## PREPARATION OF ELECTORAL LISTS.

### NOTICE.

IT is hereby notified that the General Lists of Non-rate-paying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly must be prepared during the week ending the 1st December prox., and that persons who have not already enrolled may, if duly qualified, do so by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

2. Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualification to be answered in writing; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, as is too frequently the case, much inconvenience will be occasioned, with the possible result that those who so delay will be deprived of the opportunity for enrolment.

3. Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

4. Intending applicants are further cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law; inasmuch as a penalty on conviction is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights when not qualified.

5. No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a Province may obtain an Elector's Right for such Province, and no person whose name is already on the new List of Ratepaying Electors, now being prepared, for any Division of an Electoral District may obtain an Elector's Right for such District.

6. Foreigners, who desire to obtain Electors' Rights, must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so, or before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors.

7. Deputy Electoral Registrars are further directed to make up their Lists and send them to the Electoral Registrars for their Divisions immediately after 1st December.

## ADDITIONAL BEACON, MANUKAU HARBOR.

NOTICE is hereby given that a triangular beacon, built of wood, surmounted by an iron globular cage, the whole painted black, has been erected in Manukau Harbor, on the northern side of the channel, opposite the present red beacon that marks the reef of rocks on the southern side near Onuhunga.

At low-water springs the red beacon is dry all round, with 12-ft. water at a distance of 40 feet; the black beacon has 4-ft. water all round, mud and shingle. The distance across between the two beacons is 200 feet, with 3 fathoms in mid-channel, shoaling gradually towards the sides. Masters are cautioned against approaching these beacons too near.

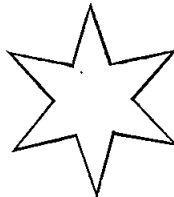

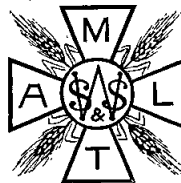

#### WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1893.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house or tenement, used wholly or partly as a domicile, at a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment; minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement by the Trust). One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand gallons.
- (4) Any person who may or shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water shall be supplied by measure shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes only, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1893, commencing from the 1st January, as also the charges for every steam boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable in one payment on 1st July, 1893.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on 1st day of January, 1893, and 1st July, 1893.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

#### LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION, 1893.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July—

- (1) On every house and tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.
- (2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the time being, the sum of two shillings in the pound of such valuation.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure—

- (1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every one thousand gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or in the event of there being no such contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering, the same to be paid for before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, shall be charged one half the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than one quarter but not exceeding one half of a mile distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

#### AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1893.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

6. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per thousand gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other than domestic purposes, it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be ten thousand gallons.
7. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain, Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.
8. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent. shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.
9. For every water-trough a charge of Twenty shillings shall be made.
10. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse-power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Five shillings for each stall shall be charged.
11. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1893. Provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be payable in advance or as may be agreed upon.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust area, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

2. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every one thousand (1,000) gallons shall be made, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

3. Such rates and charges are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1893, and the 1st day of July, 1893.

4. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

# REGULATIONS FOR CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF THE METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day

**WHEREAS** by section 13 of the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is enacted that all elections of members of the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board shall be conducted as prescribed by Regulations, and that every such election shall be held at such times and under the direction of such returning officers as the Governor in Council may from time to time appoint: And whereas by section 39 of the said Act it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may as to the whole or any part of Victoria make Regulations for (amongst other purposes) regulating the conduct of all elections, the mode in which nominations shall be made and polls taken thereat, the form of voting papers, and generally all matters whatsoever necessary for the proper carrying out thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations for the purposes aforesaid applicable to that part of Victoria comprised within the Metropolitan Fire District, that is to say:—

1. The Regulations made on the 27th day of January, 1891, so far as the same relate to the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board, are hereby rescinded.

2. *Election of the City of Melbourne Representatives.*—On receiving notice of the election by the Council of the City of Melbourne of a person to be a member of the Metropolitan Board, the Minister shall, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, declare such person duly elected to be the member of the said Board for the City of Melbourne.

3. *Election of Representative for North Yarra Group.*—On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette* and by circular addressed to each council, the council of each of the municipalities of the City of Collingwood and the other municipalities grouped with it in the Act may nominate a person to be a representative member for such group on the Metropolitan Board, and the name of the person so nominated shall be sent forthwith, by the council so nominating, to the Minister.

