- (9) Advising the Board in regard to matters relating to quarantine.
- (10) Taking immediate supervision and direction of the arrangements required for stamping out any introduced disease, such as small-pox or cholera.
- (11) Making original investigations into prevalence of diseases in man, and the relations of the same to disease in animals.
- (12) Advising the Board concerning the wholesomeness of water and of the various kinds of food on analyses submitted in connexion with the provisions of the Health Act in reference to unwholesome and adulterated food, and otherwise.
- (13) Advising the Board, acting as a Court of Appeal, in regard to applications for granting or cancelling of licences for abattoirs and noxious trade establishments.

1. One trip of the service shall be performed every six weeks, or every eight weeks, as may be expressed in the tender.
2. The port to be touched at in Queensland may be Cooktown, Thursday Island, or Cairns, as may be agreed from time to time by the contracting parties. But it shall be Cooktown unless otherwise arranged.

4. The places to be touched at in British New Guinea are, beginning and proceeding in order from the West :—

- (1) Mabuduan or Yaru, that is to say, at whichever of these two places the Government station for the Western District may be.

- (3) Roro (Yule Island).
- (4) Port Moresby.
- (5) Kerepunu or Aroma, as may from time to time be determined by the Government.
- (6) Dedele, in the east end of Cloudy Bay.
- (7) Amazon Island.
- (8) Samarai.
- (9) At some place in the middle or west end of the Gulf of Papuan, should any settlement or Government station be formed there; but there would be no place of call there at present.

5. By previous arrangement with the Government, Samarai may be made the first or last place of call, to suit the prevailing winds of the season; but, unless it is first otherwise sanctioned by the Government, Samarai shall be the first port of call.

6. The vessel or vessels to be employed in this service shall not be of less than 100 tons register.

7. No payment shall be made for the carrying of mails, which service will be held as being included under the subsidy to be paid.

8. The rate of freight to be paid by the Government for goods carried to any port or place of call in the Possession, from Thursday Island, Cooktown, or Cairns, or *vice versa*, as the case may be, shall not exceed £1 a ton by weight or measurement.

NOTE.—During the second quarter of 1892 the registered births numbered 9,496, and the registered deaths 4,066; thus the former exceeded the latter by 5,430, or 134 per cent. The births were fewer than those in the second quarter of 1891 by 813, and the deaths by 92.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 14,539, but the recorded departures by sea numbered as many as 15,584; the apparent net loss by emigration being thus 1,045. Unrecorded departures, however, estimated at 1,358, being taken into account, the actual loss is found to have been greater than this, viz., 2,403. The recorded arrivals exceeded those in the corresponding quarter of the previous year by 248, and the recorded departures by as many as 2,447. From the date of the census (5th April, 1891) to the end of the quarter under notice, the allowance for unrecorded departures was 6,501, viz., 5,024 of males and 1,477 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the apparent population at the end of June would have been 1,169,257, viz., 612,011 males and 557,246 females.

During the quarter, the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for Tasmania by 2,398, New Zealand and the South Seas by 313, and Foreign Ports by 150. On the other hand, the recorded departures for exceeded the recorded arrivals from New South Wales by 1,162, Queensland by 435, South Australia by 1,880, Western Australia by 553, and the United Kingdom by 376.

According to a return just published in New South Wales, the population of that colony is officially estimated to have been as follows on the 30th June:—Males, 639,275; females, 543,225; total, 1,182,500.

The standard required for passing the examination is as follows:—

- (a) To write correctly in shorthand, from an examiner's dictation, 600 words at the rate of 120 words a minute—five minutes in all.
- (b) To transcribe at once, in long-hand, legibly and correctly, without abbreviations, in twenty-four minutes, the passage written from dictation under sub-clause (a).
- (c) To write correctly, in shorthand, from an examiner's dictation, 1,500 words at the rate of 150 words a minute—ten minutes in all.
- (d) To read aloud correctly to the examiners, in not more than thirty minutes, the paper written in accordance with sub-clause (c).

