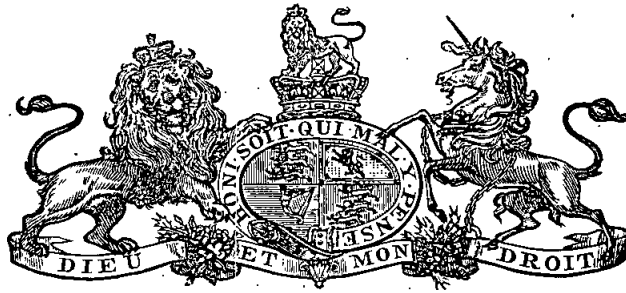

Firing shall not take place before the hour of Seven o'clock a.m. nor after the hour of Four o'clock p.m. from the month of April to the month of August inclusive, nor before the hour of Six o'clock a.m. nor after the hour of Six o'clock p.m. from the month of September to the month of March inclusive.

The births of 1,338 children, viz., 666 boys and 672 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. In the month of February, 1,260 births were registered, or 78 less than in the month under review. The births were 220 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 112 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 792, viz., 437 of males and 355 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 546, or 69 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in February by 59. They exceeded the average of February during the previous ten years by 87; but, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 154.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.73, and of deaths registered 1.62.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.5° on the 7th, and the lowest was 45.8° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (65.6°) was more than two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (46.3°) took place on the 5th, and the least range (8.1°) on the 22nd. The mean daily range was 20°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.369 inches on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.635 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.025 inches) was a little above the average.

Rain fell on 6 days, the amount of rainfall being 1.26 inches. The average rainfall in March during the previous ten years was 1.95 inches, or about two-thirds of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 55 per cent., and females 45 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, as against 44 per cent. in March, 1890; 43 per cent. in March, 1889; 44 per cent. in March, 1888; 44 per cent. in March, 1887; 46 per cent. in March, 1886; 41 per cent. in March, 1885; 42 per cent. in March, 1884; 37 per cent. in March, 1883; 43 per cent. in March, 1882; and 43 per cent. in March, 1881.

Forty-three deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a quarryman and a widow, each aged 75, died of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 75, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 76, of diarrhoea; a female servant, aged 76, of cerebral hemorrhage; a labourer, aged 76, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 76, of enlarged prostate; a tailor, a sailor, and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 78, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of cerebral softening and senile debility; a farmer, aged 78, of heart disease; a female, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a labourer, aged 80, of nephritis; a female servant, aged 81, of progressive paralysis; a lady, aged 81, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 82, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 83, of diarrhoea and anaemia; a dentist, aged 83, of bronchitis; a male, aged 84, of cirrhosis of the liver; a clergyman, aged 86, of pleurisy; a female, aged 88, of heart disease and bronchitis; a farmer, aged 89, of



valvular disease of the heart; a labourer, aged 90, of dysentery; three females, each aged 78, a gentleman, aged 79, a gardener and a female, each aged 80, a gentleman and two females, each aged 81, a commercial traveller, aged 82, two gentlemen, aged 83 and 86 respectively, a widow, aged 87, a needlewoman, aged 89, a paper-maker, aged 90, and two females, aged 90 and 93 respectively, of old age.

