TENDERS FOR A MAIL SERVICE BETWEEN NEW GUINEA AND QUEENSLAND.

THE subjoined Notice, inviting Tenders for a Mail Service between British New Guinea, and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland, is published for general information.

TENDERS are invited for running a Mail Service between British New Guinea and one of the Northern Ports of Queensland on the terms and conditions hereunder specified:—

1. One trip of the service shall be performed every six weeks, or every eight weeks, as may be expressed in the tender.
2. The port to be touched at in Queensland may be Cooktown, Thursday Island, or Cairns, as may be agreed from time to time by the contracting parties. But it shall be Cooktown unless otherwise arranged.
3. Tenders should be for 18, 26, and 35 successive trips.
4. The places to be touched at in British New Guinea are, beginning and proceeding in order from the West:—
 - (1) Mabudauan or Yaru, that is to say, at whichever of these two places the Government station for the Western District may be.
 - (2) Motumotu or Jokea, at whichever of these places may be the head-quarters of the London Missionary Society.
 - (3) Roro (Yule Island).
 - (4) Port Moresby.
 - (5) Kerepunu or Aroma, as may from time to time be determined by the Government.
 - (6) Dedele, in the east end of Cloudy Bay.
 - (7) Amazon Island.
 - (8) Samarai.
 - (9) At some place in the middle or west end of the Gulf of Papuan, should any settlement or Government station be formed there; but there would be no place of call there at present.
5. By previous arrangement with the Government, Samarai may be made the first or last place of call, to suit the prevailing winds of the season; but, unless it is first otherwise sanctioned by the Government, Samarai shall be the first port of call.
6. The vessel or vessels to be employed in this service shall not be of less than 100 tons register.
7. No payment shall be made for the carrying of mails, which service will be held as being included under the subsidy to be paid.
8. The rate of freight to be paid by the Government for goods carried to any port or place of call in the Possession, from Thursday Island, Cooktown, or Cairns, or *vice versa*, as the case may be, shall not exceed £1 a ton by weight or measurement.
9. The passage money to be paid for European Government Officers on service, proceeding from any port or place of call in the Possession to the port of call in Australia, or *vice versa*, shall be—

10. The passage money to be paid for Government Officers, proceeding on service coastwise, from Port Moresby to Samarai, or *vice versa*, shall be—

European Officers	£2 0 0

 From either of these ports to any intermediate place of call, or from one place of call to another—
 Half above rates.
 From Port Moresby to the Western Station at Mabudauan or Yaru, or *vice versa*—

European Officers	£2 0 0

 From Port Moresby or the Western Station to intermediate places of call, or from one such place of call to another—
 Half above rates.
11. The rates of freight coastwise to be paid by the Government shall be—
 - From Port Moresby to Samarai, or *vice versa*, £1 a ton.
 - From Port Moresby or Samarai to an intermediate place of call, or from one such place of call to another, and *vice versa*, 10s. a ton.
 - From Port Moresby to Western Station, at Mabudauan or Yaru, or *vice versa*, £1 a ton.
 - From Port Moresby or the Western Station to an intermediate place of call, or from one intermediate place of call to another, and *vice versa*, 10s. a ton.
12. European officers must, as passengers, be provided with food, table and bed linen by the vessel; and natives must be supplied with food and shelter. Passengers' luggage to be carried free.
13. Tenders should be at a specified sum for each trip. Each trip will be paid for when the vessel reaches Port Moresby on the trip next following.
14. A penalty of half the subsidy payable for the previous trip will be deducted, at the time that such subsidy becomes payable, for each time the vessel is three weeks or more behind her

time when she arrives at Port Moresby, unless it is shown to the satisfaction of the Administrator that the delay was caused by labour strikes or accidents to the vessel that could not be foreseen or avoided. A vessel shall be deemed behind her time if she does not arrive at Port Moresby within the six or eight weeks, as the case may be, next following the day upon which she, or a vessel employed in the same service, left Port Moresby on the previous trip of the said service.

15. Vessels employed in the service for which tenders are hereby called will have the same privileges in the Possession, as regard port and pilot dues, as vessels engaged in the Queensland coastal mail service have in that colony.

16. Tenders will be received up to the 30th day of September, 1892, and should be addressed to the Under Colonial Secretary, Brisbane, and should be marked "Tender for British New Guinea Mail Service."

PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD.

