INLAND PACKETS AND FOREIGN PACKETS TO NEW SOUTH WALES, SOUTH AUSTRALIA, QUEENSLAND, WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TASMANIA, NEW ZEALAND, FIJI, BRITISH NEW GUINEA, OR NEW HEBRIDES.

THE Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of Inland Packets and Foreign Packets to New South Wales, South Australia, Queensland, Western Australia, Tasmania, New Zealand, Fiji, British New Guinea, or New Hebrides being divided under the following heads, viz.:—(1) Commercial Papers, (2) Printed Papers, and (3) Patterns and Samples, Packets of Merchandise, &c.

WEIGHT, DIMENSIONS, AND RATES.

Commercial Papers and Printed Papers.—Maximum weight, 4 lbs. Dimensions not to exceed 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width or depth. Rate of Postage: for every 2 oz. or fraction thereof, One penny.

Patterns and Samples, Packets of Merchandise, &c.—Maximum weight, 1 lb. Dimensions not to exceed 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width or depth. Rate of Postage: for every 2 oz. or fraction thereof, One penny.

Commercial Papers shall include the following:—

Acceptances.

Accounts receipted or unreceipted (remarks such as "With thanks," "A cheque will oblige," or printed or written communications in the nature of a letter, render them chargeable as letters).

Affidavits.

Bankers' packets (i.e., packets sent from one bank to another) containing bank notes, cheques, cheque books, drafts, or orders.

Bank pass-books may be sent from or to any bank at packet rates, provided they are enclosed in covers with the ends sufficiently open to admit of postal officials seeing that "pass-books" only are being transmitted. The packet must be indorsed "Pass-book only."

SCHOOLS OF MINES AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

RULES FOR MANAGEMENT.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has ordered that payments from the Votes 1892-3, Item Division No. 30, "Schools of Mines and Technical Schools," shall be made in accordance with the subjoined Regulations :—

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.

1. The special grants for maintenance allowance provided in the Annual Appropriation for 1891-2 for Schools of Mines and Technical Schools to be continued to 31st December, 1892.

2. Each school shall be under the control and management of a Local Committee or Council that can be responsible for the conduct of the Schools to the Department of Public Instruction, and the Minister of Public Instruction may, if he think fit, appoint one or more representatives on any of the Councils.

3. All Technical Schools shall be open to inspection by any officer appointed for the purpose by the Minister of Public Instruction. Should an adverse report be received from such officer, the grant in aid may be partially or wholly withdrawn.

(a) A register of the students' attendances must be kept, and must be correctly posted up daily. Any deviation from this course will be regarded as an irregularity which will imperil the whole of the grant to the school for the year, and the Inspector may cancel all the attendances preceding his visit to a school should the register at that time show any infringement of this rule. Registers to suit the special working of any school may be used, providing they meet the requirements of the Minister of Public Instruction, and they should be large enough for four quarters' attendances. The register should be forwarded to the Secretary of the Education Department at the close of the year, when the claim for payment is made.

(b) A fee book, in which all fees paid by students are to be entered, must also be kept.

(c) For each student, the register number, name, age, occupation (if any), occupation of parent or guardian, residence, name of last school attended, class or classes in which enrolled, number of attendances at such classes during each term, and date of passing any examination of the Education Department held under these rules, must be entered in a general register.

(d) An abstract of the attendances of all students during each term, and also of the fees paid by them, must be forwarded to the Secretary Education Department not later than seven days after the close of the term.

4. There shall be four terms in the year, each of not less than ten weeks' duration.

5. A grant in aid may be made for teaching any of the following subjects in Technical Schools :—

6. Should the Council of a School desire a grant for teaching any subject not mentioned in the above list, special application must be made to the Minister of Public Instruction for permission to teach such subjects.

7. The course of study in each subject taught in Technical Schools shall be defined by a Syllabus approved of by the Minister of Public Instruction.

8. *Maintenance*.—Grant for Attendance at Approved Courses in Science and Trades subjects :—

A. For each student attending not less than 15 times in each term, for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd year's course respectively :—

(1) Science subjects, 15s., 25s., and 35s. per term.

(2) Trades subjects, 5s., 7s. 6d., and 10s. per term.

For students attending 8 times or more, but less than 15 times, in each term, half these amounts. Payments under this head will not be made on account of the same student in any one term in more than two subjects.

B. Grant for Re-agents, &c. :—

For each student who attends a Practical Chemistry or Practical Metallurgy class, an additional sum of 10s., or 5s. per term for 15 and 8 attendances respectively.

C. Payment on the result of instruction, as tested at the yearly examination of students :—

(1) Science subjects :—

(a) £2 and £3 respectively for Pass in the Elementary and Advanced Stage of each subject.

