A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., cap. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation: And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, Sir Robert George Crookshank Hamilton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief as aforesaid, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do, by this my Proclamation, prorogue the said Federal Council.

FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the seventeenth day of

February, 1891, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the seventeenth day of February, 1891, until Tuesday, the thirty-first day of March now next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased, upon the recommendation of the Public Service Board, to approve of the following alteration in the Regulations made on the 23rd day of December, 1890, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133):—

CHAPTER VII.

INSURANCE.

Repeal—Clause 6.

Add—Clause 6.—If the person assured under any policy providing for the payment of a sum of money elect or be required under the provisions of sections 143 or 145 of the Act to remain in the Public Service after he has attained the age of sixty years, or if he shall remain in such service beyond the age at which any sum shall become payable under such policy as herein-after provided, the said sum of money shall be held by the company in which such officer is assured until he retire or be removed from the Public Service or depart this life, and such company shall pay the officer so assured interest half-yearly at the rate then allowed by the Government Savings Bank for deposits on the sum accrued on such policy from the date of its maturing and until the time the officer so assured retire from the Public Service or depart this life: Provided that when any person shall have obtained a policy before his entrance into the service, payable at an earlier age than sixty years, such policy may be accepted by the Board if it be in conformity in all other respects with these Regulations.

Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890* the Veterinary Board of Victoria is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and rescind regulations for the purpose of carrying the said Act into effect, and whereas such regulations require to be confirmed by the Governor in Council, therefore the said board doth hereby rescind the regulations made under *The Veterinary Surgeons Act 1887*, and make the subjoined regulations in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act (that is to say):—

ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF BOARD.

1. *Appointment of returning officer.*—The board shall, from time to time, appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person who is registered as a qualified veterinary surgeon, and not being a member of the board, to be returning officer, and to conduct the election of members of the board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. *Date of triennial election.*—In the month of May, in the year 1891, and in the month of May, 1894, and in the month of May in every next succeeding third year thenceforward, the returning officer shall proceed to the election of seven persons, being registered veterinary surgeons of Victoria, to serve as members of the Veterinary Board of Victoria.

3. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.*—If any extraordinary vacancy shall occur in the board after the period of the first election hereinbefore mentioned, and before the triennial election then next ensuing, the returning officer shall, upon being notified by the board that an extraordinary vacancy has occurred, proceed to the election of a person being a registered veterinary surgeon to fill such extraordinary vacancy, and the person so elected shall hold office until the next ensuing triennial election and no longer.

4. *Returning officer to give notice of day of election and day of nomination, and of the time and place when and where nominations will be received.*—At every election for members to serve on the board, the returning officer shall give twenty-one days' notice by advertisement in the *Argus*, *Age*, and *Daily Telegraph*, or such other papers as may from time to time be approved of by the board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such board, and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided, and he shall also in such advertisement name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

5. *How elections shall be made.*—Should the nominations exceed the number of vacancies to be filled, an election by ballot shall be held, otherwise the returning officer shall declare those nominated duly elected.

6. *Candidates to give twelve days' notice to registrar.*—Each candidate for election to serve on the board shall give the registrar at least twelve days' notice of his intention to become a candidate for a seat on the board.

7. *Returning officer to ascertain number of votes of each candidate in presence of registrar and scrutineers—Casting vote of returning officer—Candidates declared duly elected.*—The returning officer shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, having six days previously posted to every registered veterinary surgeon to his address appearing in the Veterinary Register of Victoria, a voting-paper in the form given in Schedule IV. to these regulations, proceed in the presence of the registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon, and which have been returned to him and to take out the voting-papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied after comparing each of the signatures in such voting-papers with signatures of the voters in the signature-book hereinafter referred to and that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote. Provided always that if any person entitled to vote be unable to write the returning officer if requested by such person before the expiration of the time fixed for receiving votes and being satisfied with the voter's identity shall fill up for him his voting-paper as directed by the voter and obtain and attest his mark thereto and receive and deal with the same as the vote of such voter; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election the returning officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate and shall declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Veterinary Board of Victoria.