A PPLICATIONS are invited from persons who may be desirous of obtaining the appointment of Assistant Medical Inspector, Professional Division, in the Department of Public Health, at a salary of £500.

The person appointed will be required to give his whole time to assisting the Medical Inspector in the following matters, and such others as the Board of Public Health may from time to time direct:—

- (1) Advising the Board on the medical aspects of all sanitary matters which come before it.
- (2) Preparing regulations, circulars, and memoranda for publication on all sanitary and medical subjects connected with the health of the people.
- (3) Perusing, minuting, and advising on the reports of the local health officers.
- (4) Watching the returns and notifications of infectious diseases, and advising when special inquiries are needed, or when special action by the Board is required.
- (5) Investigating the causes and conditions attending outbreaks of infectious or contagious diseases in particular localities, making recommendations for the prevention of the spread and for the abatement of such outbreaks, and guarding against their recurrence.
- (6) Making periodical inspections of, and reporting on the sanitary condition and sanitary administration of, the various municipal districts of the colony.
- (7) Studying and advising the Board on the relations between the vital statistics of the colony and all conditions affecting them.
- (8) Inspecting, reporting on, and directing the work of public vaccination throughout the colony.
- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of food on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

Every applicant should be between the ages of 25 and 40 years, and must be vigorous and of sound health, and he must show that he possesses a surgical and medical qualification recognised by the Medical Board of Victoria, and that he has general experience in the treatment of communicable diseases.

The possession by applicants of the following additional qualifications will be considered to be valuable, although not essential:—

- (a) A scientific degree.
- (b) A diploma or certificate in State medicine.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

The births of 1,530 children, viz., 778 boys and 752 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. In the month of July, 1,393 births were registered, or 137 less than in the month under review. The births were 259 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 93 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 598, viz., 337 of males and 261 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 932, or 156 per cent. The deaths were more numerous than those in July by 16, but were less than the average number in August during the previous ten years by 21. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 193.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 3.11, and of deaths registered 1.22.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.3° on the 20th, and the lowest was 31.0° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (50.4°) was one-tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.9°) took place on the 19th, and the least range (5.9°) on the 29th, the mean daily range being 14.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.366 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.409 inches on the 14th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.963 inches) differed from the average by a fraction only.

Rain fell on 16 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.05 inches. The average rainfall in August during the previous ten years was 1.55 inches, or half-an-inch less than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 3 days during the month.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 29 per cent. to that mortality, as against 41 per cent. in August, 1891; 41 per cent. in August, 1890; 36 per cent. in August, 1889; 30 per cent. in August, 1888; 36 per cent. in August, 1887; and 30 per cent. in August, 1886.

Forty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of corobritis; an engineer, aged 75, of apoplexy; an engineer, aged 75, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 75, of cystitis; an ironmonger, aged 76, of valvular disease of the heart; a farmer, aged 76, of broncho-pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 76, of fracture of the femur; a female, aged 77, of syncope; a female, aged 78, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 78, of valvular heart

The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A gardener, aged 63, died of injuries consequent on a fall; a storeman, aged 19, by a fall from a spring cart; a gardener, aged 68, was gored by a bull; a female, aged 52, died of extravasation of blood on the brain, how caused not stated; a carpenter, aged 76, of fracture of the femur, how caused not stated; a boy, aged 12, was accidentally shot; an infant, aged 32, a carter, aged 34, a female, aged 40, two labourers, aged 52 and 55 respectively, and a female, aged 31, a civil servant, aged 32, a female, aged 34, a female, aged 40, in a bath; a mining engineer and a miner, aged 34 and 38 respectively, in a mining shaft at Antimony Hill, Templestowe, through an inrush of water; a new-born female infant was suffocated during birth; a male infant, aged 21 days, whilst vomiting; a publican, aged 67, by escape of gas; and a solicitor, aged 56, by chloroform, self administered. The homicidal deaths were those of 3 new-born male and 1 new-born female infants, who were suffocated; and a publican, aged 55, who died of peritonitis, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the first four cases, and of manslaughter in the last case. The suicidal deaths were those of a presser, aged 26, who shot himself; a bootmaker and a jeweller, aged 50 and 53 respectively, who drowned themselves; and a butcher, aged 39, who hanged himself.

