TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

VICTORIA, AUSTRALIA.—WESTERN ENTRANCE TO BASS STRAITS.
Eagle Nest, or Split Point.

REFERRING to Notice to Mariners published on the 6th August, 1890, notice is hereby given that on and after the 1st September, 1891, a red and white light will be exhibited from a lighthouse tower built on the southern extremity of Eagle Nest, or Split Point.

The lighthouse tower is of concrete, coloured white, 83 feet high, and the lantern is 220 feet above the mean level of the sea, from which will be exhibited a first order dioptric *fixed red light*, which should be seen in clear weather at a distance of 18 nautical miles.

The *red*, or principal light, will illuminate an arc of about 153 degrees seaward, with an arc of white light illuminating about 1 mile off Point Addis to the eastward, and 1 mile off Cape Paton to the westward, of the light-house.

An auxiliary *white* light, to cover a distance of 3 miles from the lighthouse tower, will illuminate an arc of 180 degrees to seaward. This auxiliary light will be invisible to an observer 14 feet above the level of the sea until within about 3 miles' distance from the lighthouse.

Approximate position, latitude 38° 28' 10".
South longitude, 144° 5' 45" east.

Caution.

The white lights are to warn mariners of their too close proximity to the shore or to the lighthouse.

CORAL REEF IN TRACK OF VESSELS FROM ROEBUCK BAY OR
DERBY TO WYNDHAM AND PORT DARWIN.

Jamieson Reef.

OWING to information given by Captain R. Jamieson, of the Adelaide S.S. Company's vessel *Olcay*, a coral reef has been found by H.M.S. *Penguin* in the track of vessels bound from Roebuck Bay or Derby to Wyndham and Port Darwin.

This reef is 2½ miles long north and south, and 1 mile broad east and west. It is mostly covered at all times of tide with from 12 to 24 feet water; but there is one small part three-quarters of a mile from the north end of the reef which dries 5 feet at low-water spring tide. This spot is in latitude 14° 4' 32" S., longitude 125° 21' 11" E. From it, the centre of the flat-topped summit of Condillac bears S 78° E., distant 12·2 miles.

The water in this locality is much discoloured at all times; and there is nothing in the appearance of the sea over the reef to indicate danger, except at nearly low water, when the shallowest part breaks. The lead gives no warning.

should pay interest on the transferred sum of Sixty-three thousand two hundred and seven pounds seven shillings and two pence (£63,207 7s. 2d.) before mentioned, from the first day of January, 1890.

4. And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the eleventh day of August, 1890 (published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-second day of August, 1890), it was ordered that of the total liabilities of the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, such Trust should pay interest from the first day of January, 1890, on the sum of Eighty-two thousand five hundred and eighty-five pounds four shillings and seven pence, which amount should be deemed domestic and stock supply expenditure.

5. And whereas by a further Order in Council bearing date the fifteenth day of December, 1890 (published in the *Government Gazette* of the nineteenth day of December, 1890), a sum of Fifty-three thousand three hundred and ninety-one pounds three shillings and five pence (£53,391 3s. 5d.) was transferred from the liabilities of the Shire of Wimmera Waterworks Trust to the liabilities of the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in respect of territory and works taken possession of by the latter Trust.

And whereas it is desirable for Treasury and book-keeping purposes that the matters dealt with in the above cited Orders in Council should be more intelligibly arranged and set forth:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, doth order as follow, that is to say:—

(a) That the two Orders in Council bearing date the eleventh day of August, 1890 (published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifteenth day of August, 1890, and the twenty-second day of August, 1890, respectively), cited in clauses 3 and 4 of this Order, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

(b) That of the total amount of liabilities from all sources of the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, interest shall be paid by such Trust, from the first day of January, 1890, on the sum of Eighty-two thousand five hundred and eighty-five pounds four shillings and seven pence (£82,585 4s. 7d.) expended on domestic and stock supply works.

(c) That notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the preceding clause (b), the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be only required to pay the sum of Two thousand nine hundred and eleven pounds seventeen shillings and ten pence (£2,911 17s. 10d.) in full satisfaction of interest for the year ending thirty-first day of December, 1890.

(d) That such portions of any of the Orders in Council afore cited, not repealed by this Order, as relate to the liabilities of the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall, so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Order, be and the same are hereby repealed.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Factories and Shops Act 1890.
CITY OF PRAHRAN.

By-Law No. 101.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Prahran numbered 101 and made under the provisions of Act number 1091, intituled the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, for the purpose of altering by-laws numbered respectively 90 and 93, made under the provisions of the said Act, and of repealing so much of boot and shoe dealers, hatters, and seedsmen, and for the licensing of shopkeepers of the respective classes of bakers, boot and shoe makers and dealers, brushmakers, drapers, furniture dealers, hairdressers, hatters, picture-frame makers and dealers, seedsmen and florists to keep open their shops after the statutory hours of closing.

THE Council of the Municipality of the City of Prahran, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in and conferred upon it by the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, doth, hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

So much of by-law No. 90 of the city of Prahran, made under section 45 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1885*, on the 5th day of April, 1886, and confirmed on the 10th day of May, 1886, as refers to shops of the class of boot and shoe dealers; and

So much of by-law No. 93 of the said city, made upon the 26th day of October, 1886, and confirmed upon the 6th day of December, 1886, as refers to shops of the respective classes of hatters and seedsmen shall be and the same is hereby altered so that such by-laws shall read as if the words "boot and shoe dealers, hatters, and seedsmen," wherever they appear in such respective by-laws, had been omitted therefrom, and so much of the said by-laws respectively as refers to shops of the before-mentioned classes shall be, and the same is hereby repealed.

And the said council doth hereby further order and direct as follows, that is to say:—

Drapers.—Shopkeepers of the class of drapers, on obtaining a licence so to do from the municipal clerk, may keep open their respective shops on each and every evening of the week, except Saturdays, until the hour of Eight of the clock, and on Saturdays until the hour of Eleven of the clock in the evening.
