### REGULATIONS.

Regulations.

19. Preaching or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected within the gardens, or on the grounds under the control of the council of the society, are strictly forbidden. A penalty of Five pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

20. No person shall be permitted, without the permission of the council, to carry on any traffic whatsoever, or distribute hand bills in the gardens. A penalty of Twenty shillings is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

21. No musical band or other instrumental or vocal performers shall be permitted to perform in the gardens, unless with the express permission of the directors. A penalty of Two pounds is imposed for an offence against this regulation.

# SANDY CREEK PUBLIC CEMETERY.—REGULATIONS AND SCALE OF FEES.

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Sandy Creek Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the Cemeterics Act 1880 (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

REGULATIONS made by the Trustees of the Sandy Creek Public Cemotery in conformity with the Act, for the general management thereof:—

Comotery in conformity with the Act, for the general management thereof:

1. All charges for interment must be paid when order for interment is given.

2. Orders for interments shall be given to the secretary at least 24 hours previous to burial, otherwise the burial shall be subject to an extra charge. The time fixed for the funeral to take place shall be the time at which the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

3. Unless otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Nine a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Nine a.m. to Five p.m. throughout the year.

4. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been ledged with the secretary, together with the name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased.

5. Every grave shall be 6 feet deep for adults, and not less than 5 feet for a child under 12 years of age.

6. Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.

7. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited with the secretary a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

8. No fence shall exceed 3ft. 6in. high, including the coping, and shall be subject to the approval of the said trustees previous to erection.

9. No servant or person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the said trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

10. No dogs, horses, nor carts will be allowed to enter the cemetery without special permission.

11. The certificate of title to allotments to be signed by the chairman, and countersigned by the secretary.

# LOWANSHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 75 of the Water Act 1890 (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Commissioners of any Waterworks Trust appointed under the said Act may, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations for or relating to all or any of the subjects mentioned in said section. Now therefore the Chairman and Commissioners of the Lowanshire Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The prevention and remedying of the waste, undue consumption, fouling, or contamination of water contained in or supplied from any part of the works within any part of the district or area under the control or management of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust.

2. The water and every part of the district or area under the control or management of the said Lowanshire Waterworks Trust, or within any part of the district or area under the control or management, shall be protected from trespass and injury of any kind whatsoever.

The penalty for each offence in respect of the breach of any such regulations shall not exceed Five pounds, and may be recovered from any offender in a summary way before any two justices.
