Marine Act 1890.

ADDITIONS TO REGULATIONS FOR THE EQUIP-
MENT OF SHIPS WITH LIFE-SAVING APPLIANCES.

WHEREAS by section 59 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria may from time to time, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make regulations for prescribing what boats, life-buoys, life-jackets, and other means of saving life at sea, shall be carried by ships to which the provisions of Part VI. of the said Act apply, and for regulating the use thereof, and for securing the safety of passengers on board of ships, and generally for regulating all matters relating to the protection of life of passengers and others: And whereas the said Marine Board did, on the 18th day of December, 1891, make such regulations as aforesaid, and which regulations were duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th day of January, 1892: And whereas it is expedient to make additional regulations thereto: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the following additional Regulations, namely:—

DIVISION C.—CLASS 4.

Regulations for Steam-ships not certified to carry Passengers plying or trading within the limits of any Port in the Colony of Victoria.

(a) Steam-ships of this class shall carry a boat or boats of wood or metal, placed under davits, such boat or boats being of sufficient capacity to accommodate at least all persons carried on board; and such steam-ships shall have proper appliances for getting the boat or boats into the water.

(b) Such steam-ships shall also carry a sufficient number of approved life-belts, so that there may be at least one for each person carried on board any such steam-ship.

(c) Such steam-ships shall also carry not less than two approved life-buoys.

(d) The Board may, in any case wherein they think it expedient to do so, relieve any steam-ship of this class from the operation of the whole or any part of Regulation (a) hereof.

(e) These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations for the Equipment of Ships with Life-saving Appliances," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1893.

The foregoing additional Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board held this second day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 102.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS ACTING COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts 1890 and 1891, do hereby make the following By-law, and all previous By-laws conflicting therewith are hereby repealed :—

FARES AND RATES FOR CONVEYANCE BY PASSENGER TRAINS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—

1. For conveyance of Members of the Victoria Racing Club between Melbourne and Flemington at race meetings, £150 per annum ; for conveyance of Members of the Victorian Amateur Turf Club between Melbourne and Caulfield at race meetings, £75 per annum ; for conveyance of Members of the Williamstown Racing Club between Melbourne and Williamstown at race meetings, £40 per annum ; and for conveyance of Members of the Victorian Club and Melbourne Hunt Club between Melbourne and Flemington or Melbourne and Caulfield at race meetings, £25 each per annum. *These amounts are for conveyance of male members only, and ladies must pay ordinary fares.*

2. The Guarantee for Race, Agricultural Show, Football, and similar Special Trains to be 10s. per mile—minimum, £5—with 2s. 6d. per mile added for all light running required.

3. Fresh Flowers, in baskets, to be charged half Parcels Rates between Melbourne and Sydney.

CHARGES ON GOODS ARE FIXED AS FOLLOWS :—

4. Metal Screenings, tarred and untarred, and tarred Coke Screenings, to be charged 1d. per ton per mile—minimum, 2s.—in truck loads.

5. Rabbits, dead, to be charged Special B Rates, with First Class minimums.

6. Scrap Iron from Melbourne to the Town of Williamstown to be charged Firewood Rates.

7. Wool from Williamstown to Port Melbourne, or *vice versa*, to be charged 9d. per bale.

8. Wire Netting from Melbourne to Albury to be charged under Special A Rates and Conditions.

9. Butter Boxes, Fruit Cases, and Fish Baskets, new, to be charged the same rates as Returned Empties.

13. The Rates for all Goods in Special A and B, Miscellaneous, First, Second, Third, and Fourth Classes (Agricultural Produce and Sugar excepted), from Serviceton to Stawell, or any intermediate station, are hereby increased by 50 per cent.

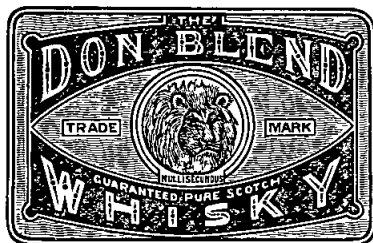

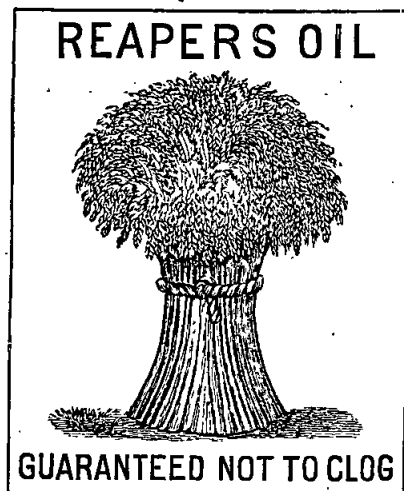

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

THE subjoined Rules of the Supreme Court having been duly laid before Parliament are now published pursuant to Law.

REGULÆ GENERALES.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the Rules of Court dated the 15th day of October, 1887, and the 14th day of December, 1887, and to substitute others instead thereof, it is ordered as follows:—

Repeal of Rules.—The said Rules of Court, and all rules for the admission of barristers and attorneys, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

RULES FOR THE ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS.

PART I.—BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

1. *Constitution of the Board.*—There shall be a Board of Examiners in the Court which shall be called the Board of Examiners for Barristers and Solicitors, and shall consist of Her Majesty's Attorney-General, and Her Majesty's Solicitor-General or Minister of Justice in Victoria, and six practising barristers and solicitors in the Court, who shall be appointed by the Judges of the Court in December of each year to act during the ensuing year: Provided that, in the event of any vacancy, it shall be competent for the Judges of the Court to fill up such vacancy.

2. *Meetings and Quorum of the Board.*—The Board shall meet as occasion may require, and may adjourn its meetings if deemed necessary; three shall form a quorum for the transaction of business, and the majority of members present shall decide all questions which may arise, and in case of an equality of votes at any such meeting or adjournment, the chairman shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

PART II.—ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS TO PRACTISE IN THE SAID COURT.

