## COSTS CLAIMED BY MEMBERS OF POLICE FORCE.

THE attention of Clerks of Petty Sessions is invited to the following notice which appeared in a recent issue of the *Victoria Police Gazette*.—

"In all cases in which the police prosecute offenders before Courts of Petty Sessions, and succeed in obtaining convictions, it is directed that they shall apply to the magistrates to make an order against the convicted persons for payment of such costs as the prosecuting members of the force or other police witnesses are entitled to claim for expenses or allowances."

"Failing such application being made, claims against the Law Department for allowances, &c., as witnesses, which members of the force may submit, will not be entertained."

With reference to the above, it is notified that every such claim must show, in cases where a conviction was obtained, why an order was not made for costs, and the claim paid from such costs; or, if no conviction was obtained, that fact should be stated.

The births of 1,259 children, viz., 678 boys and 581 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. In the month of January, 1,316 births were registered, or 57 more than in the month under review. The births were 321 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 29 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 733, viz., 416 of males and 317 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 526, or 72 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 141, and exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 62. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 147.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.63, and of deaths registered 1.53.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 100.6° on the 14th, and the lowest was 45.0° on the 6th. The mean temperature of the month (64.0°) was a degree and two-thirds below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.4°) took place on the 14th, and the least range (10.8°) on the 26th, the mean daily range being 21.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.201 inches on the 26th, and the lowest was 29.512 inches on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.921 inches) differed from the average by a fraction only.

Rain fell on 4 days, the amount of rainfall being 0.37 inch. The average rainfall in February during the previous ten years was 1.35 inches, or about an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 49 per cent. to that mortality, as against 48 per cent. in February, 1890; 52 per cent. in February, 1889; 47 per cent. in February, 1888; 52 per cent. in February, 1887; 48 per cent. in February, 1886; 48 per cent. in February, 1885; 40 per cent. in February, 1884; 42 per cent. in February, 1883; 46 per cent. in February, 1882; and 45 per cent. in February, 1881.

Thirty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month.—Of these a labourer, aged 75, died of syncope; a farmer, aged 75, of heart disease and erysipelas; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 73, of enteritis; a chemist, aged 75, of cystitis; a female, aged 76, of carcinoma of the breast; a gentleman, aged 76, of hemiplegia; a groom, aged 76, of chronic bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of exhaustion after an operation for strangulated hernia; a grazier, aged 77, of fatty degeneration of the heart; a saleswoman, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a military captain, aged 78, of chronic rheumatism; a female servant, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 78, of epilepsy and cardiac disease; a housewife, aged 78, of heart disease and cirrhosis of liver; a bootmaker, aged 78, of inflammation of the lungs; a labourer, aged 81, of enlarged prostate; a shoemaker, aged 82, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 82, of heart disease; a female servant, aged 83, of paralysis; a soldier and a widow, aged 83 and 84 respectively, of syncope; a female servant, aged 85, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 85, of gastritis; three females, each aged 75, a male, aged 76, two females, each aged 78, two females, aged 80 and 82 respectively, a labourer, aged 83, a female, aged 84, a male, aged 85, a female, aged 89, and a tailor and a female, each aged 90, of old age.

