WHEREAS by Order in Council of the 14th April, 1891, Regulations were made for the payment of allowances to officers in the Public Service while absent on duty; and whereas by clause 5 of the said regulations it is prescribed that the rates specified shall not apply to officers in respect of whom special provision has been or shall be made by Order in Council: Now therefore it is submitted for the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council that the Senior Inspector of Excise (an officer of the 3rd class) shall receive, whilst absent on duty as prosecuting officer of the Department of Trade and Customs, the sum of Fifteen shillings per diem, exclusive of the cost of fares or hire charged for travelling by railway, coach, cab, or other vehicle.

Health Act 1890.

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

BY-LAW No. 44.

A By-law of the Town of Brighton made under the provisions of the Health Act 1890, for regulating the time and manner of cleansing and emptying cesspan closets.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Council of the Town of Brighton will from the 1st day of July, 1891, undertake the providing, emptying, and cleansing of all cesspans within the said town, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said Town of Brighton order as follows:—

1. The occupier of every house shall in respect of providing for the emptying and cleansing of cesspans pay the council a fee (called a cesspan service fee) of Twenty-one shillings per pan per annum, and such fee shall be payable and paid half-yearly in advance at the offices of the council; and the first payment shall be made on or before the 1st day of July, 1891.

2. Every closet shall be constructed of such shape and dimensions as shall readily admit of the removal and replacement of the cesspans provided by the council, and the floor thereof shall be made of some impervious material.

3. Every occupier of premises shall provide and keep ready for use in the interior of every closet a constant and sufficient supply of some effective deodorant, and shall on the days appointed by the council, between the hours of Six a.m. and Ten a.m., permit access to the premises of such closet by the council's contractor.

4. No person shall remove or permit to be removed any cesspan, or the contents thereof, unless duly authorized by the council.

Every person who fails to comply with or commits any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

GRANT TO PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

1. That a sum of Twenty-seven pounds six shillings and ninepence (£27 6s. 9d.) be paid to the Eaglehawk Borough Council for expenditure, prior to the year 1890, on the Canterbury Park.

2. That a sum of Forty-three pounds twelve shillings and sixpence (£43 12s. 6d.) be paid to the Trustees of the Glenrowan Public Park for expenditure on said park.

3. That a sum of Forty-five pounds ten shillings and threepence (£45 10s. 3d.) be paid to the Committee of the Mysia Public Park for expenditure, prior to the year 1890, on the said park.

4. That a sum of One hundred and forty-nine pounds eight shillings and eleven pence (£149 8s. 11d.) be paid to the Williams-town Borough Council for expenditure during the year 1889 on Giffard-street Garden, Esplanade Garden, and Lyons-street Garden.

5. That a sum of Two shillings (2s.) be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote under Clause 1 of the Regulations of 23rd December, 1890 (gazetted 2nd January, 1891), for every One pound expended from local funds on works specified in the said Regulations.

PROCLAMATION

- (a) For a whole day, including the night, the full scale may be charged.
- (b) For a whole day, not including the night, two-thirds of the allowance only to be charged.
- (c) For a half-day, including the night, two-thirds of the allowance only to be charged.
- (d) For a half-day, not including the night, one-third of the allowance only to be charged.
- (e) Cab and coach fare, horse and conveyance hire, to be charged for extra, but in every case where practicable receipted vouchers for the same must accompany the accounts sent in for travelling expenses.

(f) The hire of a cab or car between barracks or quarters and railway or steamboat stations will be allowed if the officers be necessarily travelling with baggage.

(g) Carriage and cab hire, except as sanctioned in clause (f), will not be allowed when railway or other ordinary public conveyance is available, unless the claim be supported by a statement showing the necessity for using carriages or cabs.

(h) Cab hire, when baggage is not necessarily taken, will not be admitted for distances of less than two (2) miles, unless required for necessary saving of time apart from all circumstances under the officer's own control. A full explanation of the circumstances must accompany each claim and the distance must in every case be shown.

(i) When two or more officers proceed from one quarter on the same duty, a separate cab will not be allowed for each, unless it be shown that it was impracticable for the officers to perform their journey together.

(j) No officer shall proceed travelling on any duty without first informing his senior officer, and such senior officer before granting permission shall satisfy himself that the travelling is necessary.

