BEER DUTY ACT 1892.

REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the third day of October, 1892.

WHEREAS by the *Beer Duty Act 1892* (56 Vict. No. 1257) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for all or any of the purposes of the said Act, or for making allowances for drawback, or for spoiled stamps, or for beer which has become wasted spoiled or unfit for use, or for the disposal of damaged beer, or for altering the form of the Schedules to the said Act, and that any such Regulations may prescribe penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach thereof, and further that all such Regulations shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect from a date to be named therein : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS.

1. The duty of carrying out the provisions of the *Beer Duty Act 1892* shall devolve upon the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, under the supervision of the permanent head of the Department of Trade and Customs.
2. The bond to be entered into by every brewer in accordance with the sixth section of the *Beer Duty Act 1892* shall be in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule to these Regulations.
3. On all beer contained in vessels not specified or enumerated in section three of the *Beer Duty Act 1892*, duty shall be paid on the actual number of gallons capable of being held in such vessels, but no brewer shall sell or remove from his brewery any beer in vessels other than those specified or enumerated in the said section, or in any vessels other than those approved of by the Commissioner under section seven of the said Act.
4. One of the books required to be kept under the eighth and ninth sections of the *Beer Duty Act 1892* shall be in the form or to the effect in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.
5. The statements to be rendered monthly in accordance with the provisions of the tenth section of the *Beer Duty Act 1892* shall be in the form or to the effect in the Third Schedule to these Regulations ; and such statements shall be accompanied by a declaration in the form or to the effect in the Third Schedule to these Regulations ; and shall be signed by the brewer, or in the case of a company, by the manager, managing director, secretary, or other officer thereof.
6. Permits granted under the nineteenth section of the Act will be supplied by the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, Melbourne, on the written application of the brewer, and shall be in the form and to the effect in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.
7. Every permit granted as aforesaid shall be securely fixed upon the head of every vessel containing the beer proposed to be removed under such permit, and shall not be cancelled or destroyed until such beer is removed from the depôt, warehouse, or other building to which the same has been removed.
8. A duplicate permit shall be issued to the brewer, and on the removal of the vessel he shall write across such duplicate permit the words "removed accordingly." Such duplicate permit shall be returned to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise in such a manner as may be directed by him. Any brewer not returning to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, or not producing any duplicate permit when required by any collector, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.
9. Every brewer shall, before any beer is sold or removed from his brewery, mark or cause to be marked upon every vessel containing such beer the name of the brewer by or for whom such beer was brewed, or in the case of a company the name of the company by whom such beer was brewed. And every brewer shall, before any beer is sold or removed from his brewery, mark or cause to be marked upon every vessel a distinguishing number. Any brewer who shall mark or cause to be marked any two or more vessels with the same number shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.
10. When beer is being delivered or forwarded from any brewery, it must be accompanied by a cart note, and a duplicate cart note upon each of which the words "duly stamped" shall be written or printed in red ink and signed by the person to whom the beer is delivered. The cart note shall be handed to the person to whom the beer is delivered, and the duplicate shall be retained by the brewer.
11. No beer shall be removed from any brewery except between the hours of five o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening of the same day between the months of October and April, both inclusive, and between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of the same day between the months of May and September, both inclusive.
12. The written notice required to be given to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, collector, or other officer, under the twenty-seventh section of the said Act, shall be given twenty-four hours before the beer intended to be purchased as therein mentioned shall be removed ; and no brewer shall remove beer purchased as aforesaid without giving such notice or before the expiration of the time herein limited.

13. Whenever any unfermented worts shall be sold as mentioned in the twenty-eighth section of the said Act, such unfermented worts shall not be removed except between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of the same day, nor until twenty-four hours' notice has been given to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, collector, or other duly-appointed officer, of the intention to remove the same, stating therein the brewery from which and to which such worts are to be removed.

14. No beer shall be bottled in any brewery except from a vessel upon which a notice must be affixed stating that the contents are to be bottled, and the beer to be so bottled shall be put into bottles capable of containing either one quart or one pint, or one reputed quart or one reputed pint. No beer contained in such bottles shall be delivered or forwarded from any brewery unless accompanied by a cart note, and a duplicate cart note bearing distinguishing numbers corresponding with a duplicate thereof kept at the brewery in book form; and upon the line dividing the cart note from the duplicate cart note there shall be affixed a proper stamp or stamps equal to the amount of duty on the quantity of beer shown on the cart notes. And such stamps shall be cancelled as directed by the Act. Upon delivery of such beer in bottles the cart note shall be so cut or separated from the duplicate cart note that the stamp or stamps may be divided into two equal parts, or as nearly so as practicable. The cart note, with one portion of the stamp, shall be handed to the person to whom the beer may be delivered; and the duplicate cart note, with the other portion of the stamp, shall be retained by the brewer and kept by him, and produced at any time when requested by a collector. If any brewer delivers beer in bottle, or any person accepts delivery of such beer, without a stamp affixed to the cart note and duplicate cart note in the manner hereinbefore described, he shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

