TRADE-MARKS CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosure, are published for general information.

My Lord.—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and Roumania, relative to Trade-Marks, signed at Bucharest, on the 4th of May, 1892, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Bucharest on the 3rd ult.

I have to call your attention to Article II. of the Convention, from which you will observe that, if it is desired that the stipulations of the Convention should be made applicable to the colony under your Government, notice to that effect must be given to the King of Roumania within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications.

I have therefore to request that you will be good enough to acquaint me as soon as possible of the wishes of your Government in the matter.

CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND ROUMANIA RELATIVE TO TRADE-MARKS.

Signed at Bucharest, 4th May, 1892.

[Ratifications exchanged at Bucharest, 3rd June, 1892.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, and His Majesty the King of Roumania, desiring to conclude a Convention for the reciprocal protection of trade-marks and designs, have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Arthur George Vansittart, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Bucharest, &c., &c.;

And His Majesty the King of Roumania, M. Alexandre N. Lahovary, Grand Cross of his Order of the Crown of Roumania, &c., &c., his Minister Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs;

Who, having communicated to each other their Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The subjects of each of the Contracting Parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as are now granted, or may hereafter be granted, to native subjects, or to subjects of the most favored nation, in all that relates to trade-marks, industrial designs, and patterns.

In order that such rights may be obtained, the formalities required by the laws of the respective countries must be fulfilled.

ARTICLE II.

The stipulations of the present Convention shall be applicable to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, excepting to those hereinafter named, that is to say, except to—

India.
The Dominion of Canada.
Newfoundland.
The Cape of Good Hope.
Natal.
New South Wales.
Victoria.
Queensland.
Tasmania.
South Australia.
Western Australia.
New Zealand.

Provided always that the stipulations of the present Convention shall be made applicable to any of the above-named Colonies or foreign possessions on whose behalf notice to that effect shall have been given by Her Britannic Majesty's Representative to the King of Roumania within one year from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Convention.

ARTICLE III.

The present Convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Bucharest, as soon as possible.

It shall come into operation one month after the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either party may give notice of its intention to terminate it.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164, Part III., section 20), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revoke in part the Proclamation bearing date the 29th day of August, 1892, so far only as the same relates to the appointment of Friday, the 16th day of September, 1892, to be observed as a Bank Holiday at Tallangatta; and in pursuance of the provisions contained in the said Act and in the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. TENDERS FOR A MAIL SERVICE BETWEEN NEW GUINEA AND QUEENSLAND.

THE subjoined Notice, inviting Tenders for a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland, is published for general information.

TENDERS are invited for running a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland on the terms and conditions hereunder specified:—

1. One trip of the service shall be performed every six weeks, or every eight weeks, as may be expressed in the tender.

2. The port to be touched at in Queensland may be Cooktown, Thursday Island, or Cairns, as may be agreed from time to time by the contracting parties. But it shall be Cooktown unless otherwise arranged.

3. Tenders should be for 18, 26, and 35 successive trips.

4. The places to be touched at in British New Guinea are, beginning and proceeding in order from the West:—

(1) Mabudauan or Yaru, that is to say, at whichever of these two places the Government station for the Western District may be.

(2) Motumotu or Jokes, at whichever of these places may be the head-quarters of the London Missionary Society.

(3) Roro (Yule Island).

(4) Port Moresby.

(5) Kerepunu or Aroma, as may from time to time be determined by the Government.

(6) Dedele, in the east end of Cloudy Bay.

(7) Amazon Island.

(8) Samarai.

(9) At some place in the middle or west end of the Gulf of Papuan, should any settlement or Government station be formed there; but there would be no place of call there at present.

5. By previous arrangement with the Government, Samarai may be made the first or last place of call, to suit the prevailing winds of the season; but, unless it is first otherwise sanctioned by the Government, Samarai shall be the first port of call.

6. The vessel or vessels to be employed in this service shall not be of less than 100 tons register.

7. No payment shall be made for the carrying of mails, which service will be held as being included under the subsidy to be paid.

8. The rate of freight to be paid by the Government for goods carried to any port or place of call in the Possession, from Thursday Island, Cooktown, or Cairns, or *vice versa*, as the case may be, shall not exceed £1 a ton by weight or measurement.

