PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the Banks and Currency Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday at Avoca, as a Public Holiday at Tarnagulla, and as a Bank Holiday at Dunelly; THURSDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Colac*, and as a Bank Holiday at Cobram, Colac, Stratford, and within the Shire of Maffra; THURSDAY, THE 12TH, AND FRIDAY, THE 13TH DAYS OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as Public Half-Holidays (from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day) within the Shire of Maffra;

FRIDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Alexandra;

TUESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday at Seymour and within the Boroughs of Koroit and Rutherglen; as a Public Holiday at Ballarat, Macarthur, Warrnambool,* within the Borough of Inglewood, within the Shires of Avon, Mansfield, North Ovens, Omeo,* Oxley, Rutherglen, Traralgon,* and Yarrawonga, the East Riding of the Shire of Melton, the East Riding of the Shire of Warrnambool,* and as a Bank Holiday at Donald, Eaglehawk, Epsom, Garvoc, Horsham, Inglewood, Mirboo North, Moe, Omeo, Panmure, Rochester, Sandhurst, St. Arnaud, Tungamah, Wangaratta, Warracknabeal, Winchelsea, Yarra Glen, and within the Shires of Maffra and Tambo;
WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Roward of Maryborough and the Shire of Dunday and as a Bank Holiday at Swan

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Borough of Maryborough and the Shire of Dundas, and as a Bank Holiday at Swan THURSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shires of Bulleen and Doncaster, and as a Bank Holiday at Morwell;

THURSDAY, THE 19TH, AND FRIDAY," THE 20TH DAYS OF MARCH INSTANT, to be observed as Public Holidays within the Shire of Traralgon;

FRIDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Boort, Kyabram, and Violet Town;

MONDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Wangaratta;

Tuesday, the 24th, and Wednesday, the 25th days of march instant,*

to be observed as Public Holidays, within the Boroughs of Maryborough and Talbot; and as Public Half-Helidays (from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day) within the Shire of Tullaroop;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shires of Glenlyon and Mount Franklin;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shires of Buln Buln, the North and South Ridings of the Shire of Melton, and the
North Riding of the Shire of Ripon, and as a Bank Holiday at Beaufort and Drouin;

Tuesday, the 31st day of March instant, to be observed as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday throughout Victoria;

FRIDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF APRIL NEXT.*

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Borough of Rutherglen.