15. Every brewer who carries on the business of bottling beer shall from day to day enter, or cause to be entered, in a book to be kept by him solely for that purpose, the kind of beer, and number in detail of hogsheads, barrels, half-hogsheads, kilderkins, and other receptacles of beer which have been bottled by him, and the quantity removed in bottles from the brewery, and the name or names and address or addresses of the person or persons to whom such beer has been delivered, and such book shall be open at all reasonable hours in the day-time to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, collector, or other officer. And such book shall be in the form or to the effect in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.

16. When any beer upon which duty has been paid under the said Act shall be entered outwards at a Custom House for exportation, the cancelled stamp or stamps on every vessel containing such beer shall be destroyed by the proper officer of Customs in such manner as he sees fit, and the provisions contained in any Act relating to the Customs, restricting the amount of drawback which shall be allowed and paid upon the exportation of any goods, shall apply to the exportation of beer upon which duty has been paid under the said Act.

17. In addition to the books required to be kept by brewers under the *Beer Duty Act 1892*, there shall be also kept at each brewery a book in the form of the Sixth Schedule to these Regulations, in which shall be entered the date of delivery, number, and contents of each vessel, also the name and address of the person to whom sent or delivered, and such book shall be open at all reasonable hours in the day-time to the inspection of any officer appointed under the provisions of this Act, who may take extracts therefrom or transcripts thereof.

18. Unless the contrary be proved to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, all beer found in any brewery or premises of any brewer on or after the 1st November, 1892, shall be deemed to have been brewed or manufactured since.

19. The duplicate statement mentioned in the tenth section of the Act shall be forwarded to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries and Excise, Melbourne.

20. Every person who shall commit a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds and not exceeding Fifty pounds.

Marine Act 1890.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE

LICENSING OF BOATS AND BOATMEN AND THE EQUIPMENT OF
BOATS PLYING FOR HIRE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS.

WHEREAS by Section 57 of the *Marine Act 1890*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may license boats plying for hire in any port, and also license watermen and boatmen plying within any port: And whereas by Section 59 of the said Act the said Board, with the consent of the Governor in Council, may from time to time make and alter Regulations for the licensing of all boats plying for hire in any port, and for the licensing of watermen and boatmen plying within any port, and for affixing penalties to any breach of any regulation made by the said Board under the authority of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to make Regulations whereby every such boatman shall be required to hold a licence from the Board, and further to provide that such boats shall be licensed, and also be safe and fit for the carriage of passengers, and restricted as to the number of passengers to be carried therein: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

These Regulations may be cited as “The Regulations for the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen and the Equipment of Boats,” and shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1892.

GENERAL.

1. *Licence Fee.*—A fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be paid to the Board by the licensee with the application for the issue of any licence to be granted under these regulations.

2. *Refusal of Licence.*—The Board may refuse to issue a licence under these regulations without assigning any cause for such refusal.

3. *Cancellation of Licence.*—The Board may at any time cancel any licence issued under these regulations without assigning any cause for such cancellation.

4. *Penalty.*—Any breach of these regulations shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

5. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of these regulations the words following shall have the meanings set opposite to each:—

“Boatman” shall mean any person who may be engaged in the navigation or management of any boat which may be used for the conveyance of any passenger or passengers for hire or reward of any kind.

“Boat” shall mean any craft or vessel of any kind whatsoever which may be used for or engaged in the carriage of any passenger or passengers for hire or reward of any kind, and which, apart from these regulations, would not be subject to the control of the Marine Board or the inspection and supervision of its officers.

BOATS.

6. *Boat to be Licensed.*—No boat shall ply for hire for the carriage of passengers within any port in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* unless such boat be duly licensed by the Board in the form prescribed in Schedule III. hereto, and in accordance with these regulations.

7. *Application for Licence.*—Any person desiring to obtain a licence under these regulations for any boat shall make application to the Secretary to the Board on the form set out in Schedule I. hereto.

8. *Inspection of Boat before Issue of Licence.*—Before any boat can be licensed the same must be inspected by such officer or person as the Board may appoint for the purpose, and such officer or person shall, if he considers any boat suitable for the purpose of carrying passengers, and properly equipped therefor, give his certificate accordingly in the form provided in Schedule II. to these regulations.

9. *Inspection of Boat from time to time.*—Any officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose may, from time to time, inspect any boat licensed under these regulations, and shall be afforded every facility by the owner or person in charge to make such inspection.

