PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revoke in part the Proclamation bearing date the tenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, so far only as the same relates to the appointment of Friday, the 20th day of November instant, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Colac; and in pursuance of the provisions contained in the said Act and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), do hereby appoint

TUESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Port Fairy;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shires of Colac, Howqua, Metcalfe, and Traralgon, and as a Bank Holiday at Moe, Morwell, and Traralgon;

FRIDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Hamilton, and as a Bank Holiday at Hamilton;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Alberton, Port Albert, and Yarram Yarram;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF NOVEMBER INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, as a Public Holiday* and Bank Holiday throughout the Shire of Maffra, and as a Bank Holiday at Kilmore;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Horsham;

THURSDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF DECEMBER NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Town of Warrnambool, and as a Public Half-Holiday,* from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.