Thirty-seven violent deaths took place during the month, of which 30 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A hatmaker, aged 70, was passed over by a railway train; a clerk, aged 21, a governess, aged 29, a civil servant, aged 32, and a caretaker, aged 61, died of injuries consequent on falls; a gentle man, aged 46, of fracture of the skull, the result of being thrown from a horse; a bookkeeper, aged 22, of necrosis of knee; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 74, of fractured femur; a female, aged 54, of wound in the vagina—how caused, not stated; a newly-born male infant, of injury to the brain, caused by difficult forceps delivery; a labourer, aged 27, of injuries, the result of a gunshot wound; a male child, aged 10 months, of scalds; a girl, aged 11, of burns; a sailmaker, aged 36, of chronic lead poisoning; a widow, aged 70, of poisoning by taking chlorodyne; a printer, aged 16, a female, aged 31; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, a labourer, aged 47, a male, of occupation unknown, aged 60, and a stonemason, aged 62, were drowned in the River Yarra; a fisherman, aged 26, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a male, of occupation unknown, aged about 45, at Williamstown; a widow, aged 56, in the Port Melbourne Lagoon; and a female, aged 30, at St. Kilda; a newly-born female infant died of suffocation, due to premature and difficult labour; a newly-born female infant and two male infants, aged 2 and 6 months respectively, were overlain; a letter carrier, aged 21, was suffocated whilst vomiting. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born female infant who was suffocated, and a female, aged 20, whose throat was cut—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 23, who cut his throat; a carpenter, aged 71, who drowned himself; a labourer, aged 22, and a bootmaker, aged 41, who hanged themselves; and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 25, who threw himself in front of a passing train.

One hundred and seventeen deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—51 in the Melbourne Hospital, 17 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Pentridge Stockade, 2 in the Infant Asylum, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 361, of which 199, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 162, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 286 were under one year of age, 58 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 372. Of these, 217, or 58 per cent., were males, and 155, or 42 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 28 were between twenty and twenty-five, 43 were between twenty-five and thirty, 26 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 21 were between forty and forty-five, 30 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 25 were between seventy and seventy-five, 22 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 16 were upwards of eighty.

A slight increase occurred in the deaths from typhoid fever and diphtheria as compared with the deaths from those complaints in the month of January. The numbers in the two months, however, were much less than those which occurred in the corresponding period of either of the previous two years. As compared with the numbers in January, deaths from debility, atrophy, and inanition increased by 3, whilst those from diarrheal diseases were fewer by 12; the number in both those months was low considering the season of the year. One death from diphtheritic croup (not included with deaths from diphtheria) occurred in February and a like number in January.

REGULATIONS FOR GRANTING CERTIFICATES  
TO FACTORY ENGINE-DRIVERS AND BOILER  
ATTENDANTS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of section 38 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), has approved of the subjoined Regulations relating to the granting of certificates to factory engine-drivers and boiler attendants in factories and work-rooms, in lieu of the Regulations approved on the 28th July, 1890.

REGULATIONS.

*Preliminary Requirements.*

1. Each applicant for a certificate must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, postal note, or stamps to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate; in the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

*Certificates of Competency.*

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, first and second.

A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or workroom the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or, if a double cylinder engine be used, the combined area thereof must not exceed that of a cylinder 12 inches in diameter.

3. An applicant for a second-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has had not less than twelve months' experience in assisting at the working of an engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room. In cases where candidates are unable from any cause, to produce testimonials from their employers of their having driven engines, the Board will accept a statutory declaration that such candidates drove or assisted to drive a certain engine or engines at certain places for a period of twelve months as evidence of their having had the necessary experience to entitle them to be examined.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. The latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty (50) years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

Candidates must produce testimonials or certificates signed by their employers, and such documents must specify clearly and distinctly the class of engines they have driven. The diameter of the cylinders of the engines driven must be stated on the testimonials.

4. An applicant for a first-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has been the holder of a second-class certificate, under these regulations, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has during that period had charge of and driven a "second-class" engine for a period of not less than six months.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen (19) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty (50) years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

Candidates must produce testimonials or certificates, signed by their employers, and such documents must specify clearly and distinctly the class of engines they have driven. The diameter of the cylinders of the engines driven must be stated on the testimonials.

5. Provided nevertheless that at any series of examinations held at any place, under the provisions of these regulations, the Board may grant a first-class certificate of competency to any such applicant who produces satisfactory evidence that he has had experience in driving, who succeeds in passing the prescribed examination, and who proves to the Board that he is fully competent to drive any and every kind of engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

6. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam-engines and all connexions, boilers, and mountings, or any other machinery used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

7. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than six months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

*Certificates of Service.*

8. The certificates of service to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, first and second.

(a) A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(b) A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or, if a double cylinder engine be used, the combined area thereof must not exceed that of a cylinder 12 inches in diameter.

