CENSUS DISTRICTS.—ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the Census Act 1891 (54 Vict. No. 1171) the Governor in Council has cancelled the Order in Council, made under the provisions of the said section of the said Act on the 13th January, 1891, and published in the Government Gazette of the 16th January, page 269, defining the Districts for which Enumerators for the purpose of taking the Census shall respectively act, so far as the same relates to the District "17. Castlemaine," and in lieu thereof has defined the District "17A. Castlemaine," and "17B. Chewton and Metcalfe," in manner following, that is to say:—

17A. CASTLEMAINE.

Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Fryers, thence west by the south boundary of that parish to the east boundary of allotment 6A, section 6, parish of Fryers; south, west, and north by that allotment to the north boundary of the parish of Holcombe, and by that boundary west to the east boundary of the parish of Yandoit; by the east and north boundaries of that parish to Limestone Creek; down that creek to the Loddon River; up that river to the south-east angle of allotment 38, section 6, parish of Guildford; north to the south boundary of the Strathludden pre-emptive section; east to Campbell's Creek; up that creek to the south boundary of the parish of Castlemaine; by the south and west boundaries of that parish to the north-east angle of allotment 31B, section A, parish of Muckleford; thence north-easterly and south-easterly by the north boundaries of allotments 34 and 31, section 6, parish of Castlemaine, to a point due south of the south-west angle of the Castlemaine borough boundary; north to that angle; by the west and north boundaries of the borough of Castlemaine to the north-east angle thereof; south by the east boundary of that borough and the west boundary of the borough of Chewton to the south-west angle of the latter; east and north by the south and east boundaries of the borough of Chewton to Green Gully Creek; east by that creek to the east boundary of the parish of Chewton; south by that boundary and the east boundary of the parish of Fryers to the commencing point.

REVISED REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

THE subjoined Regulations respecting Naval Cadets, received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the Information of Candidates.

1. Appointments to naval cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Four cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed five in any one year. Service cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the army, navy, or marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury; (b) sons of officers of the navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the active list not lower than that of commander. Not more than two such latter service cadets will be nominated annually.

Applications for service cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the army; to the secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the navy or marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and service cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these regulations.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination, and will announce the results. A fee of Ten shillings will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. All nominations of candidates for naval cadetships are made by the First Lord, with the exception of a limited number which are at the disposal of individual members of the Board and the secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A flag officer or a commodore 1st class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment.

No captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of captain, but a flag officer or a commodore 1st class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

4. The nominations will be made half-yearly, as soon as convenient after the report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, and will commence on the second Tuesday in June and the last Tuesday in November in each year, and the appointments will date from the 15th July and 15th January following respectively.

6. No candidate will be eligible for the June Examinations whose age will not be within the following limits on the 15th July following, viz. :—Not less than 13 nor more than 14½ years of age. Nor for the November Examinations, whose age will not be within those limits on the 15th January following.

7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the navy.

8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a registrar's certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (*a certificate of baptism will not be accepted*); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

9. Candidates will be tested by examination in the following subjects:—

The final order of merit will be determined by the sum of the marks obtained in the test and in the further examination.

10. Colonial and service cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain 600 marks in the aggregate, as well as the proportion of marks in arithmetic and other subjects required from the candidates who compete.

11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. No candidate will be allowed to compete more than twice. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

13. For all cadets entered under these regulations the payment will be at the rate of £75 per annum for the period in the *Britannia*, to be paid half-yearly in advance to the accountant-general of the navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the cadets entered at each half-yearly examination, a number, not to exceed eight, being sons of officers of the navy, army, or marines, or of civil officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the cadet.

14. In addition to the annual payments mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, the parent or guardian will be charged with the personal expenses incurred by the cadet for washing, repairing boots and clothes, hair cutting, pocket-money, &c.

15. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be two terms in each year. The first term of each year will be from February to July, the second from September to December.

The vacations will be five weeks at Christmas, two weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

16. (a) Examinations in seamanship and study will be held at the end of each term.

(b) Cadets who fail at the end of their second term to obtain 40 per cent. of marks in mathematical subjects will be ordered to be withdrawn.

(c) Cadets who fail at the final examination to obtain 40 per cent. in the mathematical subjects, including the theory of navigation and nautical astronomy, and 40 per cent. in the technical subjects, combined with physics and French, will be ordered to be withdrawn.

(d) Cadets reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct or who fail to obtain half marks in seamanship will be "warned;" and should they be again reported or again fail to pass in seamanship they will be discharged. Any cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the *Britannia*.

* "Gardiner's Outlines of English History" (Longmans) has been selected as the present text-book for examination in English History. The subject will be divided into periods, as follows:—

Examination to be held in November, 1890, A.D. 1485-1688.
 " " " " June, 1891, A.D. 1688-1820.