Both shorthand and transcript must in all cases be written in ink.

While candidates are under examination no communication between them will be allowed.

Candidates who fail to satisfy the examiners in (a) and (b) will not be allowed to proceed further with the examination.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £4 4s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age.

Barometric measurements of heights.

5. Levelling, &c.:

Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.

6. Drawing and Charting:

Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates will be granted by the Board without examination to gentlemen who shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Examiners that they have complied with the following conditions, and shall have paid the prescribed fee. But such certificates shall state on the face of them that they have been granted without examination:—

I. Having passed some examination (equivalent in the opinion of the Board to that prescribed in Victoria) in Great Britain, the United States of America, India, or some British colony, and producing evidence of having successfully practised as a surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

II. Or having obtained the M.C.E. degree of the University, Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying of a kind similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board, reserving the right of *visà voce* or other examination if deemed necessary.

III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian colonies.

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.

Applicants for certificates without examination must appear before the Board in person, and if required must submit a letter from the Surveyor-General or Board of Examiners of the colony in which he has last performed work testifying to his character and professional qualifications.

ALFRED GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIP.— ALTERATION OF RULES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has cancelled No. 11 of the Rules for the Management of the Alfred Graving Dock and Patent Slip, and has substituted therefor the subjoined Rule No. 11:—

11. No merchant vessel will be admitted into dock, on the slip, or permitted to moor alongside the dock wharf with any gun-powder or combustibles on board. Vessels belonging to H.M. Navy, the Victorian or any Colonial Governments requiring the use of the dock, slip, or to moor alongside the dock wharf, are to have their powder and other explosives, except filled shells, small arms, machine gun, and quick-firing gun ammunition, removed before entering the dock, slip, or before mooring alongside the dock wharf. The filled shells and other ammunition retained on board are to be placed in the shell rooms, which, with the magazines containing the explosives retained on board, are not to be opened during the time the vessel remains in dock, on slip, or is moored alongside the dock wharf, except under special precautions to be approved of by the Inspector of Explosives. Provided that the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may give permission, should he see fit, for the retention on board of any such vessels of any or all of their powder and other explosives.

EXEMPTIONS REVOKED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation, and that any such Proclamation may at any time be revoked by the Governor in Council by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony and bearing date the 21st day of September, 1891, exempting from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid all Chinese arriving in Hobson's Bay in vessels from China with the intention of being immediately conveyed to any of the Australasian colonies, provided such persons do not land in Victoria, and declaring that the provisions of the said Part of the said Act shall not apply to Chinese arriving in Hobson's Bay from China with the intention aforesaid; such revocation to have effect on and after the 12th day of December, 1892.

Water Act 1890, Part II., Division 9.

THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act:—

1. Water will, subject to the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, Part II., be supplied within the district of the Trust for purposes other than domestic solely by measurement through a meter.

The charge for water so supplied shall, subject to clause 7 of these Regulations, be 1s. 3d. per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon between the Trust and the person requesting the supply, provided that the minimum charge shall be as follows:—

- For irrigation, £1 per annum.
- For carriers' and livery stables, 5s. per stall, or in open sheds 5s. per 5 feet of accommodation per annum.
- For a trough in a paddock, £2 per annum.
- For steam-engine, £1 per inch cylinder diameter per annum.
- For syphon, £1 per annum.

The Trust year begins on the 1st day of January in each year, and all payments and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

2. (a) On and from the 1st day of January, 1893, the supply of water to tenements not having meters affixed to the service-pipe as hereinafter provided shall be for domestic purposes solely. And all persons who shall use water of the Trust so supplied for domestic purposes for purposes other than domestic solely will be prosecuted according to law.