9. First-class certificates of service will be granted to such candidates as satisfy the Board that they have been in charge of and have efficiently managed and driven an engine the cylinder of which is more than 12 inches in diameter, or a double cylinder engine the cylinders of which have a combined area equal to a single cylinder of more than 12 inches in diameter, used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room for a period of not less than twelve months prior to 3rd November, 1883.

10. Second-class certificates of service will be granted to such candidates as satisfy the Board that they have been in charge of and have efficiently managed and driven an engine used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room the cylinder of which does not exceed 12 inches in diameter, or, if a double cylinder engine be used, the combined area thereof does not exceed that of a cylinder 12 inches in diameter for a period of not less than twelve months prior to 3rd November, 1883.

11. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate of service or of competency by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

*Examinations.*

12. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such times and places as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper or newspapers published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1.

*Miscellaneous.*

13. Whenever a person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee (if any) as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee (if any) herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash, stamps, postal note, or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

14. The holder of a second-class certificate of competency issued under the *Mines Act 1890* and the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall be entitled to drive any "second-class" engine under either Act.

15. Every certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall specify the name, place, and date of birth of the person to whom such certificate is issued.

16. No person in charge of steam machinery used in or in connexion with any factory or work-room shall, under any pretext whatever, unless relieved by a competent person for that purpose, absent himself or cease to have continual supervision of such machinery during the time such machinery is at work.

*Disqualification of Holder of Certificate.*

17. Any person holding a certificate of competency or of service as an engine-driver, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the proper or efficient discharge of his duties, may be called upon by the Board of Examiners to show cause why he should not be disqualified as a certificated engine-driver; and if he fail to satisfy the said Board, he may, by an order of the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, be disqualified for any period from acting as engine-driver.

18. Any such person shall, after such order, deliver into the charge of the said Board his certificate of competency or of service, which shall be retained by the said Board during the period of his disqualification, and no such person shall, during the period of such disqualification, take charge of any machinery in which steam or air is used as motive power.

19. The Board may, if they think fit, hold an inquiry into the conduct of an engine-driver accused of any of the foregoing offences; and with respect to such inquiry the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1) The inquiry shall be held at such time and place as the Board may appoint, the engine-driver to have the right to engage counsel to defend him at such inquiry. He shall receive fourteen days' notice of the Board's intention to hold the inquiry, and if the engine-driver intends to employ counsel he shall give seven days' notice of such intention to the Secretary to the Board.

(2) The Secretary to the Board shall, before the commencement of the inquiry, furnish to the engine-driver a statement of the case upon which the inquiry is instituted.

(3) The engine-driver shall attend such inquiry, and may produce such evidence as may be considered necessary.

(4) The Board shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, forward to the Minister of Mines a report containing a full statement of the case and their opinion thereon.

(5) An engine-driver may, in addition to disqualification, be compelled to defray all or part of the expenses of any inquiry which may be held under the provisions of this clause.

20. The Board may examine candidates, and grant certificates of competency to such of them as satisfy the said Board that they have had the necessary experience as engine-drivers of any class of steam-engines other than factory ones.

21. Every holder of a second-class certificate under these regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a first-class one, and in the event of the latter certificate being granted, his second-class one shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

22. Every candidate for a certificate of competency or service shall, previous to his presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true, and correct in every particular, such declaration to be presented to, and retained by, the Board.

23. The Board may grant certificates of competency to boiler attendants in cases where steam-boilers only are used, and where no engine or engine-driver is employed.

An applicant for a certificate of competency as boiler attendant must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That he has had not less than six months' experience in assisting to work a steam-boiler used in or in connexion with a factory or work-room.