3. *Preliminary Examination.*—Every person, except as hereinafter provided, must, before he enter into articles of clerkship in Victoria, produce to the Secretary of the Board a certificate of having passed at a matriculation examination in the University of Melbourne in six at least of the subjects fixed for the time being by statutes and regulations of the said University for the matriculation examination, or of having obtained honours in one and of having passed in four others, or of having obtained honours in two and of having passed in two other of such subjects, of which subjects in each of the above cases Latin must be one, and must lodge with the said secretary a copy of such certificate. Provided that if any such person shall produce to the said secretary a certificate of his having passed at a matriculation examination or of his having graduated in the University of Melbourne or in any university recognised by the University of Melbourne, or of his having passed the preliminary examination which clerks article in England, Scotland, or Ireland may be required to pass, and lodge with the secretary a copy thereof, he shall then be qualified to enter into articles of clerkship.

4. *Applicants not previously admitted.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor, not previously admitted as hereinafter provided, must be a natural-born or naturalized British subject, of the full age of 21 years, of good fame and character:—

- (1) And shall have passed the examination hereinbefore mentioned;
- (2) And shall have passed the final examination hereinafter mentioned.

5. *Certificates required.*—Every such person shall six clear days before he proposes to be examined cause to be delivered to the Secretary of the Board certificates in the form or to the effect of those in the schedules marked "A" and "B."

6. *Final Examination.*—Every such person must, not earlier than six months before the expiration of his articles of clerkship and before he apply for admission to practise in the Court, also submit to be examined by the Board, and must pass in six at least of the following branches of the law:—

- (1) Real Property and Conveyancing;
- (2) The Law of Contracts and Torts;
- (3) Equity, Divorce, and Probate;
- (4) Insolvency;
- (5) Criminal Law;
- (6) Practice of the Supreme Court in its civil jurisdiction;
- (7) Practice of the County Court and before Justices;
- (8) Constitutional Law and Legal History.

The following shall be the text-books in the subjects above specified and the special statute law in connexion therewith which shall be subjects for examination :—

- (1) Joshua Williams on Real Property, 16th edition, except chapters 2, 4, and 5 of Part I. and Part III.;
The *Real Property Act* 1890, sections 108, 109, 125, 169 to 173 inclusive, 181, 189, 197, 198, and 200;
The *Transfer of Land Act* 1890, Parts I. to VII. inclusive;
The *Wills Act* 1890;
- (2) Broom's Commentaries, 8th edition, Books II. and III.;
The *Wrongs Act* 1890;
The *Instruments Act* 1890, Parts VI., VII., VIII., and sections 228, 229, and 230;
- (3) Smith's Manual of Equity, 14th edition;
The *Marriage Act* 1890, Parts VII. to XI. inclusive, and the Rules thereunder;
The *Administration and Probate Act* 1890 (except Part IV.) and the Rules thereunder;
- (4) The *Insolvency Act* 1890 and the Rules thereunder;
- (5) Broom's Commentaries, 8th edition, Book IV. except chapter 4;
- (6) The *Supreme Court Act* 1890 and the Rules thereunder;
The *Instruments Act* 1890, sections 91 to 98 inclusive;
- (7) The *County Court Act* 1890 and the Rules thereunder;
The *Justices Act* 1890, Parts IV., V., and VI.;
- (8) Hearn's Government of England, 2nd edition.

The Board may from time to time, with the approval of the Judges, add to or alter the text-books or statute law prescribed for examination: Provided that no such addition or alteration shall come into force until the expiration of one year after a notice thereof has been posted in the Supreme Court Library and in the office of the Prothonotary.

7. *Re-examination.*—Every person who having failed to pass desires to be re-examined, shall, six clear days before he proposes to be re-examined, give to the Secretary of the Board a certificate in the form in the schedule hereto marked "B."

8. *Final Examinations.*—The Board shall hold four final examinations in each year, and three at least of the members of the Board shall be the examiners at each examination.

9. *Certificate of Final Examination.*—The examiners conducting any final examination shall sign for every successful candidate a certificate, in the form in the schedule marked "C," of his having passed such examination.

10. *Notices and Advertisements.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor in the Court, shall, before the sittings next preceding that in which he proposes to be admitted, give, in person, to the Secretary of the Board in the form or to the effect set out in the schedule hereto marked "D," written notice of his intention to apply to be so admitted, and shall at the same time post a copy of the said notice in the office of the Prothonotary, and shall also after the posting of the notice, and not earlier than twenty nor less than ten clear days before the first day of the sittings in which he shall so apply, cause the said notice to be advertised three several times in two newspapers published in Melbourne, and shall in person make application to the Board for a certificate.

11. *All Notices to be Posted.*—The Secretary of the Board shall reduce all notices into alphabetical lists, under convenient heads, and shall, on or before the first day of the sittings, affix such list in some conspicuous place in the library of the Supreme Court, and such list shall remain so affixed until the commencement of the next sittings.

12. *Affidavit of Applicant not previously admitted.*—Every person not previously admitted shall, ten clear days before the first day of the sittings in which he applies for admission to practise in the Court, make and file with the Prothonotary an affidavit in the form of the schedule marked "F" to these rules annexed.

13. *Affidavit of Applicant previously admitted.*—Every person previously admitted elsewhere shall, ten clear days before the first day of the sittings in which he applies for admission to practise in the Court, make and file with the Prothonotary an affidavit in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule hereto marked "G."

14. *Board to meet before Sittings.*—The Board shall meet seven clear days before the first day of the sittings for the purpose of considering the application of every person desirous of being admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor in the Court; and if it shall appear to the Board that such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted, and has complied with the statute law and the regulations herein contained, they shall give him a certificate in the form in the schedule hereto marked "H."

15. *Appeal to the Judges.*—Any person dissatisfied with the decision of the Board shall be at liberty to appeal against such decision to the Judges of the Court, and such appeal shall be heard by three or more of the Judges, at such times as they shall appoint, and upon the hearing thereof they may dismiss or allow such appeal, or make such other order as to them may seem fit.

16. *Form of Appeal.*—Every such appeal shall be in, or to the effect of, the form in the schedule hereto marked "I," and the appellant shall deliver a copy thereof to each of the Judges and to the Secretary of the Board.

17. *Admission.*—No person shall be admitted to practise as a barrister and solicitor except upon his appearing in person in Court, and upon reading the proper certificate or the order of the Judges, and no motion, except by leave of the Court, shall be made for any such admission on any other but the first day of the sittings.

