PROCIAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

The Pursuance of the provisions contained in the Public Service Act 1830 (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the Banks and Currency Act 1820 (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday at Hamilton;

THORSDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shires of Heidelberg and Narracan and the Northern and Southern Ridings of the Shire of Eltham; FRIDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday at Violet Town,* and as a Bank Holiday at Harrow and Jamieson;

SATURDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Port Albert;

Monday, the 23rd day of March instant, to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Borough of Wangaratta,* and as a Bank Holiday at Kingston and Smeaton;

TUESDAY, THE 24TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Dookie;

WEDNESDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, to be observed as a Public Holiday and Bank Holiday within the Borough of Daylesford and at Drysdale, and as a Public Holiday at Portarlington; THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Lillydale, and as a Bank Holiday at Gordon;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF APRIL NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday at Queenscliff;

FRIDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF APRIL NEXT,

to be observed as a Public Holiday* and Bank Holiday within the Shire of Chiltern, and as a Public Holiday at Beechworth.* * For Races.
