Three first prizes, of Forty pounds each, will be awarded: One for the best farm in the northern districts, one for the best farm in the southern districts, and one for the best farm in the Mallee district of the colony. A second prize of Ten pounds will be awarded for the second best farm in each of the above districts.
2. The work of selecting the most suitable farms for competition will be entrusted to the Agricultural Societies.
3. Notice of nomination must be forwarded to the Secretary for Agriculture, Government Offices, Melbourne, not later than the 14th October, 1890.
4. The notice must contain full particulars as to the name and place of address of the owners, and where the farm is situated.
5. The competition is to be restricted to freeholders in occupation and to Crown tenants.
6. Upon receipt of information as to the farms selected for competition, the Minister of Agriculture may appoint three judges to decide the merits of such farms, and the decision of a majority of such judges shall be final.
7. The judges will be required to communicate to the Minister of Agriculture their decisions; and also to report on the merits of the whole of the farms selected for competition.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers conferred upon us by the Navigation Acts of 1871–1881, we, the Marine Board of New South Wales, hereby make the following Harbor Regulation, that is to say:—

We hereby order and direct that no ship or other description of vessel whatsoever shall be permitted to anchor in the vicinity of a straight line drawn between the north-western portion of Daws' Point and the south-western portion of Milson's Point, in Port Jackson, or otherwise endanger the fresh water pipes which connect these places for the supply of the inhabitants of North Sydney.

For the violation or infringement of this regulation a penalty of not exceeding Fifty pounds will be incurred.

WHEREAS by the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of Part I. of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Regulations for the Victorian Naval Brigade made under the provisions of *The Discipline Act 1870*, and bearing date the 8th day of October, 1888 (that is to say):—

IN SECTION VI.—COMMAND AND RANK.

Para. 2 is cancelled, and the following is substituted:—

“Officers of the Naval Brigade shall rank with officers of Her Majesty's Regular Forces as juniors of their respective ranks, and rank with officers of the Permanent Force of the Colony according to the rank and date of their commissions.”

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan may be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands; whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a waterworks district;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it is further enacted that the Governor in Council may, where a waterworks district is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the Northern Riding of the Shire of Huntly, for a loan of Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£3,500) for the purpose of taking over from the Railway Department and the Huntly Shire Council the existing waterworks at Elmore, the erection of a water tower and tank, and the extension of reticulation within the township of Elmore, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application deposited in the Department of Victorian Water Supply; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The taking over of the said works constructed by the Railway Department and by the Huntly Shire Council within the aforesaid township of Elmore, the erection of a water tower and tank and the extension of reticulation within the township of Elmore, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust in accordance with the said application by the Councillors for the Northern Riding of the Shire of Huntly.

(2) That the Councillors for the Northern Riding of the said Shire of Huntly municipal district and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Three thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£3,500), for the purpose of taking over the aforesaid works from the Railway Department and the Huntly Shire Council, the erection of a water tower and tank, and the extension of reticulation within the township of Elmore, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the Waterworks Trust hereby constituted shall have authority shall be that portion of the Shire of Huntly included within the boundaries hereunder described, viz.:—

The township of Elmore: Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Campaspe River where the north side of the road forming the north boundary of section 7, parish of Elmore, abuts thereon; bounded thence by roads bearing respectively west sixty-five chains twenty links more or less, N. 9° 45' E. eighty chains fifty-nine links, east seventy-two chains seventy-five links, and south thirty-one chains more or less to the Campaspe River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement.

(5) The principal works to be constructed shall consist of the erection of a water tower and tank, and the extension of the existing reticulation within the township of Elmore.

(6) The name of the Trust shall be the Elmore Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

The following Regulations shall apply to that portion of the Waterworks district of the Seymour Waterworks Trust proclaimed an urban district by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of February, 1891, the boundaries of which urban district are fully described in the *Government Gazette* of the 6th February, 1891, page 764.

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements, situated within the aforesaid water district and liable to be rated, shall pay for the year 1891, in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July in such year.

(1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure :—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling for every one thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be Twenty thousand gallons per half year, or a quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive, according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) The stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, One shilling.
- (3) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the event of there not being any contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed by the Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust this 20th day of February, 1891, and the seal of the said Trust was hereto affixed in the presence of—

REGULATION No. 2.

THE Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations :—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises to which it is supplied, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
2. Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, hydrant, or any public or private service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for that purpose; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such breach.
4. When water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter, or under special agreement, the supply shall be through service-pipes of the following diameter, viz., all pipes ($\frac{3}{4}$ in.) three-quarters of an inch, except where a special agreement is made.
5. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water for any livery stables or carriers' stables, or for manufacturing purposes.
6. No person shall apply a hose or pipe to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls, or a carriage, or for any similar purposes, unless where the water is charged for by meter, except by the written authority of the Trust; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.
7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipes to any pipes of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipes or service-pipes, cocks, or fittings connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipes, service-pipes, cocks, or fittings as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
8. Before any such licence being granted by the Trust, the person applying shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.
9. The quality of material required in laying private services shall be as follows :—
(1) The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles (except those connecting the service-pipes and mains), bends, reducing couplings, plugs, &c., to be of the best galvanized iron.