(b) £4 and £6 respectively for Honours in the Elementary and Advanced Stage of each subject.

(c) £5 and £10 respectively for Pass and Honours in any higher examination than those mentioned in (a) and (b).

(2) **Trades subjects :—**

- (a) A sum not exceeding £1 and £1 10s. respectively for Pass in the Elementary and Advanced Stage of each subject for the year's work.
 (b) A sum not exceeding £2 for Pass in any higher examination than those mentioned in (a) for the year's work.

ART.**A. (3) Payments on behalf of students :—**

- (a) Upon attendances.
 (b) Upon success at examinations.
 (a) Students who attend the classes, during the presence of the teachers, in the term for which payments are claimed, and who work at one or more of the subjects named in the Art list of subjects, will be paid for at the following rates :—

- B. A merit grant of not more than 25 per cent. of the above grant (a) will be made at the expiration of the school year on the examination of the work of the students done in the school during the year.

The works of the students which have been done in class during the time for which payments are claimed must be forwarded for the purpose of examination to the Board of Examiners, Spring-street, Melbourne, before the third Monday in December. The cost of carriage may be charged forward. An allowance for packing will be made to the Committees of schools upon the following terms, upon presentation of vouchers :—Packing paper, packing cases, and ordinary carriage.

(Each student must be prepared to undergo a special examination by the Examiners appointed by the Department after the works done in class have been examined.)

C. Examinations will be held in the following subjects :—

- (a) Geometry.
 (b) Perspective.
 (c) Sciography.
 (d) Machine construction.
 (e) Building construction.
 (f) Architecture.
 (g) Time drawing of ornament, plant form, animal forms, anatomy, drapery, &c.

 (i) Composition of form and colour in Still Life, for manufactures, modelled and the flat.

In (f), (g), (h), and (i) students will have to submit specimens of their work, and obtain the permission of the Department to present themselves for examination. The payments for successes will be as follows :—

9. Classes in which the lectures or lessons are less than one hour in duration at each meeting will not be recognised. In Practical Chemistry, Practical Metallurgy, Art, and Trades subjects, they must be of at least 1½ hours' duration.

COMMON TO ALL SUBJECTS.

10. No grant will be recommended for the teaching of any subject in a Technical School unless the Minister of Education is satisfied that the teacher appointed is competent to give instruction in that subject.

----- No payment under A, B, and C will be made on account of any student in arrears with his class fees, nor if the fee charged in his class is abnormally low.

Payments on the number of students will be made quarterly, but the payment for the results of examination, or for general efficiency, will only be made at the end of the year. The register of the students' attendances will have to be attested by the Hon. Secretary and by the President, or by the Chairman of the Committee of the school. It must be sent in before the third Monday in December.

For the first three quarters of the year, the payments made on all students will be at the rates fixed for 1st year (1st sec. Art) students; the balance due for 2nd or 3rd year (2nd and 3rd sec. Art) will be paid at the end of the fourth quarter. Students placed in a wrong year or section will be reduced by the Inspector, and paid for at the rate of the class they properly belong to; and the wrong classification of students may cause a reduction of this grant.

Grant towards expense of clerical assistance will be made at the rate of £7 10s. per annum for every 25 students enrolled in the different subjects. Payment to be made quarterly.

11. Examinations in the various subjects mentioned in Rule 5, or in any subject added with the approval of the Minister to those therein mentioned, will be held yearly in every Technical School by Examiners appointed by the Minister of Public Instruction.

12. Should the Examiners' reports show that the teaching during the year has been of an unsatisfactory character, the grant in aid is liable to be wholly or partially discontinued.

13. The expenditure of grants in aid of buildings is subject to the following conditions :—

1. That the plans and specifications are approved by the Department before the commencement of the work.
2. That 25 per cent. of the grant be retained until the work has been passed by the Public Works Department.

The expenditure of grants in aid of furniture and apparatus is subject to the same conditions, but the Department will not contribute more than £2 for every £1 locally expended. Grants for the purchase of approved Museum specimens may be made by the Department at the rate of £1 for £1 locally expended.

CERTIFICATES AND REWARDS.

Certificates will be issued by the Department to students who pass any of the examinations mentioned above.

Sixty First Year's Scholarships, viz., 20 each for the Science, Art, and Trades Classes at Technical Schools; and 20 Second Year's Scholarships, viz., 10 each for Science and Art Classes, will be awarded annually to the students who gain the greatest number of marks at the preceding December Examination in the first and second years' courses respectively of any one subject. For each Scholarship the Department will pay the fees at the rate of the capitation allowance for the 2nd and 3rd years' courses of instruction respectively in the same subject.

