### MURDER, BALLARAT NORTH.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

**W**HEREAS on Saturday, the 23rd May inst., at about 6.45 p.m., a man named Nicholas Hoeney was found at the intersection of Ligar and Howitt streets, Ballarat North, suffering from wounds on his head and neck, which caused his death a few minutes afterwards; And whereas the injuries appear to have been inflicted with some such instrument as a shingling-hammer or a small tomahawk: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of One hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for information which will lead to the arrest and conviction of the offender or offenders; and that the Governor will extend Her Majesty's Free Pardon to any accomplice giving the required information, provided such accomplice did not actually commit the deed.

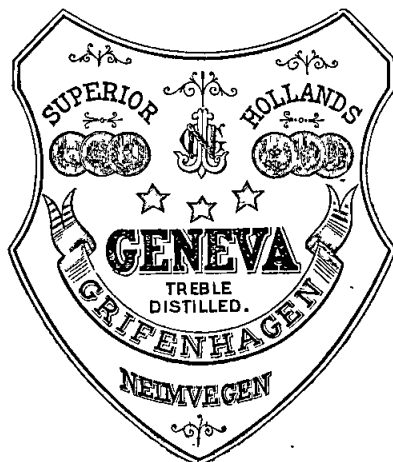

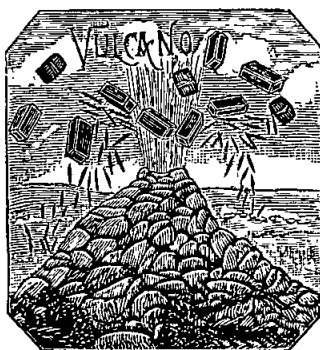

Intending candidates must give notice of their intention in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

**PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.**

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

IV. Or he must have completed the full course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, and have served one year in the field as above.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination; but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience, and of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

No. 1112) it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make orders amongst other things to constitute any part of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof, estimated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Five hundred pounds a shire; to subdivide or re-subdivide any municipal district into any number of subdivisions not exceeding eight; to alter the boundaries of or abolish the subdivisions existing in any municipal district; and to determine and alter within the limits prescribed by the said Act the number of councillors assigned to any municipality: And whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Shire of Lowan, praying that a certain area described in such petition, being the West Riding of the said shire be severed from the said shire and constituted a separate municipality under the name and title of the Shire of Lawloit: And whereas the substance and prayer of such petition have been published in the manner directed by the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make an Order constituting a shire to be named the Shire of Lawloit, the boundaries of which, as also those of the said Shire of Lowan as reduced, shall be those hereunder set forth and described; and doth order that the said new Shire of Lawloit shall be subdivided into three ridings, to be named respectively the North Riding, the West Riding, and the East Riding, the several boundaries of which shall be those also set forth and described hereunder; and doth hereby order that the council of the said newly constituted Shire of Lawloit shall consist of nine members.

WHEREAS by section 96 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, make an order that the provisions of the *Water Conservation Act 1887* (No. 946), with regard to the formation of a sinking fund by any Waterworks Trust which has obtained a loan, shall not apply in the case of any such Trust specified in such order for a period of five years or any shorter period (to be specified in such order) from the date of the Order in Council granting the loan:

And whereas by Orders in Council dated respectively the 26th February, 1883, 17th September, 1886, and 11th August, 1888, loans of £15,829, £3,500, and £6,411, were granted to the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the above-recited provisions of the said *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), doth order that the provisions of the *Water Conservation Act 1887* (No. 946) aforesaid, with regard to the formation of a sinking fund by the said Waterworks Trust, in respect of the said loans, shall not apply until the 26th February, 1883, as regards the loan of £15,829; the 13th September, 1891, as regards the loan of £3,500; and the 11th August, 1883, as regards the loan of £6,411.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### KYABRAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1891.

##### REGULATION No. 8.

THE Commissioners of the Kyabram Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1891 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

(1) For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

(2) For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Ten pounds annual value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), Two shillings and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, Thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing house-walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter.

4. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to carry or take away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, one-half inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, three-quarter inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.



6. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are the pipes of the Trust.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler, for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern only so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

10. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

11. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

12. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meters laid, and being under and in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

13. In the construction of these regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Kyabram Waterworks Trust."

14. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap, or in any way interfere with, any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be £1.

