspool.

8. No person except a nightman duly licensed in that behalf by the Council of the City of Prahran shall remove any privy, cesspool, or pan, and the contents thereof, and no person whomsoever shall remove any such privy, cesspool, or pan, or any of the contents thereof, except between the hours of Eight o'clock at night and Eight o'clock of the next ensuing morning, except on Sunday night, when the hours shall be from Nine o'clock at night till Eight o'clock of the next morning, and (except by leave of the inspector) upon the night set apart in the schedule hereto for the block of the city in which the tenement where such cesspool or pan is in use shall be situated.

9. No person whomsoever shall remove any of the contents of any privy cesspool until he shall have mixed therewith a sufficient quantity of chloride of zinc, carbolic acid, common salt, or some other efficient deodorizer to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

10. No privy cesspool shall have connected therewith or attached thereto any pipe or other appliance capable of being used for the purpose of discharging or removing any of the contents of such cesspool upon or under the surface of any adjoining ground or into any drain or sewer.

11. The occupier of every tenement in the city of Prahran in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the council the sum of Ten shillings annually, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council for emptying and removing each privy pan in use in such tenement on the 1st day of April in each year.

12. No person shall place, deposit, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited, in or on any street, road, right-of-way, lane, passage, or water channel, or in any creek, river, or reservoir, or in any public place (not being a manure depot duly appointed by the council as a place for the deposit for such manure, rubbish, or other such refuse matter), any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, offal, manure, dung, or soil.

13. If any person shall desire or intend to deposit, or cause or suffer to be deposited, on any land, field, farm, or garden within the city of Prahran, any blood, offal, or any offensive matter or thing, he shall cause the same, before the removal thereof, to be deodorized and disinfected by the admixture therewith of carbolic acid in the proportion of one part of the latter to two parts of the former of bulk, and previously notify his intention so to deposit the same to the inspector of the council.

14. The occupier of every tenement within the city of Prahran shall daily place in each pan in use at such tenement a quantity of some disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to effectually deodorize and disinfect such pan and the contents thereof.

15. The occupier of any premises within the city of Prahran used for the purposes of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatsoever, shall cause all rubbish, filth, offal, bones, water, liquids, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom at least once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any effluvia; and if the occupier of any such premises shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any such offensive matter as aforesaid, such offensive matter may be removed by the council or its officers at the expense of such occupier.

16. No night-soil, offal, fat, bones, or blood shall be removed or carried through or along any street in the city of Prahran, except in air-tight carts and between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Eight a.m., except by the express permission of the council in writing.

17. No privy, earth-closet, or cesspool, and no urinal shall be placed or built in front of any dwelling or at a less distance than 4 feet from any public highway, or from the door or window of any dwelling, or from any lane or street of a width at any part thereof of 16 feet or upwards, or from any street channel, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any partition fence.

18. Every privy or earth-closet shall be constructed of the design, dimensions, and materials, and shall be provided in respect to the middenstead of such closet with a flooring of asphalt, concrete, or other impervious material as is set forth in one or other of the specifications in the Third Schedule hereto, except in cases where the council shall otherwise order or direct.

19. Every cesspool shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be watertight, with handles thereto, and of such shape as will admit of its being fitted with an air-tight lid, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and shall be of the form of the approved pattern lying at the City Offices, Chapel-street, Prahran.

20. No closet door or trap shall abut or open upon a street or lane exceeding 16 feet in width.

21. No person removing manure, rubbish, or filth shall allow any cart containing the same to remain stationary in any street within the city of Prahran.

22. Every person erecting any new building within the city of Prahran shall, upon receiving notice so to do from the council of the said city, construct or lay such drains or pipes as may be prescribed by such notice, and if so required to do by such notice as aforesaid, shall cover the surface of the ground upon which such building is to be erected with asphalt pavement of tar and stone screenings, according to the tenor of such notice, in such manner, and so that the foundations of such building shall be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, and so that no water seepage or damp shall lodge there.

23. Whenever, in the opinion of the said council, it is necessary that any building or buildings within the said city shall be drained or provided with spouting and down pipes, the said council may order the owner of such building or buildings to forthwith construct and lay down such drains or other means of drainage, and provide such spouting and down pipes as shall be specified by such order, and the owner of such building or buildings shall, upon service of a copy of such order, construct and lay down such drains and provide such spouting and down pipes within the time limited by such order, and shall maintain the same in good order and condition.