(k) If, through the exigency of the service, the permission of the senior officer could not be obtained, such should be at once reported in writing, or verbally if the officer travelling returns within twenty-four (24) hours.

(l) When the distance travelled does not exceed twenty miles, only the necessary expenses actually incurred are to be charged.

(m) In cases where officers of the Victorian Artillery are detailed for duty which will necessitate their absence from the fort at which they are stationed, no claims for actual expenses will be allowed if they are entitled to draw working-pay. But claims for actual expenses incurred, accompanied by vouchers, may be forwarded for the approval of the Minister in cases where working-pay is not allowed, when officers proceed on duty from the fort at which they are stationed before Eight a.m. or return after Six p.m.

(n) Superior officers will be allowed the use of a private room when travelling on duty, if absolutely necessary.

(o) Field allowance may be granted to the Military Commandant at such rate, and on such occasions, as meet the approval of the Ministerial head of his department.

(p) When officers or others are absent for any period exceeding seven days, the allowance shall be reduced by such an amount as the Minister may deem requisite.

(q) The Naval or Military Commandant may be allowed to submit a claim for Table-money to the extent of the actual expense incurred, provided that the claim preferred is to meet ordinary expenditure which may exceed the amount of personal allowance granted.

(r) Before certifying to accounts for travelling expenses, officers should assure themselves that the travelling was necessary, that the time occupied was not excessive, and that the charges as a whole are fair and reasonable.

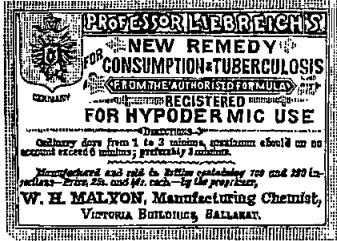

The births of 1,641 children, viz., 849 boys and 792 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. In the month of April, 1,040 births were registered, or only 5 more than in the month under review. The births were 508 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 121 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 654, viz., 344 of males and 310 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 987, or 151 per cent. The deaths were less than those in April by 97, but above the average of May during the previous ten years by 42; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 167.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.36, and of deaths registered 1.34. The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.7° on the 5th, and the lowest was 34.4° on the 20th. The mean temperature of the month (53.3°) was a fraction below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.0°) took place on the 3rd, and the least (8.0°) on the 10th. The mean daily range was 18.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.514 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.709 inches on the 17th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.233 inches) was one-fifth of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on 7 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.25 inches. The average rainfall in May during the previous ten years was 1.94 inches, or about a third of an inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on one day during the month. Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality, as against 31 per cent. in May, 1890; 33 per cent. in May, 1889; 37 per cent. in May, 1888; 32 per cent. in May, 1887; 32 per cent. in May, 1886; and 33 per cent. in May, 1885.

Thirty-one deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month:—Of these, a female, aged 75, died of Bright's disease; a sawyer, aged 76, of epilepsy; a boot manufacturer, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 76, of pleurisy and heart disease; a labourer, aged 76, of drowning in the Saltwater River; a female, aged 77, of cancer; a housewife, aged 77, of syncope; a mason, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman and a female, each aged 78, of heart disease; a collector, aged 78, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall; a female, aged 79, of senile gangrene; a female, aged 79, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of gastric ulcer and hemorrhage; a labourer, aged 81, of valvular disease of the heart; a miner, aged 81, of asthma; a female, aged 82, of heart disease; a contractor, aged 82, of pneumonia and heart disease; a female, aged 83, of cerebral congestion; a female, aged 86, of diarrhoea; a widow, aged 86, of heart disease; a female, aged 86, of disease of the kidneys and congestion of the lungs; a farmer, aged 89, of fracture of the thigh; a male of occupation unknown, aged 93, of disease of the lungs and heart; a miner and a widow each aged 80, a sawyer, aged 85, and a female, aged 88, of old age.