18. *Articles of Clerkship.*—Articles of clerkship, together with affidavits of the due execution thereof, shall be filed in the office of the Prothonotary within six months after the execution, and affidavits of service under articles shall be filed after the expiration of the term of service and ten clear days before the first day of the sittings in which application for admission shall be made. And in all matters relating to articles of clerkship and service thereunder, except where it is otherwise provided, the practice established in England shall be followed.

19. *Cause may be shown against admission.*—Any person may show cause to the Board, the Judges, or the Court against the admission of any applicant.

20. *Fees.*—The following fees shall be paid by persons desirous of being admitted to practise in the Court as barristers and solicitors :—

For every person lodging with the secretary the copy certificate mentioned in Rule 3 ...	2 guineas.
For every examination and re-examination	5 „
For certificate of final examination	1 „
For every person previous to issue of certificate or order for admission	50 „

21. *Rules not to apply to Students-at-Law, Clerks previously Articled, &c.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained, except Rules 6, 8, 9, 10, 11, 17, and 20, shall affect any person who was on the 1st day of January, 1892, a student-at-law, an articulated clerk, or serving as a Judge's associate, but every such person may, except as aforesaid, be admitted as if these rules had not been promulgated; and the Board of Examiners established by these rules and the secretary shall have the like powers and perform the like duties in regard to any such person as would have been had and performed by the Board and Secretary under the said rules if the same had not been repealed.

22. In case of non-compliance within the specified time with any rule now or hereafter to be in force for the admission of barristers and solicitors, the Court shall have power upon application made to it for that purpose, to enlarge or abridge the time appointed by any such rule for doing any act or taking any proceeding, and may substitute for any time appointed for doing any act or taking any proceeding any other time, upon such terms as the Court may think fit, and any such enlargement, abridgement, or substitution may be ordered although the application for the same is not made until after the expiration of the time appointed.

PART III.

23. *Payment of Fees.*—All fees received by virtue of the foregoing rules shall be paid to the Secretary of the said Board; and in any case in which any applicant be not admitted to practise in the said Supreme Court, the fee required to be paid by him, on his admission to practise, shall be returned to him at his request, on his giving up any certificates he may have received under these rules.

24. *Fees received to be lodged in Bank to the credit of the Chief Justice.*—All such fees received by the said secretary shall be by him lodged in the bank to the credit of the Chief Justice of the said Court on account of the "Supreme Court Library Fund," and entries of such receipts, lodgments, and of all disbursements, shall be duly made in a book to be called the "Supreme Court Library Fee Book," to be kept by such secretary.

25. *Application of Fees.*—All such fees shall be applied to the purchase and maintenance of a library for the use of the Supreme Court, and to such other purposes as a majority of the Judges at the request of the Library Committee shall from time to time direct, and for payment as follows :—

To the Board of Examiners for every final examination, 25 guineas.
And to the secretary as the Library Committee may direct.

26. *Account of Fees to be published in Court on the first day of the Sittings.*—The secretary or, in his absence, such other person as the Chief Justice may direct, shall, on the first day of each sittings, present an account of all fees received by such secretary since the first day of the preceding sittings, and the mode of disbursement of the same or any part thereof, and the amount remaining undisposed of, if any.

27. *Library Committee.*—The Library Committee shall consist of the Judges of the said Court and the Board of Examiners, who shall have power to make rules and regulations for the management and good government of the library; and the profession shall have free access to such library, subject, nevertheless, to the rules to be made in that behalf.

28. *Secretary to the Board.*—Such person as the Judges may from time to time appoint shall be and act as Secretary to the said Board, and shall perform such duties as these rules and the said Board may require.

29. *Boards, &c., to continue in Office.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Board of Examiners for Barristers, the Board of Examiners for Attorneys, and the Secretary to the said Boards in existence at the coming into force of these rules shall respectively be and act as the Board and Secretary under these rules until the 1st day of January, A.D. 1893.

30. *Interpretation.*—The word "sittings" in these rules shall mean a sittings of the Full Court, and the word "Court" in Rules 17, 19, and 22 shall mean the Full Court.

31. These rules, with the exception of Rule 20, shall come into force on the 31st day of December, A.D. 1892, and until the said Rule 20 comes into force by operation of law the Rules of Court bearing date the 15th day of October, A.D. 1887, shall, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, continue in force so far as regards the fees required by the said rules to be paid.

The births of 1,386 children, viz., 715 boys and 671 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of November. In the month of October, 1,373 births were registered, or 13 less than in the month under review. The births were 289 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 15 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in November numbered 543, viz., 309 of males and 234 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 843, or 155 per cent. The deaths exceeded those in October by 31, but were below the average of November during the previous ten years by 114. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by as many as 296.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.82, and of deaths registered 1.10.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 90.8° on the 19th, and he lowest was 45.0° on the 3rd. The mean temperature of the month (61.8°) was 1.2° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (33.7°) took place on the 28th, and the least range (6.0°) on the 1st. The mean daily range was 9.1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.142 inches on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.936 inches on the 8th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.840 inches) was nearly a tenth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 11 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.74 inches. The average rainfall in November during the previous ten years was 3.18 inches, or nearly half-an-inch more than in the month under notice.

Males contributed 57 per cent., and females 43 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 36 per cent. to that mortality, as against 40 per cent. in November, 1891; 35 per cent. in November, 1890; 55 per cent. in November, 1889; 47 per cent. in November, 1888; 41 per cent. in November, 1887; and 54 per cent. in November, 1886.

Forty-three deaths of persons who had attained or exceeded the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, an engineer, aged 75, died of paralysis; a master mariner, aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of apoplexy; a painter, aged 76, of rheumatism; two females, each aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of enteric obstruction; a mariner, aged 76, of cirrhosis of the liver; a female, aged 76, of hernia; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; a plasterer, aged 77, of congestion of the liver; a female, of unknown occupation, aged 78, of cancer; a female, aged 78, of gastritis; a gentleman, aged 78, of cystitis; a farmer, aged 79, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 79, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 79, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 79, of cancer; a female, aged 80, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 80, of bronchitis; a sailor, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a bootmaker, aged 81, of hernia; a clergyman, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a drover, aged 84, of cancer; an engineer, aged 84, of apoplexy; a gentleman, aged 84, of intestinal obstruction; a female, aged 86, of heart disease; a female, aged 87, of constipation; a farmer, aged 87, of fracture of the thigh, how caused not stated; a farmer, aged 88, of pneumonia; a female, aged 88, of softening of the brain; a wheelwright, aged 93, of cardiac dropsy; a shipwright, aged 75, a blacksmith, aged 76, a female, aged 77, a gentleman, aged 79, a messenger and a female, each aged 80, a gentleman, aged 81, a female, aged 85, and a gentleman, aged 87, of old age.