4. *Election of Representative for South Yarra Group.*—On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette* and by circular addressed to each council, the council of the municipalities of South Melbourne and the other municipalities grouped with it in the Act may nominate a person to be a representative member for such group on the Metropolitan Board, and the name of the person so nominated shall be sent forthwith, by the council so nominating, to the Minister.

5. *Election of Representatives by both groups.*—If on the day so specified and notified more than the required number of candidates for the Metropolitan Board are nominated by the councils of any group entitled to elect, the Minister shall prepare a list of all persons nominated by such councils, and shall forward a copy of the same to the council of each municipality forming such group, and such council shall, before a day to be specified at the time of forwarding such list, strike out on such list all the names, except that of the candidate for whom such council desires to vote, and return such list within the prescribed time so altered to the Minister.

6. The Minister shall, on the date specified for the return of such lists, count all the votes received by him as indicated on the lists so returned, and shall declare the candidate having received the largest number of votes to be representative member on the Board for such group of municipalities.

7. In cases of equal voting, the Minister shall have a casting vote.

8. In the nomination of candidates by councils other than that of the City of Melbourne, the procedure followed in connexion with the election of mayor or president of the council shall be followed as nearly as may be, or such proceedings may be conducted in accordance with any by-laws to be hereafter made by any city or other municipality for that purpose.

9. *Election of Representatives for the Fire Insurance Companies.*—On or before a day to be specified by the Minister, and notified in the *Government Gazette*, and by circular so far as is reasonably practicable addressed to each fire insurance company, the insurance companies may elect persons to be representative members of the Metropolitan Board.

10. The principal officer in Victoria for the time being managing the fire business of an insurance company carrying on business in Victoria shall be qualified to vote at any election for the same on behalf on such insurance company.

11. Ten days before any election, every fire insurance company shall, by its chairman of directors, manager, secretary, or other superior officer, notify to the Secretary of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria the name of its principal officer, representative, or agent authorized to vote on behalf of such company.

12. Candidates for the Board shall be nominated, in writing, by two voters, and such nomination paper shall be lodged at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria not less than five days prior to the date of the election, addressed to the secretary of such association, and the secretary of such association for the time being shall be the returning officer for the purpose of holding and declaring the result of such election, with power to appoint, in writing, a deputy for that purpose should he be unable to preside thereat.

13. Should the number of persons so nominated not exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such association, or his deputy, shall report to the Minister the names of the persons so nominated to the Board, and the Minister shall thereupon notify such election of such persons to the Board in the *Government Gazette*.

14. Should the number of persons nominated exceed the number to be elected, the secretary of such association, or his deputy, shall, by advertisement in at least two newspapers published daily in Melbourne, and, as far as reasonably practicable, by circular addressed to each insurance company, fix and notify the day at which a poll will be taken.

15. Such poll shall be taken by such secretary, or his deputy, and each candidate may appoint a scrutineer to be present at the taking of such poll and the counting of the votes. The poll shall be taken at the office of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Victoria, or at such other place as the Minister may from time to time, by notification in the *Government Gazette*, direct, and shall be open from Eleven a.m. to Four p.m.

16. Each company, and the person voting on behalf of any company at any election for the Metropolitan Board, shall be entitled to vote in accordance with the following scale:—

If the company in respect of which the vote is cast has, under the 105th section of the *Stamps Act 1890*, returned for the year previous to the election a premium revenue of not less than £4,000, one vote for each member to be elected.

If £4,000, but less than £8,000, two votes for each member to be elected.

If £8,000, but less than £12,000, three votes for each member to be elected.

If £12,000, but less than £16,000, four votes for each member to be elected.

If £16,000 and upwards, five votes for each member to be elected.

17. The secretary or his deputy shall forthwith, after the conclusion of the polling and in the presence of the scrutineers, if any, open and count the voting papers, and such secretary or deputy shall report the result of such poll to the Minister, who shall declare the candidate or candidates having received the largest number of votes to be the representative member or members on the Board for the insurance companies, and shall notify the same in the *Government Gazette*.

18. A list of all fire insurance companies carrying on business and insuring property within Victoria shall be published by the Minister in the *Government Gazette*.

Any insurance company omitted from such list may be inserted therein by applying to the Minister within seven days from the publication thereof.

Such list, with the name or names of any insurance company so added, shall be taken to be the roll of insurance companies entitled to vote at the election of insurance companies' representatives on the Metropolitan Board.