THE Commissioners of the Murchison Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an urban district, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

##### REGULATION No. 3.

1. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such persons either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied; but no such cutting off of the water supply shall exempt the offender from payment of the water-rate during such suspension of the supply, nor from any fine or penalty provided for such offence by the *Water Act 1890* or these regulations.

2. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe or service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. Before any such licence shall be granted the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent person. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling any such licence at any time.

4. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend, by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention to do so, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission, in writing, of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

5. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with any pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with pipes of the Trust, or

who shall make such communication, except under the superintendence and according to the direction of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any pipe to communicate with pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

6. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting the service-pipe or otherwise as the said Trust may think fit, until the necessary repairs have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipe, the occupier (if any), and if none the owner, shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipes being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. The Trust may order meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter to be provided, fixed, and maintained at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied will be charged for at the rates provided for in the regulations made by the Trust from time to time in that behalf.

8. Every meter shall be so placed so as to be open to inspection and as far as practicable in a situation where it cannot be affected by frost or injured by any other means, and shall be provided with means of access thereto.

9. The whole of the works herein referred to shall be carried out under the superintendence and according to the directions of the Trust's officer, and any disputes between the various parties concerned as to the quality of work and labour done or to the exact meaning of this specification and the general conditions, shall be referred to the Trust, whose decision in all cases shall be final and binding on all parties.

#### EAST BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the East Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

##### No. 2.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers.

2. All irrigation or other outlets required from any of the channels or works of the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust, upon the application only of owners of the land to be supplied from such outlet or outlets, or of occupiers of the said land indorsed or approved by such owners.

3. All applications for the construction of irrigation outlets shall be dealt with by the duly appointed committee of the Trust to manage and regulate the distribution of the available water, and known as the Water Committee, except when otherwise directed by the Trust.

4. Only one outlet shall be allowed to each owner or occupier of land up to 320 acres, and one for every additional 320 acres, or fraction thereof, except in such cases where the Trust may order otherwise, or the full cost of construction of the said outlet is paid by the applicant.

5. Outlets may be fixed at any suitable spot most convenient to the applicant, subject to the approval of the engineer to the Trust.

6. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier, or any other person in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

8. In no case shall the charge for supply of water be less than for 3 inches per acre for cultivated land.

9. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the committee of the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence. And the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.



10. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him.

11. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances (unless by the express written sanction of the Trust), open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

12. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of the Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, and to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

13. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.

## FITTINGS AND CONNEXIONS FOR THE DIAMOND DRILLS.

1. The contractor must provide all necessary tools and labour, and also all material where not otherwise specified in the Schedule, for fully completing all work which may be ordered, and he shall, as soon as finished, deliver such work at the nearest railway station, or at any other place not exceeding a distance of one mile from his workshop, which may be indicated by the officer in charge. Each delivery must be accompanied by an invoice or delivery note in duplicate. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods shall have been approved of by the officer in charge. The contractor shall, in every case, immediately after despatching any goods to the Department or to any of the drills, send or give notice to the officer in charge of the time of despatch, of the place where such goods have been forwarded, and the number of the order for the same; failing which being done, the contractor will be liable to have his contract cancelled without further notice, at the option of the Secretary for Mines.

2. The contractor will be required to furnish, in duplicate, any accounts he may have against the Mining Department in the prescribed form, accompanied by the orders for the goods, and receipts from the persons for whose use the same have been supplied; each account must include all the goods mentioned in the order.

3. The contract will be for such articles or repairs as may be ordered from the 1st July, 1891, to 30th June, 1892. All material and workmanship in connexion with this contract are to be of the very best description, and to be to the entire satisfaction of any officer who may be authorized by the Minister of Mines or Secretary for Mines to act on behalf of the Department of Mines in connexion with this contract, and such officer (herein designated the officer in charge) shall have full power to reject any articles he may deem to be not satisfactory or not in every way suitable.

4. When any order shall have been given to the contractor, he must use every despatch in getting the work done; if he do not, or if the work or material be not to the entire satisfaction of the officer in charge, it shall be optional with such officer in charge to cancel such order and get the work required done wherever he shall think fit, at the contractor's risk and expense; and any extra expense so incurred over the contract price will be deducted from any moneys due to the contractor. The officer in charge shall be the sole judge as to whether the contractor is using all necessary despatch in getting the work done, and as to whether the work or material is of the very best description. On the contractor receiving any portion of drills, machinery, or tool for repairs or otherwise from any of the drills, or from any other source, he must, in every case, send a receipt for the same to the officer in charge.