Thirty-two deaths were ascribed to violence during the month, of which 22 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 8 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 9, was killed by a kick from a horse; a quarryman, aged 50, by a stone whilst blasting; a boy, aged 6, by some blocks falling on him; a stonemason, aged 56, by a chain breaking; a male child, aged 1 month, and a boy, aged 7, died of injuries to the head; a farmer, aged 87, of fracture of the thigh; and an auctioneer, aged 40, of fracture of the leg, how caused not stated; a boy, aged 10, of traumatic tetanus; a female infant, aged 1, of injuries consequent on burns; a salesman, aged 34, and a female, aged 6, were found drowned in the River Yarra; an apprentice, a lighterman, and a draper, aged 16, 33, and 42 respectively, in Hobson's Bay; 3 new-born female infants, a male infant, aged 12 hours, and two female infants, aged 1 and 4 months respectively, were overlain; a new-born female infant died of injury to the respiratory system during birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male and a new-born female infant, who were suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of an architect, aged 21, who shot himself; a greengrocer and a ganger, aged 52 and 59 respectively, who cut their throats; a signalman, aged 38, who poisoned himself; and a female, aged 35, a gardener, aged 37, a miner, aged 55, and a bricklayer, aged 57, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and ten deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 53 in the Melbourne Hospital, 10 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the Homœopathic Hospital, 8 in the Children's Hospital, 5 in the Women's Hospital, 7 in the Immigrants' Home, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 1 in the Blind Asylum, 1 in the Infant Asylum, and 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 197, of which 103, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 94, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 155 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 13 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 346. Of these, 206, or 60 per cent., were males, and 140, or 40 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 21 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 10 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 34 were between sixty and sixty-five, 27 were between sixty-five and seventy, 19 were between seventy and seventy-five, 24 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 19 were upwards of eighty.

The approach of summer is marked by an increase in the deaths from diarrhoeal diseases, the number being 33, as against 8 in October and only 1 in September. VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR EXCURSIONS.

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from the 19th December, 1892, till the 3rd January, 1893 (both dates inclusive, Sundays excepted), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 3rd January will be available till the 3rd February. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the date the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. (See exception as under.) During the same period tickets will also be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 82 Swanston-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Bendigo (J. Hemming), to Melbourne only. On 23rd and 24th December, 1892, a temporary office for the issue of tickets to the principal stations will also be open in the corridor of the General Post Office. On tickets issued at Spencer-street and Prince's-bridge stations, and at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 82 Swanston-street, City, bearing dates from the 19th till the 26th December, 1892, inclusive, and from the 27th December, 1892, till the 3rd January, 1893, inclusive, the journey can be commenced on any day during the respective period, and the tickets will be available for return till 26th January or 3rd February, 1893, inclusive (as the case may be).

Sydney Excursion tickets.—From the 19th till the 31st December, 1892 (both dates inclusive), excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £5 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line. Passengers can, however, travel by the express train on the New South Wales line on payment of 15s. first class, and 10s. second class. The journey cannot be broken on the New South Wales line.

And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf enabling, has taken possession of the works of the said Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, and is desirous, in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, of making a rate for the payment of such interest and the expenses incidental to the maintenance of the said works, and the collection of the rates, and the formation of a sinking fund, in such manner as the Governor in Council directs: And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the eighteenth day of December, 1883, certain portions of the said Waterworks Trust District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the eighteenth day of November, 1890, made under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, the Waterworks District of the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, exclusive of the lands comprising the aforesaid Urban Districts of Kerang and Castle Donnington, was divided into four divisions, numbered I., II., III., and IV., respectively, and the boundaries of each division were in and by such Order in Council limited and defined. And it was further directed in and by the aforesaid Order in Council of the eighteenth day of November, 1890, that the rates necessary for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust, and for the maintenance of the waterworks of the said Trust, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, should be levied in Divisions I., II., and III. A Regulation of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, made under the Water Act 1890, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the waterworks district of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Winchelsea in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1893: Provided that the sum of Ten shillings shall be the minimum amount of rates to be paid annually by every owner or occupier of any such lands or tenements.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments of Ninepence each, and the first portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1893, and the second portion or instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1893.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Shire of Winchelsea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

**TRAGOWEL PLAINS IRRIGATION AND WATER
SUPPLY TRUST.**

REGULATION No. 8.

THE Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

That clauses 7 and 8 of Regulation No. 4 be and the same are hereby repealed, and the following adopted in lieu thereof:—

7. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be Sixpence per inch per acre for all land, including gardens, except as hereinafter provided, payment in all cases to be made in advance.

8. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the committee of the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with a less quantity of water than is equal to the value of Twelve shillings and sixpence, excepting in the cases of gardens under the area of one acre in extent, which may be dealt with by the Trust on their merits, and such arrangement made from time to time as may be deemed expedient, and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays as well as on ordinary working days.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 3rd day of November, 1892.

No. 4.

A Regulation of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, made under the Water Act 1890, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the waterworks district of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the Shire of Lancefield in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1893.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two portions or instalments, and the first portion or instalment of Ninepence shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1893, and the second portion or instalment of Ninepence shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of July, 1893.

The minimum rate to be paid for the year 1893 where water is supplied shall be Twenty shillings.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

BY-LAW 3.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such Commissioners by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), make the following Regulations for the due administration and the carrying out of the powers conferred on the said Commissioners respecting the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Commissioners, and such rates shall be payable in two moieties, one on the first day of January and the other on the first day of July in each and every year:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual value of £20 and under, the annual minimum sum of £1 sterling; except for unoccupied lands where no water is laid on, and on these the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of valuation.

2. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £20 and not exceeding £300, the annual sum of £5 per centum on the amount of valuation.

3. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £300 and not exceeding £500, the annual sum of £4 10s. per centum on the amount of valuation.

4. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £500, the annual sum of £4 per centum on the amount of valuation.

5. Warehouses and wholesale stores not being dwellings or used in retail business, the annual sum of £3 10s. per centum on the amount of valuation.

6. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables, or for manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or fountains, fish ponds, or for any ornamental or other purpose not provided for in this by-law.

7. The Commissioners may by notice intimate to the owner or occupier of any premises within the Water Supply District using water for domestic and other than domestic purposes that the water supplied is to be charged for by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a suitable meter for measuring the supply within seven days after the date of such notice, and thereupon such owner or occupier shall within the time specified, at his own expense, provide such a meter.

8. Water supplied by measure to be used in private dwellings or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per thousand gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Commissioners would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

9. For water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, unless otherwise specified, One shilling per thousand gallons.

10. For water supplied to mining companies, manufacturers, and others, for steam boiler purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons. And the minimum quantity to be charged for water supply to any such boiler shall be ten thousand gallons per month.

11. For water supplied to be used in crushing, puddling, slaicing, or washing auriferous stone or earth, Threepence per thousand gallons.

12. Where water is supplied for domestic use and in addition is used to supply boilers for steam-engines under 10 horse-power, the charge shall be by special agreement or at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum, in addition to the charge for domestic use (except in cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power).

13. For water supplied to charitable institutions for garden or irrigation purposes, Sixpence per thousand gallons.

14. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Sixpence per thousand gallons.

15. For water supplied to gardens and nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per thousand gallons.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per thousand gallons or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied for private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

18. For water supplied to troughs in streets, Ten shillings each per annum, in addition to the charge for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

19. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time), Threepence per thousand gallons, so long as the water in the Gong Gong and Kirk's Reservoir is overflowing, and Sixpence per thousand gallons when such overflow has ceased, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

20. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Five shillings (5s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

21. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where it is supplied by measure for domestic use, the watering or irrigation of private gardens, or for any other purpose whatsoever, shall be the quantity for which the return would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable upon the premises so supplied if supplied under the rating or otherwise than by measure.

22. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

23. Where water is supplied for domestic use, except when paid for by meter or under special agreement, the supply shall be through a separate service-pipe from the main pipe to each tenement, unless otherwise agreed upon, of the following diameter according to the assessed annual value of the premises supplied, as follows:—

(1) For premises assessed at or under £30, (½) half-inch pipes.

(2) For premises assessed at more than £30 per annum, (¾) three-quarter inch pipe.

(3) No service of a larger bore than (¾) three-quarter inch will be permitted, unless by special consent of the Commissioners.

24. No house shall have any connexion with the pipes or fittings of any other premises, whether on the same or separate allotments.

25. That portion of every service-pipe or fitting between the stop-tap on the main pipe and the street boundary or building line shall be laid and repaired by the Commissioners, at the expense of the consumer, owner, or occupier; and in every case in which the main shall not be in the centre of the street, the charges to be paid shall be equal in all ordinary cases, the longer and shorter service-pipes being each charged for at the rate of half their combined values.

26. Should any person allow any service-pipe or pipes, stop-cock, or other fittings conveying water from the main pipes of the Commissioners into or upon the premises of such person to remain defective or in want of repair after having received notice from any officer of the Commissioners that such service-pipe, stop-cock, or fittings required repairing, the Commissioners may stop the water flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

27. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier or the owner shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and to pay to the Commissioners all or any reasonable costs and charges incurred by or necessary to be incurred by the Commissioners in repairing or renewing any such service-pipes in streets within the Ballarat Water Supply District; and all such costs and charges shall be recoverable by process of law.

28. Any person supplied with water for domestic or other purposes by the Commissioners who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds and to the supply being discontinued.

29. Every person who shall have agreed with the Commissioners for a supply of water by measure, or who shall be called upon by the Commissioners to affix a water meter, shall at his own expense provide such meter, and keep and maintain the same in good working order and condition, to the satisfaction of any officer or agent of the Commissioners, and in the event of any repairs being required, notice in writing shall be immediately given to the Commissioners, and the registration on the dial of the meter of the quantity of water supposed to have been used, shall be taken before such meter is removed or such repairs are effected, and every person requiring to remove or alter the position of any meter shall give twelve hours' notice at the least to that effect to the Commissioners.

30. If any meter should cease registering, and during the time it is undergoing repairs, the Commissioners may estimate and charge for the water consumed, by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous month or quarter, or during the corresponding period of the preceding year.

31. Any person connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

32. No meter shall be affixed unless it is first approved of by an officer of the Commissioners, and the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

33. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main pipe, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that no more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

34. Any person receiving water from the Commissioners who shall take and carry away such water from his premises to any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Commissioners, or who shall allow any person to take and carry away the same, or who shall sell the water supplied by the Commissioners to any other person, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five pounds.

35. Any person not having agreed with the Commissioners for a supply, taking or carrying water away from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five pounds.

36. If any person supplied with water by the Commissioners wilfully or negligently causes or suffers any pipe, valve, cock, cistern, bath, soil-pipe, water closet, and other apparatus or receptacle to be out of repair, or to be so used or constructed as that the water supplied to such person by the Commissioners is or is likely to be contaminated, wasted, misused, unduly consumed for irrigation, the watering of gardens, or otherwise howsoever, or so as to occasion or allow the return of foul air or other noxious or impure matter into any pipe belonging to or connected with the pipes of the Commissioners, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Five pounds.

37. The officers of the Commissioners may enter any house, building, or lands to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Commissioners by measure or otherwise, in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for the measuring,

conveyance, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, and to inspect and examine if there be any waste or misuse of such water, and may from time to time enter any house, building, or lands for the purpose of removing any meter, instrument, pipe, or apparatus the property of the Commissioners; and if any person hinders any such officer from entering or making such inspection or effecting such removal, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and the Commissioners may cut off the supply of water to such house or premises; but without the consent of a Justice of the Peace this power of entry shall be exercised only between the hours of sunrise and sunset of any day of twenty-four hours.

