Health Act 1890.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 35.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Hawthorn, made under the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 35, for the purpose of carrying out the sealed-pan system for the removal of night-soil.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

- 1. On and after the 1st day of October, 1892, the system adopted up to that date for the removal of night-soil within the city shall be discontinued, and from and after that date every closet within the City of Hawthorn shall be furnished with a double pan service.
- 2. The pan or pans in use in each and every tenement in the City of Hawthorn shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid, and shall not be removed except between the hours of Eleven o'clock in the evening and Five o'clock in the following morning.
  - 3. To provide for the proper disposal of night-soil,

The occupier of every tenement within the City of Haw-thorn, in which any night-soil pan is in use, shall pay to the council for each pan an annual charge of Twenty-two shillings for the removal of the said night-soil.

- 4. The amount of the annual charge may be altered from time to time by resolution of the council.
- 5. All closets to be hereafter erected in the city shall be constructed to the satisfaction of the council.
- structed to the satisfaction of the council.

  6. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law, No. 35, shall forfeit and payfor every such offence a penalty or sum not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such offence shall be committed or continued.
- I hereby certify that the foregoing By-law, No. 35, was duly made and passed by the Council of the City of Hawthorn on the 28th day of September, 1892.

### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
- II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service, to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
- III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

The Board of Examiners shall affix a numerical value to each subject, and shall determine the numerical or other standard for Passes in the several subjects. In the event of a candidate failing to pass on first presenting himself for examination, the Board shall have the option of admitting him a second time without charge, or at a reduced fee, if he shall have obtained a certain standard in such examination.

### CERTIFICATES WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

- III. Or producing evidence satisfactory to the Board of the possession of sufficient professional qualifications and experience in land surveying, and of having successfully practised as a land surveyor for not less than twelve months in some of the Australian

This condition is intended specially to meet the case of men advanced in years, and who have been long in practice.
