REGULATION TO RESTRAIN THE SALE AND USE OF FIRE-ARMS IN SAMOA.

THE following Despatch from Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, and its enclosure, are published for general information.

My Lord, —Herewith I have the honour to enclose copies of a Regulation, No. 1 of 1891, "To restrain the sale and use of firearms in Samoa."

This Regulation adopts, without any alteration, the provisions of the Final Act of the Berlin Conference with regard to the restrictions on the sale and use of firearms, placing British subjects, who have hitherto been subject to somewhat severer restrictions, on the same footing as other nationals.

A REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Western Pacific Order in Council of 1879)

TO RESTRAIN THE SALE AND USE OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION IN SAMOA.

[L.S.] JOHN B. THURSTON,

28th November, 1891.

1. Whereas by Article VII section one of the Final Act of the Conference on Samoan Affairs signed at Berlin on the 14th June 1889 by the Representatives of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Empress of India His Majesty the Emperor of Germany King of Prussia and the President of the United States and assented to by Samoa as attested by a Certificate signed by the King of Samoa it is provided as follows:—

"The importation into the contract of the

"The importation into the islands of Samoa of Arms and Ammunition by the natives of Samoa or by the citizens or sub-jects of any foreign country shall be prohibited except in the following cases:—

(a) Guns and ammunition for sporting purposes for which written licence shall have been proviously obtained from the President of the Municipal Council;
 (b) Small arms and ammunition carried by travellers as personal appanage.

No. 156.—December 31, 1891.—1.

"The sale of arms and ammunition by any foreigner to any native Samoan subject or other Pacific Islander resident in Samoa is also prohibited.

"Any arms or ammunition imported or sold in violation of these provisions shall be forfeited to the Government. The Samoan Government retains the right to import suitable arms and ammunition to protect itself and maintain order but all such arms and ammunition shall be entered at the Customs (without payment of duty) and reported by the President of the Municipal Council to the Consuls of the three Treaty Powers."

Now therefore any British subject who shall do or who shall counsel aid abet encourage or procure any other person to do any act contrary to the aforesaid provisions of section one of Article VII of the Final Act of the Conference on Samoan Affairs signed at Berlin on the 14th June 1889 shall on conviction thereof be liable to punishment as follows:—

- (1) Imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months with or without hard labour and with or without a fine not exceeding Ten pounds; or
- (2) A fine alone not exceeding Ten pounds without any imprisonment.
- 2. From and after the coming into force of this Regulation Regulation No. 1 of 1884 "To Prohibit the Supply of Arms Ammunition and Explosive Substances to Natives of the Western Pacific Islands" shall cease to apply to the islands of
- 3. This Regulation may be cited as "The Samoan Arms Regulation 1891" and shall come into force on the seventh day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred

"Causes of Wreck at the Port Phillip Heads.

"Causes of Wreck at the Port Phillip Heads.

"A careful inquiry into the casualties which have occurred at the entrance of Port Phillip has shown that in nearly every case they have taken place in consequence of the vessels either attempting to enter the Heads at night without a pilot or against a strong ebb stream, which, it must be remembered, runs partly athwart the entrance with great force, frequently at the rate of 7 knots, causing a high confused tumbling sea, which, in southerly or westerly gales, often breaks from point to point. The mariner must not suppose that because he has a fine fair wind outside the Heads he can always force his vessel against the ebb. To this error is attributable the loss of several vessels. The wind, although fresh outside, frequently falls light just as the vessel gets into the tide-ripple between the Heads, when she becomes unmanageable; and even with a strong breeze vessels often shear athwart the tide, which hereabouts forms a series of strong irregular eddies."

- II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

 IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

BOROUGH OF WANGARATTA.

By-law No. 3.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890 (No. 1098) the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Wangaratta make the following by-law, being Bylaw No. 3, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, that is to say:—

- 1. This by-law shall apply to that part of the borough bounded on the north by suburban sections 21, 72, 73, and 74, on the east by the Ovens and King rivers and Millard-street, on the south by Crisp-street and the One-mile Creck, on the west by the said creek, and again on the north by Evans-street and the Ovens River, and again on the west by the railway line.
- 2. The system of removing the contents of closet pans at night time be and is now abolished, and that a day service be substituted therefor.
- 3. The day service will be that known as the "double-pan service," and the pans and the covers used in making the removals will be provided by the council.
- 4. Once in each week the person contracted with by the council shall remove the pans in use, and shall leave thoroughly cleansed ones in their place.
- 5. No owner or occupier of premises shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of closet pans or their contents, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons appointed in that behalf by the council, and such pans and their contents shall be removed by the contractor at such times and in such manner as the council may from time to time direct.
- 6. Every occupier and every person having the control or management of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such carth-closet to be immediately on deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle. receptacle.
- 7. For the use of each pan supplied to him and for the removal and disposal of its contents, each owner or occupier shall pay to the council, half-yearly and in advance, a sum equal to Ninepence (9d.) per week.

8. If any person commit a breach of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Tenpounds and not less than Five shillings, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

9. This by-law will come into operation on the day after publication in the Government Gazette.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do hereby make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the beforementioned rates; and, where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water rrom the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons. Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre; and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

BRIGHT WATERWORKS TRUST—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1892.

THE Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements, liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1892, in respect of water supplied by the Trust, within the urban district of the said Trust:—

1. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land, of an annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house, tenement, piece, or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One, shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Twe pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charges shall be Five shillings for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, and on the 1st day of July, 1892.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.



Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary. Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at cace emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box. Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by Gazette notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

- 1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or caten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; cats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from caten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for caten or wheaten hay.
- 2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depôt may be called upon to supply any other Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, and for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.
- 4. The forage; when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net.weight, to be indorated on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

 5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
- 6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

- 7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
- the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

 8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

 9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing: and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
- 10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulet, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- 11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- 12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1892, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