Forty-three violent deaths took place during the month, of which 32 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, 6 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A male child, aged 3, and a labourer, aged 73, were passed over by horse vehicles; a commission agent, aged 39, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall from a tram-car; a wire-worker, aged 37, of fracture of the skull, caused by being struck by a railway engine; a male of occupation unknown, aged 50, was passed over by a railway train; a house-painter, aged 56, was found dead on the railway line; a bricklayer, aged 23, died of injuries received through being dragged by a horse; a labourer, aged 66, of injuries received when drunk; a carpenter, aged 53, a fireman, aged 44, a labourer, aged 70, an asphaltier, aged 39, a labourer, and a male of occupation unknown, each aged 50, died of injuries resulting from falls—the first named from a window, the second from a ladder, the third from a scaffold, but particulars for the others were not specified; a seaman, aged 25, was crushed between two steamers; an engineer, aged 36, was killed through being caught by the belt of an engine; an artist, aged 43, died of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a cordial-maker, aged 53, of tetanus, the result of a cut on the hand; a girl, aged 7, and a labourer, aged 37, of burns, the latter having fallen into the fire during an epileptic fit; a painter, aged 62, of plumbism; a boy, aged 10, and a carpenter, aged 27, were accidentally drowned in the River Yarra, and a labourer, aged 19, in a dam at Box Hill; a farmer, aged 25, a wood-turner, aged 32, a labourer, aged 41, a bricklayer, aged 47, and two males of occupation unknown, aged 50 and 60 respectively, were found drowned in the River Yarra, and a housewife, aged 41, in Hobson's Bay; a newly-born male infant died of umbilical hæmorrhage, consequent on a fall at birth. The deaths classed as homicidal were those of 4 newly-born infants who were suffocated or strangled—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in three of the cases. The suicidal deaths were those of a bricklayer, aged 67, who shot himself; a bricklayer, aged 39, who cut his throat after excessive drinking; a male of occupation unknown, aged 55, who poisoned himself with carbolic acid; a clerk, aged 61, who drowned himself in Hobson's Bay; a boot-clicker, aged 25, and a plasterer, aged 62, who threw themselves in front of passing trains. The case of judicial hanging was that of an engine-driver, aged 28, who was executed in the Melbourne Gaol for murder.

One hundred and thirty-seven deaths, or 17 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—55 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 7 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 4 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 11 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 12 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Austin Hospital, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, 3 in the Infant Asylum, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, and 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 352, of which 178, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 174, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 267 were under one year of age, 60 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 440. Of these, 259, or 59 per cent., were male, and 181, or 41 per cent., were female; 17 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 39 were between twenty and twenty-five, 32 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 41 were between thirty-five and forty, 35 were between forty and forty-five, 19 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 44 were between sixty and sixty-five, 26 were between sixty-five and seventy, 32 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 25 were upwards of eighty.

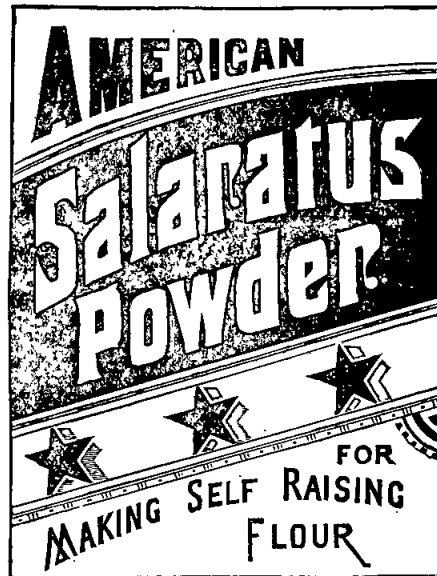

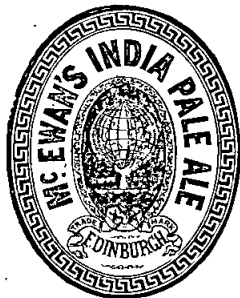

WHEREAS by the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government of persons engaged by virtue of Part I. of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to and alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces, that is to say:—

**PART I.—SECTION VIII.**

Dress Regulations, paragraph 29 to read:—

“Officers in the Militia Reserve, and on the Unattached List, may wear the uniform of the branch in which they have served, but with the letter ‘R’ on the shoulder-straps below the badges of rank. The letter ‘R’ in silver embroidery on garments for which gold shoulder-straps are authorized, and in gilt metal or in gold embroidery on garments for which cloth straps are authorized.”

Paragraph 30 to read:—

“Officers retired with permission to wear uniform will wear the uniform of regiments in which they last served, but with the letter ‘R’ on the shoulder-straps below the badge of rank. The letter ‘R’ being the same as those above specified.”

**Add new paragraph 30A.—**

“Non-commissioned officers and men of the 1st class Reserve will wear the letter ‘R’ in metal over the designation of the corps to which they belong.”