One hundred and nineteen deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 48 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 3 in the Children's Hospital, 6 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, and 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 176, of which 97, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 79, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 128 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 422. Of these, 240, or 57 per cent., were males, and 182, or 43 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 12 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 45 were between twenty-five and thirty, 34 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 27 were between fifty and fifty-five, 31 were between fifty-five and sixty, 44 were between sixty and sixty-five, 43 were between sixty-five and seventy, 28 were between seventy and seventy-five, 12 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 35 were upwards of eighty.

Twenty-nine deaths were set down to specific febrile and zymotic diseases both in July and August. Under this head deaths from whooping-cough rose from 2 to 5, and deaths from puerperal fever from 3 to 5. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever and diphtheria fell from 8 and 6 respectively to 6 and 4, and deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, which numbered 3 in July, disappeared altogether in August. Under the head of Constitutional Diseases, deaths from phthisis and other tubercular complaints numbered 106 in the month under notice as against 87 in the previous month.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to typhoid fever and diphtheria in each month of 1892 and the two previous years:—

Water Act 1890, Part II., Division 9.

THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act:—

1. Water will, subject to the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, Part II., be supplied within the district of the Trust for purposes other than domestic solely by measurement through a meter.

The charge for water so supplied shall, subject to clause 7 of these Regulations, be 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon between the Trust and the person requesting the supply, provided that the minimum charge shall be as follows:—

- For irrigation, £1 per annum.
- For carriers' and livery stables, 5s. per stall, or in open sheds 5s. per 5 feet of accommodation per annum.
- For a trough in a paddock, £2 per annum.
- For steam-engine, £1 per inch cylinder diameter per annum.
- For syphon, £1 per annum.

The Trust year begins on the 1st day of January in each year, and all payments and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

2. (a) On and from the 1st day of January, 1893, the supply of water to tenements not having meters affixed to the service-pipe as hereinafter provided shall be for domestic purposes solely. And all persons who shall use water of the Trust so supplied for domestic purposes for purposes other than domestic solely will be prosecuted according to law.

(b) All persons requiring water for other than domestic purposes solely on and after the said 1st day of January, 1893, shall deliver to the Trust engineer personally a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto, and upon acceptance by the secretary of such notice the person delivering the same shall be deemed to have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure.

(c) Every person having delivered such notice, if the same be accepted by the secretary, shall be entitled forthwith to use water for the purposes in the said notice set forth, and the quantity of water used before a meter be affixed shall be ascertained by the average consumption during such number of days following the fixing of the meter as the secretary may deem right.

(d) No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be deemed to be a meter within the meaning of clause 1 of this Regulation unless the pattern or type be of a kind approved of by the Trust.

(e) All meters shall be affixed in such position as the engineer or secretary to the Trust may direct, and the keys shall be kept by such engineer or secretary.

(f) When a meter shall be out of repair, the water consumed during the period of disrepair shall be ascertained according to the consumption during such number of days following repair as the secretary may think right.

(g) No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-engine without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

3. (a) Any person who shall waste or misuse, or allow to be wasted or misused, the water supplied to him by the Trust, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(b) A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include watering horses in free stables, or hosing down or washing horses or vehicles.

(c) Unless a meter shall be affixed to the service-pipe, no person shall have fitted to the pipes or apparatus through which he receives the water of the Trust any tap with a thread union or other attachment for the purpose of attaching thereto hose.

(d) No person shall have fitted to any bath supplied by water from the Trust any overflow pipe.

4. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair, and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may, by notice, require the same to be placed in proper order, or it may by its employes enter on the premises whereon repairs may be required and repair or replace, or refit and cleanse, such of the pipes or apparatus as may so require to be dealt with, and the costs, charges, and expenses of so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of such premises; and, in default of payment in addition to any penalties incurred, the Trust may recover the amount of such costs, charges, and expenses from the owner or occupier of such premises in any court of competent jurisdiction, as money paid for the owner or occupier, as the case may be; and in such proceeding the Trust may proceed against the owner or occupier individually or as co-defendants.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not allow any other person to use such water, unless by special authority of the Trust; and any person who shall use without such authority the water supplied to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. The Trust will, upon the application of an intending consumer, supply to him a meter at cost price, for cash on delivery, or on time payment on the following terms:—£1 cash deposit, and the balance bearing interest at 10 per cent. per annum by annual payments of £1.

7. Any person having agreed to be supplied with water by measure may take the water supplied for domestic purposes through the meter service on the following terms:—He shall be

entitled to a supply per annum, for domestic purposes, at 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, until at such rate the charge for the quantity consumed would equal the current water rate on the tenement; and thereafter all the water consumed shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes for which water is supplied to such consumers by measure.