After June, 1891, the subject will be divided into two periods, viz.:

1st period from the earliest times to A.D. 1603.
 2nd period from A.D. 1603 to 1820.

The first period being set at the Examination held in November, and the second period at that held in June of each year.

(e) Any cadet who shall at any time appear to their Lordships to be unfit for the naval service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the *Britannia*, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the cadet to the *Britannia*), to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the navy.

18. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

19. The parent or guardian of every cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

20. No pay will be allowed by Government to cadets in the *Britannia*. The pocket money allowed to cadets will be charged to the parents.

21. As only cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. *Britannia*, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of cadets being taught to swim before they join the training ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of use of the boats.

ARRIVING FROM GUATEMALA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall, by Proclamation, notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place, and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria, and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid, shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act, and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of the departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively; and it is also enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid, and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid, or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall, upon their arrival at any place in Victoria, be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council, and notified by Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats, persons, and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall, either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria, come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation notify that

GUATEMALA

is infected with Small-pox, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

No. 2. Commencing at the intersection of Bridge-street and Peel-street; thence easterly along Bridge-street to Victoria-street; thence easterly along Victoria-street to the eastern boundary of the town.

No. 3. Commencing at the intersection of Bridge-street and Peel-street; thence easterly along Bridge-street to Victoria-street; thence easterly along Victoria-street to Humfray-street; thence north-easterly along Humfray-street to the northern boundary of the town.

No. 4. Commencing in Peel-street at the south side of Bridge-street; thence south along Peel-street to Barkly-street; thence south-westerly by Barkly-street to the southern boundary of the town.

No. 5. Commencing in Peel-street at the north side of Bridge-street; thence northerly by Peel-street to Chisholm-street.

Tramway where it crosses railway to be under control of Commissioners of Railways.—That the tramway to be constructed upon so much of the said route as crosses the Victorian Railway line in Humfray-street shall be under the absolute control of, and be subject to all such regulations and orders as may, from time to time be made by the Commissioners of Railways, who shall not, however, be in any way liable in respect of any damage or injurious consequences which may in any manner occur to any person or to any property in consequence of the said route crossing the railway line.

Gauge.—That the gauge of such tramway shall be four feet eight and a half inches, and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from one (1) to eleven (11) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as much part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive power.—That the motive power to be used upon the said tramway shall be electricity.

Maximum speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be ten (10) miles in the hour.

Time of completion.—That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of three (3) years from the date of this Order.

Passenger traffic only.—That such tramway shall be used for passenger traffic only.

Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public to be observed.—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the routes of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down passengers.—That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of all streets, and at such other points upon the several routes as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and charges.—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say, for each passenger:—

From Peel-street to the southern boundary of the town *vid* Bridge-street, Main-street, and Geelong-road, or *vice versd*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

From Peel-street to the eastern boundary of the town *vid* Bridge-street and Victoria-street, or *vice versd*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

From Peel-street to the northern boundary of the town *vid* Bridge-street, Victoria-street, and Humfray-street, or *vice versd*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

From Bridge-street to the southern boundary of the town *vid* Peel-street and Barkly-street, or *vice versd*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

From Bridge-street to Chisholm-street *vid* Peel-street, or *vice versd*, or any lesser distance between, Threepence.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said Schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council shall direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said Municipality of the Town of Ballarat East shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid out to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable James Henry Wheeler, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

become and continue, a body politic and corporate by the style and title named in the Order in Council, and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition, signed by not less than twenty-five contributors to the institution known as the Warracknabeal District Hospital, praying that the said institution may be incorporated: And whereas the substance or prayer of the said petition has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary within one month after the date of such publication: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, declare the contributors for the time being to the institution called and known as the Warracknabeal District Hospital, in the colony of Victoria, to be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application should have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, should submit such application, and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he might think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and the Governor in Council might thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or might disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and should make an Order in Council accordingly: And it was further enacted that if the Governor in Council should approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust should be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving the construction of any proposed waterworks, and of the constituting of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose, should—

(a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out such proposed waterworks, and of paying the cost and expense of preparing the general plan and description of the same, and the costs of the application for the constituting of such Waterworks Trust; and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the Public Loan out of which such loan might be granted;

(b) Specify the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Waterworks Trust shall have authority, to be called a waterworks district;

(c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;

(d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and

(e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with this Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council thinks fit.