(b) All persons requiring water for other than domestic purposes solely on and after the said 1st day of January, 1893, shall deliver to the Trust engineer personally a notice in the form in the Schedule hereto, and upon acceptance by the secretary of such notice the person delivering the same shall be deemed to have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure.

(c) Every person having delivered such notice, if the same be accepted by the secretary, shall be entitled forthwith to use water for the purposes in the said notice set forth, and the quantity of water used before a meter be affixed shall be ascertained by the average consumption during such number of days following the fixing of the meter as the secretary may deem right.

(d) No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be deemed to be a meter within the meaning of clause 1 of this Regulation unless the pattern or type be of a kind approved of by the Trust.

(e) All meters shall be affixed in such position as the engineer or secretary to the Trust may direct, and the keys shall be kept by such engineer or secretary.

(f) When a meter shall be out of repair, the water consumed during the period of disrepair shall be ascertained according to the consumption during such number of days following repair as the secretary may think right.

(g) No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-engine without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

3. (a) Any person who shall waste or misuse, or allow to be wasted or misused, the water supplied to him by the Trust, shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(b) A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include watering horses in free stables, or hosing down or washing horses or vehicles.

(c) Unless a meter shall be affixed to the service-pipe, no person shall have fitted to the pipes or apparatus through which he receives the water of the Trust any tap with a thread union or other attachment for the purpose of attaching thereto hose.

(d) No person shall have fitted to any bath supplied by water from the Trust any overflow pipe.

4. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair, and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may, by notice, require the same to be placed in proper order, or it may by its employes enter on the premises whereon repairs may be required and repair or replace, or refit and cleanse, such of the pipes or apparatus as may so require to be dealt with, and the costs, charges, and expenses of so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of such premises; and, in default of payment, in addition to any penalties incurred, the Trust may recover the amount of such costs, charges, and expenses from the owner or occupier of such premises in any court of competent jurisdiction, as money paid for the owner or occupier, as the case may be; and in such proceeding the Trust may proceed against the owner or occupier individually or as co-defendants.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not allow any other person to use such water, unless by special authority of the Trust; and any person who shall use without such authority the water supplied to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

6. The Trust will, upon the application of an intending consumer, supply to him a meter at cost price, for cash on delivery, or on time payment on the following terms:—£1 cash deposit, and the balance bearing interest at 10 per cent. per annum by annual payments of £1.

7. Any person having agreed to be supplied with water by measure may take the water supplied for domestic purposes through the meter service on the following terms:—He shall be entitled to a supply per annum, for domestic purposes, at 2s. 6d. per 1,000 gallons, until at such rate the charge for the quantity consumed would equal the current water rate on the tenement; and thereafter all the water consumed shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes for which water is supplied to such consumers by measure.

8. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations he shall, where not otherwise expressly provided, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.

If any person acts in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay when due or on demand any rates or charges, the water may be cut off by stop-valve, or cutting through the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may determine.

In acting under or giving effect to the foregoing Regulations, the secretary, instructed by resolution of the Trust, may do, and in his name sign for the Trust, all things and documents required to be done or executed by the Trust, and in construing the Regulations, "The Trust" means "The Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust," the singular imports the plural, the masculine imports the feminine, and persons imports a corporation.

On holdings exceeding 100 acres but not exceeding 640 acres, Four pounds.
On holdings exceeding 640 acres, for every additional 320 acres or portion of 320 acres Two pounds.

If filled by water conveyed by gravitation—

On holdings not exceeding 100 acres, One pound.
On holdings exceeding 100 acres but not exceeding 320 acres, Two pounds.
On holdings exceeding 320 acres, for every additional 320 acres or portion of 320 acres One pound.

Such charges to be payable annually on tanks being filled irrespective of any application from the owners or occupiers of such lands for such tanks to be filled, and such annual charges to be made payable from the 1st day of January, 1892.