And the Honorable Allan McLean, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The births of 1,373 children, viz., 706 boys and 667 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. In the month of September, 1,506 births were registered, or 133 more than in the month under review. The births were 225 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 93 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 512, viz., 270 of males and 242 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 861, or 163 per cent. The deaths were less than those in September by 16, and were below the average of October during the previous ten years by 53. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been below that average by 216.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.79, and of deaths registered 1.04.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 78.7° on the 11th, and the lowest was 38.9° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (56.7°) was one-tenth of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28.0°) took place on the 16th, and the least range (4.1°) on the 13th. The mean daily range was 16.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.227 inches on the 24th, and the lowest was 29.491 inches on the 11th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.889 inches) differed from the average by a very small fraction only.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 3.46 inches. The average rainfall in October during the previous ten years was 2.48 inches, or nearly an inch less than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 53 per cent., and females 47 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 26 per cent. to that mortality, as against 27 per cent. in October, 1891; 31 per cent. in October, 1890; 40 per cent. in October, 1889; 35 per cent. in October, 1888; 36 per cent. in October, 1887; and 32 per cent. in October, 1886.

Thirty-nine deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 76, died of syncope; a gentleman, aged 76, of apoplexy; a railway gatekeeper, aged 76, of pleurisy; two females, each aged 77, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 77, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 77, of pleurisy; an accountant, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 78, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 79, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 79, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 79, of nephritis; a tailor, aged 80, of syncope; a gardener, aged 80, of bronchitis; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of pleurisy; a female, aged 81, of fracture of the thigh; a laundress, aged 82, of heart disease; a female, aged 82, of broncho-pneumonia; a female, aged 83, of insanity; a draper, aged 83, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 85, of paralysis; a gentleman, aged 85, of cystitis; a gentleman, aged 86, of heart disease; a brushmaker and a female, each aged 87, of bronchitis; a tailor, stated to be aged 106, of syncope; a female, aged 77, a female, aged 78, a labourer, aged 80, a saddler, aged 82, a bootmaker and a widow, each aged 83, a labourer and a female, each aged 84, a female, aged 85, two females, each aged 86, and a female, aged 89, of old age.

Twenty-nine deaths were ascribed to violence during the month, of which 24 were set down to accident and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 69, was passed over by a railway train, a boy, aged 3, by a vehicle; a boy, aged 8, was killed by a kick from a horse; and a female, aged 81, died of fracture of the thigh, how caused not stated; a boy, aged 8, was shot; a seaman, aged 21, of tetanus, caused by a splinter having become impacted in his finger; a female, aged 21, and a female child, aged 2, were burnt, and an engine-driver, aged 37, was scalded to death; a railway porter, aged 24, a miner and two stonemasons, each aged 37, a female, aged 45, and a male of unknown occupation, aged 55, were found drowned in the River Yarra, a puller-out, aged 25, off St. Kilda pier, and a gardener, aged 29, at Brighton; two male infants, aged 2 and 4 days respectively, and two female and one male infants, aged 2, 3, and 6 months respectively, were overlain; a new-born female infant was suffocated at birth; and a fireman, aged 42, was choked by food. The suicidal deaths were those of an advertising agent, aged 26, a bootmaker, aged 65, and a labourer, aged 62, who cut their throats; a miner, aged 55, who hanged himself; and a miner, aged 70, who threw himself from a bridge.

Ninety-nine deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 37 in the Melbourne Hospital, 12 in the Alfred Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Austin Hospital, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 5 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 135, of which 77, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 58, or 43 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 95 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 377. Of these, 193, or 51 per cent., were males, and 184, or 49 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 37 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 15 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 30 were between sixty and sixty-five, 28 were between sixty-five and seventy, 32 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 24 were upwards of eighty.

#### OMEQ DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

BY-LAWS of the Omeo District Hospital made by the Committee thereof, and confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose, viz., 16th July, 1892.

#### OBJECT.

1. The object of the institution is to afford medical and surgical relief to poor persons requiring it, and to casualties.

#### CONSTITUTION.

2. The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and subscribers.

#### QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

3. Life governors, life subscribers, governors for one year, and contributors shall be eligible to sit on committee, with the privileges of voting at all general, special, and adjourned meetings of governors and contributors, and with power to recommend patients according to the undermentioned scale:—

Life Governors—3 in-patients, or 6 out-patients annually.