9. The passage money to be paid for European Government Officers on service, proceeding from any port or place of call in the Possession to the port of call in Australia, or *vice versa*, shall be—

For coloured men half these rates.

10. The passage money to be paid for Government Officers, proceeding on service coastwise, from Port Moresby to Samarai, or *vice versa*, shall be—

European Officers	£2 0 0
Natives	0 10 0

From either of these ports to any intermediate place of call, or from one place of call to another—

Half above rates.

From Port Moresby to the Western Station at Mabudauan or Yaru, or *vice versa*—

European Officers	£2 0 0
Natives	0 10 0

From Port Moresby or the Western Station to intermediate places of call, or from one such place of call to another—

Half above rates.

11. The rates of freight coastwise to be paid by the Government shall be—

From Port Moresby to Samarai, or *vice versa*, £1 a ton.

From Port Moresby or Samarai to an intermediate place of call, or from one such place of call to another, and *vice versa*, 10s. a ton.

From Port Moresby to Western Station, at Mabudauan or Yaru, or *vice versa*, £1 a ton.

From Port Moresby or the Western Station to an intermediate place of call, or from one intermediate place of call to another, and *vice versa*, 10s. a ton.

12. European officers must, as passengers, be provided with food, table and bed linen by the vessel; and natives must be supplied with food and shelter. Passengers' luggage to be carried free.

13. Tenders should be at a specified sum for each trip. Each trip will be paid for when the vessel reaches Port Moresby on the trip next following.

14. A penalty of half the subsidy payable for the previous trip will be deducted, at the time that such subsidy becomes payable, for each time the vessel is three weeks or more behind her time when she arrives at Port Moresby, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Administrator that the delay was caused by labour strikes or accidents to the vessel that could not be foreseen or avoided. A vessel shall be deemed behind her time if she does not arrive at Port Moresby within the six or eight weeks, as the case may be, next following the day upon which she, or a vessel employed in the same service, left Port Moresby on the previous trip of the said service.

15. Vessels employed in the service for which tenders are hereby called will have the same privileges in the Possession, as regard port and pilot dues, as vessels engaged in the Queensland coastal mail service have in that colony.

16. Tenders will be received up to the 30th day of September, 1892, and should be addressed to the Under Colonial Secretary, Brisbane, and should be marked "Tender for British New Guinea Mail Service."

PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.

APPLICATIONS are invited from Officers in the Public Service who may be desirous of obtaining the appointment of Assistant Medical Inspector, Professional Division, in the Department of Public Health, at a salary of £500 a year.

The Officer appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters, and such others as the Board of Public Health may from time to time direct:—

- (1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
- (2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.
- (3) Perusing, minuting and advising on the reports of the local health officers.
- (4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.
- (5) Investigating the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.
- (6) Making periodical inspections of, and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of, the various municipal districts of the colony.
- (7) Studying and advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of foods on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

Every applicant should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be vigorous and of sound health, and he must show that he possesses a surgical and medical qualification recognised by the Medical Board of Victoria, and that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable diseases.

The possession by applicants of the following additional qualifications will be considered to be valuable, although not essential:—

- (a) A scientific degree.
- (b) A diploma or certificate in State medicine.

Applications, accompanied by evidence of qualification, will be received by the Secretary Public Service Board, up to Thursday, the 8th September, 1892.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £1 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent

thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

1. Principles of Construction, Manipulation, Adjustment, and use of following Instruments, viz.:

2. Principles and Practice of Land Surveying:

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field-notes;
Topographical surveying;
Setting out block surveys;
Laying out roads;

Plotting from field-notes.

3. Computations connected with Land Surveying:

Reduction of traverses and bearings;
Computations connected with the setting out of roads and curves;
Elimination of discrepancies in measurements and observations in the field;
Computation of areas, including irregular and curved boundaries.

4. Trigonometry, Astronomy, &c.:

Plane trigonometry (practical);
Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude;
Determination of true meridian;
Determination of azimuth;
Barometric measurements of heights.

5. Levelling, &c.:

Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.

