TRADE MARKS CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT
BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosure, are published for general information.

My Lord,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and Itoumania-relative to-Trade-Marks, signed at Bucharest, on the 4th of May, 1892, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Bucharest on the 3rd ult.

I have to call your attention to Article II. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the colony under your Government, notice to that, effect must be given to the King of Roumania within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

Thave therefore to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me as soon as possible of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

or, or or CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA RELATIVE TO TRADE-MARKS.

Signed at Bucharest, 4th May, 1892.

[Ratifications exchanged at Bucharest, 3rd June, 1892.] HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the King of Roumania, desiring to conclude a Convention for the reciprocal protection of trade-marks and designs, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Arthur George Vansittart, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Charge d'Affaires at Bucharest, &c., &c.;

And His Majesty the King of Roumania, M. Alexandre N. Lahovary, Grand Cross of his Order of the Crown of Roumania, &c., &c., his Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

### ARTICLE I.

The subjects of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to native subjects, or to subjects of the most favored nation, in all that relates to trade-marks, industrial designs, and patterns.

In order that such rights may be obtained; the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries must be fulfilled. No. 116.—September 9, 1892.—1,

ARTICLE III.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Bucharest as soon as possible.

It shall come into operation one month after the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either party may give notice of its intention to terminate it.

TENDERS FOR A MAIL SERVICE BETWEEN NEW GUINEA AND QUEENSLAND.

THE subjoined Notice, inviting Tenders for a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland, is published for general information.

TENDERS are invited for running a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland on the terms and conditions hereunder specified:—

- 1. One trip of the service shall be performed every six weeks, or every eight weeks, as may be expressed in the tender.
- 2. The port to be touched at in Queensland may be Cooktown, Thursday Island, or Cairns, as may be agreed from time to time by the contracting parties. But it shall be Cooktown unless otherwise arranged.
- 3. Tenders should be for 18, 26, and 35 successive trips.
- 4. The places to be touched at in British New Guinea are, beginning and proceeding in order from the West:—
  - Mabudauan or Yaru, that is to say, at whichever of these two places the Government station for the Western District may be.
     Motumotu or Jokea, at whichever of these places may be the head-quarters of the London Missionary Society.

    (3) Roro (Yule Island).
    (4) Port Moresby.
    (5) Kerepunu or Aroma, as may from time to time be determined by the Government.
    (6) Dedele, in the east end of Cloudy Bay.
    (7) Amazon Island.
    (8) Samarai.
    (9) At some place in the middle or west end of the Gulf of Papuan, should any settlement or Government station be formed there; but there would be no place of call there at present.
- 5. By previous arrangement with the Government, Samarai may be made the first or last place of call, to suit the prevailing winds of the season; but, unless it is first otherwise sanctioned by the Government, Samarai shall be the first port of call.
- $6.\ \,$  The vessel or vessels to be employed in this service shall not be of less than 100 tons register.
- 7. No payment shall be made for the carrying of mails, which service will be held as being included under the subsidy to be paid.
- 8. The rate of freight to be paid by the Government for goods carried to any port or place of call in the Possession, from Thursday Island, Cooktown, or Cairns, or vice vera, as the case may be, shall not exceed £1 a ton by weight or measurement.

A penalty of half the subsidy payable for the previous trip will be deducted, at the time that such subsidy becomes payable, for each time the vessel is three weeks or more behind her time when she arrives at Port Moresby, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Administrator that the delay was caused by labour strikes or accidents to the vessel that could not be foreseen or avoided. A vessel shall be deemed behind her time if she does not arrive at Port Moresby within the six or eight weeks, as the case may be, next following the day upon which she, or a vessel employed in the same service, left Port Moresby on the previous trip of the said service.
- 15. Vessels employed in the service for which tenders are hereby called will have the same privileges in the Possession, as regard port and pilot dues, as vessels engaged in the Queensland coastal mail service have in that colony.

PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.

A PPLICATIONS are invited from Officers in the Public Service who may be desirous of obtaining the appointment of Assistant Medical Inspector, Professional Division, in the Department of Public Health, at a salary of £500 a year.

The Officer appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters, and such others as the Board of Public Health may from time to time direct:—

(1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary

inten cheers as the Board on Fuone health may from time to there are the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.

(2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.

(3) Perusing, minuting and advising on the reports of the local health officers.

(4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.

(5) Investigating the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular-localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.

(6) Making periodical inspections of, and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of, the various municipal districts of the colony.

(7) Studying and advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.

(8) Inspecting, reporting, on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.

(9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.

(10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small pox or cholera.

(11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in animals.

(12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.

(13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for granting or cancelling of licences, for abattors and noxious trade establishments.

Every applicant should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be vigorous and of sound health, and he must show that he possesses a surgical and medical qualification recognised by the Medical Board of Victoria, and that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable diseases.

The possession by applicants of the following additional qualifications will be considered to be valuable, although not essential:

(a) A scientific degree.

(b) A diploma or certificate in State medicine.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent

thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

Note.-By service in the field is to be understood the survey and sudivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of riva roce or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit, a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such