5. When any work is required that does not appear in the Schedule, offers may be obtained in the usual way without in any way infringing this contract.

6. As soon as possible after the contract is signed, the Department will lend the gauge-tape and nuts to the contractor for fourteen days, when the contractor must return them to the Department, having first made gauge-taps and dies for his own use. The Department will require the contractor to make standard gauges for all necessary work at his own expense. The contractor must also make duplicate gauges for his own use and at his own expense.

7. When goods shall be ordered of a size not exceeding one-quarter of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price for such goods shall not be more than that quoted in the Schedule. In cases, however, where the size required shall be more than one-quarter of an inch over the sizes mentioned in the Schedule, the price specified in the Schedule for the next larger size will be paid to the contractor.

8. It will be competent for the Secretary for Mines on behalf of the Government, or the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of one month.

9. The contractor must deliver to the Department all gauges, patterns, and all old material, at least fortnightly; failing which, it will be in the power of the Secretary for Mines to cancel the contract without further notice.

The contractor shall provide two inches of sawdust for the bottom of the coffin; a small block of wood to keep the head of the deceased in position, and sufficient white calico to cover the body. In the event of a body being decomposed, or whenever it may be considered necessary by the member of the Police Force issuing the order for the burial, a coffin must be supplied sufficiently large to leave at least 2 inches between the body and the sides and top and bottom of the coffin, and this space must be filled up round the body with pine or phenyle sawdust by the contractor at his own expense; and in the event of any neglect in so providing or filling up the coffin it will be competent for the Tender Board to inflict a fine not exceeding £5 to be deducted as in Condition 9. Coffins to be properly lowered into the graves, and the graves filled up again.

4. The graves to be dug of the proper depth, and in conformity with the Cemetery Regulations.

5. In the event of the contractor failing to attend punctually to the order, the work will be otherwise performed, and the extra expense, if any, incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. When burials are required to take place on Sunday, no delay must take place in complying therewith, and any additional fees charged by the cemetery authorities will be repaid to the contractor.

The contractor must pay the minister's fee for reading the burial service should it be claimed, and he will be reimbursed, on producing the minister's receipt, which must specify that the burial service was duly and properly performed, and that he received the fee for so doing; the receipt must also specify the name, age, and denomination of deceased, the name and denomination of the minister who performed the burial service, and the hour when the service was performed.

8. The account is to be rendered monthly to the officer ordering the service for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne. The charge for the minister's fee should be included in the account for the funeral.

9. In the event of any charge of impropriety or neglect in conducting the funerals being established against the contractor, the Government may for the first offence deduct from the security money, by way of fine, £5; and for the second offence a similar amount, and, in addition thereto, may forthwith cancel the contract.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

**KYNETON HOSPITAL.**

**BY-LAWS** of the Kyneton Hospital (incorporated), as adopted at a special meeting of contributors, convened for that purpose and held in the Mechanics' Institute, Kyneton, on the 5th March, 1891.

The By-laws till now existing for the management of the Hospital shall be and are hereby repealed.

1. The Hospital shall be for the purpose of affording medical aid and surgical relief in accident or disease, under such conditions as the committee shall from time to time determine.

**PRIVILEGE OF CONTRIBUTORS.**

2. Every benefactor of Twenty pounds and upwards, and every annual contributor of One pound and upwards, shall be regarded as "contributors for the time being," under the section of the Act of Incorporation, and be eligible to be members of committee.

3. Every such contributor shall have power for twelve months from the date of his subscription to recommend patients for the Hospital, at the rate of one in-patient and two out-patients for every pound sterling subscribed, subject to the approval of the committee, and shall also be entitled to one vote at the meetings of the contributors, provided that such subscription shall have been paid to the collector, and reported by him to the treasurer on or before 3 o'clock p.m., on the day preceding the day fixed for holding the annual elections of officers and members of committee of management.

4. The sum of Twenty pounds sterling or more, paid by one person in any one donation in any one year, shall entitle the donor to be placed on the list of life governors. The life governors have the same privileges in respect of recommending patients as annual subscribers of three pounds, and they are eligible for election as members of committee or any honorary office.