38. The water supplied in the above-named district shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations and not otherwise, and if any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the Regulations aforesaid, or shall do or cause anything to be done in contravention of any of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and the Commissioners may cut off the supply from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Commissioners.

39. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "officer" shall be deemed and be taken to mean an officer or servant of the Commissioners duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Commissioners" shall be deemed to mean "The Ballarat Water Commissioners."

40. Upon the coming in force of the By-law, all by-laws heretofore made relating to the rates and charges and regulations relating to the supply of water within the Ballarat Water Supply District shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates and charges due and payable thereunder.

BY-LAW 4.

THE Ballarat Water Commissioners doth hereby, pursuant to and in the execution of the powers and authorities conferred upon such Commissioners by the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), make the following Regulations for the due administration and the carrying out of the powers conferred on the said Commissioners respecting the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

1. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe, or alter, repair, or in any measure interfere with any pipe of the Commissioners, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Commissioners, he shall obtain from the Commissioners a licence or authority in that behalf to execute such work.

2. No person shall be authorized or allowed to lay private service-pipes, and attach the same to any pipe belonging to the Commissioners or to any private service-pipe already connected with the pipes laid by the Commissioners, unless he can satisfy the Commissioners or their officer that he is competent to execute such work.

3. No private service whatsoever to be laid or extension made by any authorized person, unless he has ascertained at the office of the Commissioners that the person for whom such work is intended has duly signed the required form of application to the Commissioners, and has received the consent of the Commissioners to execute such work.

4. No person shall under any pretext whatsoever interfere with the water mains, pipes, or fittings belonging to the Commissioners, or lay or repair service-pipes within the boundaries of the streets or roads within the Ballarat Water Supply District, as the Commissioners' workmen only are empowered to execute such work.

5. Every authorization granted by the Commissioners shall apply and refer only to the individual to whom it has been granted; and such person shall not be entitled by virtue of his authorization to employ or allow any journeyman or other person to perform plumber's work on his behalf in connexion with the supply of water unless the said journeyman or other person is himself duly qualified.

6. No private service shall be laid or extension made from one tenement to another by any authorized plumber, unless the owner or occupier of the premises to which the service is to be laid produces for his inspection a written order or permission from the Commissioners to execute such work.

7. Before any private service is laid, extension made, or meter affixed and attached to the service-pipe laid by the Commissioners, or otherwise to service-pipes already connected, each authorized person shall give 24 hours' notice of same, and shall after each service or extension, &c., has been completed report on the prescribed form the nature of the work done, and lodge the same at the office of the Commissioners within 24 hours of such service or extension, &c., being completed as aforesaid.

8. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Commissioners for each service-pipe being laid and completed by him in a sound, workmanlike, and durable manner, and to remain in that condition (sound and watertight) for a period of three (3) months after each service has been completed.

9. Each authorized person shall be held solely responsible to the Commissioners for any injury occasioned by him or under his authority, from whatsoever cause, to the service-pipes laid by the Commissioners, their street mains, or other property, whilst attaching services to the pipes laid by the Commissioners, or to services already laid and connected with the Commissioners' water supply, and any loss of water sustained by the Commissioners through such injury, or its ascertained value, together with the cost of all and every repairs necessitated thereby shall be refunded by such person to the Commissioners within twenty-four (24) hours after the time of such injury having occurred.

10. Every person previous to being licensed or authorized to lay private services shall read the specifications in the office of the Commissioners and shall sign in witness thereof his name and address, and at the same time deposit the sum of Five pounds (£5) sterling as security for the strict observance and performance of the stipulations and conditions contained therein, and in case of the non-observance or non-performance of any of the stipulations and conditions aforesaid, the Commissioners may cancel such licence or authority, and shall be entitled to declare such deposit to be absolutely forfeited as liquidated damages, and the name of such person may at once be struck off the roll of those authorized to lay private services, and the same may be published in any local paper.

11. Providing that the period of maintenance of private services laid has duly expired, deposits may be withdrawn at any time upon seven (7) days' notice in writing to that effect being given previously to the secretary of the Commissioners, when the name or names of such parties withdrawing their deposits may be published as before described in a local paper; and the Commissioners reserve the right on their part to alter, cancel, and annul the term and nature of any licence or authority to lay such services at any time.

12. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Commissioners, without giving at least twelve hours' notice, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Commissioners, without the permission of the Commissioners in writing being first obtained, or shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Commissioners.

13. No person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commissioners or service-pipes therefrom, except according to the specification approved of by the Commissioners, and if necessary subject to and under the superintendence and according to the directions of the engineer or of some officers of the Commissioners, nor shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Commissioners of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Commissioners.

Quality of Materials required in laying private services, viz.—
14. The whole of the pipes, tees, thimbles, bends, reducing-couplings, &c., to be of the best galvanized wrought iron.

15. All pipes and pieces to be true in sectional form, straight longitudinally, and of equal strength and thickness throughout the entire body of same.

16. All ends of pipes, bends, &c., to be properly and truly threaded, and capable of being screwed into thimbles, tees, &c.

17. The whole of the tubes, tees, bends, or other fittings to be perfectly new, sound, and free from all defects, and capable of standing hydrostatic pressure equal to a column of water of 400 feet.

18. All delivery cocks to be high pressure, and made of brass of the best quality and workmanship and of approved pattern, to screw into elbows or bends, &c. All cocks to stand the same pressure as the tubes.

19. All meters required to be fixed on private ground to be of a pattern approved by the Commissioners, and no meter to be provided and fixed by any person unless previously approved by the engineer or his representative.

20. No service-pipes on private ground shall be laid at a less depth below the surface of the ground than ten (10) inches.

21. All jointing between tubes, bends, couplings, elbows, and cocks to be made with red lead and flax only, and other jointing to be made in an approved manner.

22. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the regulations under this By-law, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

23. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation or company, whether aggregate or sole; the word "engineer" or his representative shall be deemed and be taken to mean the engineer or an officer or servant of the Commissioners duly authorized in that behalf; and the word "Commissioners" shall be deemed to mean "The Ballarat Water Commissioners."

