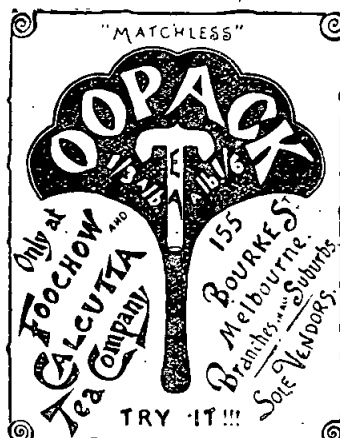

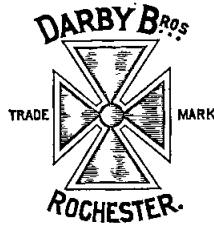

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1200) it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan district or any country district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Board or the Country Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall, for the purposes of the said Act, be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the Country Fire Brigades Board has certified that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this Proclamation declare that so much of the Shire of Wodonga as lies within the boundaries of the township of Wodonga shall be added to and form part of the North-Eastern Fire District.

That for the purposes of such election for the year 1892 the said Yatchaw Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall cause to be prepared as from the 1st day of February, 1892, a voters' list in the form of the first schedule to the aforesaid regulations bearing date the 8th day of January, 1889, and shall revise the same.

3. That the two Commissioners so elected at such election shall hold office until the 3rd day of February, 1895, when they shall be deemed to have held office as such Commissioners for the full period allowed by the said regulations, and shall retire accordingly.

4. That the said regulations, bearing date as aforesaid, in so far as the same are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Order, shall be deemed to be regulations for the election of Commissioners at the annual election for the year 1892.

And the Honorable George Graham, Her Majesty's Minister of Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SHEPPARTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 14.

1. Regulation No. 12, as approved by the Governor in Council on the 16th day of November, 1891, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. This Regulation shall apply to the Urban District of Numurkah, as such district is proclaimed and defined in a certain Order in Council bearing date the 23rd June, 1890.

3. The rates hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said urban district shall pay in respect of the year 1892, in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes.

4. On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings; on every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds ten shillings, according to the municipal valuation for the time being, an amount equal to Ten per centum on the amount of the said municipal valuation, provided that no owner or occupier shall be rated in respect of more than one vacant allotment.

5. Such rates shall be payable in two equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1892, and the 1st day of July, 1892.

6. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Water Trust on the 8th day of January, 1892.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1892.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 12.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds and not exceeding Fourteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of ten per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above Fourteen pounds and not exceeding Nineteen pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, an amount of eight and three-quarters (8 $\frac{3}{4}$) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement of Twenty-six pounds and not exceeding Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds five shillings.

6. For every house or tenement of Thirty-six pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to six and a quarter (6 $\frac{1}{4}$) per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, One pound sterling.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Twenty pounds annual municipal value, an amount of five per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

10. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to five per cent. on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

11. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 8,000 gallons.

12. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an acre, per annum 16,000 gallons; exceeding half an acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 24,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses.

In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

13. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

14. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre.

15. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

16. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

17. For water supplied to syphon pumps Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

18. For water supplied for private fountains Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1892, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

DERGHOLM PUBLIC CEMETERY.—RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR
THE GENERAL MANAGEMENT THEREOF.

- All charges for interment shall be paid when order for interment is given.
- Orders for interments shall be given to the secretary at least twenty-four hours previous to burial.
- The time fixed for the funeral to take place shall be the time at which the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m.
- No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been lodged with the secretary, together with the name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of deceased.
- Every grave shall be 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults shall be interred in each, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra width, two infants being considered equal to an adult.

- Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.
- No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited with the secretary a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and, in case of re-interments or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.
- No fence shall exceed 3ft. 6in. in height, including the coping, and shall be subject to the approval of the trustees previous to erection.
- No servant or person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- No dogs, horses, or carts will be allowed to enter the cemetery without special permission.
- No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery, except as approved by the trustees.
- No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery without the authority of the trustees.
- The certificate of title to allotments to be signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE HEYFIELD COMMON AND THE MAFFRA COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on 4th August, 1890, the Council of the Shire of Maffra having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Heyfield Common and the Maffra Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Commons:-

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers may respectively depasture on the common within a distance of five miles from their places of residence, four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on such common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. No person shall depasture on either of the commons stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner.