(c) That he is, at the date of examination, not under the age of eighteen (18), nor over the age of fifty (50) years. The latter age is not to apply to persons who have previously worked steam-boilers.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the applicant's employers bearing on this clause may be considered satisfactory evidence.

No. 1120), has approved of the subjoined regulations relating to the granting of certificates of competency and service to mining engine-drivers, in lieu of the regulations approved on the 28th July, 1890.

**REGULATIONS.**

**PRELIMINARY REQUIREMENTS.**

1. Each applicant for a certificate of competency or service must forward to the Secretary for Mines, Mining Department, Melbourne, notice in writing of his intention to present himself for examination, such notice to be given not less than fourteen clear days prior to the date of examination.

The notice must be accompanied by cash, post-office order, or postal notes to the amount or value of 10s.

Should the applicant pass the prescribed examination, the deposit shall, in each instance, go towards payment of the fee for certificate; in the event, however, of the failure of the candidate to pass the examination, such amount shall be forfeited to the consolidated revenue.

No certificate shall be issued until full payment of the fee required shall have been made to the Secretary for Mines.

**CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.**

2. The certificates of competency to be issued by the Board of Examiners shall be of two classes, namely, *first* and *second* :—

A first-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes.

A second-class certificate shall entitle the holder thereof to drive any engine used for mining purposes except a winding engine.

3. An applicant for a second-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character.

(b) That within a period of two (2) years prior to the date of examination he has, during not less than twelve months, been assisting in driving engines used for mining purposes.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of eighteen (18) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years.

This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving engines previous to their attaining the age of fifty years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties.

A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company by whom the applicant is or has been employed, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause may be considered satisfactory evidence.

4. An applicant for a first-class certificate must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence—

(a) Of his respectability of character—

(b) That he has been the holder of a second-class certificate under these regulations, or that he has been the holder of a first-class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, for a period of not less than twelve months, and that he has had at least six months' experience during that period in assisting to drive a winding engine.

(c) That he is at the date of examination not under the age of nineteen (19) years, nor over the age of fifty (50) years. This latter age not to apply to persons who had experience in driving a winding engine previous to their attaining the age of fifty years.

(d) That neither his eyesight nor his hearing is defective, and that he is not subject to any other mental or bodily infirmity likely to interfere with the efficient discharge of his duties. A document signed by the mining manager or engineer of the company by whom the applicant is or has been employed, and by the engine-driver by whom the applicant has been taught, bearing on this clause may be considered satisfactory evidence.

5. Provided nevertheless that at the first examination held at any place the Board may grant a first-class certificate of competency to any applicant who produces satisfactory evidence that he has had experience in driving a winding engine who succeeds in passing the prescribed examination, and who proves to the Board that he is fully competent to drive any and every kind of engine used for mining purposes.

**CERTIFICATES OF SERVICE.**

6. An applicant for a certificate of service must produce to the Board satisfactory evidence that he has been in charge of and has efficiently managed and driven for a period of not less than twelve months prior to the 3rd November, 1883, winding, pumping, and crushing engines, or either of them, with boilers and appendages. A document signed by the mining manager and engineer or by the mining manager and legal manager of the company by whom the applicant is or has been employed, bearing on this clause, may be considered satisfactory evidence.

**EXAMINATIONS.**

7. Examinations will be conducted by the Board at such time and place as may from time to time be notified by the Secretary in the *Government Gazette* and in a newspaper published or circulated in the locality, and candidates will be examined according to priority of receipt of notice required by clause 1; a list of the candidates and the order in which they will be examined shall, if necessary, be published in a newspaper as aforesaid.

8. Candidates for certificates of competency will be examined as to their practical knowledge and working of machinery, including steam and other engines, boilers, furnaces, stampers, winding and pumping gear, or any other machinery used for mining purposes.