24. No person shall convey in or through the city of Prahran any meat intended for consumption as human food except in a covered cart or waggon with closed sides or curtains in a cleanly condition, and so arranged and kept as that such cart or waggon, sides or curtains, shall be in a cleanly condition, and shall protect such meat from sunshine, dust, mud, or filth; and no person and no dog or other animal shall sit or lie upon any such meat.

25. The occupier of premises on which any yard, pen, or other enclosure is used for the keeping of fowls shall cause the same to be properly swept and cleansed from time to time as may be necessary, and shall at all times keep the same in such a state as not to be a nuisance.

26. All rags, flock, and cotton or woollen waste or other like material used or intended to be used in the manufacture of bedding or furniture shall, before the same be so used, be disinfected by placing the same in a chamber filled with superheated steam, so as to prevent injury to health. No person shall, within the said city of Prahran, use any such material as aforesaid until the same be so disinfected in the manner hereby directed.

Penalties.

27. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this by-law, No. 100, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings; or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

Block 4.—Malvern-road to the Yarra, Chapel-street to Boundary-road, Wednesday night.

Block 6.—High-street to Dandenong-road, Chapel-street to Boundary-road, Friday night.

THE THIRD SCHEDULE.

SPECIFICATIONS OF PRIVIES.

Internal dimensions not less than 5 feet by 3ft. 6in., and 7 feet high from floor to upper plate or ceiling. Nothing herein contained shall prevent any person from building better finished or more elaborately fitted privies, provided that, in the opinion of the City Surveyor, due provision has been made for all the requirements of these specifications.

No. 1. Privy of Wood.

Framing of hardwood or any pine or fir timber. All other timber to be of pine or fir, or for the internal fittings any superior joiner's wood. Foundation of not less than six 4-in. x 4-in. redgum blocks, 3 inches above the surface of the ground, and down to solid ground; studs and plates 3 inch x 2 inch mortised and tenoned together, trim for door, and opening under seat; cover exterior of walls with ½-in. weatherboards, securely nailed to studs with at least 1 inch lap, butting against 2½-in. x 1½-in. angle staves, all wrought; floor joists 4 inch x 2 inch, covered with ½-in. grooved and tongued flooring; roof may be either hipped or gabled, rafters 4 inch x 1½ inch, hips and ridges 7 inch x 1½ inch, covered with corrugated galvanized iron, secured with screws or nails to 2½-in. x 1½-in. batten, or with slates and galvanized iron ridging not less than 14 inches wide; if finished with gables to have 5-in. x 1-in. barge boards and 4½-in. x 1-in. covering board. The door to be not less than 6 feet high by 2ft. 4in. wide, 1 inch ledged, hung with 18-in. T hinges, and fastened with Norfolk latch and 4-in. bolt, or may be panelled with butt hinges and proper lock; the door for access to underneath the seat to be not less than 1ft. 8in. wide by 1ft. 5in. high, 1 inch ledged, hung with 18-in. T hinges, and fitted with 4-in. bolt or stout turn button; the seat to be thick and not less than 1 inch, 18 inches wide, and 18 inches high, with 11-in. by 10-in. egg-shaped hole with rounded edge, the front of the hole to be 3½ inches from the front or outer face of the rises, the seat to be supported by strong bearers and 1-in. riser. The floor of the space under the whole area of the seat to be made up with concrete or brickwork rendered on top with cement mortar (one of Portland cement to two of sand), the surface of this floor to be at the level of 1ft. 4in. below the upper surface of the seat, the sides of the space for receiving the pan to be enclosed with 4½-in. brickwork laid in mortar, not more than 4 inches wider than the pan, or wooden battens may be fixed 6 inches above the cemented floor to serve as guides for the pan, in the same position as the above-described brickwork. The seat, door, and walls or guides to be arranged for the reception of the prescribed pan 1ft. 2in. high and 1ft. 3½in. diameter, with handles projecting 1½ inches. If the privy be called there must be a ventilator 6 inches square at or near the highest part of the ceiling, opening to the outer air; if a lid be provided for the seat, there must be a ventilator of 3-in. iron pipe from under the seat to above the roof of the privy.

