ROYAL INSTRUCTIONS TO THE GOVERNOR.

THE Governor directs the publication of the following Instructions to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet.

VICTORIA.

INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies.

VICTORIA R. I.

INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, or to Our Lieutenant-Governor or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony and its Dependencies. Dated 9th July, 1892.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this Ninth day of July, 1892, in the Fifty-sixth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent bearing date the Twenty-first day of February, 1879, We did constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies (which said Colony and its Dependencies are therein and hereinafter called the Colony):

Preamble.
Recites Letters
Patent of 21st
February, 1879,
constituting the
Office of Governor.

And whereas We did thereby authorize and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenor of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as might be issued to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as might from time to time be given to him under Our Sign Manual and Signet or by Our Order in Our Privy Council, or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such Laws as were then or should thereafter be in force in the Colony :

Recites Instructions of 21st February, 1879.

And whereas We did issue certain Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the Twenty-first day of February, 1879 :

And whereas We are minded to give these further Instructions to Our said Governor :

Revokes aforesaid Instructions.

Now know you that We do hereby revoke the aforesaid Instructions, and We do by these Our Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet direct and enjoin and declare Our Will and pleasure as follows :—

Interpretation.

I. In these Our Instructions, unless inconsistent with the context, the term, "the Governor" shall include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Colony, and the term "the Executive Council" shall mean the members of Our Executive Council for the Colony who are for the time being the responsible advisers of the Governor.

Oaths to be administered by Governor.

II. The Governor may, whenever he thinks fit, require any person in the public service to take the Oath of Allegiance, together with such other Oath or Oaths as may from time to time be prescribed by any Law in force in the Colony. The Governor is to administer such Oaths or cause them to be administered by some Public Officer of the Colony.

Governor to communicate Instructions to Executive Council.

III. The Governor shall forthwith communicate these Our Instructions to the Executive Council, and likewise all such others, from time to time, as he shall find convenient for Our service to impart to them.

Governor to preside.
Governor to appoint a President.
Senior Member to preside in the absence of the Governor and President.
Seniority of Members.

IV. The Governor shall attend and preside at the meetings of the Executive Council, unless prevented by some necessary or reasonable cause, and in his absence such member as may be appointed by him in that behalf, or in the absence of such member the senior member of the Executive Council actually present shall preside ; the seniority of the members of the said Council being regulated according to the order of their respective appointments as members thereof.

Quorum.

V. The Executive Council shall not proceed to the despatch of business unless duly summoned by authority of the Governor nor unless two members at the least (exclusive of the Governor or of the member presiding) be present and assisting throughout the whole of the meetings at which any such business shall be despatched.

Governor to take advice of Executive Council.

VI. In the execution of the powers and authorities vested in him, the Governor shall be guided by the advice of the Executive Council, but if in any case he shall see sufficient cause to dissent from the opinion of the said Council he may act in the exercise of his said powers and authorities in opposition to the opinion of the Council, reporting the matter to Us without delay, with the reasons for his so acting.

In any such case it shall be competent to any member of the said Council to require that there be recorded upon the Minutes of the Council the grounds of any advice or opinion that he may give upon the question.

VII. The Governor shall not, except in the cases hereunder mentioned, assent in Our name to any Bill of any of the following classes:—

Description of Bills not to be assented to.

1. Any Bill for the divorce of persons joined together in holy matrimony.

2. Any Bill whereby any grant of land or money, or other donation or gratuity, may be made to himself.

3. Any Bill affecting the currency of the Colony.

4. Any Bill imposing differential duties (other than as allowed by the *Australian Colonies' Duties Act 1873*).

5. Any Bill, the provisions of which shall appear inconsistent with obligations imposed upon Us by Treaty.

6. Any Bill interfering with the discipline or control of Our forces in the Colony by land or sea.

7. Any Bill of an extraordinary nature and importance, whereby Our prerogative or the rights and property of Our subjects not residing in the Colony, or the trade and shipping of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies, may be prejudiced.

8. Any Bill containing provisions to which Our assent has been once refused, or which have been disallowed by Us—

Unless he shall have previously obtained Our Instructions upon such Bill through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, or unless such Bill shall contain a clause suspending the operation of such Bill until the signification in the Colony of Our pleasure thereupon, or unless the Governor shall have satisfied himself that an urgent necessity exists requiring that such Bill be brought into immediate operation, in which case he is authorized to assent in Our name to such Bill, unless the same shall be repugnant to the law of England, or inconsistent with any obligations imposed upon Us by Treaty. But he is to transmit to Us by the earliest opportunity the Bill so assented to, together with his reasons for assenting thereto.

Powers in urgent cases.