Life Subscribers—2 in-patients, or 4 out-patients annually.

Governors for one year—10 in-patients, or 20 out-patients annually.

Contributors—1 in-patient, or 2 out-patients annually.

£25 personal contribution in one year shall constitute a life governor.

£20 personal contribution in one year, life subscriber.

£40 donation by society, association, or company shall entitle same to nominate life governor.

£15 donation by society, association, or company to nominate governor for one year.

£30 first-named executor under will—Life subscriber.

£1 yearly subscription—Contributor.

Persons who shall have conferred any signal benefit on the hospital irrespective of subscriptions may be elected honorary life governors at any general meeting of subscribers, on the recommendation of the committee, and shall be entitled to all the privileges appertaining to the position of life governor.

4. Ministers of religion, employers, or any person collecting shall receive one member's ticket for every £1 collected, provided they have not availed themselves of the position of governors.

5. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription be paid, and no governor or contributor will be entitled to any privilege until his or her subscription be paid.

6. Life and annual governors, life and annual subscribers, all honorary officers, and other contributors of £1 and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of governors and contributors to the hospital. No person shall vote as a governor or contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital, nor any new governor or contributor, unless his subscription shall have been paid six months previously.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

7. At all meetings of contributors the president, one of the vice-presidents, or treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair; but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a deliberate as well as a casting vote.

8. The annual meeting of the contributors to the hospital shall be held on the third Saturday in the month of July in every year for the following purposes:—

(a) The election of honorary and honorary consulting medical and surgical officers and auditors for the year.

(b) The election of members of the committee of management.

(c) The transaction of any other business of which due notice shall have been given or that may arise at such meeting.

9. At all general meetings of contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum be present the chair shall be taken, but if no quorum be present within one hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

10. It shall be competent for the committee of management or any five or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary to summons a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every meeting shall be called by the secretary or three members of committee.

11. All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

12. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept in a box at the hospital with two keys, one of which shall be kept by the president and the other by the secretary.

13. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the committee of management at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

14. On the third Saturday in the month of July in every year the one-third part of the elected members of committee shall go out of office, but may be, nevertheless, re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall be in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by Act 27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 11.

15. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the secretary, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the said Act, are required to go out of office, 27 Vict., No. 220, sec. 11.

#### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

16. The institution shall be managed by fifteen (15) members of committee, who shall be elected from the governors and contributors at the annual meeting, and the committee at its first sitting shall elect from amongst its members a president, two vice-presidents, and treasurer for the ensuing twelve months.

17. The committee of management may suspend any honorary medical or surgical officer, or one or more of its own members on any well founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, to be confirmed at a special meeting of governors and contributors to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the committee.

18. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulations, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.

19. They shall meet on the third Saturday in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint, five to form a quorum; but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time appointed, such meeting, as well as every special meeting hereinafter authorized, shall stand adjourned to such day and hour as the members present may determine. The chairman of committee shall have a casting as well as a deliberate vote.

20. The general committee shall have full power to consider any application and discharge any patient who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for so refusing any application or ordering any discharge.

21. No person holding any office or place of profit or in the gift of the board, or concerned or participating in the profit in or of any contract with the board, shall be capable of holding a seat thereon. Provided that nothing in the preceding part of this rule shall extend or apply to any contract entered into by any company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons, or any incorporated company where such contract is entered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association, or to any person by reason of his being interested in any public journal publishing advertisements.

22. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet, at the annual meeting of governors and contributors, in July of each year; such balance-sheet to be published in one or more of the local papers at least within fourteen days after such meeting.

23. The president and vice-presidents shall be members *ex officio* of all committees, and the treasurer *ex officio* of the committee of management.

24. The committee of management, at their first meeting after the annual meeting of subscribers, shall elect a sub-committee consisting of three members, to be designated a finance committee, and shall at each monthly meeting elect a house committee consisting of two or more members.

#### CHAP. I.—ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

25. The board shall commence business at each meeting as soon as the legal quorum is present.

26. That the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, except at special meetings of the board, unless the confirmation of such minutes be as part of the business of the special meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of such proceedings.

27. At all meetings of the board the reading of the correspondence, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of regular business.

28. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

29. The order of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board, however, may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given, in writing, to the secretary ten clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration. All such notices of motion to be considered in the order in which they were given.

30. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him in writing be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.
