PREPARATION OF ELECTORAL LISTS.

NOTICE.

IT is hereby notified that the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 1st December prox., and that persons who have not already enrolled may, if duly qualified, do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

2. Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

3. Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

4. Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

5. No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on the new List of Ratepaying Electors, now being prepared, for any Division of an Electoral District may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

6. Foreigners, who desire to obtain Electors' Rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.

7. Deputy Electoral Registrars are further directed to make up their Lists and send them to the Electoral Registrars for their Divisions immediately after 1st December.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling, the sum of One shilling and sixpence on each pound of such value.

**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1893.**

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 13.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of Eleven pounds and not exceeding Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of eight and three-quarters ($8\frac{3}{4}$) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement of Sixteen pounds and not exceeding Eighteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of One shilling and eightpence in the £1 per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
4. For every house or tenement of Nineteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty-two pounds annual municipal value, an amount of seven and a half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every house or tenement of Twenty-three pounds and not exceeding Twenty-six pounds annual municipal value, an amount of One shilling and fivepence in the £1 per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
6. For every house or tenement of Twenty-seven pounds and not exceeding Twenty-eight pounds annual municipal value, an amount of six and two-thirds ($6\frac{2}{3}$) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
7. For every house or tenement of Twenty-nine pounds and not exceeding Thirty-six pounds annual municipal value, an amount of six and a quarter ($6\frac{1}{4}$) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
8. For every house or tenement of Thirty-seven pounds and not exceeding Forty-four pounds annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds five shillings per annum.
9. For every house or tenement of Forty-five pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of five per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
10. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, One pound sterling.
11. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Twenty pounds annual municipal value, an amount of four and a half ($4\frac{1}{2}$) per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound.
12. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
13. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to four and a half per cent. on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound.
14. For every water trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 8,000 gallons.
15. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows :—
Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 24,000 gallons; for every additional acre and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for any fractional part of an acre.
In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
16. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.
17. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre.
18. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
19. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.
20. For water supplied to syphon pumps Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

21. For water supplied to private fountains Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1893, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

Water Act 1890.

ST. ARNAUD SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.

THE Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations :—

No. 7.

Regulation for determining rates to be paid for supply of water for domestic and other use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply for the Wycheproof Urban District, situated within the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust District, and which Urban District was proclaimed and defined on the 15th August, 1892.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carrier's stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers or for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour) or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees or plants, or washing the house walls or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.
2. The charges for water supplied by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows :—
(a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
(b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
(c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
(d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum, 23,000 gallons.
(e) Exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
(f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
(g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust where water is supplied by measure, shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.
4. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.
5. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated in any urban district, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
7. The commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within any urban district to have water from any public service-pipe in such urban district at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.
8. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and no such pipe shall in any case exceed that known as a 2-in. pipe; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

14. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

15. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

16. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

17. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe, or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and, if none, the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

18. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

19. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

20. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of the Regulations, or fail to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

21. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said Regulations and not otherwise.

22. In the construction of these Regulations, the word "Trust" shall mean the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 7, was made by the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust this 5th day of October, 1892.

1. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house, tenement, piece or allotment of land of an annual municipal value exceeding Twenty pounds sterling, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, provided that such rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, except in the case of hotels and boarding-houses.

3. For water supplied by the Trust to livery and carriers' stables, the charges shall be Five shillings for every stall or loose-box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

4. The above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1893.

5. Such person and persons as the Commissioners of the Bright Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

3. For all water sold by meter by the Trust, the sum of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

4. For every public water trough supplied by the Trust, the sum of One pound per annum shall be charged unless supplied by measurement.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by measure.

6. The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1893, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1893.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Mooroopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

TRAMWAY IN THE BOROUGH OF SEBASTOPOL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of October, 1892.

WHEREAS by the *Tramways Act 1890* it is provided that tramways may be constructed in any municipal district (except the municipal districts of Fitzroy, Collingwood, Prahran, Richmond, South Melbourne, Hotham, St. Kilda, Brunswick, Kew, Hawthorn, and Sandridge) when authorized by an Order of the Governor in Council made in that behalf upon the application of the council of the municipality, in compliance with the provisions of the said Act and of the rules and regulations to be from time to time made by the Governor in Council: And whereas the Council of the municipality of the Borough of Sebastopol has made an application, under the common seal of the said municipality, in accordance with the said Act and with the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder, for an Order by the Governor in Council authorizing the construction of a tramway in the municipal district of the municipality of the said Borough of Sebastopol: And whereas the Governor in Council, being satisfied that the requirements of the said Act and of the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council thereunder have been duly complied with by the said council of the said municipality, and that notice of the intention of the said council to make the said application, in which notice the route proposed to be followed was described, and persons objecting to the same were called upon to lodge their objections within the time required by the regulations, has been duly published as required by the rules and regulations made by the Governor in Council in pursuance of the said Act in that behalf, and that no objections to the said application have been lodged within the time provided in the said rules, and, being satisfied also that it is expedient and proper that the said application should be granted, has determined to grant the same, subject to the restrictions and conditions hereinafter contained: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth for the purpose aforesaid make the Order following, that is to say:—

“That the Council of the municipality of the Borough of Sebastopol shall be and is hereby authorized to construct a tramway in the municipal district of the Borough of Sebastopol.”

