PUBLIC HEALTH.—SHIRE OF BACCHUS MARSH

By-Law No. 6.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 6 of the said Shire (that is to say):—

1. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the following area, namely:—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 6 (W. Easay's), in the parish of Korkuperrinul; thence northerly along the western boundary of that allotment to its north-west angle; thence easterly along the north boundary of the same allotment to its intersection with the Gisborne-road; thence southerly along that road to a point three chains north of its junction with Lerderberg-street; thence easterly sixty chains; thence in a line south to the river Werribee; thence across that river to the road between allotments 8 and 9, in the parish of Parwan; thence south along that road to its junction with the three-chain road; thence north-westerly to the north-west angle of allotment 48; thence south to the south-east angle thereof; thence westerly along the south boundary of allotment 54; thence northerly along the west boundary thereof; thence westerly in a direct line to the western boundary of allotment 30; thence in a direct line north to the river Werribee; thence easterly along that river to the commencing point.

2. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is hereby abolished, and instead thereof every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service, to be provided by the occupier.

3. The Council will not accept as sufficient for any house any earth-closet or privy, unless it be in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and shall have the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth, or some other deodorizing material, to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan, and emptying and cleansing the same. All privies shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises, shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan placed in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

5. The pan in use in every earth-closet shall, when full, but not less frequently than once a week, be closed with a tightly-fitting lid, and removed in the day time to such place as the Council may have appointed.

6. The Council may, upon the recommendation of the Health Officer and Inspector of Nuisances, exempt any premises within the area above defined from the operation of this by-law.

7. No person but the person authorized by the Council shall be employed by the occupier of any house or premises for the removal of night-soil, and no other person shall remove the same except in cases of exemption.

8. Every occupier of premises from which night-soil is removed shall pay to the officer appointed by the Council such fee for removal per pan as the Council may find to be necessary to cover the expense of the service, or the Council may make a fee for each year, and such fee shall be payable on demand by the authorized officers of the Council, and may be recovered from the occupier or owner as a debt due to the Council, and incurred by the authority of such occupier or owner.

9. This by-law may be cited as "a by-law for regulating earth-closets, and the emptying and cleansing of cess-pans."

10. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds) nor less than Five shillings.

11. This by-law shall come into full force and operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

REGULATIONS FOR COASTAL PILOT SERVICE ISSUED BY THE  
MARINE BOARD OF QUEENSLAND.

1. The Board will issue licences to as many persons of approved competency, not at first exceeding six in number, as may from time to time be found necessary, to act as pilots for vessels navigating Torres Strait and the Inner Route.

2. The fee for every such licence shall be £2.

3. Any person acting in the capacity of pilot for Torres Strait and the Inner Route as aforesaid, without being duly licensed, and when the services of a licensed pilot are available, shall be liable to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £20.

4. The pilots that are available, other than those regularly employed by certain steamship companies, shall take vessels in turn, and shall be paid the following fees for their pilotage services:—

Melbourne to Thursday Island	... £50
Sydney or Newcastle to Thursday Island	... 45
Morton Bay to Rockhampton	... 12
" " Townsville	... 20
" " Cooktown	... 25

5. Should a coast pilot be discharged at any place between Thursday Island and Moreton Bay, he shall, provided there is no vessel requiring his services, be paid the price of or be given a saloon passage by steamer from the place of discharge to Brisbane.

6. Coast pilots detained in quarantine are to be paid the same allowance for detention as that required by the 126th section of the Navigation Act to be paid to local pilots.

7. Should any vessel, while in charge of a pilot, take the ground or receive damage through any fault of the pilot, or be caused any unnecessary delay, it shall be lawful for the Board to make such deduction from the fee payable to the pilot under these regulations as they may think fit.

8. Every pilot shall keep a log of his proceedings, and at the end of every month shall send an abstract of its contents to the portmaster, and should any vessel of which he is in charge take the ground or meet with any accident it shall be specially reported to the Board.

9. It shall also be the duty of every pilot to report to the portmaster any changes found in the channels, and any danger not already known, or not laid down upon the charts.