**MEETINGS OF CONTRIBUTORS.**

5. The annual meetings shall be held on the last Thursday in July in each year, at which the report of the committee and balance-sheet shall be submitted for the approval of the contributors. At the commencement of the business of such meetings three contributors shall be appointed to try the validity of all

disputed elections during the year. Two contributors shall also be elected as auditors for the year, and any vacancies occurring in the said offices during the currency of the year shall be filled up by the committee for the time being. All matters pertaining to the Hospital shall be open to discussion; and resolutions may be passed on any such matters, and any business brought before it (which may consistently with the Act of Incorporation and the By-laws be transacted at it) may be absolutely decided upon. That the balance-sheet and annual report of committee be published in one or more newspapers prior to the annual meeting.

6. At all meetings of the contributors or of the committee the president, or in his absence the vice-president, shall take the chair, but in the absence of these officers the meeting shall choose its own chairman.

7. At all meetings of the contributors or of the committee the chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and also a casting vote whenever the numbers are equal.

8. It shall be competent for the general committee, by vote, or any twelve or more contributors, by writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of contributors at any time or times between the annual meetings; the occasion of calling every such meeting shall be specified in the requisition, and no other business shall be transacted thereat; and every such meeting shall, with an intelligent reference to its object, be called by the secretary, by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, at least one week before the day of meeting, the business of such meeting being fully set forth in such advertisement.

9. At all meetings of contributors twenty present shall form a quorum, and in the event of there being no quorum, the majority present shall appoint a subsequent day (not more than fourteen days after) for the meeting to be held.

**MANAGEMENT.**

10. The affairs of the Hospital shall be managed by a committee, consisting of a president, vice-president, treasurer, twelve (12) ordinary members, and three honorary medical officers, who shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting of contributors, as herein provided, or at a meeting of contributors specially called for that purpose, and who shall retire in the following order, viz.:—The president, vice-president, treasurer, and honorary medical officers (who shall be three in number, and shall reside within ten miles of the town of Kyneton) annually, and ordinary members in accordance with clause 11 of Act 220, 27 Victoria, and clause 4 of Act 816, 48 Victoria. But every retiring member shall be eligible for re-election; and any member of committee, on being elected to any of the above offices, viz., president, vice-president, treasurer, or honorary medical officers, shall cease to be an ordinary member of committee, and the vacancy so made shall be filled up at the same meeting at which such officer is elected. Should any vacancy occur in any of the before-mentioned offices, it shall be filled up by the remaining members of committee, in accordance with clause 12 of Act 220. No member of committee shall remain longer than three years in office without being re-elected, except as provided in clause 4 of Act 816, 48 Victoria.

11. The general committee shall direct the business of the Hospital, frame rules for its internal regulations (the same not being repugnant to the By-laws), alter, repeal, amend, and make new rules, enter into contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles for the use of the Hospital, direct payments to be made for the same, and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the institution. They shall meet once in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint by way of adjournment or otherwise, and four shall form a quorum. If no quorum shall be present within thirty minutes after the time named, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereinafter authorized, shall stand adjourned to such day as the members present may determine. All new rules made by the committee shall be embodied in their report to the contributors.

12. The president shall be an *ex officio* member of all committees.

13. The general committee, by vote, or three members thereof, by writing under their hand, or the president, shall be at liberty at any time to require the secretary to summon a special meeting of the general committee, three clear days' notice of which shall be given to each member, and the object specified.

14. No member of committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have any pecuniary interest.

15. All paid officers and servants shall be appointed and dismissed by the general committee, and shall find such security as may be required.

16. The treasurer shall receive all moneys on behalf of the institution, and deposit the same in such bank as the committee shall direct, to the credit of the Kyneton Hospital. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee, by drafts on the bank, which shall be countersigned at a meeting by the chairman and secretary. He shall keep an account of all money received and paid, and report the same to each monthly meeting of committee, and shall present a financial report to the annual general meeting of contributors, the same being previously examined and signed by the auditors.

17. The honorary medical officers shall have access to the Hospital at all times. They and the resident surgeon shall perform all surgical operations in such order as may be agreed upon among themselves, but no such operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of as many of the medical staff as can be obtained, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in cases of importance or protracted continuance in the Hospital.

18. The secretary shall attend all annual, special, and general committee meetings, take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose, and carry out all the directions of such meeting in all particulars incident to his office.

19. The collector shall canvass for and collect subscriptions, and all moneys due to or receivable by the institution, in all



cases giving receipts, and shall, within seven days of the time of receipt of such moneys, pay over the same to the treasurer, who shall give him an acquittance.