24. Upon the coming into force of this By-law all by-laws heretofore made relating to matters herein affecting the water supply within the Ballarat Water Supply District shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed thereunder.

The foregoing Regulations were made and passed by the Ballarat Water Commissioners on the 2nd day of December, 1892, to take effect from the 1st day of January, 1893, as witness the common seal of the said Commissioners affixed hereto in the presence of—

Such rate is hereby made payable on the 2nd day of January, 1893.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

REGULATION No. 9.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1893 on all rateable property within the Urban District of Wycheproof.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Wycheproof, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1893, commencing on the 1st of January, 1893, and terminating on the 31st of December, 1893, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 2nd of January and the other on the 1st of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the St. Arnaud Shire Waterworks Trust on the 30th day of November, 1892.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1893.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds sterling annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

3. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and, where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, One pound per annum on each inch diameter of the cylinder.

5. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon); and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1893, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1893, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1893, and the 1st day of July, 1893.

REGULATION FOR 1893.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 16.

1. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah as such district is proclaimed and defined in a certain Order in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890.

2. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said Urban District shall pay in respect of the year 1893 in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

3. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twelve pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Twelve pounds, a rate of One shilling and eight pence in the pound sterling on the amount of the municipal valuation for the time being, provided that no owner or occupier shall be rated in respect of more than one vacant allotment.

4. Such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1893, and the 1st day of July, 1893.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION No. 3.

THE Commissioners of the Healesville Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks District of the Healesville Waterworks Trust shall pay for the year 1893 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rates to be payable half-yearly in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in such year:—

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement during the said year, the sum of One shilling in the pound of such valuation.

(3) The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied township or subdivisional allotments shall be Sixpence in the pound of the municipal valuation of such vacant allotment during the said year, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Ten shillings be made.

2. The following shall be the charges payable in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Ninepence for every one thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where so supplied shall be twenty thousand gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at Ninepence per thousand gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For stand-pipe or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, Sixpence.

(3) For a temporary supply, during the erection of new buildings, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the event of there not being any contract, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for the stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

3. All accounts for water supplied under special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly or as may be agreed upon.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE LONGWOOD RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Edward Hill and James Edward Maxfield, a majority of the members of the Committee of Management of the Longwood Race-course and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency thereon, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry, without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall camp in the reserve or erect thereon any dwelling or any both or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeepers or other persons authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.

10. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for fêtes or sports shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every adult	s. d.
For the admission of every saddle horse, exclusive of rider	1 0
For the admission of every carriage, cart or other vehicle drawn by one horse	2 0
For the admission of every additional horse attached to carriage, cart, or other vehicle	0 6

12. The net proceeds of all sports or fêtes, other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

13. No person shall, after the 1st day of December, 1892, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a book-maker except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

(1st) That he be registered annually as a book-maker by the committee of management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Longwood Jockey Club, or by those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of one pound (£1).

(2nd) That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a book-maker he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the committee of management of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Longwood Jockey Club, or those authorized by such committee of management, committee, or stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations, shall in accordance with section 130 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at any station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, clean white (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheat hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled; or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of the delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. It will be competent for the Secretary of the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving, in writing, a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September, 1893, and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon on Tuesday, the 17th day of January, 1893, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails, viz., Letters, Packets, Parcels, and Newspapers, as undermentioned, FOR THREE YEARS, from the 1st July, 1893, to 30th June, 1896.

1. Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and are to be forwarded (if by post, PREPAID AND REGISTERED) for receipt at the General Post Office by the hour and date first above mentioned, addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for Mail Service No. " indorsed on the cover, or placed in the Tender-box at the General Post Office.

2. *Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender.*

3. *The amount of the tender must be stated AT RATE PER ANNUM in words as well as figures.*

4. Every tender must bear the *bonâ fide* signature and address of the tenderer, and bear the names of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the contract in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

5. Every tender must be accompanied by cash, bank cheque, bank draft, or a bank deposit-receipt to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the annual amount named in the tender; this deposit to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government within ten days of being notified that the documents are ready for execution. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

6. The money or other security deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being duly signed.

7. The money or other security deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts.

8. In the event of a new line of railway, or a new railway station on an existing line being opened for traffic, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the Postmaster-General shall have the power of cancelling the contract for any mail service running in the vicinity of the railway without compensation to the contractor, or shall have power to alter the points of arrival and departure of the mails; and, in the event of the travelling distance on any mail line being in such manner increased or diminished, all payments for the service subsequent to the alteration shall be computed on the basis of the average mileage-rate of the contract.

9. In the event of it being found necessary, from any cause, to absolutely cancel a contract, the Postmaster-General shall have full power to do so, provided that, unless the contract be cancelled on account of any fault on the part of the contractor, or on account of the opening of a railway line or a new railway station, payment shall be made to the contractor as compensation of a sum equal to ten per cent. of the moneys which would have become due on the unexpired period of the contract if the latter had been continued for the full term of three years.

10. Tenderers are requested to state the mode by which they propose to convey mails, whether by vehicle, on horseback, or by man on foot. If by vehicle, the description of vehicle and number of horses by which it is to be drawn to be given.

11. Tenderers are informed that the Department undertakes to carry parcels up to 7 lbs. in weight by all services for which tenders are accepted for conveyance of mails by vehicle.

Packets up to 3 lbs. in weight are conveyed by horseback services.

12. Tenderers for services to and from Post Offices and Railway Stations are required to name a lump sum per annum for the number of trips specified in the call for tenders, and also state a rate per trip as a basis of payment for additional trips, or for reduction in the payment, should the number of trips be increased or lessened during the currency of the contract.

A "trip" to mean a journey from the Post Office to the Railway Station, and from the Railway Station to the Post Office, *carrying mails each way.*

The carriage of mails one way, viz., either from a Post Office to a Railway Station or from a Railway Station to a Post Office, shall be regarded as half a trip, and payment made accordingly. Where tenders are invited for a service to and from a Post Office and Railway Station "as often as required," tenderers are required to name a lump sum per annum for the work, and such sum shall not be liable to alteration either through increase or diminution in the number of trips.