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WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. X. (Scholarships) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the Regulation following in lieu thereof, viz. :—

X.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

The Minister of Public Instruction will award Scholarships to seventy-five pupils of State Schools at an examination to be held in the year 1892, and thenceforward will annually award Scholarships to fifty pupils of State Schools in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned :—

1. Scholars will be selected upon competitive examinations held during the last three months of each year. No competitor will be permitted to attend any such examination unless he shall have been classified in the Sixth Class of his school from at least the first day July immediately preceding, and shall have produced a certificate of birth showing that he will not have completed his fourteenth year before the first day of January succeeding the examination; and no competitor will be selected unless he shall, during the two years immediately preceding the latter date, have been continuously on the rolls of, and in attendance at, a State School.

2. The subjects for examination will be :—

Spelling from Dictation, Composition, Penmanship, Arithmetic, Grammar, Geography, History, Elementary Science,	} As far as prescribed in Regulation I.
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3. Each Scholarship will be of the annual value of Ten pounds, tenable for three years, upon the following conditions :—

(a) That the scholar shall, at the commencement of the session following the award of the Scholarship, become a student in one of the following public grammar schools :—Church of England Grammar School, St. Patrick's College, Scotch College, or Wesley College, all of Melbourne; or in the Church of England Grammar School, of Geelong; or in one of such other schools as may be approved of by the Minister; or in one of the Schools of Mines at Ballarat or Bendigo; or in an Agricultural College; or in a State School approved by the Minister.

(b) That the scholar show progress, as required in clause 7.

(c) That he shall continue to attend one of the above schools, and shall obtain at the end of each year a report from the authorities of the same.

If no report or an unfavorable report be received, or if at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any scholar has been disorderly or immoral, the Scholarship and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

4. No Scholarship will be awarded to any candidate who fails to obtain a satisfactory proportion of the total number of marks.

5. Where a scholar does not reside within three miles of an approved place of education, the Minister may, at his discretion, allow him such sum as will cover the cost of transit to and fro, if the school is easily accessible by rail or coach; or may increase the Scholarship to one of forty pounds, tenable upon the conditions mentioned in clause 3.

6. Students who gained Scholarships at the examination held in December, 1890, and whose Scholarships have been commuted, will be examined in December, 1891, when the best thirty will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. Holders of such renewed Scholarships will be again examined in December, 1892, when the best fifteen will have the Scholarship renewed for a further period of twelve months. But no commuted Scholarship shall be renewed to any competitor who fails to obtain at least 30 per cent. of the maximum number of marks obtainable.

7. Holders of Scholarships gained subsequently to December, 1890, will be required to attend an examination, to be held by the Department at the end of the first and second years of their tenure, and those who fail to pass satisfactorily will have their Scholarships withdrawn.

8. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments, however, by the Minister will be conditional on moneys being placed at his disposal by the Legislature.

“Applications for the remission of fines for non-effectiveness, accompanied by the recommendation of the Commanding Officer, must be made so as to reach Head-Quarters not later than the 25th June of each year, otherwise they will not be considered, and pay-sheets are not to be rendered to the Paymaster until a decision has been given in all cases submitted.”

Part VII., Section I.

Paragraph 2 (Ambulance Corps).—In column “Facings,” the word “Scarlet” is cancelled.

MURRUMBEENA REGISTRATION DISTRICT.

Commencing at the junction of the south side of the Dandenong-road and the eastern side of the Race-course-road; thence southerly along the eastern side of the Race-course-road to the intersection of Grange-road; thence southerly along the east side of Grange-road to the north side of the Warrein-road; thence easterly along the north side of the Warrein-road to Warrigal-road; thence northerly along the west side of Warrigal-road to the Dandenong-road; and thence westerly along the south side of the Dandenong-road to the commencing point.

or any foot passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such waggon, cart, or carriage, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or whistle, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, who overtakes and passes any vehicle or any horse or any other beast of burden shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal.

6. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, or carriage, or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such waggon, cart, or carriage, or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.