No. 2. Privy of Brick.

The foundation may be of stone walling 12 inches wide, or brickwork 13½ inches wide laid in mortar, not less than 3 inches above the surface of the ground and down to solid ground, the walls to be of brickwork in lime mortar, 9 inches thick, strike the joints of the brickwork on both faces, and lime-white the walls inside, or plaster the same.

The floor, roof, doors, seats, and fittings, and floor under the seat, and ventilation to be as described for privy of wood, except that the floor joists are to bear on a 3-in. x 1½-in. redgum plate bedded in mortar, and the doors to have solid frames 4½ in. x 3 in. on axed stone or 3-in. redgum sills.

GRANITE FLAT (SNOWY CREEK) PUBLIC CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.
2. No burial shall be permitted to take place in the said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the officer in charge before the funeral enters the cemetery.
3. Orders for interment will be received by the sexton or by any of the trustees.
4. The trustees will cause all graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves will be requested to construct them under the direction of the trustees.
5. A form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, will be provided, and must be filled up where practicable and entered in the interment-book in the same form.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for burials will be Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for burials will be from Two o'clock to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

8. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and no interment of an adult will be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 4 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.

9. No exhumation shall be permitted to take place until a licence from the Minister of Justice has been obtained, in addition to the approval of the trustees.

10. A plan of every monument and a copy of every inscription to be submitted to the trustees for their approval.

11. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after the model to be seen on application.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected. A register of all grounds is kept by the secretary.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.

4. The unloading of the coal will be performed under the direction of an officer of the Department, and the work must be done to his satisfaction.

5. 6. 8. 9. In case of the occurrence of strikes or lock-out affecting the mine or mines from which the contractor obtains his supply for this contract, the contractor shall supply coal in accordance with the conditions of this contract from such other working mine or mines as the Railway Storekeeper may direct.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Victorian Railways Commissioners.

11. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security-money will be absolutely forfeited to the Victorian Railways Commissioners as liquidated damages for breach of contract, and the contractor will be disqualified from tendering for a period of twelve months.

BY-LAWS OF THE BALLARAT DISTRICT ORPHAN ASYLUM.

[INCORPORATED UNDER 27 VICT. NO. 220.]

AT a special meeting of governors and contributors of the Ballarat District Orphan Asylum, duly called for the purpose, and held at Ballarat at 8 p.m. on Monday, the 10th day of August, 1891, it was resolved—

That the by-laws of the Ballarat District Orphan Asylum heretofore existing shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and that the following by-laws shall henceforth be the by-laws of the said asylum. Provided, however, that all acts, matters, things heretofore had or done under or by virtue of such repealed by-laws shall be of the same force and effect and validity as if such by-laws were not hereby repealed, and as if the following new by-laws had not been passed.

1. The object of the Ballarat District Orphan Asylum (hereinafter throughout these by-laws designated "the asylum") shall be the reception, maintenance, education, apprenticeship, and by all or any of such means, and otherwise advancing in life children deprived of one or both parents by death, subject to such conditions as may from time to time be adopted by the committee.

2. Orphan children shall be admitted as hereinafter provided without reference to the religion or country of their parents. All children admitted as inmates shall be entered as members of the religious denominations to which they belonged during the lives of their parents; and no change shall be permitted during their continuance in the asylum.

3. The guardians of any orphan children appointed by deed will, or otherwise, may apply to have such children admitted as inmates of the asylum upon such terms and conditions as such guardians and the committee may agree on.

4. Whenever the committee are of opinion that an inmate has a parent or guardian in a position to contribute to his or her support, they shall inquire into the position of such parent or guardian, and require payment of such sum as they consider ought to be paid; and in default of payment the committee may remove the inmate, or may take such other steps as they may deem advisable.

5. The asylum shall be governed by a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and a committee consisting of fifteen members; but no minister of religion, recognised as such by any religious denomination, shall be eligible for the office of president or vice-president.