Thirty-nine violent deaths took place during the month, of which 35 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, 2 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A gentleman, aged 30, a labourer, aged 49, and a gatekeeper, aged 50, were passed over or knocked down by railway trains; a horse-tram car-driver, aged 30, died of injuries, the result of being dragged by a tram-car—his foot having slipped whilst driving; two boys, aged 11 and 14 respectively, three carters, aged 12, 23, and 31 respectively, a dairyman, aged 59, and a hawker, aged 60, were passed over or knocked down by vehicles, which in two instances were cabs, and in the other cases carts or lorries; a carter, aged 42, died of internal injuries, the result of being jammed by a dray; a carpenter, aged 33, was killed by a lift; a labourer, aged 40, died of fracture of the spine, the result of a fall into the hold of a ship; a verger, aged 56, and a collector, aged 78, of fracture of the skull, the result in the former case of a fall down stairs; a farmer, aged 89, of fracture of the thigh—how caused not stated; a girl, aged 8, of burns, her clothes having become ignited; a boy, aged 6, was accidentally drowned at South Melbourne, and a storekeeper, aged 24, in the Elwood Swamp; six persons were found drowned, viz., a female, aged 24, a labourer, aged 32, and a fireman, aged 35, in the River Yarra, a master mariner, aged 44, in Hobson's Bay, a glass-blower, aged 53, in the Bay, near Brighton, and a labourer, aged 76, in the Saltwater River; a male child, aged 9 weeks, and a carpenter, aged 52, were suffocated whilst vomiting; a male infant, aged 1 month, also a female and a male infant, aged 3 and 4 months respectively, were suffocated in bed; a carpenter, aged 69, was suffocated in silt; a fireman, aged 35, died of the effects of chloroform administered previous to an operation; a newly-born male infant, of want of skilled treatment at birth; and a newly-born female infant, of hæmorrhage from the umbilical cord. The death presumed to be homicidal, and classed accordingly, was that of a newly-born female infant, who was suffocated, an open verdict being returned at the inquest. The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 38, who cut his throat, and a labourer, aged 67, who hanged himself. The case of judicial hanging registered was that of a Hindoo hawker, aged 24, who was executed in the Melbourne Gaol, on the 27th of the previous month, for murder.

One hundred and thirty-seven deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—60 in the Melbourne Hospital, 18 in the Alfred Hospital, 1 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 5 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Infant Asylum, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 207, of which 104, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 103, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 142 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 447. Of these, 240, or 54 per cent., were males, and 207, or 46 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 33 were between twenty and twenty-five, 36 were between twenty-five and thirty, 29 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 38 were between forty-five and fifty, 29 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 49 were between sixty and sixty-five, 43 were between sixty-five and seventy, 27 were between seventy and seventy-five, 16 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 15 were upwards of eighty.

As compared with the experience of the previous month, deaths from diphtheria increased from 11 to 23—the latter being the highest number since September, 1890—and deaths from bronchitis and pneumonia increased from 39 to 58. With these exceptions, the mortality under the different heads was generally lower in May than in April. Typhoid fever caused only 20 deaths in May, which is the smallest number in any month since December, 1890. The following is a statement of the number of deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each of the first five months of 1891, and of the two previous years:—

THE subjoined Regulations and Scale of Fees, which have been made by the Trustees of the Shepparton Public Cemetery, have, pursuant to the provisions of sections 9 and 16 respectively of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1072), been approved by the Governor in Council.

SHEPPARTON GENERAL CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them the Trustees of the Shepparton General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave, or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the Act, shall apply to the Trustees therefor. If approved the Trustees, on the payment of the requisite fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such, with full particulars for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given to the secretary six (6) working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule C shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under directions of the secretary on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped therein.
8. That every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed with a less depth than 3 feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground after such interment.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which during live the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy-registrar of deaths, or a coroner; such certificate shall be delivered to the sexton before the funeral enters the cemetery.
12. That the hours for burials shall be as follows:—On week-days—September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.
13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m., except by special permission of the Trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral entering by the principal entrance shall pass to the west of the central gate, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to pass the central gates. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than a walking pace within the cemetery. The hearse and mourning coaches are not permitted off the main roads of the cemetery.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection, shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery, without the permission of the Trustees, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance.

21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

22. That the Trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for interment either in said or any other cemetery.

23. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the Trustees a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, in addition to that of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

24. That any workman not employed by the Trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the Secretary, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

25. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

26. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

27. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

28. That the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the Trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.