6. Drawing and Charting:

Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;
Drawing;
Hill shading;
Writing.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

EXAMINATIONS FOR MINING SURVEYORS.

THE Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Mines hereby give notice that the next examination will commence on the dates specified below.

Candidates must give notice in writing of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any receipt and pay office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the six following subjects:—

- (1) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (2) Levelling.—Practice of surface and underground levelling, levelling by vertical angles, plotting sections.
- (3) Mensuration of earthwork.
- (4) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- (5) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (6) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visd voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM THE CONTINENT OF EUROPE, AND THE COUNTIES OF INDIA, PERSIA, AND EGYPT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such

notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place, and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria, and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid, or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid, shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act, and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of the departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid, or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is also enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid, and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid, or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall, upon their arrival at any place in Victoria, be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats, persons, and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and things shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall, either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria, come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation notify that

THE CONTINENT OF EUROPE, AND THE COUNTRIES OF INDIA, PERSIA, AND EGYPT,

are infected with Cholera, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such places to Victoria.

QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF INFECTION IN CONNECTION WITH VESSELS ARRIVING FROM OR HAVING TOUCHED AT PLACES INFECTED WITH CHOLERA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Health Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with cholera, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels arriving from or having touched at any such place, and all persons and things on board any such vessels shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any order made by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection, and further that all such vessels and all persons and all things on board the same shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by Proclamation, and that until such vessels, persons, and things shall have performed and be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall come or be brought on shore unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such order as aforesaid, and further that all such vessels and all persons and things as aforesaid shall be subject to all the provisions, rules, regulations, and restrictions contained in any orders which shall be made by the Governor in Council concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection: And whereas the Governor in Council has notified, by Proclamation as aforesaid, that the continent of Europe, the Island of Malta, the countries of India, Persia, Egypt, China, and Japan, and the Eastern Archipelago are infected with cholera, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such places to Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby order and direct, first, that all vessels arriving from or having touched at such places as aforesaid, and on board which during the voyage there has occurred, or at the time of

arrival there is any case of cholera, shall be forthwith taken to and detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, and all such vessels, and all persons and things on board the same, shall be subject to the provisions of the said Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Health Act 1890 relating to vessels obliged to perform quarantine, and that the passengers and crews shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer at the said station; secondly, that all vessels arriving from or having touched at such places as aforesaid, on board of which there is not, and has not been during the voyage, any case of cholera, shall be detained, and, if necessary, anchored in some suitable position away from other vessels, and from any pier or wharf until all things on board which the Health Officer deems likely to carry infection shall have been either destroyed or disinfected to the satisfaction of the said Health Officer, and all processes of cleaning and disinfection of such vessels which he may order have been carried out to his satisfaction, and until clean bills of health shall have been granted by the Health Officer to such vessels; and thirdly, that no rags, or any worn out or disused textile fabrics, shall be landed from any vessels arriving from or having touched at any such places as aforesaid, except with the previous consent, in writing, of the Board, which consent the Board, in their discretion, may withhold or may grant subject to such conditions as to disinfection or otherwise as to them may seem fit; and lastly, that the Board of Public Health may grant licences to the Medical Inspector, Health Officers, Pilots, or other persons specially authorized by the Board to go on board any vessels arriving from or having touched at such places as aforesaid, and to quit them in such cases and under such conditions as they deem fit.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF AUGUST, 1892.

THE births of 79 boys and 58 girls, or in all of 137 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of August. Of these, 58 occurred in Ballarat East, 67 in Ballarat West, 9 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 6 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 125, viz., 70 of boys and 55 of girls.

The deaths registered in August numbered 77, viz., 49 of males and 28 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 60. In July the recorded deaths numbered 43; in August, 1891, they numbered 72; in August, 1890, they numbered 62; in August, 1889, they numbered 63; in August, 1888, they numbered 66; in August, 1887, they numbered 69; in August, 1886, they numbered 50; in August, 1885, they numbered 64; in August, 1884, they numbered 64; in August, 1883, they numbered 50; and in August, 1882, they numbered 42.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the suburban districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Candidates who fail to satisfy the examiners in (a) and (b) will not be allowed to proceed further with the examination.