9. If a candidate shall fail to pass the examination prescribed, he shall not again present himself until a period of not less than six months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

**COPIES OF CERTIFICATES.**

10. Whenever any person proves to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he has, without fault on his part, lost or been deprived of any certificate previously granted to him under the provisions of the *Mines Act 1890*, such Board shall, upon payment of such fee, if any, as they may direct, but not exceeding the fee specified in the Schedule hereto, cause a copy of the certificate to which the applicant appears to be entitled, to be made out and certified by the Secretary to the Board, and delivered to the applicant, and any copy so made and certified as aforesaid shall have the effect of the original certificate. The fee, if any, herein referred to shall be paid to the Secretary for Mines in cash or post-office order, and shall by him be paid into the consolidated revenue.

11. If a candidate attempt to obtain a certificate of service or of competency by means of false testimonials, he shall not be allowed to again present himself to the Board of Examiners for examination until a period of not less than twelve months shall have elapsed from the date of his last examination.

12. The holder of a second-class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Mines Act 1890* and the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* shall be entitled to drive any second-class engine under either Act.

13. The holder of a first-class certificate of competency or service issued under the *Mines Act 1890*, shall be entitled to drive any engine at a mine, and any engine under the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*.



## DISQUALIFICATION OF HOLDER OF CERTIFICATE.

14. Any person holding a certificate of competency or of service as an engine-driver, and who is charged with any offence or misconduct likely to be detrimental to the proper or efficient discharge of his duties, may be called upon by the Board of Examiners to show cause why he should not be disqualified as a certificated engine-driver; and if he fail to satisfy the said Board, he may, by an order of the Governor in Council, published in the *Government Gazette*, be disqualified for any period from acting as engine-driver.

15. Any such person shall, after such order, deliver into the charge of the said Board his certificate of competency or of service, which shall be retained by the said Board during the period of his disqualification, and no such person shall, during the period of such disqualification, take charge of any machinery in which steam or air is used as motive power.

## COMPLAINTS.

16. If at any time representations be made to the Board of Examiners that any engine-driver holding a certificate of competency or service is, by reason of incompetency or gross negligence, unfit to discharge his duties, or has been convicted of an offence against the *Mines Act 1890*, the Board may, if they think fit, inquire into the conduct of such engine-driver; and with respect to such inquiry the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1) The inquiry shall be held at such time and place as the Board may appoint, the engine-driver to have the right to engage counsel to defend him at such inquiry. He shall receive fourteen days' notice of the Board's intention to hold the inquiry, and if the engine-driver intends to employ counsel he shall give seven days' notice of such intention to the Secretary to the Board.

(2) The Secretary to the Board shall, before the commencement of the inquiry, furnish to the engine-driver a statement of the case upon which the inquiry is instituted.

(3) The engine-driver shall attend such inquiry, and may produce such evidence as may be considered necessary.

(4) The Board shall, upon the conclusion of the inquiry, forward to the Minister of Mines a report containing a full statement of the case and their opinion thereon.

(5) An engine-driver may, in addition to disqualification, be compelled to defray all or part of the expenses of any inquiry which may be held under the provisions of this clause.

17. Every holder of a second-class certificate under these regulations must produce such certificate to the Board previous to his being examined for a first-class one, and in the event of the latter certificate being granted, his second-class one shall be surrendered and delivered up to the Board.

18. Every candidate for a certificate of competency or service shall, previous to his presenting himself before the Board for examination, make a statutory declaration that the testimonials he produces are genuine and true and correct in every particular; such declaration to be presented to and retained by the Board.

**BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1891.**

REGULATION No. 6.

By virtue of Act No. 1156.

