I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One hundred and ninety-four thousand nine hundred and eighty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety and ninety-one.”

## Water Act 1890.

## RIGHTS AND POWERS OF THE WIMMERA TRUSTS IN THE WATERS OF THE LITTLE WIMMERA RIVER AND THE YARRIAMBIAK CREEK.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixth day of July, 1891.

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient that the rights, powers, and privileges of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, and the proposed Eastern Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (when constituted) respectively, to, over, and in the waters of and the works on the Little Wimmera River and the Yarrambiack Creek should, by Order in Council, be particularly specified and set forth:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, doth order as follows, that is to say:—

I. That a quantity of water of Three thousand (3,000) cubic feet per minute shall be allowed to flow down the Little Wimmera River for the supply of the diversions made for stock and domestic use, by way of the Ashen's weir and Ashen's Creek, and by way of the Longernong weir and Yarrambiack Creek, and for all probable enlargements thereof or extensions therefrom, so long as the volume flowing in the Little Wimmera at the point of diversion of the supply to Taylor's Lake exceeds that quantity; and when it does not exceed that quantity then the whole shall be allowed to pass.

II. Of the excess over Three thousand (3,000) cubic feet per minute the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be entitled to divert Fifty per cent. (50%) for the supply of the Taylor's Lake scheme; and the balance of the excess, that is Fifty per cent. (50%) thereof, shall be reserved for the service of the East Wimmera district for irrigation or other purposes.

III. That whenever the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust or the proposed Eastern Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (when constituted) shall have utilised the whole of the supply assigned to it above, and shall be in a position to utilise a further supply, it shall be entitled to demand that all rights of the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in the waters of the Little Wimmera aforesaid shall cease, subject, however, to the following further conditions, viz.:—

- (1) That the said proposed Eastern Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (when constituted) shall take over and pay for all such works constructed by the said Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust within the East Wimmera district, as have been designed with its concurrence and sanction, or with the concurrence and sanction of the aforementioned Wimmera United Waterworks Trust.
- (2) That the Eastern Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust (when constituted) shall become a joint guarantor with the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust in respect of the cost of the storage and diversion works at the Upper Glenelg, and shall be entitled to a corresponding share in the rights in the water stored and diverted.

IV. That the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust and the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be joined in the control of the Yarrambiack Creek, and of the diversions therefrom; the Trusts to be equally represented in such control.

V. That the details be settled by the aforesaid Wimmera United Waterworks and the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts, with the concurrence and privity of the officers of the Water Supply Department, with an appeal in case of dispute to the Minister of Water Supply.

VI. That such portion or portions of any previous Order or Orders in Council relating to either the Western Wimmera Irrigation and Water Supply Trust or the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, shall, so far as the same may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Order, be and the same is or are hereby repealed.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

All the above ranks receive rations in addition to their pay, but married non-commissioned officers and men on the establishment, and men who at any time from the nature of their duties or the exigencies of the service cannot be rationed, will be paid ninepence a day in lieu thereof.

(e) Cab and coach fare, horse and conveyance hire, to be charged for extra, but in every case where practicable receipted vouchers for the same must accompany the accounts sent in for travelling expenses.

(f) The hire of a cab or car between barracks or quarters and railway or steamboat stations will be allowed if the officers be necessarily travelling with baggage.

(g) Carriage and cab hire, except as sanctioned in clause (f), will not be allowed when railway or other ordinary public conveyance is available, unless the claim be supported by a statement showing the necessity for using carriages or cabs.

(h) Cab hire, when baggage is not necessarily taken, will not be admitted for distances of less than two (2) miles, unless required for necessary saving of time apart from all circumstances under the officer's own control. A full explanation of the circumstances must accompany each claim, and the distance must in every case be shown.

(i) When two or more officers proceed from one quarter on the same duty, a separate cab will not be allowed for each, unless it be shown that it was impracticable for the officers to perform their journey together.

(j) No officer shall proceed travelling on any duty without first informing his senior officer, and such senior officer before granting permission shall satisfy himself that the travelling is necessary.

(k) If, through the exigency of the service, the permission of the senior officer could not be obtained, such should be at once reported in writing, or verbally if the officer travelling returns within twenty-four (24) hours.

(l) When the distance travelled does not exceed twenty miles, only the necessary expenses actually incurred are to be charged.

(m) In cases where officers of the Victorian Artillery are detailed for duty which will necessitate their absence from the fort at which they are stationed, no claims for actual expenses will be allowed if they are entitled to draw working-pay. But claims for actual expenses incurred, accompanied by vouchers, may be forwarded for the approval of the Minister in cases where working-pay is not allowed, when officers proceed on duty from the fort at which they are stationed before Eight a.m. or return after Six p.m.

(n) Superior officers will be allowed the use of a private room when travelling on duty, if absolutely necessary.

(o) Field allowance may be granted to the Military Commandant at such rate, and on such occasions, as meet the approval of the Ministerial head of his department.

(p) When officers or others are absent for any period exceeding seven days, the allowance shall be reduced by such an amount as the Minister may deem requisite.

(q) The Naval or Military Commandant may be allowed to submit a claim for Table-money to the extent of the actual expense incurred, provided that the claim preferred is to meet ordinary expenditure which may exceed the amount of personal allowance granted.

(r) Before certifying to accounts for travelling expenses, officers should assure themselves that the travelling was necessary, that the time occupied was not excessive, and that the charges as a whole are fair and reasonable.

And the Honorable Sir Frederick Thomas Sargood, K.C.M.G., Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Fire Brigades Act 1890.*

REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE PROCEEDINGS AND POWERS OF LOCAL COMMITTEES.