**PART II.—SECTION II.**

Add new paragraphs:—

**2a. Armourers and Blacksmiths.**

*Free kit (clothing).*

- 1 tunic, blue cloth
- 1 pair trousers, blue cloth
- 1 helmet, white
- 1 helmet bag

Rout's selection, parish of Mirboo; thence south-westerly by that selection, and southerly by that selection and the west boundary of allotments 5, 6, 7, 14, 15, and a line to the north-west angle of allotment 52; thence south by the west boundary of allotments 52 and 53, to the south-west angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence east by a road being the north boundary of allotments 68, 67, 66, 65, 64, 63, and 62 to the Morwell River; thence southerly by said river to the north-west corner of allotment 1, parish of Gunyah Gunyah; thence east along the north boundary of said allotment to its north-east angle; thence south by the east boundary of allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 13B, and 13, to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence south-westerly by the road from Foster to Rosedale to Mount Fatigue; thence west by a direct line to the north-east angle of allotment 61B, parish of Mirboo South; thence west by the north boundary of allotment 61B and 61A to the south angle of allotment 37, parish of Dumbalk; thence north-westerly by a road to the north-west angle of said allotment; thence west by a road being the north boundary of allotments 37A, 38, 35, 34, 102B, 102A, 101, 100, and 99 to the north-west angle of the last named allotment; thence south-westerly by a road being the north-western boundary of allotment 99 to the road forming the south-west boundary of block 80A; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Nerrena, Meeniyan, and Tarwin South to the northern boundary of the parish of Waratah; thence easterly by that boundary to the sea coast; thence southerly, westerly, and north-westerly by the sea coast to the east boundary of the parish of Wonthaggi; thence northerly by that boundary to the south-west angle of block 21, parish of Kirrak; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 13; thence northerly by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 12; thence easterly by that allotment and allotment 9, and northerly by the latter allotment and a road to the north-west angle of block 51; thence westerly by the road from Anderson's inlet to the south-west angle of block 50; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of block 44A; thence easterly by a road to the north-west angle of block 47; thence northerly by a road to the north-west angle of block 41; thence easterly, northerly, and westerly by the south, east, and north boundaries of the parish of Kongwak to the road forming the east boundary of block 62B, parish of Korumburra; thence northerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 92; thence easterly by a road to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a road known as Whitelaw's track to the road known as McDonald's track; and thence north-easterly by that road to the commencing point.

Rout's selection, parish of Mirboo; thence south-westerly by that selection and southerly by the north-western and western boundaries of that selection and a road to the south-west angle of allotment 15; thence further south by a line and the west boundary of allotments 52 and 53 to the south-west angle of the last-named allotment; thence east by a road being the north boundary of allotments 68, 67, 66, 65, 64, 63, and 62 to the Morwell river; thence southerly by said river to the north-west corner of allotment 1, parish of Gunyah Gunyah; thence east along the north boundary of said allotment to its north-east angle; thence south by the east boundary of allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 13B, and 13 to the south-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence north-easterly by the road from Foster to Rosedale, through the parishes of Gunyah Gunyah, Wonyip, Binginwari, Jumbuk, and Bulgua to the road from Yarram to Traralgon; thence northerly by the latter road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, parish of Bulgua; thence east by the north boundary of the last-named parish to the south-east angle of allotment 20, parish of Callignee; thence north by the east boundaries of that allotment and allotments 19 and 18, west by the north boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to a point in line with the east boundary of allotment 16, north by a line and the east boundaries

**WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST

**WHEREAS** by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And that every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, shall state—

(a) The amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same, and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan may be granted;

(b) Shall proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust shall have authority, to be called a waterworks district;

(c) Shall state what are the principal works to be constructed; and

(d) Shall contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit.

And whereas it is further enacted by section 25 of the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid that whenever a waterworks district is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Town of Warrnambool, for a loan of

Thirty-three thousand one hundred and thirty-six pounds six shillings sterling (£33,136 6s.) to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of the town of Warrnambool, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) The Municipal Council of the Town of Warrnambool for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Thirty thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£30,500), for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Commencing at a point on the River Hopkins marked A on Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Water Supply, Melbourne, being the south-west angle of section I, parish of Wangoom; thence by a line bearing north eighty chains; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and twenty-one chains ten links; thence by a line bearing north fifty chains to centre of Merri River; thence west by Merri River six chains or thereabouts; thence by a line bearing south thirteen chains seventy-five links to south side of road; thence by a line bearing east five chains; thence by a line bearing south thirty-five chains fifty-two links; thence by a line bearing west to the Merri River; thence by the Merri River to its mouth; thence on the south by the sea-coast of Warrnambool Bay from the mouth of the said Merri River to the mouth of the River Hopkins; and thence by the west bank of the River Hopkins to the point of commencement.