8. *Voting-paper may become invalid—Voting-paper to be delivered to address of returning officer.*—If any voter shall suffer to remain upon any voting-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto the vote given in and by such paper shall be rejected by the returning officer. The voter shall enclose such voting-paper in an envelope furnished to him with the printed address of the returning officer thereon, and shall cause the same to be received by the returning officer before the hour fixed for holding such election.

9. *How candidates may retire.*—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election desire to retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature, such candidate, not later than eight clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice stating

same, retaining the block counterpart of such receipt. He shall, once in each week, pay over to the treasurer the amount of money received by him during the week, and obtain the treasurer's signature upon each block counterpart for the money therein mentioned.

23. *Registrar to preserve certificates.*—The registrar shall receive and preserve certificates, cards, or tickets issued by the examiners signifying that examinations have been passed.

24. *Form of register for veterinary surgeons.*—The registrar shall keep "The Veterinary Register of Victoria" in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule to the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*.

25. *Signature of registered veterinary surgeons.*—The registrar shall from time to time keep and maintain a signature book, containing the signature of each and every registered veterinary surgeon, which shall be arranged in alphabetical order, and shall produce such book for the inspection of the returning officer appointed by the board on the day of the holding each and every election provided for by these regulations.

TREASURER.

26. *Appointment of honorary treasurer.*—The board may from time to time appoint one of their number as honorary treasurer, who shall find security in the sum of One hundred pounds sterling, and may pay to such honorary treasurer, out of the moneys accruing under this Act, a sum sufficient to recoup him for any premiums he may have to pay to any fidelity or guarantee society for obtaining such security as aforesaid.

27. *Duties of treasurer.*—It shall be the duty of the honorary treasurer to receive all moneys from the registrar, and to lodge the same in some bank appointed by the board, to the credit of an account, headed "Veterinary Board of Victoria," and to pay by cheque, signed by the treasurer and two members of the board, such accounts as the board may from time to time order by resolution, which shall specify the sums of money to be paid and to whom.

28. *Monthly statement of treasurer and annual balance-sheet.*—The treasurer shall present to the board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and he shall also, in the month of January in each year, prepare and present to the board an annual balance-sheet showing the exact financial position of the affairs of the board.

AUDITORS.

29. *Appointment of auditors and term of office.*—The board may appoint, in the month of March in each year, two fit and proper persons as auditors, who shall hold office until the month of March in the following year, and the board may pay out of the moneys accruing under the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, a fee of Two pounds two shillings to each of such auditors.

30. *Duties of auditors.*—The auditors shall inspect the books and accounts of the board, and examine the annual balance-sheet prepared by the treasurer, and shall certify to the same if correct, and they shall also investigate and examine all contracts, accounts, invoices, parcels, bills, and vouchers in anywise, relating to or concerning the same which may be kept by or in the possession of the treasurer and registrar, and they shall also examine the bank pass-book, and ascertain that it corresponds with the account of the board in the bank, and they shall present an annual report to the board stating the result of their inspection and examination.

EXAMINERS.

31. *Appointment of examiners, and how paid.*—The board shall annually appoint three of their number, or three other fit persons, to act as examiners, and may pay out of the moneys accruing under the Act such fees as they may from time to time determine to any examiner other than a member of the board.

32. *Vacancy in the examiners' board, how filled.*—The board shall from time to time fill up any vacancy in the office of examiner.

33. *When examinations shall be held.*—The examiners shall meet as often as may be required for the purpose of conducting examinations at such time as may be directed by the board, and such examiners shall report the result of every examination to the board at the next meeting immediately following the same.

34. *Examiners may recommend the granting or refusal of diploma.*—The examiners may recommend the granting or refusal to such persons as shall have tendered themselves for examination as in their discretion may seem fit diplomas of competent skill, knowledge, and qualification, and such recommendation, in writing, shall be delivered by the examiners to the registrar and submitted at the next regular meeting of the board for its approval, and on approval such persons shall be entitled to the diploma of the board.

35. *Recommendations to be preserved.*—The registrar shall receive and preserve the recommendations issued by the examiners specifying what examinations have been passed.

EXAMINATIONS.

36. *Students to pass three examinations.*—Students shall be required to pass the three examinations hereinafter mentioned before the examiners appointed by the board, before being entitled to diplomas of competency or registration under the said Act.