- (2) All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of the same.
- (3) All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, trees, &c., &c.
- (4) The whole of the pipes, tees, bends, &c., to be sound and free from all defects, and capable of a hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water 400 feet.
- (5) All delivery cocks and thimbles for connecting the service-pipes and mains to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship, and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows, bends, &c. All cocks and thimbles to stand the same pressure as the pipes.
- (6) No service-pipes shall be laid at a depth below the surface of the ground less than 10 inches.

10. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust; each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Trust. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

13. No person shall, without the written permission of the Trust, water streets or thoroughfares by means of a hydrant and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

14. The fire-plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires, unless any other use of them is allowed in writing by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of the officers of the Trust.

15. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of premises, or of any land or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying on of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundaries of such land, premises, or tenements abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

16. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charges imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

18. The officers of the Trust shall have power at all reasonable times to enter any house, building, or land through or into which water is supplied by the Trust by measure or otherwise in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring, conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or preventing waste, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or land for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus, the property of the Trust, and if any person hinder such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

19. The water supply in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

20. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole. The word "officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean any officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Trust" shall be deemed to mean the Seymour Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed by the Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust this 20th day of February, 1891, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

MELBOURNE WATER SUPPLY.

BY-LAWS.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, make the by-laws following:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

i. On every house or tenement of £20 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300.

iii. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300, and One pound per centum on the amount of such valuation in excess of £300.

iv. Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except where in the opinion of the Board a meter shall be necessary.

v. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler, except where in the opinion of the Board a meter shall be necessary.

vi. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be— at the Melbourne wharves, Three shillings per one thousand gallons; at other places, Four shillings per one thousand gallons.

vii. Water for horses, where the number kept on one tenement does not exceed two, will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse, and water for cows up to three in number, kept or partially kept on premises, at the rate of Five shillings for each cow, but it shall be optional for the owners of same to take the supply by measure.

In instances where the above numbers are exceeded, the supply of water must be by measure.

viii. The Board may supply water for the making and mixing of concrete at the rate of Twopence per cubic yard, and for masonry and brickwork at the rate of Three halfpence per cubic yard, as measured in the work.

ix. Water supplied by the Board by measurement will be charged at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic the minimum charge will be 25,000 gallons per quarter.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per thousand gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period and be from time to time renewable as the Board shall see fit, and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person; whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. and galvanized-iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services.

Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed ½ inch.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million gallons.

17. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of, the Board.

19. Baths to be fitted must not exceed 6ft. 3in. in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 3in.; the section of bottom to be a segment of a circle, the ends to be circular in shape and sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

20. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

21. No person shall, without the written permission of the Board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

22. The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the Water Supply Branch of the Department of Public Works, and any person not duly authorized turning on the water or otherwise interfering with such water supply shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

24. No tap shall be placed in any garden or yard, or to or outside of any dwelling or premises supplied with the water of the Board, unless a water-meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

25. In the construction of these by-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time, under regulations to be made for such purpose, to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and place it under the management of any borough or shire council or mining board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner in which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite two or more commons, or add to such common any selection which may have been taken up within the area of such common and subsequently abandoned; and it is also enacted that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published, and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundred and twenty-eighth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a common the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

REDESDALE, EMBERTON, AND METCALFE COMMON.—Three thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight acres, more or less, county of Dalhousie, parishes of Redesdale, Emberton, and Metcalfe, being the several portions of land hereinafter described, viz.:

One thousand nine hundred acres, more or less, being the Timber reserve and all unappropriated Crown lands situate in the parish of Redesdale;

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division eight of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove ironbark timber, which, at a height of three feet from the surface of the ground, is of a less diameter than twenty-four inches, on or from the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Amherst, Bet Bet, Bung Bong, Carisbrook, Craigie, Eglinton, Lillieur, Maryborough, and Wareek. —(91.B.57206.)

KYNETON RESERVE FOR RACING AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION.—REGULATIONS.

WE, Salathiel Booth, George Walker Johnson, Andrew Thomson, Martin McKenna, John Elder Andrews, James Forster, and Henry Lennox Buscombe, a majority of the duly appointed trustees of the land in the parish of Lauriston, at Kyneton, permanently reserved for racing and recreation

purposes, and for drilling and reviewing volunteers, having framed the following supplementary regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall, after the date of the making hereof, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker upon any portion of the reserve unless and until he shall comply with the following conditions:—

1st. That he be registered annually, or for each or for any race meeting, as a bookmaker by the committee of management or the committee or stewards of the Kyneton District Racing Club, or by those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards.

2nd. That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket or badge to be supplied by the committee of management, committee, or stewards aforesaid, or by those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which ticket or badge shall be visible to the public and shall have his name legibly printed thereon.

3rd. The fee for registration of every such person as a bookmaker under the foregoing regulation shall be (a) if registered annually the sum of £2, and (b) if registered for any single race meeting the sum of £1 for each and every such race meeting.

2. The foregoing Regulations shall apply only to the days on which race meetings shall be held in the reserve by the Kyneton District Racing Club or under its auspices.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

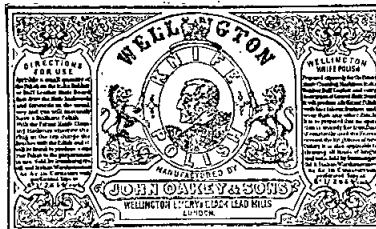