3. Sheep and goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may set apart for the purpose.

4. The fees for depasturing stock on the commons shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in every year:-

For every horse, Six shillings (6s.) per annum.
For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings (4s.) per annum.

For every sheep Sixpence (6d.) per annum.

For every goat Four shillings (4s.) per annum.

Calves or foals under eight (8) months old, the progeny of stock legally depasturing on the commons, free.

5. When the fees are paid the managers shall give a receipt in the prescribed form; and the herdsman shall register, in a book to be kept for that purpose, the brands and descriptions of the stock, together with the owner's name and address and the amount of fees paid in each case, and shall brand the stock so registered with the common brand, H or M, as the case may require, in pitch or tar.

6. No pigs shall be permitted to depasture on either of the commons, and no bull or entire horse shall be allowed thereon, without the consent, in writing, of the managers.

7. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for any stock depasturing on the commons, except as provided in clause 8, but the herdsman shall endeavour to see all registered stock on the commons once at least in every seven days, and in the event of any to his knowledge straying he shall give notice, in writing, to the owners thereof within twenty-four (24) hours after missing the stock from the commons.

8. In the event of any stock straying from the commons and being impounded the herdsman shall be responsible to the owners for the impounding expenses and for the safe return of such stock to the commons, provided he fail to comply with the requirements of clause 7.

9. The herdsman shall impound all stock found trespassing on the commons when instructed to do so by the managers, and shall keep correct records of the same, so that the fees arising therefrom may be duly credited to the commons account.

10. All persons desirous of removing stock from either of the commons shall give twenty-four (24) hours' notice of their intention to the herdsman.

11. The managers shall cause all stock affected or supposed to be affected with any contagious disease to be removed from the commons, and the herdsman shall give notice at once to the owners of such stock to arrange for the immediate removal thereof.

12. In the event of any stock dying upon the commons the owners of such stock shall, after twenty-four (24) hours' notice, in writing, from the herdsman, or after the carcasses have been pointed out to the owners by the herdsman, cause all such carcasses to be at once burned or destroyed, failing which the herdsman shall cause the same to be destroyed at the owner's risk and expense.

13. Due notice by advertisement in the local newspapers circulating in the district shall be given of the mustering of stock on the commons every six months, and every owner of stock thereon shall assist or authorize some person to represent him in branding the stock with the commons brand.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE CRESWICK RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Joseph Williams, Robert Falls, David Lyall, and Henry Jebb (a majority of the duly appointed trustees of the Creswick Race-course and Recreation Reserve), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein and thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 186 of the *Land Act 1890*:-

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset except as hereinafter provided.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.

5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission in writing of the trustees; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the trustees.

7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the trustees first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day it may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports, nor bring therein any horse carriage or other vehicle except on production of a ticket issued by the trustees, duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle, but no ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve, and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to the gatekeeper or other person authorized by the trustees to collect the same.

10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports, shall be as follows:—

For the admission of every additional horse attached to carriage, cart, or other vehicle	0	6

12. The net proceeds of all sports or fêtes other than those given for the benefit of the public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

13. No person shall, after the 11th day of February, 1892, carry on the trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, except in and on such portions of the reserve as may be set apart for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

1. That he be registered annually as a bookmaker by the trustees of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Creswick Racing Club, or by those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, on payment of a fee of One pound (£1).

2. That during the time he shall be in or upon the reserve carrying on his trade, business, or calling of a bookmaker, he shall wear a ticket, to be supplied by the trustees of the reserve, or the committee or stewards of the Creswick Racing Club, or those authorized by such trustees, committee, or stewards, which shall be visible to the public, and shall have thereon his name.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the vermin districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square-mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the vermin districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Middle Vermin District shall be Eleven shillings per square mile.