37. *When examinations shall be held.*—Two examinations shall be held during each year, *i.e.*, in June and November, and students for the final examinations shall be examined in the practical before the oral portion. Each student is to be examined by each of the examiners at the practical examination for not less than a quarter of an hour.

38. *Subjects to be examined at first examination.*—At the first examination a student shall be examined in Materia Medica and Pharmacy (one table, one examiner), Chemistry and Toxicology (one table, one examiner), Botany (one table, one examiner).

39. *Subjects of second examination.*—At the second examination a student shall be examined on the Anatomy of the Horse and the Domesticated Animals (two tables, two examiners), Physiology and Histology (one table, one examiner).

40. *Subjects of third examination.*—A student in his final examination shall be examined on Morbid Anatomy, Pathology, Pathological Toxicology (one table, two examiners), Diseases of the Horse, including Veterinary Medicine, Surgery, and Therapeutics (one table, two examiners), Diseases of the Domestic Animals, including Veterinary Medicine, Surgery, and Therapeutics (one table, two examiners). He shall also undergo a practical examination as to the soundness and diseases of horses, in writing of certificates, prescriptions, and in dispensing medicines (two examiners), likewise as to the diseases of other domesticated animals, and in writing of certificates (two examiners).

41. *Terms to be used by examiners.*—The terms to be used by the examiners in their record of examinations are "Very good," "Good," "Sufficient," "Indifferent," and "Bad."

42. *Names of students who have passed.*—The examiners shall specially notify to the board the names of the students who have passed at the final examination with "Great credit" or with "Very great credit."

43. *President to attend examination.*—The president, or senior member of the board deputed by him, will be expected to attend and superintend the examinations once at least in the year.

FEES.

44. *Fees, Schedule III.*—The scale of fees specified in Schedule III. to these regulations shall be those payable to the registrar of the board before examination or registration, as provided by section 14 of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, in lieu of, and in substitution for, the fees specified in the Second Schedule to the said Act.

45. *Appropriation of fees.*—The board shall be at liberty out of any moneys coming to its hands, under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, or of these regulations, to pay and discharge all costs, charges, and expenses, debts, liabilities, and obligations incurred by it howsoever in connexion with framing these regulations or carrying out the provisions of the said Act and regulations, and all matters and things done thereunder.

APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION.

46. *Schedules V. and VI.*—Every application for registration shall be in the form of a declaration by the applicant, showing that he is entitled thereto under the provisions of the *Veterinary Surgeons Act 1890*, supported by such corroborative evidence as the board may in each case, in its absolute discretion, require; and the application of a person other than a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons of Great Britain, or of any college or school recognised by the board, shall be in the form prescribed in Schedule V. and shall be supported by a declaration in the form prescribed in Schedule VI. to these regulations; and every applicant shall, before registration, sign his name in the registrar's signature-book hereinbefore referred to.

47. The veterinary colleges and schools whose certificates or diplomas of competency as a veterinary surgeon will be recognised by the board are the following:—

- The College of Alfort, at Paris, in France.
- The College of Lyons, in France.
- The College at Berlin, in Prussia.
- The College at Copenhagen, in Denmark.
- The College at New York, in the United States of America.
- The College at Bombay, in the Empire of India.
- The College at Montreal, in Canada, America.
- The College at Stockholm, in Sweden.

And such other colleges and schools as may from time to time be approved and recognised by a resolution of the board.

48. The board shall, on approval of the application and payment of the proper fees of a person entitled otherwise than by examination or to registration under the said Act, grant and cause to be issued to him a certificate of registration in the form specified in Schedule II. to these regulations under the seal of the board.

CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THE Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, has made the following Rules, Regulations, and Orders respecting the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply, the same being a work constructed under the authority of the said Act, viz:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The district which shall be rated for the Castlemaine and Sandhurst District Water Supply shall be the whole of the Borough of Castlemaine, the whole of the Borough of Chewton, the whole of the United Shire of Mount Alexander, the whole of the United Shire of Metcalfe, the whole of the City of Sandhurst, the whole of the Borough of Eaglehawk, the whole of the Shire of Marong, the whole of the Shire of Huntly, the whole of the Shire of Strathfeldsaye, and the whole of the Shire of Maldon.

3. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board within the said district, that is to say:—

- (i.) On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, One pound per annum.
- (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of £5 per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and Two pounds five shillings per centum on the amount of valuation in excess of £700.
- (iii.) On every shop not used as a domicile above the annual value of £20, a rate of £4 per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive; Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700; and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.
- (iv.) The rates to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (v.) The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Board from the mains by measure shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, except in cases hereinafter specially mentioned.
- (vi.) For water supplied from the mains for building purposes the minimum rate shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per month, except in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (vii.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes, including sluicing, the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (viii.) For water supplied from the channels to crushing mills, pyrites works, &c., the rate shall be Threepence per 1,000 gallons.
- (ix.) For water supplied from the mains to gardens, nurseries, vineyards, or other lands cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket grounds, the rate shall be Sixpence (6d.) per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels for like purposes the rate shall be Twopence (2d.) per 1,000 gallons. All such supplies from the channels shall be continuous or regularly intermittent, and the minimum amount of water to be supplied shall be 30,000 gallons per month, to be made in one (1) delivery; and the water shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply shall from time to time direct.
- (x.) For water supplied to any cemetery the rate shall be Fourpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (xi.) For water supplied to any public parks or gardens the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (xii.) The rate to be charged for water supplied for sluicing purposes from the main aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be One halfpenny (½d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge to any consumer shall be for not less than 1,000,000 gallons per month. Water supplied from the aqueducts for sluicing purposes shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply may from time to time direct.
- (xiii.) For water supplied to any trough the rate shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per annum.

(xiv.) The rate to be charged for water supplied for gas-engines shall be Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied from the mains or pipes shall be:—

- (i.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure; and
- (ii.) If for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter.

5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables, or a supply for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purposes. No hose or pipe is to be supplied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls or a carriage, or for any similar purpose unless the water is charged for by a meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

6. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Board, who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

9. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

10. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board without giving two days' notice to the Board or the local inspector of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe-work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

12. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or service-pipe therefrom, without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted. No service-pipe of a larger bore than half (½) inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Board.

13. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings, all joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

14. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

15. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting of the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to be run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter shall be capable of registering at least one million gallons.

18. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair, or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

19. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with, except upon written application to and the approval of the Board.

20. Baths supplied from the pipes, except when the supply is by meter, must not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line, by a mean width of two feet, and a depth of one foot nine inches, with the ends sloping inwards. Over-flow pipes will not be permitted.

21. Any person whether licensed as aforesaid or not connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

22. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush, and the supply shall be by meter.

23. If any person supplied with water by the Board does or causes to be done anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully, or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

24. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be applied to the streets by carts or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

25. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock and Six o'clock a.m.

26. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations and not otherwise.

27. In the construction of these rules and regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include the corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

BACCHUS MARSH IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust do hereby make this Regulation for annual rating and other charges and purposes as follows:—

1. For every house or tenement of £20 annual value or under, situated within the area supplied by the water mains of the Trust, the minimum sum of £1 per annum shall be charged.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20 used partly or wholly as a domicile, 5 per cent on the annual value.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, not being a domicile, 3½ per cent on the annual value; minimum, £1.

4. For water supplied from channels for irrigation purposes the rate shall be 1d. per 1,000 gallons, which is equivalent to 6d. per 1,000 cubic feet. Delivery shall be made of not less than 60,000 gallons at one time, and the water shall be delivered from the channels at such times and in such manner as may from time to time be directed by regulations made by the Trust.

5. All measurement of water for irrigation shall be by gauges, approved, fixed, and kept in repair at the expense of the owner or occupier of the land irrigated, and to the satisfaction of the Trust. The registration of the quantity supplied shall be made by an officer of the Trust, and the gauges shall not be removed or interfered with without the consent of such officer.

6. Delivery of water for irrigation shall be taken at such times and in such order as the Trust shall direct, and, if absolutely necessary, shall be continued on Sunday. Every person shall receive notification of the time when water will be supplied to him, and to what extent.

7. Any person not being duly authorized who shall open irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause damage to the works of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

8. Applications for water for irrigation shall be accompanied by cash for payment of same to the amount covering quantity required, but the Trust shall not necessarily deliver the full amount of any such order thus received. Any sum paid for water not supplied will be returned to the applicant.