Route.—That the route of such tramway shall be as follows:— Commencing at the northern boundary of the borough, at the intersection of Rubicon-street and Albert-street; thence southerly along Albert-street to Queen-street.

Gauge.—That the gauge of such tramway shall be 4ft. 8½in., and that the said tramway shall be constructed in the manner set out and described in the working plans and specifications, numbered from one (1) to three (3) inclusive, now deposited in the Public Works Department, and which plans and specifications are indorsed with a memorandum of the Minister of Public Works, identifying the said plans and specifications so deposited as the plans and specifications referred to in this Order, and which plans and specifications are to be deemed to be incorporated in this Order, and to be deemed as such part of the same as if they were set out in detail in this Order.

Motive power.—That the motive power to be used on the said tramway shall be horse power.

Maximum speed.—That the maximum speed of the progression of the cars upon the said tramway shall be eight (8) miles in the hour.

Time of completion.—That the tramway shall be completed and open for traffic throughout its entire length within the period of nine (9) months from the date of this Order.

Passenger traffic only.—That such tramway shall be used for passenger traffic only.

Necessary precautions for safety of passengers and public to be observed.—That every precaution necessary to secure the safety of the passengers upon the said tramway, and also to secure the safety of passengers passing along the streets upon the route of such tramway, shall be taken and ordered by the said council of the said municipality.

Stoppages for taking up and setting down passengers.—That, for the convenience of the public, the cars shall stop for the purpose of taking up and setting down passengers at the intersection of all streets, and at such other points upon the said route as may be convenient, and in such manner as not to interfere with or endanger the general traffic of the streets or the safety of the passengers in the cars.

Tolls and charges.—That the charges to be made for every passenger on the said tramway may be, but shall not exceed, the following, that is to say:—For each passenger.—From Rubicon-street to Victoria-street, *via* Albert-street, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, 2d.; from Victoria-street to Queen-street, *via* Albert-street, or *vice versa*, or any lesser distance between, 2d.

Governor in Council to be sole judge of breach of Order.—That the Governor in Council shall be the sole judge of the compliance with or of the breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order; and for the purpose of enabling the Governor in Council to arrive at a just decision, an inquiry into the facts of each case shall be conducted in the manner provided in clause 25 of the regulations contained in the Second Schedule to the said Act, before an officer to be appointed in that behalf by the Governor in Council, as provided in the regulations in the said schedule.

If upon the report to the Governor in Council by the referee, made under the said clause 25 of the regulations in the Second Schedule of the said Act, the Governor in Council shall, as such sole judge, determine that there has been any failure of or non-compliance with or that any breach of any of the requirements contained in this Order has occurred, by way either of commission or omission, then the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited or shall cease and determine or shall be suspended as the Governor in Council may direct; and in the case of the Governor in Council ordering a suspension only of such powers, then the Governor in Council shall, in his adjudication, state for what period such suspension shall take effect.

If in such adjudication the Governor in Council shall determine that the powers conferred by this Order shall be forfeited, or shall wholly cease and determine, then the Council of the said municipality of the Borough of Sebastopol shall forthwith proceed to restore the streets along which the said route is laid to their condition previous to the construction of such tramway, unless the Governor in Council otherwise order.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE SNUGBOROUGH (WOODSIDE)
CEMETERY.**

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Snugborough (Woodside) Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under 12 years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE ARARAT COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th day of August, 1890, the Borough Council of Ararat, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Ararat Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council:—

REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these Regulations, the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every 10 acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of October and the 1st day of March in every year:—

For every cow, heifer, ox, or steer, 6s. per annum.
For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, 8s. per annum.
For every goat, 1s. 6d. per annum.
For every sheep, 3s. 6d. per annum.
Progeny under the age of six (6) months of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

4. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

5. During the months of October and March in each year, or as soon thereafter as possible, all owners of stock on the common shall be required to muster such stock in their own yards, or in some other convenient place to be determined by the managers, within forty-eight (48) hours after receiving notice in writing so to do, and to assist in branding them with the common brand, horses only being exempt from branding.

6. Previous to the depasturing of stock, the owners thereof shall register the same with brands and descriptions in a book to be kept for the purpose, and such registration shall be renewed half-yearly, and shall be made previous to the branding of such stock.

7. Holders of licences shall be at liberty to substitute stock for others removed from the common during the currency of their licences, by giving notice, in writing, to the herdsman, showing the brands and number of stock so substituted, and a record of such notice shall be kept by the herdsman.

8. All stock depastured on the common, if not registered, branded, and duly paid for, shall be liable to be impounded by the managers.

9. No entire animal shall be depastured on the common without the written permission of the managers.

10. No licence shall be transferred without the written permission of the managers.

11. When any animal is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common within twelve hours after receiving notice so to do from the managers or herdsman, and such animal shall not again be put on the common without the special permission, in writing, of the managers.

12. After due notice has been given, the managers shall, at the owner's expense, be at liberty to remove all diseased animals from the common, and also, at the owner's expense, to remove, bury, or destroy all dead carcasses found on the common.

13. No person shall cart away water from any dam on the common without the permission, in writing, of the managers.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.