And it was further enacted that the Governor in Council might, where a waterworks district is either wholly or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof within one or more ridings of any municipal district, appoint the councillors for such riding or ridings, together with any other person or persons, not exceeding three in number, to be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust of such waterworks district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description, as set forth in a certain application of the Councillors for the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Yarrowonga, for a loan of Nine thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£9,500) for the purpose of taking over from the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust the waterworks constructed by that body within the township of Yarrowonga, and also for the purpose of making additions to such waterworks, as shown on the general plan and description accompanying the said application, deposited

in the Department of Victorian Water Supply; and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

(1) The taking over of the said works constructed by the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust within the aforesaid township of Yarrowonga, the making of additions to such waterworks, and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust in accordance with the said application by the Councillors for the Eastern Riding of the Shire of Yarrowonga.

(2) That the Councillors for the Eastern Riding of the said Shire of Yarrowonga municipal district and three other persons shall be the Commissioners of the Waterworks Trust.

(3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Eight thousand pounds sterling (£8,000), for the purpose of taking over the aforesaid works from the Shire of Yarrowonga Waterworks Trust, and the making of additions to such works for the supply of the township of Yarrowonga with water, and also for paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payment of which interest shall be made half-yearly.

(4) That the limits of the land within which the Waterworks Trust hereby constituted shall have authority shall be that portion of the Shire of Yarrowonga included within the boundaries hereunder described, viz.:—

The town of Yarrowonga, county of Moira, parish of Yarrowonga: Commencing at a point on the left bank of Murray River in a line with the east side of Wood's-road; bounded thence by a line, allotment 17, a line, allotments 26B and 26A, and a line bearing south to the north-east angle of allotment 54; thence by the last-mentioned allotment, allotment 53, and a line bearing west eighty-one chains; thence by allotment 28, a line, allotment 15, and a line bearing north to Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the point of commencement.

(5) The principal works to be constructed shall consist of additions to the existing reticulation within the township of Yarrowonga.

(6) The name of the Trust shall be the Yarrowonga Urban Waterworks Trust.

WHEREAS by section 222 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purposes, amongst others, following, viz:—

- (a) For determining the period for which the commissioners of any Trust elected for an urban division shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office;
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such commissioners shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat;
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such commissioners shall be filled up;
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such commissioners; and
- (e) For prescribing, subject to the provisions of the said Act, any other matter necessary for giving effect to Part III. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth, for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to the urban division of a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, duly appointed under the said Act, and known as the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. *Interpretation of terms.*—In these regulations “the Minister” shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; “the Trust” or “the said Trust” shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and “the urban division,” “the said division,” or “the said urban division” shall mean the urban division of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply District, as such urban division is limited and defined by a certain proclamation made on the 31st December, 1890, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 9th January, 1891.

2. *Period for which commissioner shall hold office.*—The period during which the commissioner elected for the said urban division shall hold office shall be three years.

3. *Retirement of commissioner.*—The Commissioner shall retire at the expiration of every three years, but shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. *Extraordinary vacancy, how filled, and term of office.*—Should a vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy; and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy; and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

5. *Date of first election of commissioner.*—Date of ordinary triennial election.—The first election of a commissioner of the said Trust for the said division shall be held on the 11th day of March, 1891, and the ordinary triennial election shall be held on the 11th day of March in every third succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

6. *Voters' list to be prepared.*—For the purposes of the first election of a commissioner of the said division, a voter's list shall be prepared by the secretary or other proper officer of the Trust, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

7. *Form of voters' lists.*—*First Schedule.*—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the first schedule hereto, and shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every municipal ratepayer of the municipal district, or such part thereof as may be within the said division of the said Trust, and shall also specify the description and situation of the rateable property of each such person, and shall state as to the number of votes to which each such person is entitled under the provisions of the said Act, the number of votes to which each such person is respectively entitled for the time being under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890*.

8. *Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.*—*Second Schedule.*—Objections to list to be in writing, and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, in some convenient place within or near to the said division, for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said division, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

9. *Grounds of objection to be stated.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within eight days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

10. *Minister to revise and certify list.*—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct; and no objections to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

11. *Certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of a commissioner of the Trust for the said division, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within three years next after the date of the said first election.

12. *Voters' list to be prepared triennially.*—Before the first day of February in each third succeeding year the officers of the Trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence, and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known) of every municipal ratepayer of the municipal district, or such part thereof as may be within the said division, and shall also specify the description and situation of the rateable property of each such person, and shall state as to the number of votes to which each such person is entitled under the provisions of the said Act, the number of votes to which each such person is respectively entitled for the time being under the provisions of the *Local Government Act, 1890*.