10. *Number of Passengers—How determined.*—Before being licensed, every boat shall be measured by an officer of the Board or person appointed for the purpose, and the number of adults which the said boat may carry shall be in the proportion of one to each 18 inches of sitting room, provided that such sitting room shall be clear of all interference with the oars when in use or with the proper working of the boat. For the purposes of this regulation two (2) children under twelve years of age shall be reckoned as equal to one adult.

11. *Particulars to be Painted on Boat.*—Each boat licensed under these regulations shall be assigned a number by the Secretary, which number the owner of such boat shall cause to be painted upon the bows thereof in figures of not less than 4 inches in height, and the name or names of the owner or owners shall be painted on the inside of the stern thereof, together with figures showing the maximum number of passengers such boat is entitled to carry, in letters or figures of not less than 2 inches in height.

12. *Particulars—How to be painted.*—All such letters or figures shall be painted in white paint on a dark ground, or in black paint on a light ground.

13. *Certificate of Officer.*—No licence shall be issued until a certificate, as prescribed in Schedule II. hereto, has been forwarded to the Board by the proper officer that the requirements of these regulations have been fully complied with.

14. *Crew.*—If any owner or person having charge of any boat shall permit such boat to be used in the conveyance of any passengers for hire or reward of any kind, without being in charge of a crew of duly licensed boatmen, of the number specified in the licence granted to such boat, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these regulations, and punishable accordingly, and the licence for such boat shall be cancelled.

15. *Complement of Passengers.*—If any person shall, with or without the knowledge or consent of the licensee, go on board any licensed boat having at the time its full complement of passengers, he shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these regulations.

16. *Buoyancy, Equipments, &c.*—Every licensed boat, while plying for hire in the carriage of passengers, shall be fitted in such a manner that she shall have on board such material as will create an internal buoyancy sufficient to prevent the boat and passengers therein from sinking should any accident occur; and such buoyant material shall be in the proportion of not less than one-half cubic foot for each passenger such boat is licensed to carry; and such boat shall be properly equipped with a full complement of oars, masts, sails, seats, and all other gear necessary to the safe navigation of the boat; and any owner, or person in charge of any boat, who allows her to be used without being provided or equipped as required by these regulations, shall be deemed guilty of a breach thereof, and punishable accordingly.

17. *Boat and Gear to be maintained in Good Order.*—Every licensed boat shall, while she continues to be licensed, be kept in good order and repair, both as regards hull and working gear, by the owner or person in charge thereof; and, if at any time the officer appointed by the Board to make an inspection of such boat shall report to the Board that this regulation has not been complied with, the licence shall be immediately withdrawn and cancelled.

18. *Boat to be Ballasted and Marked.*—Every boat, when employed in the carriage of passengers for hire or reward, shall be ballasted to the satisfaction of the officer or person appointed by the Board for that purpose, and such ballast shall be properly secured to prevent the same from shifting. Ballast marks must be cut in on the port side of the stem, and on the starboard side of the stern; and the water-line, as indicated by such ballast marks, must be painted on each side of the boat.

19. *Property of Passengers left in Boat.*—All goods and property left in any licensed boat shall be handed over by the person in charge thereof to the nearest officer of police as soon as practicable after such has been found.

BOATMEN.

20. *Boatman to be Licensed.*—No person shall ply for hire as a boatman within the limits of any Victorian port outside of the port of Melbourne as defined in the Second Schedule to the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890* unless he be the holder of a licence issued by the Marine Board in the form prescribed in Schedule VI. hereto, which shall be produced on demand to any officer of Customs, of police, or of the Board, or to any passenger who may desire to see same.

21. *Application for Licence.*—Application for a licence to ply as a boatman must be made to the Secretary on the form prescribed in Schedule IV. hereto; and the applicant shall forward, with his application, written evidence, showing that he is a person of good character, and that he is competent to have charge of or be engaged on board any boat employed in the carriage of passengers. Should such evidence not be deemed by the Board satisfactory in these points the application will be refused.

22. *Competency of Applicant.*—Every applicant for a licence as boatman must, prior to the issue of a licence, be required to satisfy the officer of the Board or other person appointed by them for the purpose that he is competent to have charge of and navigate a boat used in the conveyance of passengers; and such officer shall give his certificate to the Board as to the efficiency of such applicant in the form prescribed in Schedule V. hereto; and, should such applicant fail to satisfy such officer, his application will be rejected.

23. *Boatman to furnish Regulations on Demand.*—Every licensed boatman shall carry a copy of these regulations, or any additions to or amendments thereof, which will be furnished to such boatman by the Secretary on application, or on being supplied with the address of such boatman; and he shall produce the same when required to do so to any person hiring his boat.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MARYSVILLE CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Marysville Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

- These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

- No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.
- No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless [otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE CLEAR LAKE CEMETERY.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Clear Lake Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