**R**EGULATIONS for imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Borough Echuca Water Trust District for the year 1891:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough Echuca Water Trust district shall pay for the year 1891, namely:—
2. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or less, the sum of Twenty-five shillings.
3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, in addition to the Twenty-five shillings named in the last clause a sum of Four pounds per centum for every pound from Twenty-six pounds to One hundred pounds, inclusive, and a sum of Three pounds per centum on every pound from One hundred pounds upwards.
4. On every cordial or aerated water factory or other factory a charge of Ten pounds per centum, and on every flour-mill a charge of Fifteen pounds per annum.
5. On every steam-engine a charge of Twenty shillings, not to include any engine working any factory or mill named in clause 4.
6. On every livery-stable a charge of Seven pounds Ten shillings per annum.
7. On every hotel a charge of Five pounds per centum on the valuation up to One hundred and fifty pounds; and for every pound from One hundred and fifty pounds upwards a charge of Three pounds per centum, including eight stalls; every extra stall, One shilling.
8. On every horse-trough, a charge of Twenty shillings.
9. On houses, lands, hotels, &c., &c., using a hose, in addition to the foregoing charges named for each respectively, a charge of Twenty shillings.
10. The charge for every private house shall include one quarter acre of land. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a private house, and water laid thereon, an extra charge of Ten shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre shall be paid.
11. In cases where parties have gardens, from any part of which produce is sold, in addition to the ordinary charge for domestic purposes they shall pay an additional charge of Fifty shillings for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre cultivated or watered.

*Cases where water is not laid on.*

12. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., &c., not supplied with water, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the valuation of same.
13. On each allotment or piece of land rated separately from any tenement, a charge of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of same, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Two shillings and sixpence.

*Meters.*

14. The charge of water supplied by meter shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000), provided that the amount shall not in any case be less than the charges hereinbefore made.
15. The charge for water supplied from the Trust stand-pipes shall be Three shillings per thousand gallons (1,000).

The foregoing regulations were duly made and adopted by the Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, at their office, Echuca, on the 17th day of December, and the seal of the Trust was affixed hereto this 20th day of December, 1890.

**GISBORNE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION.**

**BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BY-LAWS.—  
GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.**

**T**HE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the *Water Act 1890*, make the By-laws following:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Geelong Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

- (i.) On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £100 up to £300; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £500; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £500.
- (iii.) Buildings used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (iv.) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
- (v.) For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, the rate shall be One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (vi.) The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Twopence per hundred gallons.
- (vii.) Horses shall be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence each per annum.
- (viii.) Water for steam-boilers shall be charged at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (ix.) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (x.) On all buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate to be charged shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, excepting in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, or by special agreement.
- (xi.) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be One shilling per hundred gallons for the first three hundred gallons; above three hundred gallons and not in excess of four hundred gallons the charge shall be Ninepence per hundred gallons; above four hundred gallons and not in excess of five hundred gallons the charge shall be Eightpence per hundred gallons; in excess of five hundred gallons the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge is One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2.) If for other than domestic purposes only twenty-five thousand gallons per quarter.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employes, committing any breach of these by-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission, in writing, of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Diameter of Pipe.	Weight of Pipe per yard.
3/8 inch ... ..	5 lbs.
1/2 inch ... ..	6 lbs.
5/8 inch ... ..	7 1/2 lbs.
3/4 inch ... ..	9 lbs.
1 inch ... ..	12 lbs.
1 1/4 inch ... ..	16 lbs.
1 1/2 inch ... ..	20 lbs.

Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be permitted. No service of a larger bore than 3/4 inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Board.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

17. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Board as out of repairs or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board.

19. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

20. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line, by a mean width of two feet, and a depth of one foot nine inches, the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

21. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

22. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed, and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

24. If any person supplied with water by the Board does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

25. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be supplied to the streets by carts, or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

26. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m.

27. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

28. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

COOL STORAGE FOR BUTTER.—NOTICE.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Secretary for Agriculture, Melbourne, from persons desirous of cool storage for butter during the summer months. The butter will be stored, free of charge, at the Newport Refrigerating Works.

The quantity to be received from each person will be limited.

All butter received must be of good quality, manufactured in Victoria, and be packed in sound export casks or boxes.

Delivery will be taken by the Dairy Expert at the Newport Refrigerating Works.

Storage will not be allowed for any period to exceed three months, and no butter is to be removed within fourteen days of date of delivery.