20. A house committee, consisting of five members, three of whom shall form a quorum, shall be elected for six months, by, from, and subject to the general committee. It shall be their duty to visit the Hospital at least once a fortnight, to examine the buildings, inspect the wards, make inquiries as to the quality and quantity of the rations, enforce the rules, investigate the accounts, and bring up a report at the next monthly meeting of the same, and all other things connected with the management of the institution, and requiring attention, for the consideration of the general committee. They shall have power to make such purchases for the use of the Hospital to the extent of Five pounds as may be urgently required. The office of any member of the house committee shall cease by his ceasing to be a member of the general committee, or by neglecting to attend to his duties for two months in succession. The election of this committee shall take place at the first meeting of general committee after the annual election and again at the expiration of six months. Vacancies shall be filled by general committee.

21. There shall be a standing finance committee, consisting of three members and the treasurer, who shall examine all accounts prior to the monthly meetings, and certify to their correctness, two members to form a quorum; and that in the event of the finance committee not having passed the accounts prior to the meeting, the committee shall have power to appoint two of those present to examine the accounts, and upon their report the said accounts shall be dealt with by the committee.

#### ELECTIONS.

22. At all annual elections held under these by-laws the president for the time being shall be the returning-officer, and shall have power to appoint a deputy to act in his behalf, such deputy to have full power to give a casting vote if necessary.

23. Not less than fourteen clear days before any election held under these by-laws the returning officer or his deputy shall give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district, and by such notice shall require every candidate at such election to notify his candidature to the returning officer or his deputy at such place and at such time as may be appointed, not being less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein, in writing under his hand, and signed by two contributors nominating him, and by himself or his agent assenting to such nomination.

24. Where, at the expiration of the time fixed for receiving nominations of candidates, there are not more candidates than there are vacancies in each office respectively, the returning officer or his deputy shall declare such candidates duly elected.

25. If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of officers and members of committee to be elected, the returning officer or his deputy shall cause ballot-papers to be printed with the names of all the candidates in full thereon, and shall notify such nomination in some newspaper circulating in the district.

26. Any candidate, duly nominated, desirous to retire from such candidature may do so not later than four clear days before the day fixed for the annual election by forwarding to the returning officer or his deputy a paper signed by him stating that he retires from such election.

27. On the day and at the place fixed by the returning-officer or his deputy, the poll shall be open from two o'clock p.m. till four o'clock p.m., and any contributor may at any time between the hours herein specified demand and shall receive from the returning officer or his deputy a ballot-paper to be marked by him according to the directions printed thereon and deposited in the ballot-box within the said hours.

28. At the expiration of the time fixed for closing the poll the returning officer or his deputy shall, in the presence of two scrutineers then and there appointed by the contributors, open the ballot-box, count the votes given for each candidate, and declare the result of such poll, and shall also notify said result in the next issue of some newspaper circulating in the district.

29. In the event of the number of candidates nominated not being equal to the number to be elected, an extraordinary election shall be held to fill such vacancies as may be required.

30. The secretary shall, between the hour of three o'clock p.m. on the day proceeding that fixed for holding every annual election and the hour fixed for holding every annual meeting of contributors, make out a list arranged in proper alphabetical order of all persons entitled to vote under these by-laws, such list to be certified under the hands of the president and treasurer.

All applicants for admission must in ordinary cases procure a recommendation from a contributor before being allowed the benefits of the Hospital, the fitness of all applicants for relief to be determined by the house committee, and in the absence of the other members by the resident surgeon. Every applicant for treatment must also sign the following declaration on the recommendation form.

I, A.B., hereby certify that I am in such destitute circumstances as to be unable to pay for medical treatment, medicines, or other relief.

32. Cases of emergency or severe accidents shall be admitted without requiring a recommendation, and the sub-committee or resident surgeon have the power of dispensing with the recommendation paper in special cases. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no person afflicted with any infectious disease or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of one of the medical or surgical officers and resident surgeon or house committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as in-patient under any circumstances, and the cause of the refusal of any applicant so refused admittance shall be stated by the resident surgeon in his report to the next meeting of the general committee.

83. All patients shall be required to pay the actual expense of their in-maintenance as far as their circumstances may enable them, and all property found on deceased patients shall be handed to the legal representatives of the Curator of Intestate Estates, and an account rendered to the said curator for the amount due for the patient's maintenance and burial.