10. In case of any misconduct, or of any accident arising through misdirection or neglect, or any infringement of the Navigation Act of 1876, or Harbour Regulations, on the part of any person holding a pilot's licence, the Board, should they consider the circumstances of the case to justify such a course, will suspend or cancel such licence, as may seem proper to them, and any such person whose licence shall have been so suspended or cancelled who shall act as pilot for any vessel navigating Torres Strait or the Inner Route shall be liable to forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £50; and if the licence of any person so offending shall have been at the time suspended, the term of suspension may be lengthened or the licence may be cancelled as the Board may think fit.

11. Every person whose licence as aforesaid is suspended or cancelled shall at once forward or deliver such licence to the Board, or to the shipping inspector at the nearest port, as the Board may direct, and any such person who shall neglect or refuse so to do shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £50.

12. The licensed pilots shall find their own boats and vessels, and pay all expenses incurred in carrying out the pilot service.

13. Any pilot who leaves the pilotage ground for any other employment shall, before doing so, forward his licence to the Board, to be retained by them; and any pilot who leaves the pilotage ground as aforesaid without the sanction of the Board, or without depositing his licence with the Board, shall be considered to have left the pilot service, and his licence will be cancelled accordingly.




**LOWANSHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—

WHEREAS by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, it is enacted that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust appointed under the said Act may, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations for or relating to all or any of the subjects mentioned in said section. Now therefore the Chairman and Commissioners of the Lowanshire Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

**REGULATIONS.**

1. The prevention and remedying of the waste, undue consumption, fouling, or contamination of water contained in or supplied from any part of the works within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust.

The water and every part of the waterworks within any reserve or within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust, or within any proclaimed urban district under such control or management, shall be protected from trespass and injury of any kind whatsoever.

The penalty for each offence in respect of the breach of any such regulations shall not exceed Five pounds, and may be recovered from any offender in a summary way before any two justices.

**THE SWAN HILL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY

**BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.—BY-LAWS.—  
GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.**

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by the *Water Act 1890*, make the By-laws following:—

1. All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Geelong Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

- (i.) On every house or tenement of £10 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of £10, a rate of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £100 inclusive; Four pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £100 up to £300; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £500; and Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £500.
- (iii.) Buildings used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- (iv.) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
- (v.) For water supplied by the Board by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Board, the rate shall be One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (vi.) The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Twopence per hundred gallons.
- (vii.) Horses shall be charged for at the rate of Seven shillings and sixpence each per annum.
- (viii.) Water for steam-boilers shall be charged at the rate of Fifteen shillings per horse-power per annum, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.
- (ix.) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in such cases as the Board shall require that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

(x.) On all buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate to be charged shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, excepting in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, or by special agreement.

(xi.) For water supplied to shipping the charge shall be One shilling per hundred gallons for the first three hundred gallons; above three hundred gallons and not in excess of four hundred gallons the charge shall be Ninepence per hundred gallons; above four hundred gallons and not in excess of five hundred gallons the charge shall be Eightpence per hundred gallons; in excess of five hundred gallons the charge shall be at the rate of Six shillings per thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—(1.) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge is One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2.) If for other than domestic purposes only twenty-five thousand gallons per quarter.

4. The Board may grant permission to persons requiring water for "domestic" and for "other than domestic purposes" to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Board against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.

5. Any person receiving water from the Board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employés, committing any breach of these by-laws.

9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

10. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days' notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission, in writing, of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

11. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the Board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board. Wrought-iron piping of approved quality, and lead piping of the following weights only, will be allowed to be fixed for either internal or external services:—

Diameter of Pipe.	Weight of Pipe per yard.
3/4 inch ... ..	5 lbs.
1 inch ... ..	6 lbs.
1 1/4 inch ... ..	7 1/2 lbs.
1 1/2 inch ... ..	9 lbs.
1 3/4 inch ... ..	12 lbs.
2 inch ... ..	16 lbs.
2 1/2 inch ... ..	20 lbs.

Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be permitted. No service of a larger bore than 1/2 inch will be permitted unless by special consent of the Board.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house-service between the main and the

building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which, after notice that service-pipe requires repairing, any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

16. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million (1,000,000) gallons.

17. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Board as out of repairs or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

18. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board.

19. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

20. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed six feet three inches in length along the centre line, by a mean width of two feet, and a depth of one out nine inches, the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.

21. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

22. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

23. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed, and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

24. If any person supplied with water by the Board does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

25. The streets shall not be watered from hydrants or fire-plugs by means of a hose, but the water is to be supplied to the streets by carts, or by manual labour, or by special stand-pipes of approved size and form.

26. Channel flushing and filling of public baths shall only be permitted between the hours of Ten o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m.

27. The water supplied in the above district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the same regulations, and not otherwise.

28. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Board" shall mean the Board of Land and Works.

## PROPOSED SEVERANCE OF AREA AND CONSTITUTION OF A NEW MUNICIPALITY.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43) the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 41st section of the said Act, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Buln Buln which is described in their Petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the Shire of Buln Buln and constituted a new municipality under the name or title of "The Shire of Poowong and Jeetho."

Area described in Petition:-

Commencing at a point at the south-west corner of the parish of Jumbunna East; thence in a line almost due north to the north-west corner of selection No. 45 (known as Horner's), parish of Jeetho West; thence along Jeetho West road to the south-west corner of No. 31, said parish; thence due west to the most southern point in block 8; thence along the Jeetho West road to a point south-east of block 128; thence along the southern boundary of blocks 128, 126, 125, and 90 to the south-western corner of 89; thence in a line due north to a point at the north-east corner of 80; thence in an easterly direction to a point at the south-west corner of 75; thence due north to the north-west corner of 74; thence along the southern boundary of 58 by a Government road through 73 and 102 to the north-west corner of 73c; thence due south to the south-west corner of said block; thence due east to the south-east corner of 106n; thence to the north-west corner of 70; thence due east to the north-east corner of 70; thence due south to the south-west corner of 62; thence due east to the south-east corner of said block; thence due north to south-west corner of 54; thence due east to the south-east corner of 112; thence due north to south-west corner of 51; thence due east to Pheasant Creek; thence northerly to the north-west corner of 54; thence due east to the south-east corner of 81; thence due north to the south-eastern corner of 80; thence due east to Lang Lang River; thence along said river to a point on the eastern boundary of 28; thence in a line due south to the north-west corner of 30; thence due east to the north-east corner of 30; thence south to north-west corner of 38; thence easterly to the north-east corner of 43; thence due north to the north-west corner of 45; thence due east to the parish boundary; thence southerly along boundary of Poowong; thence of Jeetho to a point at the north-eastern corner of 610; thence along eastern boundary of said block and of 62b to the north-east corner of 33b;

Petitioners state that the Great Southern Railway, which intersects the proposed shire about mid-way, centralizes the interests of the settlers therein; and, in consequence, severs their interest and connexion with the Gippsland Railway and the roads leading thereto. That the new railway necessitates the making of new roads, and consider the municipal body having control thereof should be thoroughly represented. That owing to the distance of the greater portion of the proposed shire from the present Shire Hall at Drouin, so much expense and loss of time are incurred in travelling as to debar the council from being as representative as it should be. That for the same cause it becomes impossible for the officers of the shire to supervise works so far distant from head-quarters, and that important works are often but imperfectly supervised, or are not supervised at all.

Petitioners therefore pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever the said area from the Shire of Buln Buln, and constitute it a separate municipality under the name and title of the "Shire of Poowong and Jeatho," and that the shire be not subdivided—the council to consist of nine (9) members.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in accordance with the provisions of, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, doth by this present Order confirm the scheme for the reduction in width of a road in the parish of East Charlton, as set out and coloured red on a plan attached to such scheme, and deposited in the office of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne, the said scheme being under the seals of the Shire of Korong and the Board of Land and Works, and under the hands and seals of the owners of land having a frontage to the road aforesaid proposed to be reduced in width, or within three chains thereof.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything therein contained, the Governor in Council may from time to time, if he thinks fit, by Order in Council, divide any district into so many divisions of such size and with such boundaries irrespective of the ownership of the land, whether the same should happen to belong to one or more owners, as may be just and expedient, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the works wholly or partly constructed for the benefit of such divisions respectively, and to the capabilities of such district for purposes of irrigation; direct that any rates or any particular rate made by any Trust under Part III. of the said Act shall be levied only in a certain division or certain divisions (to be by him specified) of the district of such Trust; direct that such rates shall be levied differentially as between the various divisions of the district of such Trust, and determine the proportion in which such divisions of the districts of such Trusts shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the works constructed wholly or partly for the benefit of such divisions respectively: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby divide the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust into the divisions following, that is to say:—