VIII. The Governor shall not pardon or reprieve any offender without first receiving in capital cases the advice of the Executive Council, and in other cases the advice of one, at least, of his Ministers; and in any case in which such pardon or reprieve might directly affect the interests of our Empire, or of any country or place beyond the jurisdiction of the Government of the Colony, the Governor shall, before deciding as to either pardon or reprieve, take those interests specially into his own personal consideration in conjunction with such advice as aforesaid.

Regulation of power of pardon.

IX. All commissions granted by the Governor to any persons to be Judges, Justices of the Peace, or other officers shall, unless otherwise provided by law, be granted during pleasure only.

Judges, &c., to be appointed during pleasure.

X. The Governor shall not quit the Colony without having first obtained leave from Us for so doing under Our Sign Manual and Signet, or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, except for the purpose of visiting the Governor of any neighbouring Colony for periods not exceeding one month at any one time, nor exceeding in the aggregate one month for every year's service in the Colony.

Governor's absence.

Temporary leave of absence.

XI. The temporary absence of the Governor for any period not exceeding one month shall not, if he have previously informed the Executive Council, in writing, of his intended absence, and if he have duly appointed a Deputy in accordance with Our said Letters Patent, be deemed a departure from the Colony within the meaning of the said Letters Patent.

Governor's absence and departure from the Colony. Interpretation clause.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133, Part VI., section 135) and in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of East Loddon;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Public Holiday* throughout the Borough of Majoreca and the Shires of Avoca, Bet Bet, and Tullaroop, and as a Bank Holiday at Ararat and Maryborough;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Hamilton;

THURSDAY, THE 15TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, AND TUESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Chiltern;

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Tallangatta;

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Echuca;

FRIDAY, THE 23RD DAY OF SEPTEMBER NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Ballarat;

TUESDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout the Shire of Chiltern;

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF OCTOBER NEXT, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Bridgewater and Inglewood.

- (7) Studying and advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

PARTLY REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Althrice, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the Session of the Parliament of Victoria holden in the twentieth and twenty-first years of Her present Majesty's reign, entitled *An Act to Regulate the Importation Carriage and Sale of Gunpowder*, and numbered XXI., it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim any town, township, or municipal district, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and that if any person should bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and should not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it should be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the second day of July, 1861, certain municipal districts were proclaimed to be districts within the meaning and intent of the said Act, and whereas it is expedient that the above-recited clause of the said Act, and whereas it is expedient that the said Proclamation should be in part revoked: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation so far only as the same relates to

UNSEAWORTHY VESSELS AND DEFECTIVE EQUIPMENTS.

NOTICE TO OWNERS, AGENTS, AND MASTERS.

THE attention of Owners, Agents, and Masters is directed to the provisions of the *Marine Act 1890*, in respect of vessels proceeding to sea in an unseaworthy state or with incomplete or defective equipments; and the following extracts from the said Act are published for general information:—

Unseaworthy Vessels.

Section 102.—Every person who sends or attempts to send, or is party to sending or attempting to send, a ship to sea, and every master of a ship who knowingly takes the same to sea from any port in Victoria, in such unseaworthy state that the life of any person is likely to be thereby endangered, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor unless it is proved that the sending or taking of any such vessel to sea in such unseaworthy state was, under the circumstances, reasonable and justifiable.

Equipments.

Section 123.—It shall be the duty of the owner of every ship or of his agent to see that such ship is properly equipped; and no seagoing ship shall be deemed to be properly equipped unless she is provided with all necessary anchors, chains, sails, warps, charts, lamps, lights, boats, rafts, or other appliances for saving life, fog signals, and signals of distress.

Section 124.—(1) If any ship proceeds to sea without being equipped as hereinbefore provided, or if in the case of any ship registered in Victoria any of such equipments are lost or rendered unfit for service in the course of the voyage through the wilful fault or negligence of the owner or master; or

(2) If in the case of any ship registered in Victoria, in case of any such equipments being accidentally lost or injured in the course of the voyage, the master wilfully neglects to replace or repair the same on the first opportunity; or

(3) If such equipments are not kept so as to be at all times fit and ready for use.

Then if the owner or agent appears to be in fault he shall incur a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds, and if the master appears to be in fault he shall incur a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

AMENDED REGULATION FOR THE ADJUSTMENT OF COMPASSES.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make, alter, or repeal regulations for the adjustment of compasses made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: And whereas the said Marine Board did, on the 11th day of October, 1889, make such regulations as aforesaid: And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulation No. 6 of the "Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses" published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st November, 1889, and also to substitute an amended regulation therefor:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the aforesaid regulation, and, in lieu thereof, doth make and substitute therefor the following Amended Regulation, namely:—

6. *Place and mode of adjustment.*—Where the compasses of any ship to which these regulations apply are to be adjusted, such ship shall be taken to the swinging buoys laid down for such purpose in any port, or, at the option of the master or other person in charge thereof, such ship may be swung for the adjustment of compasses in Hobson's Bay or Port Phillip Bay, or Corio Bay, by means of distant objects or by azimuths or amplitudes of the sun.

