# CENSUS DISTRICTS.—ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the Census Act 1891 (54 Vict. No. 1171) the Governor in Council has cancelled the Order in Council, made under the provisions of the said section of the said Act on the 13th January, 1891, and published in the Government Gazette of the 16th January, page 269, defining the District for which Enumerators for the purpose of taking the Census shall respectively act, so far as the same relates to the District "17. Castlemaine," and in lieu thereof has defined the District "17. Castlemaine," and "17B. Chewton and Metcalfe," in manner following, that is to say:—

#### 17a. · Castlemaine.

Commencing at the south-cast angle of the parish of Fryers, thence west by the south boundary of that parish to the east boundary of allotment 6a, section 6, parish of Fryers; south, west, and north by that allotment to the north boundary of the parish of Holcombo, and by that boundary west to the east boundary of the parish of Yandoit; by the east and north boundaries of that parish to Limestone Creek; down that creek to the Loddon River; up that river to the south-east angle of allotment 38, section 6, parish of Guildford; north to the south boundary of the Stratholdden pre-emptive section; east to Campbell's Creek; up that creek to the south boundary of the Stratholdden pre-emptive section; east to Campbell's Creek; up that creek to the south boundary of the parish of Castlemaine; by the south and west boundaries of that parish to the north-east angle of allotment 31n, section A, parish of Castlemaine, to a point due south of the south-west angle of the Castlemaine borough boundary; north to that angle; by the west and north boundaries of the borough of Castlemaine to the south-west angle of the latter; cast and north by the south and east boundary of the borough of Chewton to the south by that creek to the east boundary of the parish of Creek; east by that creek to the east boundary of the parish of Fryers to the commencing point.

REVISED REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

THE subjoined Regulations respecting Naval Cadets, received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

By His Excellency's Command,

#### REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the Information of Candidates.

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Appointments to naval caeteships will be made by limited election, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury; (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination, and will announce the results. A fee of Ten shillings will be required from each candidate.

- 2. Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.
- 3. All nominations of candidates for naval cadetships are made by the First Lord, with the exception of a limited number which are at the disposal of individual members of the Board and the secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A flag officer or a commodore 1st class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment.

No captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of captain, but a flag officer or a commodore 1st class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

- In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.
- 4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Tuesday in June and the last Tuesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.
- 6. No candidate will be eligible for the June Examinations whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz. :—Not less than 13 nor more than 14½ years of age. Nor for the November Examinations, whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.
- 7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Givil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.
- 8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a registrar's certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (a certificate of baptism will not be accepted); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

i. Arithmetic: including proportion, vulgar and

ii. Geometry: Euclid, Book I., with exercises and

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test and in the further examination.

10. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 660 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.

and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.

11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but, he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age. the limits of age.

12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

13. For all cadets entered under these regulations the payment will be at the rate of £75 per annum for the period in the

14. In addition to the annual payments mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, the parent or guardian will be charged with the personal expenses incurred by the cadet for washing, repairing boots and clothes, hair cutting, pocket-money, &c.

15. The period of training on board the Britannia will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

16. (a) Examinations in seamanship and study will be held at the end of each term.

(b) Cadets who fail at the end of their second term to obtain 40 per cent. of marks in mathematical subjects will be ordered to be withdrawn.

(c) Cadets who fail at the final examination to obtain 40 per cent. in the mathematical subjects, including the theory of navigation and nautical astronomy, and 40 per cent. in the technical subjects, combined with physics and French, will be ordered to be withdrawn.

(d) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory

withdrawn.

(d) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct or who fail to obtain half marks in seamanship will be "warned;" and should they be again reported or again fail to pass in seamanship they will be discharged. Any cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the Britannia.

\* "Gardiner's Outlines of English History" (Longmans) has been selected as the present text-book for examination in English History. The subject will be divided into periods, as follows:—

Examination to be held in November, 1890, A.D. 1485-1688. After June, 1891, the subject will be divided into two periods, viz.:—

1st period from the earliest times to A.D. 1603. 2nd period from A.D. 1603 to 1820.

The first period being set at the Examination held in November, and the second period at that held in June of each year.

- (e) Any cadet who shall at any time appear to their Lordships to be unfit for the naval service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the Britannia, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.
- 17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the Britannia is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the Britannia), to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.
- 18. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the
- 19. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.
- 20. No pay will be allowed by Government to cadets in the ritannia. The pocket money allowed to cadets will be charged Britannia. to the parents.
- 21. As only cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. Britannia, the Lords Commissioners of the Admirally desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of cadets being taught to swim before they join the training ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of use of the boats.

Polling booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, caused to be hired and used as a polling booth, any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.
- 23. Returning officer to preside at polling booth.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.
- 24. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.
- 25. Pencils to be provided.—The retiring officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

Mode of voting—Where voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give, more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers, the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and up person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or ballot-papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.
- 27. Ballot-papers to benumbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll; and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.
- 28. Informal ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void, ann of no effect.
- 20. What questions may be asked.—At any election of a Commissioner the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to

- do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—
  - "Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force in the urban division of this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll")?
- And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.
- 30. Folse answer, polling twice, and personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once, at the same election, or who shall depart, or attempt to depart, from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as herein-before provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.
- 31. Result of polling, how ascertained—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer shall, in the presence of, and subject to the inspection of, so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidate who has received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected a Commissioner of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes the returning officer shall have the casting vote.
- 32. Ballot papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of a Commissioner, forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, indorse with a description of the content thereof, and sign the sealed pareel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall as soon as may be after the first meeting of Trust Commissioners after any such election shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the sccretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, indorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.
- 33. Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.—
  If any question arise as to the due election of the Commissioner
  at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of
  any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the
  Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be
  final and binding.
- 34. Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election, but no Commissioner, in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen, shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.
- 35. Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.
- 36. Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancy.—If at any election of a Commissioner for the said division the vacancy is not filled up, then it shall be deemed to be an extraordinary vacancy, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioner eventually elected to fill such vacancy shall go out of office as if elected at such election.
- 37. Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election, shall be defrayed by the Trust.
- 38. Penalty for breach of Regulations.—These Regulations shall also be deemed to be Regulations under section 414 of the Water Act 1830; and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.
- 39. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to, o inconsistent with, this interpretation.