8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations he shall, where not otherwise expressly provided, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.

If any person acts in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay when due or on demand any rates or charges, the water may be cut off by stop-valve, or cutting through the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may determine.

In acting under or giving effect to the foregoing Regulations, the secretary, instructed by resolution of the Trust, may do, and in his name sign for the Trust, all things and documents required to be done or executed by the Trust; and in construing the Regulations, "The Trust" means "The Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust," the singular imports the plural, the masculine imports the feminine, and persons imports a corporation.

For the supply of water to gardens and special plots of land on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's district (in the Shires of Benalla and Yarrowonga respectively), there shall be charged such sum as the Trust Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.

3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1892, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1892, and shall be payable on the 1st day of September, 1892.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of Part I. of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the Medical Staff of the Victorian Naval Brigade and the Permanent Naval Forces, and doth hereby annul paragraphs 11 to 18 inclusive of section X. of the Regulations for the Victorian Naval Brigade, made under the provisions of *The Discipline Act 1870*, and bearing date the 8th day of October, 1888:—

REGULATIONS.

The officers of the Medical branch will, subject to the orders of the Commandant, be detailed for duty by and be under the immediate command of the Principal Naval Medical Officer, whether permanent or brigade, both for discipline and professional supervision.

When on active service, they will be employed on general duties, and on all such special duties in camp or on board as the Principal Naval Medical Officer may decide.

The Regulations for the Medical department of Her Majesty's Navy will be taken as a guide in so far as they are applicable, more especially in respect to constitution, general duties, hospital organization and management, supply of surgical instruments, appliances, and materials, medicines and medical materials, medical examination of recruits, sanitary and general regulations.

Medical officers will be detailed for duty with the various subdivisions or divisions, and will be directed by the P. M. O., in conjunction with the Commanding Officer, to perform the undermentioned duties:—

- (a) Examination of recruits.
- (b) Attendance at gun and rifle practice, musters, inspections, boards, and medical surveys.

No medical officer will be allowed to draw pay for other than the above, unless permission for such be given by the Naval Commandant, through the P. M. O.

In the event of the medical officer being unable to attend any of the foregoing duties, he will make arrangements with another medical officer to take his place, informing the Commanding Officer; or will report to the P. M. O. in sufficient time to enable him to provide for the carrying out of the duties. The amount of pay earned by the medical officer detailed as a substitute will be deducted from the pay of the officer for whom such substitute was provided.

The medical officers will be required to give professional attendance to the drill instructors who may be attached to the divisions at the several stations.

Duties of the P. M. O.—He will perform all the duties appertaining to the Chief Executive Officer of the Medical Staff as may be directed by the Commandant. He will attend daily on board the Flag Ship, and have medical charge of all officers and men quartered there, and examine all recruits for entry in the Permanent Naval Force. Every half-year he will furnish to the Naval Commandant a report on all recruits who have joined the Service within that period, and will also make an inspection once in every six months of all medical stores and appliances, and submit a statement thereon.

And the Honorable George Davis, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WOORAK CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Woorak Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any public grave may, on approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees, or balance of fees, as per scale of charges.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do

so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. Wooden picket fences are allowed, but if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.

7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased stated, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the sexton.

8. Order for interment shall be given to the sexton the day previous to the interment.

9. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

10. The hours for burials shall be—September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

11. The procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

12. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

13. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

14. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

15. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

16. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

17. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

18. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

19. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 4 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively, that is to say:—

The wine made was less than in the previous season by 329,607 gallons in the Rutherglen, 87,412 gallons in the Yackandandah, and 23,247 gallons in the North Ovens Shire, and by smaller quantities, amounting in the aggregate to 16,854 gallons, in the Beechworth, Chiltern, and Wodonga Shires, the falling off being attributed to the crop having suffered from frosts. There was, moreover, a falling off, said to be attributable to blight, of 4,400 gallons in the Bright and Oxley Shires, and a falling off, said to be attributable to the great heat in January and February, of 52,553 gallons in the Bet Bet, Lillydale, and Stawell Shires, and a falling off, said to be attributable to dry weather and destruction by birds, rabbits, and hares, of 22,025 gallons in the shires of Maldon, Marong, McIvor, Strathfieldsaye, and Waranga. The net falling off in the colony, as a whole, amounted to 454,363 gallons, as shown in the table.