9. For every water trough the sum of 10s. per annum shall be paid.

10. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, 10s. per annum on each inch of the diameter of the cylinder.

11. The rate to be charged for water supplied by the Trust from any stand-pipe shall be 1s. for one load of 200 gallons or less, and for each additional 100 gallons or part thereof, 6d.

12. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement from the mains (except a special agreement be made) 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons shall be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purposes of irrigation, or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows: The minimum charge to be 10s. per annum when garden is under 1-16th of an acre, and watered without a hose:—

1-16th of an acre and less, per annum	8,000
Exceeding 1-16th of an acre, but not exceeding ¼ acre, per annum	12,000
Exceeding ¼ acre, but not exceeding ½ acre, per annum	16,000
Exceeding ½ acre, but not exceeding ¾ acre, per annum	28,000
Exceeding ¾ acre, but not exceeding 1 acre, per annum	34,000
Exceeding 1 acre, but not exceeding 1 acre, per annum	40,000

And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

In cases of extensions of area supplied, or new applications from persons desirous of obtaining a supply of water by measurement during the currency of the year, all such applications granted subsequent to 30th June in any year shall be entitled to a rebate of one-half the annual charge.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 3,000 gallons per stall used for above purposes. Each space of five feet shall be charged for as a stall.

13. For water supplied by the Trust to public parks, gardens, or show-yards (except a special agreement be made) 6d. per 1,000 gallons shall be charged; and to market gardens, nurseries, and vineyards cultivated for trade purposes, 1s. per 1,000 gallons.

14. In lieu of any of the measurement charges in this regulation the Trust may, whenever it shall be deemed expedient, or any person obtaining water from the mains, may cause a meter or meters to be affixed, such to be provided at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at rates to be fixed by written agreement for a period of not less than six months. The annual water rate payable on shire assessment to go in liquidation of such charges by measurement, and be supplemented by any additional amount required. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

15. For a temporary supply during erection of buildings a charge of 5s. per week during period of erection, with a minimum of 10s., or by meter, as mentioned in clause 14. When a special connexion with the main has to be made the applicant must pay the cost of such connexion.

16. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stable, or a supply for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation of grass plots, gardens, or grounds, either by manual conveyance or mechanical or artificial contrivance for transporting water to the roots of plants, or trees, or grasses, either with or without labour; or for water power; or for fountains or any ornamental purpose. No

hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants unless the water is supplied by measure, computed by acreage as above, or by meter.

17. If any meter should cease registering, from period of such cessation, and during the time when it is undergoing repair, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

18. Fire-plugs shall not be used except for purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

19. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

20. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe or channel, without being authorized by the Trust to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

21. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run waste, or for the purpose of irrigating gardens, &c., without paying the charges imposed by these regulations and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each breach.

22. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

23. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

24. No person (whether a licensed plumber or not) shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such breach.

25. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, open, or injure any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, weir, channel, reservoir, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

26. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on the water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of £2, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of £2 shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good or restoring the said footpath or otherwise as the Trust may deem best.

27. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of £5; and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of £2 for each day after notice from the Trust.

28. Overflow waste-pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

29. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as the Trust may deem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier, if any, and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair, or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of £2 for each day after notice of offence from the Trust.

30. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of £2 for each offence.

31. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention to these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which, under any of these regulations, ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

32. In construction of these regulations the word "person" shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st January, 1891, and ending on the 31st December, 1891, and shall be paid half-yearly in advance on the 1st January and 1st July, 1891; and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust may from time to time approve of for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1884* it was amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council might by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Part VIII. of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and