This Regulation shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Adjustment of Compasses," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1892.

The foregoing Amended Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this nineteenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING Candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

1. Principles of Construction, Manipulation, Adjustment, and use of following Instruments, viz.:—

Theodolite,

Prismatic compass,
Chain.

2. Principles and Practice of Land Surveying:

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field-notes;
Topographical surveying;
Setting out block surveys;
Laying out roads;
Setting out of curves;
Plotting from field-notes.

3. Computations connected with Land Surveying:

Reduction of traverses and bearings;
Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves;
Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field;
Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.

4. Trigonometry, Astronomy, &c.:

Plane trigonometry (practical);
Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude;
Determination of true meridian;
Determination of azimuth;
Barometric measurements of heights.

5. Levelling, &c.:

Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.

6. Drawing and Charting:

Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;
Drawing;
Hill shading;
Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *ried voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

Health Act 1890. SHIRE OF YEA. BY-LAW NO. 4.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the Shire of Yea, in the name and on behalf of the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the said shire, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 4 of the said council, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law, pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in and within the boundaries of the township of Yea.

4. *Definitions*.—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises. “Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and “Earth-closet” shall include a pan-closet of any description. “Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not. “Council” shall mean the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Yea. Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

5. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground; and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

6. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

7. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron or of other material to be approved by the council, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet.

8. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding ten feet in width.

9. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of one foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

10. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall, once at least in every week, empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

11. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents, or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

12. When any nightman is licensed by the council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same, and no such occupier or person shall contract for the removal of night-soil therefrom with any nightman or person who is not licensed in that behalf by the council.

13. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter, or thing, shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

14. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Four a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the council (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed so soon as the same is emptied.

15. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find their way, or be likely to find their way, into any drain or sewer.

16. The occupier of every house or tenement in the township of Yea in which any night-soil pan is in use shall pay to the council, or to such person or persons as the council may, by resolution, appoint to receive the same, the sum of Twenty-six shillings per annum, or such other sum as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council, for emptying and removing the contents of each pan, such sum to be paid by monthly instalments of Two shillings and twopence per month, on the first day of each month in each year, or on such other day or days as may from time to time be fixed by resolution of the council.

17. Every person who shall, by any act or default, be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion not being less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

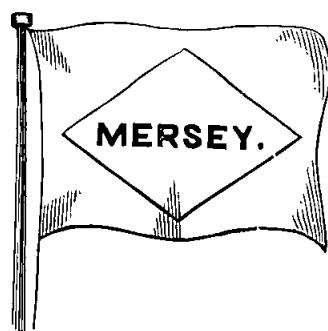

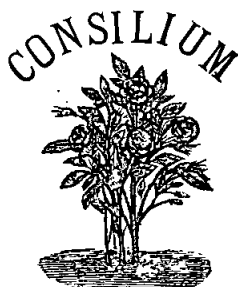

**COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.**

REGULATION No. 3.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. The form of measurement shall be determined by the Trust.

2. Every outlet required, in addition to those to be provided free of cost by the Trust shall be constructed by the Trust, and the cost of such outlet shall be borne by the occupier of the land.

3. Any person who shall construct any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority of the Trust, and (in that case) without the supervision of its authorized officer, or in any manner other than that authorized by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

4. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be One penny per inch per acre, and three inches shall be deemed to be a watering. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered by pumping from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre, and four inches shall be deemed to be a watering.

5. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of gravitation water than is equal to the value of Five shillings, or of pumped water to the value of Twenty shillings; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

6. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him, whereupon, and before the delivery of the water shall be proceeded with, he shall pay to the Secretary to the Trust, or other officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose, the sum of money to which the quantity of water to be delivered to him will amount at the rate or price set forth in clause 4 of this Regulation.

7. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers shall, under any circumstances, open any such outlet, or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works.

8. Any person not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust who shall open any irrigation outlets, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

9. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

10. All outlets, whether their cost of construction or only a portion thereof has been paid by the owner or occupier of the land to be supplied from such outlet, shall remain absolutely under the control of the Trust, and shall not be interfered with either by such owner or occupier, or any other person, in any way whatsoever, except with the express sanction of the Trust, in writing, and under the supervision of its engineer or other responsible officer.

11. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

12. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against this Regulation shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of section 411 of the *Water Act 1890*.