Each box or cask must be legibly branded at top and bottom thereon.

In despatching butter a way-bill giving full particulars of the number of casks or boxes, together with brands or marks, and weights, tares, &c., must accompany same.

The butter will be stored at the owner's risk, and no responsibility will be accepted by the Department for loss or damage.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from the 23rd March till the 4th April inclusive, available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 23rd March will be available till the 23rd April. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. During the same period tickets will be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 281 Collins-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Sandhurst (J. Hemming) to Melbourne only.

Sydney Excursion tickets.—From the 23rd March till the 3rd April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available

for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. 1st class and 10s. 2nd class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey cannot be broken on that line.

**Adelaide Excursion tickets.**—From the 25th till the 30th March (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £4 2s. 6d.; 2nd class, £2 12s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

**Brisbane Excursion tickets.**—From the 23rd March till the 3rd April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £10; 2nd class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets, which are available for return for three calendar months from date of issue, are also available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, and the journey may be broken.

**Luggage.**—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

**Horses and vehicles.**—From the 25th March till the 4th April (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

**Commercial travellers' samples.**—From the 25th March till the 4th April (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

**Parcels.**—On the 25th, 26th, 27th, 28th, and 30th March, parcels must be at the Parcels office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

**Goods sheds Holidays.**—The 27th and 30th March will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray West when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates. On the 26th, 27th, 28th, 30th, and 31st March, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Sandhurst, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid. Fruit and other perishable goods will not be received at the Melbourne goods sheds after 12 noon on 26th March.

**Seaside Excursions.**—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised. (See posters at stations.)

#### EXCURSION TICKETS.

From the 23rd till the 30th March (both dates inclusive) a booking window will be kept constantly open at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations for the sale of excursion tickets to all stations (suburban excepted). ROKEWOOD COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the management and control of the Rokewood Common.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the Rokewood Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

Regulations.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows, and shall be payable quarterly in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—

For every horse or mare, Five shillings per annum.  
For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum.

For every head of small cattle, Four shillings per annum.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

4. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine months shall be depastured on the common without the sanction, in writing, of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast which in their opinion would be dangerous to other stock.

5. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers any indication of disease in stock on the common, and shall give notice thereof in writing to the owners of such stock, and the managers shall at once take steps to remove such stock from the common, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such stock may suffer.

6. The stock on the common shall be mustered by the herdsman at any time or place appointed by the managers for the purpose, and all unregistered stock found on the common shall be liable to be impounded.

7. The managers of the common shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing thereon.

8. Any stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid within ten (10) days after the beginning of each quarter shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

10. By-law making a Rate for Water Supply Purposes.

**T**HE Council of the Borough of Saint Arnaud doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by Part VI. of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rate for one year from the 1st day of January, 1891, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

A By-Law of the Borough of Port Melbourne, made under Section 47 of the *Factories and Shops Act, 1890*, and numbered 58, for permitting shops of particular classes, on obtaining licences to keep open after the hours mentioned in Section 46 of the Act, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licenses; also for repealing portion of By-law No. 52 of this borough.

**I**n pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Port Melbourne order as follows:—

1. That that portion of Clause No. 1 of By-law No. 52, which reads, "boot dealers' shops, until eight o'clock in the evening of every day in the week except Saturday and Sunday," be repealed, and the same is hereby repealed.
2. That shops within the Borough of Port Melbourne of the particular classes hereinafter named, not included in the fourth schedule of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, may, upon being duly licensed, keep open or be kept open as follows, that is to say:—China, glass and earthenware dealers' shops, fancy goods dealers' shops, tin-smiths' shops, and boot and shoe dealers' shops, until nine o'clock of the evening of every day of the week except

Saturday and Sunday, and on Saturday until eleven o'clock of the evening; and haters' shops until half-past eight o'clock of the evening of every day of the week except Saturday and Sunday, and on Saturday until half-past ten o'clock of the evening.

3.
