PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

TUESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Borough of Wangaratta and the Shires of Marong and Narracan.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and in the fifty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