(5) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of an inlet from the River Merri to the pumping station; basins for lime precipitation and a settling tank; the erection of a pumping plant, service reservoirs at high and low levels, and the reticulation of the town of Warrnambool.

(6) That the name of the Trust shall be the Warrnambool Waterworks Trust.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### EAST BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the East Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, No. 1156, do make the following Regulation:—

##### No. 1. REGULATION OF PROCEEDINGS AT MEETINGS OF THE EAST BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST, ETC.

1. *General conduct of business.*—In all cases not herein provided for, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
2. *Minutes of meeting to be read at next subsequent meeting.*—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall be signed by the chairman; and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Trust at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required.
3. *Order of business at meetings.*—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
  - (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Trust.
  - (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
  - (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
  - (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
  - (v.) Payments.
  - (vi.) Ordinary business.
  - (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
  - (viii.) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
  - (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
  - (x.) Notices of motion.
  - (xi.) Reading of rough minutes (if required).

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

4. *Addresses to Governor.*—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the chairman and secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

5. *Motions.*—All notices of motion shall be dated, and given by the intending mover to the secretary at the close of the meeting of the Trust, or delivered to him at his office personally or by post, provided that he receive them at least four days before the meeting at which they are to be proposed; and such secretary shall number and enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which they may be received.

6. *Notice of motion to be given.*—No commissioner shall make any motion initiating any subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

7. *Petitions.*—No motion except that for receiving same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

8. *Motions to be moved in order in the motion book.*—Except by leave of the Trust, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the secretary in the notice of motion book, or they may be postponed by vote of the Trust, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

9. *Motion to be proceeded with by commissioner giving same, except with consent.*—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.

10. *Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.*—No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

11. *Orders, &c., of debate.*—Any commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the commissioner (if any) calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the commissioner in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

12. *Nature of motion to be stated.*—Any commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

13. *Motion not to be withdrawn without leave.*—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Trust.

14. *Motion to be seconded.*—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded, but a commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

15. *Mover of motion.*—A commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a commissioner merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

16. *Designation of commissioners.*—The commissioners in meeting of the Trust shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of chairman or commissioner, as the case may require.

17. *Priority of commissioners.*—If two or more commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

18. *Chairman to rise in addressing the Trust.*—The chairman shall rise in addressing the Trust to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

19. *Commissioner not to speak a second time on the same question.*—No commissioner shall speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

20. *Points of order.*—The chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final, except when an appeal is made to the Trust immediately upon the chairman giving his decision. On such an appeal no commissioner shall speak more than once, and the question shall be put thus:—"Shall the decision of the chair be maintained?"

21. *Commissioners not to digress, &c.*—No commissioner shall digress from the subject-matter under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other commissioner in a previous debate, and all imputations of improper motives and all personal reflections on commissioners shall be deemed highly disorderly.

22. *Commissioner to apologize for disorderly, &c., expressions.*—Whenever any commissioner shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other commissioner, the commissioner so offending shall be required by the chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

23. *Commissioner called to order to sit down.*—A commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.

24. *Commissioner twice offending guilty of an offence.*—Any commissioner using offensive or disorderly language, and having been twice called to order or to withdraw and apologize for such conduct, and refusing so to do, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

25. *Strangers.*—Any person, not being a commissioner, who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, shall be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when lawfully requested by the chairman so to do, may be forthwith removed by him, and shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

26. *Committees of the whole.*—Whenever a majority of the Trust determine, any matter before the Trust may be referred to a committee of the whole for consideration and report to the Trust, and such report may be received and adopted, or otherwise as the Trust may think fit. When the Trust resolves itself a committee of the whole, the public shall be ordered to withdraw by the chairman, and the doors shall be closed, unless a majority of the committee determine otherwise.

27. *Commissioners not attending order for call.*—Any commissioner not attending in compliance with an order for call of the Trust, without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation.

28. *Commissioner may demand documents.*—Any commissioner may of right demand the production of any documents of the whole Trust applying to the question under discussion, and he may, at any time during business hours, require the officers of the Trust to produce for his inspection or examination any books or documents belonging to the Trust, but such books or documents shall not be removed from the officers without the permission of the chairman, and then only for short and limited periods.