No payment will be made on behalf of a Scholarship holder for a second or third year's course of instruction unless the Department be satisfied that such instruction can be effectively given in the school.

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS IN THE UNITED SHIRE OF METCALFE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1112, section 388) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the United Shire of Metcalfe has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets in the Township of Taradale within the said Shire, be so declared public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the streets hereinafter named and described, and situate within the United Shire of Metcalfe aforesaid, to be Public Highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

230A. Permanent Instructors of the Horse Artillery will draw clothing on the following scale. Issue to be made on the 1st September in each year:—

- 1 dress jacket, quinquennially.
- 1 helmet, white, quinquennially.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XV. (Records) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz.:—

XV.—RECORDS.

1. The rolls and registers are records of the school, and are to be kept in the school, together with all circulars and all invoices of free grants of furniture, apparatus, books, and other requisites.

2. School Rolls.—

- (1) The roll, which must be original, and not copied from papers, slates, &c., will always commence on the 1st January and 1st July, and terminate on the 30th June and 31st December respectively.
- (2) The names of all children above four and a half years of age attending school are to be entered in the order of their classes, and the age of each child at the time of commencing the roll is to be given.
- (3) The roll is to be called and marked in ink, two hours previous to the time fixed for closing the school morning and afternoon, and only those children who are present at roll-call and answer to their names may be marked as present. The time for roll-call must be stated in the time-table. The attendance of children under four and a half years of age must not be recorded.
- (4) If a child leaves before school is closed, and has not attended two hours, the mark denoting presence must be cancelled in the manner prescribed in the directions for filling up the rolls printed on the face of the roll sheet.
- (5) The number of attendances made by the school must be entered at the close of each school meeting.
- (6) When any day is observed as a holiday, the word "Holiday" should be written in the attendance column for that day.
- (7) The reasons assigned by parents for the absence of their children from school should be noted in the attendance columns.

3. Teachers' Rolls and Attendances.—

- (1) The time of his arrival and of his departure is to be entered by each member of the staff in the roll sheets provided for the purpose. If any teacher leaves the school premises during the day, the interval of his absence should be recorded in the same manner. Visiting teachers will also enter the time they arrive at and leave the school.
- (2) The absence of any member of the staff shall be promptly reported and explained; and whenever leave of absence on account of illness is required for a longer period than two days, a medical certificate showing the nature of the illness or injury and the probable extent of absence must be forwarded. When a member of the staff is frequently unpunctual, such unpunctuality should be reported.

4. *Registers.*—The registers are to be kept in accordance with the directions accompanying them, and they with the other records are at all times to be open to the inspection of the officers of the Department and to the members of the Board of Advice when visiting the school.

* In night schools the roll must be called and marked not less than one hour and forty minutes before the time fixed for closing the school.

PORTLAND GAOL TO BE A POLICE GAOL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Gaols Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1096) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council shall have power from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to revoke any Proclamation theretofore made or which thereafter may be made under section 4 of the said Act, or under any other authority in that behalf which shall have notified any building, erection, house, enclosed place, or premises to be a public gaol, prison and house of correction, or penal establishment, and that thereupon the building, erection, house, enclosed place, and premises referred to in such notice shall cease to be a public gaol, prison, house of correction, or penal establishment accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that the Governor in Council, upon a certificate from the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments that any lock-up is fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days, may from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim any police lock-up so certified to be a "police gaol": And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the 22nd day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, certain buildings and premises therein described and situated at Portland were amongst others declared, proclaimed, and notified to be a public gaol, prison, and house of correction within the meaning of and in accordance with the provisions of *The Statute of Gaols 1864*: And whereas the Inspector-General of Penal Establishments has certified that the said buildings and premises are fit for the reception of prisoners whose sentences do not exceed thirty days: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power and authority conferred by the *Gaols Act 1890* aforesaid, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned as relates to the buildings and premises therein designated "Portland Gaol," and do hereby proclaim the buildings and premises described in the aforesaid Proclamation as the Portland Gaol to be a Police Gaol: And, with the advice of the Executive Council aforesaid, I do hereby further declare that this my Proclamation shall have effect on and after the 15th day of August, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A CRICKET
GROUND AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC
RECREATION AT WHALERS' POINT, IN THE
MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF PORTLAND.

WE, William Primrose Anderson, Hugh John Munro Campbell, and Thomas Webb Smith, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for a Cricket Ground and other purposes of Public Recreation, at Whalers' Point, in the municipal district of Portland, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the Committee of Management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve, on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, sports, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—
For the admission of every person, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling (1s.).
For the admission of every vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).
Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