*The Loddon Division.*—Comprising such portion of the Trust District as may be included within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at a point being the south-east corner of allotment 13, section A, parish of Yarrowalla; thence by the southern boundary of said allotment to its intersection with the River Loddon in a northerly direction to the offtake of the Twelve-mile Creek; thence by the Twelve-mile Creek in a northerly direction to its intersection with the north boundary of allotment 81, section A, parish of Loddon; thence east along said north boundary to the north-east corner of said allotment 81; thence southerly along western boundary of one and a half chain road, such western boundary being the eastern boundary of allotments 81, 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 13, 15, 18A, 19A, and 22, all of section A, parish of Loddon, to a point being the intersection with the north boundary of allotment 1, section A, parish

of Yarrowalla, of said boundary produced; thence east to the north-east corner of said allotment 1; thence south along the eastern boundaries of allotments 1 and 6 to the south-east corner of allotment 6; thence east along the south boundary of allotment 5 to a point being the intersection with the eastern boundary of allotments 7 and 12 produced; thence south along the said eastern boundary to the south-east corner of allotment 12; thence east along the south boundary of allotment 11 to its intersection with the east boundary of allotment 13 produced; thence south along the said eastern boundary to the point of commencement.

*The Pennyroyal Division.*—Comprising such portion of the Trust District as may be included within the following boundaries, viz.:—Commencing at a point being the north-east corner of allotment 81, section A, parish of Loddon; thence southerly along the western boundary of a one and a half chain road, such western boundary of road being the eastern boundary of allotments 81, 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, and 7, to the south-east corner of allotment 7, all of section A, parish of Loddon; thence east across road and along the south boundary of allotments 50 and 52 to its intersection with the west boundary of allotment 47 produced; thence south, east, and north by the western, southern, and eastern boundaries respectively of said allotment 47 to a point in the south boundary of allotment 52, being the intersection with the east boundary of allotment 47 produced; thence east along the south boundary of allotments 52 and 53 to its intersection with the west boundary of allotment 45, section A, parish of Loddon, produced; thence south, east, and north by the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of said allotment 45 respectively to a point in the south boundary of allotment 54, being the intersection with the east boundary of allotment 45 produced; thence west to the south-east corner of allotment 53; thence north along the eastern boundary of allotments 53, 64, 67, and 73 to the north-east corner of allotment 73; thence west along the north boundary of allotment 73 to its intersection with the east boundary of allotments 80 and 80A produced; thence north by the said east boundary of allotments 80A and 80 across a three-chain road to the south-west corner of allotment 83; thence east, north, and west by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries respectively of said allotment 83 to the north-west corner of same allotment; thence north along the eastern boundary of allotment 88 to the north-east corner of said allotment 88; thence west along the north boundary of said allotment 88 produced to its intersection with the eastern boundary of allotment 91; thence south-westerly along the eastern boundary of allotments 91, 89, and 90A to the point of commencement.

*The Tragowel Division.*—Comprising such portion of the Trust district as may not be included within the Loddon and Pennyroyal Divisions as hereinbefore defined.

And doth hereby direct that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust for the construction and maintenance of its works, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied differentially as between such said divisions, and doth determine that the proportions in which such divisions shall be rated respectively one to another, regard being had to the cost and expenses of the works constructed wholly or in part for the benefit of such divisions respectively, shall be as follows, that is to say:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling on the annual value of rateable property rated for municipal purposes in the said divisions shall be—

The Loddon Division	... ..	Ninepence.
The Pennyroyal Division	... ..	One shilling.
The Tragowel Division	... ..	Eighteenpence.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

EASTER EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from the 23rd March till the 4th April inclusive, available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 1st April will be available till the 1st May. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. (See also additional notice *re* tickets from Melbourne.) During the same period tickets will be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 281 Collins-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Sandhurst (J. Hemming) to Melbourne only.