29. *Voting.*—The Trust shall vote by a show of hands, and any commissioner present and not voting, and not being disabled by law for so doing, shall be liable to the penalty imposed for a breach any of the provisions of this regulation. Divisions shall be taken upon any question submitted to the vote of the Trust, provided any commissioner demand it, before the next business has proceeded with. When division is taken, the secretary shall call the names of those commissioners who are present, and enter in his minute book how each vote, whether affirmatively or negatively, and the result shall be declared by the chairman.

30. *Question, how declared.*—The chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Trust, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the results thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

31. *Motions, &c., to be in writing.*—At every meeting of the Trust all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

32. *Amendments.*—(1) No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of. (2) An amendment destroying or altering the intention of a motion shall be in order, but an amendment relating to a different subject shall not be in order. (3) On an amendment to "strike out and insert," the paragraph to be amended shall first be read as it stands, then the words proposed to be struck out and inserted, and, finally, the paragraph as it would stand if so amended.

33. *Effect of rejection of original motion.*—If any words of an original question be rejected, the insertion of other proposed words shall form the next question, whereupon any further amendment to insert other words may be moved.

34. *If amendment be negatived, a second one may be moved.*—If an amendment be negatived, then a second amendment may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved; but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Trust for discussion at a time.

35. *Mover of motion to have right of reply.*—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no commissioner, with the above exception, shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

36. *Adjournment.*—(1) No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made. (2) A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except—1st, when a commissioner is in possession of the floor; 2nd, when the commissioners are voting; 3rd, when adjournment was the last preceding motion; 4th, when it has been decided that the previous question shall be taken. (3) A motion simply to adjourn cannot be amended, but a motion to adjourn may be and is open to debate.

37. *Protests.*—Any commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the secretary, and signed by such commissioner, and shall be also entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

38. *Lapsed questions.*—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of the commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.

39. *Explanations.*—While a member is speaking no one shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling to order or asking of the chairman leave to explain or to call the previous question. A commissioner allowed to explain shall only have the right to explain an actual misunderstanding of language and shall be strictly prohibited from going into debate on the merits of the case.

40. *Privileged questions.*—(1) When a question is before the Trust the only motion in order shall be—1st, to adjourn; 2nd, the previous question; 3rd, to lay on the table; 4th, to postpone indefinitely; 5th, to postpone to a definite period; 6th, to refer; 7th, to divide if the sense will permit of it; 8th, to amend; to take precedence as herein arranged, and the first three to be decided without debate. (2) When the previous question is moved and seconded it shall be put in this form—"Shall the main question now be put?" If this is carried all further amendments and debates shall be excluded and the question shall be taken on the amendment first. If the question has been amended the question shall be taken on the amendment first. It shall not be in order to reconsider the agreement to take the previous question. (3) When a motion and amendment are under discussion it will be in order for any

member to give notice of another amendment which he intends to move in the event of the amendment being lost. Upon such notice no debate will be allowed at that stage. (4) When a motion is postponed indefinitely it shall not come up again during that meeting.

41. *Resolutions, how revoked or altered.*—No resolution at any meeting of the Trust shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice of the intention to propose such resolution or alteration be given to each of the commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of two-thirds of the commissioners present at such subsequent meeting if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to, or by a majority if the number of commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.

42. *Special meetings.*—The Trust may hold special meetings, and the chairman or any three or more of the commissioners may call a special meeting, but no such meeting shall be held unless four clear days' notice thereof at least be given.

43. *Notices of meetings.*—All notices of any meeting or adjourned meeting of the Trust shall be in writing, and shall be delivered or sent by the post or otherwise to the place of abode or place of business of each of the commissioners two clear days at least previous to such meeting; and every such notice shall specify the time of meeting; and in case of a special meeting shall specify the object thereof; and no business shall be transacted at any special meeting except such as is stated in the notice thereof.

44. *Power to suspend officers.*—The Trust may, at any ordinary or special meeting, resolve that a special meeting be called to consider the removal from his office of any officer appointed by the Trust, and may direct that notice of such special meeting be given, and thereupon may suspend such officer from his office pending the holding of such meeting, and may appoint some other person to perform the duties of such office in the meanwhile.

