DECLARATION BY RETURNING OFFICER OF THE DETERMINATION OF ELECTORS REGARDING VICTUALLERS' LICENCES WITHIN THE MALDON LICENSING DISTRICT.

LICENSING DISTRICT.

THE undersigned James Robertson, a member of the Licensing Court for the Maldon Licensing District, having been directed by His Excellency the Governor in Council to take a Poll of the Electors within the said Licensing District upon the 11th November, A.D. 1891, to determine whether or not the number of Victuallers' Licences in that District should be decreased, and, having taken such Poll accordingly, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Licensing Act 1890, and of the Regulations thereunder, publish and declare the determination of the Electors of the said District to be that the number of Victuallers' Licences within the said District shall not be reduced from the existing number of nineteen (19), and that the number of Victuallers' Licences within the said District shall therefore be nineteen (19).

THE Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 10.

1. Clauses 1 and 7 of Regulation No. 3, made by the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 95 of The Irrigation Act 1886, on the 2nd day of May, 1890, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 23rd day of June, 1890, vide Government Gazette of 27th June, 1890, are hereby repealed.

of 7th June, 1890, are hereby repealed.

2. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. The charges for water supplied by measure shall be One shilling per inch per acre, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for annually to all owners and occupiers of land within the Trust district outside of the divisions of Dimboola, Natimuk, and Jung Jung shall be at the rate of ten inches per acre or portion of an acre, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

The foregoing regulation, numbered ten, was made by the Commissioners of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust under and by virtue of section 254 of the Water Act 1890, this 9th day of October, 1891.