*Sydney Excursion tickets.*—From the 23rd March till the 3rd April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £5 6s. 6d.; 2nd class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. 1st class and 10s. 2nd class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey cannot be broken on that line.

*Adelaide Excursion tickets.*—From the 25th till the 30th March (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets available by the express and ordinary trains will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide at

the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £4 2s. 6d.; 2nd class, £2 12s. 6d. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

**Brisbane Excursion tickets.**—From the 23rd March till the 3rd April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Brisbane at the following return fares, viz.:—1st class, £10; 2nd class, £6 17s. 6d. These tickets, which are available for return for three calendar months from date of issue, are also available by the express and ordinary trains on all lines, and the journey may be broken.

**Luggage.**—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for.

**Horses and vehicles.**—From the 25th March till the 4th April (both dates inclusive), the Department cannot engage to forward horses or vehicles by passenger trains unless accommodation can be provided by special arrangement.

**Commercial travellers' samples.**—From the 25th March till the 4th April (both dates inclusive), commercial travellers' samples will not be taken to or from roadside stations except by mixed or goods trains.

**Parcels.**—On the 25th, 26th, 27th, 28th, and 30th March, parcels must be at the Parcels office, at both Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, 30 minutes before starting time of the ordinary trains.

**Goods Sheds Holidays.**—The 27th and 30th March will be observed as holidays in the goods branch, and only dairy produce goods trains will run. Perishable goods will, however, be delivered at all stations on application. Consignees of powder can ascertain from the station-master at Footscray West when explosives will be received in lieu of these dates. On the 26th, 27th, 28th, 30th, and 31st March, fruit and dairy produce will not be carried by purely passenger trains between Melbourne, Sandhurst, and Ballarat, nor on the North-Eastern line, unless parcels rates are paid. Fruit and other perishable goods will not be received at the Melbourne goods sheds after 12 noon on 26th March.

**Seaside Excursions.**—The issue of these tickets at the principal stations will continue as already advertised. (See posters at stations.)

**EXCURSION TICKETS.**

From the 23rd till the 30th March (both dates inclusive) a booking window will be kept constantly open at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations for the sale of excursion tickets to all stations (suburban excepted). On 25th and 26th March a temporary booking office for the issue of tickets to the principal stations will also be open in the corridor of the General Post Office. On tickets bearing dates from the 23rd till the 30th March (both dates inclusive) the journey can be commenced on any day during that period. The tickets will be available for return till 30th April inclusive.

—RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION.

REGULATIONS.

WE, James Lecky, jun., Thomas Patterson, Frederick Poole, George Poole, Charles Rossiter, and George Howard, a majority of the duly appointed committee of management of the reserve in the parish of Cranbourne, town of Cranbourne, for a race-course and other purposes of public recreation, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890.

Regulations.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided, and the divisions into which the reserve with the buildings and other erections and fences thereon is parcelled out and known, are as follows:—

1. The lawn, the grand stands, the saddling-paddock, the members' stand, and carriage-paddock and approaches.
2. The weighing-yard, the stewards' room, the committee room, the committee stand, the stewards' stand, the judge's box, and approaches.
3. The enclosure called "The Outer Reserve," and approaches.
4. The enclosure called "The Outer Carriage Paddock," and approaches.
5. The ground called "The Flat," and approaches.
6. The training ground and approaches.

2. Subject to the provisions of the seventh regulation, all persons who shall have duly paid for admission to the sixth of the said divisions for the purpose of training or exercising horses shall, upon production of their tickets, be admitted thereto with their horses for the period for which such tickets are issued, subject, however, to such orders as the committee of management or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club may from time to time give as there may be occasion with reference to such division.

3. No person except the judge and timekeeper, or any person the judge may call to his assistance, shall enter the judge's box. No person shall enter the stewards' stand or the stewards' room, except the stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or such persons as they may invite.

4. No person shall enter the weighing-stand or the weighing-yard, or the approaches thereto, except the committee of management, or the stewards and committee of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, stewards, or committee, the jockeys requiring to be weighed, and the owners and trainers of horses desirous of seeing their jockeys weighed.