13. *Copy of list to be available for inspection.*—*Third Schedule.*—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, at some convenient place within or near to the said division, for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said division; and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

14. *Grounds of objection to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust.*—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

15. *Special meeting of Trust to be held to revise list.*—List to be certified.—In the month of February in each third succeeding year, a special meeting of the Trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list, and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause, shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners, or a majority of the commissioners present, may determine to be just and necessary; and the list when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

16. *Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.*—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of a Trust Commissioner for the said division, to be held within three years from the 11th day of March then next, the said day inclusive.

17. *Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.*—*Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.*—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the Trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if, at the time of any election, the office of chairman of the Trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the officer of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him, or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

18. *Notice of election.*—*Nomination of candidates.*—*Fourth Schedule.*—Fourteen clear days before any election of a commissioner under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election, by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said division, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said division to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon, and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination-day, cause to be delivered, at the place aforesaid, to the returning officer, a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by no less than three persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate, in token of his assent to being so named; and such candidate, or some person on his behalf, shall, at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds (£10) to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and by whom, or on whose behalf, such payment shall not have been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of a commissioner.

19. *Where only one candidate is nominated.*—If, at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates, only one candidate shall have been nominated, the returning officer shall then declare such candidate to be duly elected, and he shall be deemed to be duly elected accordingly.

20. *When more than one candidate is nominated.*—*Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.*—If, at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates, more than one candidate shall have been nominated, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the said division, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioner upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said division as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint; and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Eleven o'clock a.m., and close at Three o'clock in the afternoon.

21. *Retirement of candidates before polling-day.*—If at any election, after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid, any candidate for such election, and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid, are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate, and the persons aforesaid, may sign and deliver to the returning officer not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires; and the said paper generally circulating in the said division, a copy of such notice; and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such publication aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such retirement reduced to one, shall, on the day appointed for the election, declare the remaining candidate duly elected; and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election; and, if such papers are already printed, shall erase such name therefrom; and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

22. *Polling booth may be hired.*—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, caused to be hired and used as a polling booth, any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

23. *Returning officer to preside at polling booth.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling booth for taking the poll.

24. *Scrutineers may be appointed.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number, actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling booth.

25. *Pencils to be provided.*—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins; and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer, or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

26. *Mode of voting—Where voter is illiterate.*—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialed by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers, the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate; and after such name or names have been so struck out, the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and no person, having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or ballot-papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

27. *Ballot-papers to be numbered.*—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll; and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

28. *Informal ballot-papers.*—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of Commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void, and of no effect.

29. *What questions may be asked.*—At any election of a Commissioner the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to

do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

“Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll now in force in the urban division of this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of property described to be situated in (here specify the street or other place described in the roll)?”

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

30. *False answer, polling twice, and personation.*—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once, at the same election, or who shall depart, or attempt to depart, from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

31. *Result of polling, how ascertained.—Returning officer to have casting vote.*—Immediately upon the close of the poll the returning officer shall, in the presence of, and subject to the inspection of, so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll publicly declare the candidate who has received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected a Commissioner of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes the returning officer shall have the casting vote.

32. *Ballot papers, how disposed of.*—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of a Commissioner, forthwith, after the declaration of the poll, indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall as soon as may be after the first meeting of Trust Commissioners after any such election shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, indorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three Commissioners of the Trust.

33. *Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.*—If any question arise as to the due election of the Commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question, in writing, to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

34. *Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by Trust.*—If any question arise as to the due election of any Commissioner at any subsequent election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such question shall be determined by the Commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election, but no Commissioner, in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen, shall act as a Commissioner at such meeting or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a Commissioner until such question shall have been so determined; and the majority of the Commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

35. *Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.*—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the Commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just; and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

36. *Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancy.*—If at any election of a Commissioner for the said division the vacancy is not filled up, then it shall be deemed to be an extraordinary vacancy, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the Commissioner eventually elected to fill such vacancy shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

37. *Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.*—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election, shall be defrayed by the Trust.

38. *Penalty for breach of Regulations.*—These Regulations shall also be deemed to be Regulations under section 414 of the *Water Act 1890*; and any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

39. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to, or inconsistent with, this interpretation.

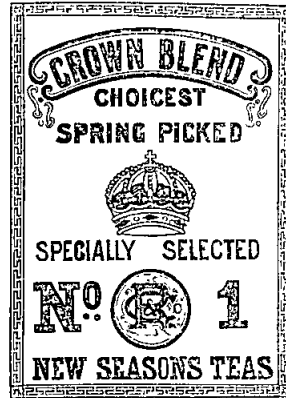

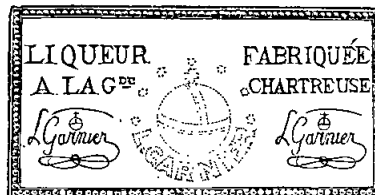