the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of the said Act, and bearing date the first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should, cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber from the unappropriated Crown lands in the parishes of Moora, Murchison, Waranga, and Whroo, county of Rodney, comprised within the boundaries specified therein: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation aforesaid, so far only as the same relates to live timber, which, at a height of two feet from the surface of the ground, is twenty-four inches or more in diameter.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground is broken or vault re-opened.
2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
3. Orders for interment to be given to the trustees or sexton at least eight hours previous to interment.
4. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug but when a brick or other grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the directions of the trustees or whom they may appoint.
5. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be punctually observed.
6. The usual hours for the performance of funerals shall be from sunrise to sunset until otherwise ordered.
7. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.
8. Plan of every monument or headstone must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
9. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
10. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept which may be examined.
11. No burial will be allowed to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar or coroner holding an inquest or inquiry on the body to be interred, or from a magistrate, such certificate must be delivered to the person in charge at the cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.
12. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROYAL PARK, MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890*, power is given to the Trustees of any Crown lands heretofore reserved from sale for any public purpose whatsoever with the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of such lands vested in them or any part thereof, or for the preservation of good order and decency in such lands: Now therefore the Trustees of the Royal Park, in pursuance of the power as aforesaid, do hereby make the Rules and Regulations following to be observed and enforced in the Royal Park, Melbourne:—

1. All rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of the Royal Park, Melbourne, are hereby rescinded.
2. The gates of the park shall be open for horses and private vehicles from sunrise to sunset.
3. No public conveyance, cart, or vehicle plying for hire or bearing other name or number, shall, in any case, be permitted to use any of the roads of the park as a thoroughfare.
4. Vehicles shall approach the entrance to the Zoological and Acclimatisation Society's Gardens from the south, and after setting down passengers, shall be removed to the site set apart as a carriage stand. No horse shall stand within the gardens, or be attached to any of the fences around them.
5. No person shall ride or drive on the grass or on the footways, and all persons using the carriage ways shall keep the proper side of the road as on public roads.
6. No person shall enter the park for the purpose of breaking in horses, or training or exercising horses, or break in, train, or exercise horses within the park, or jump horses over any of the fences, or drive cattle or sheep through the park.
7. No person shall climb any of the fences or trees, or damage the same by cutting or otherwise defacing the same, or stick bills on the trees, fences, or gates, or lie on the seats, or, without the sanction of the trustees, remove any wood, gravel, stone, sand, earth, or other material from the park.
8. No person shall bring any dog into the park unless held by a chain or cord, or discharge firearms, or throw stones, or use any projectile whatever, or molest any of the animals in the park, or, without the sanction of the trustees, kindle any fire therein.
9. No person shall be allowed in the park with firearms of any sort, bows and arrows, shanghaiis, slings, or other such implements.
10. No person shall take birds' nests, or enter upon plots of ground enclosed for plantations or other purposes.
11. No public meeting or assemblage of people for any purpose shall be held in the park without the sanction of the trustees.
12. No person taking part in sports of any kind (or under any other circumstances) shall appear in the park except in decent costume.
13. No person shall (unless by permission in writing of the trustees) sell or offer for sale any article of merchandise or trade within the park.
14. No person shall leave empty bottles, or broken glass, or crockery, paper, or any other litter in the park, or beat carpets, or dry clothes, or commit any nuisance.
15. Preaching or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected, shall not be permitted within the park.
16. All goats and poultry found within the park shall be liable to be destroyed.
17. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports, shall not be played or take place in any part of the park on Sundays.

18. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or taking part in a fight or disturbance, or committing in the park any act of indecency, or appearing in indecent costume, or making use of foul, indecent, threatening, or abusive language to or within hearing of any other person, may be forthwith removed by any Crown lands bailiff or police constable.

19. 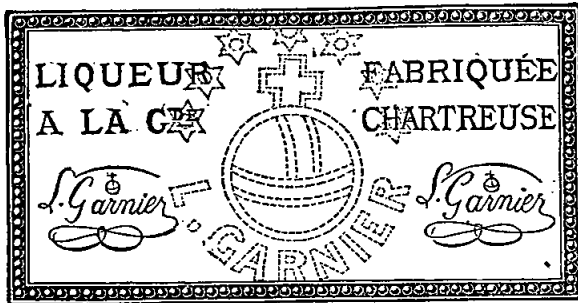

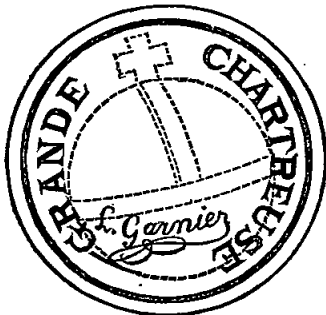