34. The resident surgeon shall receive all out-door patients, previously admitted for medical treatment, on Tuesdays and Fridays, between the hours of twelve and two o'clock. Previous to the departure of patients, who may leave the Hospital of their own desire, they shall be required to sign a declaration to that effect.

35. Ministers of religion, or persons certified by them in writing to be qualified, and no other, shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at all reasonable times for the purpose of religious instruction. Every clergyman or religious instructor shall confine his visits to the sick patients who belong to his religious communion, unless his services are specially requested by any of the patients, and shall impart religious instruction at the bedside of the patient in such a way as to be as little overheard as possible by the surrounding patients. It is not allowable to read in a loud voice or conduct public religious service in the sick wards of the Hospital, but the board room of the Hospital shall be available for public worship among the convalescents of each religious persuasion, as far as the same may be practicable, subject to the approval of the general committee.

#### CONTRACTS.

36. The general committee shall not have power to enter into agreements with the paid officers or servants, or into any contracts for the supply of goods for a period extending over the Hospital year, which shall terminate on the last Thursday of July in every year.

37. That no member of committee shall be allowed to supply any article whatsoever for the use of the Hospital, either by tender or otherwise.

38. All goods shall, where practicable, be supplied by contract, and all tenders for the supply of goods shall be accompanied by a cash deposit as security of the due fulfilment of the contract to such amount as the general committee shall from time to time direct.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE ROYAL PARK, MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* power is given to the Trustees of any Crown lands heretofore reserved from sale for any public purpose whatsoever, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of such lands vested in them, or any part thereof, or for the preservation of good order and decency in such lands: Now therefore the Trustees of the Royal Park, in pursuance of the power as aforesaid, do hereby make the Rules and Regulations following to be observed and enforced in the Royal Park, Melbourne:—

1. All rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, and management of the Royal Park, Melbourne, are hereby rescinded.

2. The gates of the park shall be open for horses and private vehicles from sunrise to sunset.

3. No public conveyance, cart, or vehicle plying for hire, or bearing either name or number, shall, in any case, be permitted to use any of the roads of the park as a thoroughfare.

4. Vehicles shall approach the entrance to the Zoological and Acclimatisation Society's Gardens from the south, and after setting down passengers, shall be removed to the site set apart as a carriage stand. No horse shall stand within the gardens, or be attached to any of the fences around them.

5. No person shall ride or drive on the grass or on the footways, and all persons using the carriage ways shall keep the proper side of the road as on public roads.

6. No person shall enter the park for the purpose of breaking in horses, or training or exercising horses, or break in, train, or exercise horses within the park, or jump horses over any of the fences, or drive cattle or sheep through the park.

7. No person shall climb any of the fences or trees, or damage the same by cutting or otherwise defacing the same, or stick bills on the trees, fences, or gates, or lie on the seats, or, without the sanction of the trustees, remove any wood, gravel, stone, sand, earth, or other material from the park.

8. No person shall bring any dog into the park unless held by a chain or cord, or discharge firearms, or throw stones, or use any projectile whatever, or molest any of the animals in the park, or, without the sanction of the trustees, kindle any fire therein.

9. No person shall be allowed in the park with firearms of any sort, bows and arrows, shanghais, slings, or other such implements.

10. No person shall take birds' nests, or enter upon plots of ground enclosed for plantations or other purposes.

11. No public meeting or assemblage of people for any purpose shall be held in the park without the sanction of the trustees.

12. No person taking part in sports of any kind (or under any other circumstances) shall appear in the park except in decent costume.

13. No person shall (unless by permission in writing of the trustees) sell or offer for sale any article of merchandise or trade within the park.

14. No person shall leave empty bottles, or broken glass or crockery, paper, or any other litter in the park, or beat carpets, or dry clothes, or commit any nuisance.

15. Preaching or public harangues, whereby a crowd is collected, shall not be permitted within the park.



16. All goats and poultry found within the park shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Cricket, football, or other athletic sports shall not be played or take place in any part of the park on Sundays.

18. Any person found in a state of intoxication, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or taking part in a fight or disturbance, or committing in the park any act of indecency, or appearing in indecent costume, or making use of foul, indecent, threatening, or abusive language to or within hearing of any other person, may be forthwith removed by any Crown lands bailiff or police constable.

19. Any person offending against any of the foregoing Rules and Regulations shall, in accordance with section 137 of *Land Act 1880*, No. 1106, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who so offends; and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff, officer or servant, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