45. *Committees of trust and quorum.*—The Trust may from time to time, as they may see fit, appoint occasional or standing committees, and may fix the quorum of every such committee, and every such committee shall appoint one of the commissioners thereof to be chairman of such committee; and the Trust may from time to time continue, alter, or discontinue such committee, and such committee may from time to time remove such chairman; and every such committee shall report to the Trust. The chairman of the Trust shall be *ex officio* member of all committees, and shall preside at all meetings at which he is present.

46. *Meetings, chairman, &c., of committee.*—Every committee so appointed may meet from time to time, and may adjourn from place to place as they may think proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the committee unless the quorum of members (if any) fixed by the Trust, and, if no quorum be fixed, three members be present; and at all meetings of the committee, if the chairman be not present, one of the commissioners present shall be appointed chairman; and all questions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the commissioners present, and, in case of an equal division of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his vote as a member of the committee.

47. *Seal.*—The seal of the Trust shall be in the custody of the secretary, and shall not be impressed except by direction of the Trust, and in the presence of at least three commissioners.

48. *Lapsed order of the day may be restored.*—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

49. *Committees.*—Minutes of all proceedings of committees, as well as their reports, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the chairman of the committee, shall be presented to the Trust; and the secretary, when practicable, shall attend all meetings of the committee.

50. *Meetings of committees.*—The secretary shall convene every committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any time thereafter by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the chairman of the committee, or of any two members of the committee.

51. *Petitions.*—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day.

52. *Petitions to be respectful.*—It shall be incumbent on every commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that the contents do not violate any by-law or any provision hereof.

53. *Commissioners to affix their names.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall write his name at the beginning thereof.

54. *Petition to be in writing.*—Every petition shall be in writing, and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof; and the petition shall be prepared in a way similar to that adopted with regard to petitions presented to Parliament.

55. *To be signed by the petitioners.*—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks, and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.

56. *No letters, &c., to be attached.*—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.

57. *No letters or memorials to be dealt with.*—No letters or memorials shall be dealt with at any meeting of the commissioners unless received at the offices of the Trust, or the office of the chairman, not later than the day preceding the day of meeting.

58. *Deputations to signify intention.*—Deputations can only be received by the Trust when they have signified their intention of waiting upon the Trust, and stated their object at least one day beforehand.

59. *Letters or memorials returned for amendment.*—When letters or memorials do not accurately indicate the localities by giving the number of the allotment, and section, and name of the parish, or other technical description, it shall be in order to return the documents for amendment.

60. *Commissioners confined to statement of certain facts.*—Every commissioner presenting a petition to the Trust shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

61. *Appointment, &c., of officers.*—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the irrigation district, and such other newspapers, if any, as the Trust may determine, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same.

62. *Salaries of officers, &c.*—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed, before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, by advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement, except when the Trust by special resolution, which may be moved without notice, orders otherwise.

63. *No commissioner, &c., to be surety for officer.*—No commissioner or officer of the Trust, and no assessor or auditor of the Trust, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Trust, or for any work to be done for the Trust.

64. *Expense of preparing security.*—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty or contract, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

65. *Suspension of rules.*—Any one or more of the rules and regulations contained herein may be suspended for a special purpose on motion, upon notice duly given, and shall not otherwise be suspended, except by a unanimous vote of the Trust.

66. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this regulation, he or she shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds.

**YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.**

**T**HE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulations:—

*Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust District.*

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at £24 (Twenty-four pounds *ster.*) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1891.

2. Upon properties of the municipal value of £15 and not more than £23, a rate of One pound and ten shillings shall be payable. Upon properties valued at £14 and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, provided that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be payable.

4. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) from the works of the Trust, shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For every steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government departments, cricket grounds, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties, shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Fifty shillings per annum, otherwise by special agreement.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrant, for each load of two hundred gallons or under, Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Ten shillings, and a maximum rate of Forty shillings, per annum for persons using a hose for ornamented or garden purposes.

11. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid monthly.

12. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust and by virtue of the powers contained in the *Water Act 1890*, on the 20th day of March, 1891.

2. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

3. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality.

4. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternatively, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

5. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt.

6. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the officer commanding, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.

10. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

11. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.