6. The asylum shall be supported by donations and voluntary contributions, together with such aid as may be obtained from Her Majesty's Government.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF LIFE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

7. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of life governors:—Every donor of £10 and upwards, every person who shall raise by one or more collections in one year the sum of £20 or upwards from persons not claiming membership, on account of their contribution toward such sum, any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20, one of the executors under any will by which a bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the asylum, or any person recommended by the committee for special services rendered, shall be a life governor, and entitled to vote at all general and special meetings of life governors and contributors, and shall be entitled to all the privileges appertaining to contributors, but shall not be eligible to hold office.

8. Every contributor of £1 or upwards annually, dating from the time of payment, shall be entitled to vote at all general and special meetings of life governors and contributors, and be eligible to hold office.

9. Every life governor or annual contributor of £1 shall be entitled to recommend for admission to the asylum one child, and no more during the current year; of £5 five, two children; of £10 ten, and upwards, three children; and the minister of any congregation making a collection in aid of the funds of the asylum, of not less than £10, shall be entitled to recommend two children for admission, and three children for a collection of £20 and upwards, within twelve months from the date of the payment of such collection. The privilege of recommendation in all the above cases within the time specified shall be exhausted only upon the admission of the child recommended.

10. No person shall in any case be entitled to more than one vote on any question except the chairman, as hereinafter provided.

11. An annual meeting of life governors and contributors shall be held on the last Thursday in the month of July in each year, due notice of which shall be given at least one week previously in one or more of the local papers, at which meeting an annual report and balance sheet shall be presented, and the election of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, five members of the committee, two auditors, and the following honorary offices, viz., medical officers, standing counsel, solicitor, dentist, and oculist, shall take place; and the consideration of such other business as may arise.

12. To qualify a contributor to become a candidate for election to the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, member of the committee, or any honorary office, or that of auditor, at the annual meeting of life governors and contributors, he must be nominated by a life governor or contributor, in the form and to the effect set forth in the first schedule hereto, addressed to the secretary, and delivered at his office at the asylum not later than eight o'clock p.m. on the Tuesday preceding the date of the annual meeting. Provided, however, that after the formal nominations shall have been disposed of at such annual meeting, any office which may be vacant by reason of the election of any non-retiring member of the committee to the office of president, vice-president, or treasurer, or by reason of insufficient nominations having been received for any of the offices, such vacancies shall be filled up at the said annual meeting, in addition to those filled in accordance with this by-law.

13. Any non-retiring member of the committee being elected to the office of president, vice-president, or treasurer, shall thereby vacate his first-named office.

14. No person shall hereafter be eligible for nomination to any office unless he shall have been a contributor for fourteen days prior to the date of the annual meeting. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to any person whose name for one year preceding such annual meeting shall appear on the list of contributors to the asylum.

15. In the event of any vacancy occurring during the year in the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, or in any honorary office, or that of auditor, the same shall be filled up at a special meeting of the committee convened by circular for that purpose, of which not less than seven days' notice shall have been given.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

16. At all meetings of life governors and contributors the president, or in his absence one of the vice-presidents, shall take the chair; but should neither be present, the meeting shall choose its own chairman, and every question submitted to such meeting shall be decided by the majority of votes of the life governors and contributors then present, and in the event of the votes being equal the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his deliberative vote.

17. If at any annual or special general meeting of the life governors and contributors to the asylum, at least ten of the life governors and contributors qualified to vote shall not assemble and proceed to business within one hour from the time fixed for the meeting, no election of officers shall be made, nor shall any business be done at that time, but in such case there shall be another meeting of the asylum, at the same place and at the same hour of the same day in the following week; and at this last-mentioned meeting any number of life governors and contributors (qualified to vote as aforesaid) exceeding three shall constitute a meeting.

18. At the request of twenty life governors and contributors, or of the committee, a special meeting shall be called, and the secretary shall forthwith give notice of such meeting in one or more of the local papers, at least seven days before the meeting is to be held; and no other business than that specified in such requisition shall be transacted.

19. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

20. At all general and special meetings of life governors and contributors two scrutineers shall be appointed, whose duty it shall be to count the votes, and report the numbers to the president, and the secretary shall provide a list containing the names of all persons entitled to vote at such meetings.

COMMON SEAL.

21. The common seal of the asylum shall be kept at the asylum, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the president and the other by the secretary.

22. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by a resolution of the committee, and then only by the secretary, in the presence of and witnessed by two members of the committee specially appointed for that purpose.

23. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year, one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may, nevertheless, be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office, without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

24. If any member of the committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the president of the asylum, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto a contributor to the asylum until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire in addition to those hereinbefore provided for.

COMMITTEE.

25. The committee shall conduct and supervise the general business and management of the asylum, admit and discharge children, appoint, suspend, and discharge salaried officers, accept contracts, authorize payments, frame rules for the internal management of the asylum, and shall meet once in each month, or oftener, if necessary, at such time and place as they may determine.

26. The secretary and superintendent shall be appointed under the seal of the asylum.

27. The president may at any time convene a special meeting of the committee for the consideration of such special business as he may think fit to bring forward, seven days notice of which shall be given by circular.

28. On receipt by the secretary of a requisition in writing signed by five members of the committee, requiring a special meeting of the committee to be called, he shall within seven days from the receipt of such requisition convene such meeting by circular, provided such requisition shall state the business to be brought forward, and no other business but that specified in said requisition shall be transacted or discussed at such special meeting.

29. The chairman shall have a deliberative, and in the event of an equality of votes, a casting vote.

30. At all meetings of the committee not less than five shall constitute a meeting.

31. The committee shall have power to enter into agreements for the apprenticing, or otherwise arranging for the employment of any of the inmates, under such conditions and rules as may from time to time be adopted.

32. At the ordinary meeting of the committee in the months of February and August in each year, five members shall be appointed a house committee, in addition to the two vice-presidents and treasurer, who shall be members *ex officio* (not less than three to form a quorum), and shall meet at such times as they may determine, to superintend the internal arrangements of the asylum, examine accounts, receipts, and bank pass-book, engage and discharge the domestic servants of the asylum, purchase food, clothing, and other necessities, and attend to all matters relating to the health and comfort of the children, and all other matters which may be remitted to them by the committee. They shall furnish a report of the business transacted by them to the committee at the ensuing meeting.

33. All applications for the admission of children into the asylum shall be in the form and to the effect set forth in the second schedule hereto, and shall be submitted to the committee at its next meeting, when two members of the committee shall be appointed to inquire into and report to the committee, in the form and to the effect set forth in the third schedule hereto, as to the eligibility of the candidates recommended for admission. But if authorized by resolution of the committee, and on the recommendation of the committee of inquiry, the president may order the admission of the children. Provided, however, in case of urgency, when an application has been received as herein provided for, and before being submitted to the committee, the president, on a report from the secretary that the conditions set forth in these by-laws have been complied with, and on the recommendation of three members of the committee, in the form and to the effect set forth in the fourth schedule hereto, shall have power to order the temporary admission of any child until the next ensuing meeting of the committee.

34. No member of the committee shall be a contractor, or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly; nor shall any member of the committee be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

35. The president shall be an *ex officio* member, and, when present, chairman of all committees.

AUDITORS.

36. The auditors shall examine, certify, and report on the correctness or otherwise of the half-yearly accounts, terminating on the 30th June and the 31st December in each year.

SECRETARY.

37. The secretary shall attend all meetings, keep all accounts, and minutes of all business transacted at all meetings of committees, and perform the clerical work of the asylum, as directed by the committee.

TREASURER.

38. All moneys received by the secretary or collector on account of the asylum shall be paid to the treasurer within seven days, and the treasurer shall deposit the same within three days afterwards to the credit of the asylum in such bank as the committee may from time to time appoint.

39. On receiving any moneys from the collector the treasurer shall sign collector's acquittance-book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

40. Every payment shall be made by cheque, which shall be signed by the president (or, in his absence, a vice-president) and the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

41. Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the treasurer shall require a warrant, signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

42. The honorary medical officers of the asylum shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, who shall have access to the asylum at all times, perform all surgical operations, and report the same in a book kept for that purpose at the asylum. Any honorary medical officer neglecting his duty, without a reasonable excuse, shall cease to hold office, and another be appointed in his stead.

SUPERINTENDENT.

43. The superintendent shall be responsible for the management and property of the asylum, under the direction of the committee.

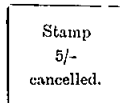