13. A separate *bonâ fide* tender must be sent in for each service.

14. The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used, Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

15. The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the establishment of any new Post Office, or the removal of any existing Post Office, during the term of his contract, unless such establishment or removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the extent of one mile.

BY-LAWS OF THE HORSHAM DISTRICT HOSPITAL (INCORPORATED).

1. The By-laws of the Horsham District Hospital (hereinafter referred to as "The Hospital") in force up to the date of the publication of this By-law are hereby repealed save as to all rights accrued, acts done, appointments made, or liabilities incurred thereunder.

MANAGEMENT.

2. There shall be a president, two vice-presidents, and a treasurer of the hospital who shall hold office for one year.

3. There shall be two auditors who shall hold office for one year.

4. The hospital year shall run from the day for the time being fixed for the retirement of one-third of the committee to and inclusive of the next such day. All contributions shall be deemed to have been made for the current hospital year.

5. The committee shall direct the general business of the hospital, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint, suspend, and discharge all paid officers and arrange the terms of the employment of such.

6. The committee shall meet on the 2nd Tuesday in each month at Three p.m. Any three members of the committee may summon a meeting for any time upon giving Twenty-four hours notice of the hour of meeting, and stating in such notice the business for which the meeting is summoned.

7. The medical officer shall have full power to deal with all urgent applications for admission, recording in writing the reasons for treating the case as urgent.

8. No paid officer of the hospital shall be a contractor directly or indirectly, nor shall any member of the committee be present at the discussion of nor vote upon any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

9. The books and accounts of the hospital shall be audited annually by the auditors.

10. The committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the hospital, together with an audited balance-sheet at the annual meeting; such balance-sheet shall be published in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

11. The committee shall appoint a house committee of three of its members, two to form a quorum, who shall attend to the internal management of the hospital, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the medical officers, collector's, dispenser's, and house steward's books, and such other matters as may be delegated to them by the committee of management.

(a) The house committee shall retire quarterly, and its members shall be eligible for re-appointment on the next committee.

(b) It shall meet once in each week or oftener on such days and at such hours as it may appoint, and the honorary medical officers shall be members *ex-officio* of the house committee.

(c) It shall also, once at least in each month, audit the house accounts and check the stores book.

(d) It shall watch the entire expenditure of the hospital, and shall carefully scrutinize the monthly analysis of such expenditure, with due regard to the number of patients in the house, reporting to the committee any matter of importance.

(e) It shall be present (without notice) once in each fortnight at the receipt and distribution of stores, and once in each quarter shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores with the house steward's and dispenser's books.

(f) It shall have the power to employ persons other than the medical officer, secretary, matron, and nurses, for any work in or about the hospital, and to discharge the same.

(g) It shall define the duties of officers and servants, and such duties shall be incorporated in their several agreements.

12. All contracts may be made by the committee.

13. The common seal of the hospital shall be kept by its banker for the time being.

ELECTIONS APPOINTMENTS.

14. The president, vice-president, and treasurer shall be elected at the annual meeting.

15. The auditors shall be appointed at the annual meeting.

16. Members to fill the vacancies of retiring members of the committee shall be elected at the annual meeting.

17. All contested elections or appointments shall be by ballot only.

VOTES.

18. For voting purposes members shall be divided into "members" and "corporations."

(a) Members contributing £1 per annum shall be entitled to 1 vote.

(b) Members contributing £5 per annum shall be entitled to 2 votes.

(c) Members contributing £10 per annum shall be entitled to 3 votes.

(d) Members contributing £20 in one sum as a personal contribution during the current year and thereafter one for life, 3 votes.

19. "Corporations" shall be entitled to the same votes as members, save that the right to vote shall cease with the expiry of the current year notwithstanding the amount of the contribution.

20. Corporations shall be entitled to vote by any member or officer appointed by the corporation under seal, or by resolution, for that purpose.

21. No member shall be entitled to vote while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital.

MEETINGS.

22. There shall be held at the hour of half-past Three p.m. on the day for the time being appointed for the retirement of the committee "The Annual Meeting" of the members.

23. At all meetings of members ten shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not present within half-an-hour of the hour of meeting, or if there shall cease to be a quorum, the meeting shall be adjourned by the president, vice-presidents, chairman, or treasurer, or in their absence by the secretary, for one week, and at the adjourned meeting any number shall constitute a quorum.

24. Ten or more members may by requisition signed require the secretary to convene a special meeting of the members. Such requisition shall specify the business to be dealt with at the meeting, and none other shall be introduced unless the introducer shall have given three days' notice thereof to the secretary.

25. Notice of special meetings shall be given by the secretary to members seven clear days before the date, and any notice of any business intended to be introduced at a special meeting shall be given by the secretary to members immediately on receipt of such notice.

26. All requisitions and other notices of special business shall be accompanied by a number of copies equal at least to the number of members for the time being.

27. The president, vice-presidents in the order of election, or the treasurer shall take the chair at all meetings except those to be held under section 7 of the Act incorporating the hospital. And in the absence of such officers the meeting shall elect its own chairman, and by ballot on demand of any two members. The chairman shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

28. Minutes shall be kept by the secretary, and in his absence by an acting secretary to be appointed for the time being by the chairman.

29. The minutes, when confirmed and signed by the chairman at a subsequent meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the proceedings of the meeting of which they are a record.

30. At any meeting the chairman may, and at the request of three members shall, appoint a meeting at not less than seven days nor more than fourteen at which the minutes of the then meeting shall be brought up for confirmation, and such meeting shall be a special meeting.

31. The secretary shall, on demand, at any time within five days of any meeting, produce for inspection of any member requiring the same the minutes to be brought up for confirmation.

OFFICERS.

32. There shall be a medical officer who shall be a duly registered medical practitioner.

33. All medical officers shall be duly registered medical practitioners.

34. There shall be a secretary, matron, and nurses at salaries to be fixed for the time being by the committee.

PATIENTS.

35. Members and honorary medical officers shall be entitled to recommend one in-patient and three out-patients annually subject to approval of house committee.

36. Any person wishing to be received in the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted with the sanction of the House Committee, provided there be accommodation and on producing a recommendation signed by a member.

37. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with primary syphilis, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of the medical officer, honorary surgeons, or of the committee of management, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.