5. No person shall enter the committee stand, the committee room, or the several approaches thereto, except the committee of management, or the committee and stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or their respective officers, and such other persons as the committee of management, and committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, may invite to do so.

6. No person, unless otherwise permitted under these regulations, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof unless such person shall have a ticket duly authorizing him in that behalf.

7. No person who has been proved to the satisfaction of the committee of management, or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee

of management, committee, or stewards, to have been at any time guilty of any malpractice or dishonorable conduct in connection with racing, or who has been proved to the satisfaction of the committee of management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, to be a defaulter, shall enter upon the reserve or any division or part thereof.

8. Every member of the Cranbourne Racing Club, and every person paying for admission to the first, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth divisions shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, or (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper, servant, or other person having authority from the committee of management or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, to demand the production or surrender of the same.

9. No person shall remain upon the reserve, or any division or part thereof, except the sixth division, for a longer period than half-an-hour after the last race of the day shall have been run.

10. Persons taking or hiring for any race meeting the grand stands, or any portion thereof respectively, or any booth upon the reserve, shall abide by any order given by the committee of management, or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards in reference to the reserve and the buildings and other erections thereon.

11. No person shall take any dog into the reserve, or any division or part thereof, or into any building thereon.

12. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers, or climb, jump over, remove, or destroy the fences or gates, or roll or throw stones or glass upon the reserve, or discharge firearms therein; nor shall fires be lighted within a hundred yards of the race-course, as defined by fences, posts, or buildings.

13. Any person committing in the reserve, or any division or part thereof, or in any of the buildings or erections for the time being thereon, any of the following offences, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and is or may be in possession of a ticket of admission:—

1. Assaulting any other person.
2. Being drunk.
3. Riding, crossing, or trespassing upon the course, or any part of it, during a race meeting, or when the horses are preparing or prepared to start, or are running for any race.
4. Using profane, indecent, or obscene language.
5. Using any threatening, abusive, or insulting words.
6. Behaving improperly or riotously.
7. Being found in the first, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth of the said divisions, and not producing upon demand or (if required) not surrendering to any gatekeeper, servant, or other authorized person having authority from the committee of management, or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, to demand the production of the same, a ticket duly authorizing admission to such division, unless the person so found shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, that the proper charge for admission has been paid by him, and that his ticket has been lost or surrendered.
8. Obtaining admission to the reserve, or any division or part thereof, when disentitled to such admission under these regulations.
9. Remaining in the reserve, or any division or part thereof, after having been warned off any part of the reserve.
14. The scale of tolls and charges which shall be levied and taken for admission to the several divisions of the reserve and buildings thereon respectively shall be as follows:—

Provided always that the committee of management, or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, may exempt any member of a racing club, wholly or partially, from the payment of all or any such charges or fees; and the money so received shall, after deducting necessary expenses, be applied in the permanent improvement of the reserve for racing and other purposes of public recreation, or in the erection, maintenance, or repair of buildings and fences, or the planting of trees or shrubs in the reserve, and in prizes for any race, or for the owner of any horse engaged in any race, or in such other manner in or upon the reserve as shall be necessary or expedient for the purpose of rendering the same more convenient and useful for racing and other purposes of public recreation.

15. No person shall, after the 31st day of March, 1891, carry on any trade, business, or calling whatever on any portion of the reserve other than upon such portions as may be respectively set apart by the committee of management, or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, for the carrying on of

such trades, businesses, or callings, and then only when he shall have obtained the consent, in writing, of such committee of management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards.

16. No person shall, after the 31st day of March, 1891, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on the portions of the said first, third, and fifth divisions respectively set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall comply with the following conditions:—

1st. That he be registered annually, or for each or for any race meeting, as a bookmaker by the committee of management, or the committee or stewards of the Cranbourne Racing Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards.

2nd. That, during the time he shall be in or upon the said divisions carrying on his trade, business, or calling of bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the committee of management, committee, or stewards, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which ticket shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

17. The foregoing regulations (excepting the second, twelfth, and such part of the thirteenth as denotes the charge for admission to train horses on the sixth division) shall apply only to the days on which race meetings shall be held in the reserve by the Cranbourne Racing Club, or under its auspices.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