WHEREAS by section 39 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, as to the whole or any part of Victoria, make regulations for the purposes therein specified: And whereas by section 40 of the said Act it is further enacted that after the first meeting of the Country Fire Brigades Board all regulations as to any country fire district shall be prepared by such Board and submitted to the Minister for approval prior to being made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Regulations following have been prepared by the Country Fire Brigades Board and submitted to the Minister for approval in the manner provided by the now in part recited Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, acting with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.—ACT NO. 1200, SECTION 39.

These Regulations shall apply to those parts of the colony of Victoria known as the nine Country Fire Districts, as set forth in the first Schedule of the Act and in the Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor, published in the *Government Gazette* of 3th June, 1891, whereby certain portions of country fire districts were excised therefrom, and to any part of the colony of Victoria that may hereafter be added to or included in country fire district.

(a) For a whole day, including the night, the full scale may be charged.

(b) For a whole day, not including the night, two-thirds of the allowance only to be charged.

(c) For a half-day, including the night, two-thirds of the allowance only to be charged.

(d) For a half-day, not including the night, one-third of the allowance only to be charged.

## (SUB-SECTION 1.)

*For Regulating the Business and Proceedings at the Meetings of Local Committees.*

1. *Office and place of meeting.*—The office and place of meeting of each local committee may be at any of the fire brigade stations situated within the fire district over which such local committee exercises jurisdiction, as may be determined upon by it and approved of by the Country Board, and for this purpose each local committee is hereby authorised and empowered to take, occupy, and use any room, office, or other portion of a fire brigade station, together with the contents thereof, for the conduct of its business and meetings, free of all charges and expenses whatsoever. Each local committee may from time to time change the location of its office and place of meeting, as it may by resolution determine, subject to the consent of the Country Board being first obtained.

2. *Committee to regulate its meetings.*—Each local committee may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate its meetings as it thinks fit, and shall meet when called together by the Country Board for any specific purpose.

3. *Proceedings to be reported to the Board.*—Entries of all proceedings of each local committee, with the names of the members who attend each meeting, shall be made in books to be provided by the Country Board and kept for that purpose, and copies of such entries, certified to as correct by the chairman, shall be furnished to the secretary of the Country Board within seven days of each meeting.

4. *General conduct of business.*—In the general conduct of business report shall be had to the regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of 5th May, 1891, for meeting and conduct of business by the Country Fire Brigades Board, *vide* section 39, paragraph 1, clauses numbered 13 to 33 both inclusive, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of each local committee.

## (SUB-SECTION 20.)

*For defining the powers and duties of local committees and the furnishing of the Boards with reports and returns by such local committees both periodically and when required by the Boards.*

1. *Committee may nominate a secretary.*—Each local committee may from time to time nominate a person to be its secretary, such nomination to be submitted to the Country Board for approval or otherwise, and the Board may appoint the person so nominated, or any other person it may decide upon, to be the secretary to such local committee, and the Board shall determine the duties and the remuneration of such secretary, and may at any time suspend or dismiss such secretary, either by its own determination or by the recommendation of such local committee.

2. *Duties of secretary.*—The secretary of each local committee shall attend all meetings of the local committee, and shall enter the minutes of resolutions and proceedings in a minute book to be kept for that purpose. He shall perform, to the satisfaction of the local committee and of the Country Board, all such duties as may be imposed upon him, and shall, subject to the control of the Board, have charge of all books, papers, and other property of the Board that may be in the custody of the local committee. He shall cause to be kept an accurate record, in convenient form for reference, of all business transacted by the local committee. He shall attend promptly to all communications received from, and use despatch in forwarding reports and returns to, the secretary of the Country Board. He shall be under the general direction of the secretary of the Country Board in all matters relating to office routine and management.

3. *Committee to requisition for supplies.*—All supplies required for the conduct of the business of each local committee shall be requisitioned for to the Country Board in such form as may be directed by the Board from time to time, and the Board may allow, disallow, or amend such requisition, and may provide such supplies, or authorize the purchase of same by any local committee.

4. *Committees not to purchase supplies or incur liabilities.*—Local committees shall not incur, accept, or in any way undertake any liability, or lend, lease, sell, acquire, or purchase any property or supplies whatsoever, unless with the consent of the Country Board previously obtained.

5. *Duties of committees.*—It shall be the duty of each local committee—

- (1.) To report to the Country Board any irregularity in the working of the brigades that may come under its notice.
- (2.) To ascertain the requirements of the various portions of its district, and report to the Country Board accordingly.
- (3.) To furnish such reports and returns as the Country Board may at any time and from time to time require.
- (4.) To examine requisitions or applications for supplies from the brigades, and to report on same to the Country Board.
- (5.) To exercise supervision over the brigades for the purpose of seeing that the regulations for the general maintenance of brigades in a due state of efficiency are observed so far as such supervision does not clash with the general duties and powers of the Country Board and its officers as contained in the Act.
- (6.) And generally to do such things as the Country Board may direct from time to time for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Act.

3. *Penalties.*—If any local committee, or if any secretary of any local committee, makes default in transmitting any report or return within fourteen days after it shall have become due, or within fourteen days from notice sent by the secretary of the

Country Board of the non-receipt of such report or return, such local committee or secretary of local committee (as the case may be) shall be liable to a penalty of One pound, and to a further penalty of not more than One pound for each day such default is continued after any conviction thereof, the maximum penalty in any case not to exceed Five pounds.

And the Honourable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SHIRE OF WODONGA.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

ORDER OF THE COUNCIL OF THE SHIRE OF WODONGA, MADE ON THE 27TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* (sections 390 and 391), the Council of the Shire of Wodonga do hereby order that the land hereinafter described shall be a public highway from and after the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, that is to say:—
