PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint

THURSDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF APRIL NEXT,
to be observed as a Public Holiday within the Shire of Buln Buln;

FRIDAY, THE 3RD, AND SATURDAY, THE 4TH DAYS OF APRIL NEXT,
to be observed as Public Holidays within the Shire of Mildura;

WEDNESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF APRIL NEXT,
to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Dunkeld.

All vessels and boats should be kept at least 800 yards to the left and one mile to the right of the line of fire for a distance of 6,000 yards from the battery.

NOTICE.—CENSUS OF 1891.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria (54 Vict. No. 1171), entitled the *Census Act 1891*, it is enacted that an account shall be taken of the Population and of the Live Stock in the Colony: And whereas Sunday the 5th day of April, 1891, has been fixed by the said Act as that on which such account shall be taken: It is hereby notified that, for the purpose of such account, printed forms will be left at each dwelling on or before the 4th day of April, 1891, and will be called for on the 6th day of April, 1891, or as soon after as practicable.

All occupiers or persons in charge of dwellings are required to enter the particulars sought for in such forms to the best of their knowledge, information, and belief; and if any person shall refuse or wilfully neglect to fill up such forms, or to sign and deliver the same; or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to answer, or untruly answer, any inquiry made by a sub-enumerator for any of the purposes of this Act; or shall wilfully make, sign, or deliver, or cause to be made, signed, or delivered, any false return or statement of any particular in such forms; or shall obstruct any person in the performance of his duty under the said Act, the person so offending will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
