## EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE ORIENTAL REPUBLIC OF THE URUGUAY.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor and its enclosure are published for general information.

SIR,—With reference to my predecessor's Circular Despatch of the 16th of March, 1885\*, I have the honour to transmit to you, for *The London Gazette*, publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated 27th November, 1891, the 24th of November, 1891, for giving effect to the Protocol between Her Majesty and the President of the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay, concluded at Monte Video on the 20th of March, 1891, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Monte Video on the 17th of July, 1891, for the extension of the period stipulated in Article IX. of the Treaty of 26th March, 1881, for the mutual extradition of Fugitive Criminals.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. EXTRADITION TREATY BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE ORIENTAL REPUBLIC OF THE URUGUAY.  
WINDSOR, 24TH NOVEMBER, 1891.

At the Court at Windsor, the 24th day of November, 1891.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient; and that if, by any law made after the passing of the Act of 1870 by the Legislature of any British possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in such British possession, Her Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Acts in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, suspend the operation within any such British possession of the said Acts, or of any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law continues in force there and no longer:

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the twenty-sixth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, between Her Majesty and the President of the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the fifth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, it was directed that the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should apply in the case of the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay:

And whereas by an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in 1886, and entitled "An Act respecting the Extradition of Fugitive Criminals," provision is made for carrying into effect within the Dominion the surrender of fugitive criminals:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the seventeenth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, it was directed that the operation of the Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, should be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as the provision of the said Act of the Parliament of Canada of 1886 should continue in force and no longer:

And whereas a Protocol was concluded on the twentieth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, between Her Majesty and the President of the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay providing for the extension of the period stipulated in Article IX. of the above-mentioned Treaty of the twenty-sixth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, which Protocol is in the terms following:—

"MONTE VIDEO, the twentieth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, their Excellencies Mr. Ernest Mason Satow, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Her Britannic Majesty's Minister Resident and Consul-General, and Dr. Manuel Herrero y

"EN MONTE VIDEO, a los veinte dias del mes de Marzo del año de 1891, reunidos en el Ministerio de Relaciones Exteriores, suas Excelencias el Señor Don Ernesto Satow, Miembro de la muy Distinguida Orden de San Miguel and San Jorge, Ministro Residente y Cónsul-General de Su Magestad Británica en la

Espinosa, Minister for Foreign Affairs, having met together at the Ministry for Foreign Affairs with the object of providing for the extension of the period stipulated in Article IX. of the Treaty for the Extradition of Criminals in force between their respective countries, for the provisional arrest of persons charged with any of the crimes or offences specified in the said Treaty, and having exchanged their full powers, which were found to be in good and due form, have agreed to the following Declaration, which shall be considered an integral part of the said international compact:—

“The period of thirty days fixed by Article IX. of the Treaty for the Extradition of Criminals in force between the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay and Great Britain, for the provisional arrest of persons charged with any of the crimes or offences specified in the said Treaty, being thoroughly recognised as insufficient, both Governments agree that the said period shall henceforth be fixed at sixty days.

“In witness whereof the said Plenipotentiaries have caused the present Protocol to be drawn up in duplicate, and have signed both copies, and thereto affixed their seals on the date above expressed.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Protocol were exchanged at Monte Video on the seventeenth day of July, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the seventh day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, the said Acts shall apply in the case of the said Protocol of the twentieth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as fully to all intents and purposes as in the case of the said recited Treaty of the twenty-sixth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.

Provided always, and it is hereby further ordered that the operation of the said Extradition Acts, 1870 and 1873, shall be suspended within the Dominion of Canada so far as relates to the Oriental Republic of the Uruguay and to the said Treaty and Protocol, and so long as the provisions of the Canadian Act aforesaid of 1886 continue in force, and no longer.

“Siendo notoriamente insuficiente el término de treinta dias que establece el Artículo IX del Tratado de Extradición de Criminales vigente entre la Gran Bretaña y la República Oriental del Uruguay, para la detención preventiva de las personas perseguidas por alguno de los crímenes ó delitos especificados en el referido Tratado, ambos Gobiernos convienen en que dicho plazo quede desde luego fijado en sesenta dias.

“En fé de lo cual, los Señores Plenipotenciarios hicieron labrar el presente Protocolo por duplicado, cuyos ejemplares firmaron y sellaron con sus sellos en la fecha arriba expresada.

## ASSAULT BY BURGLARS ON CONSTABLE WARREN, AT NORTHCOTE.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD AND FREE PARDON TO AN ACCOMPLICE.

## SHIRE OF TOWONG.

By-Law No. 3, UNDER THE "HEALTH ACT 1890."

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Towong, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, that is to say:—

*Pans for Night-soil.*

The ordinary system of open pans for night-soil shall be abolished.

*Double-pan Service.*

In lieu of such ordinary system of pans, every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be fitted with air-tight lids, and the pans removed for cleansing at least once a week.

*Removal of Night-soil.*

No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the said Council, and any such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied alternately as the said Council shall direct.

*Use of Deodorant.*

Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

*Charges for Removal.*

For the removal of such night-soil every householder or occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the said Council the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for every pan used for a once-a-week service, and for a twice-a-week service the sum of Fifty-five shillings per annum, and such sum or sums shall be paid quarterly in advance respectively, and in default of payment the same to be and become recoverable in any Court of Petty Sessions.

*Extent of Application of By-law.*

This by-law, numbered 3, shall apply to and have operation within the township of Tallangatta, in the Shire of Towong.

*Penalties.*

If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than One pound for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

## MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

By-Law No. 3.—WATER SUPPLY.

*Preamble.*—The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such board by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890* (54 Victoria No. 1197), and by so much of the *Water Act 1890* as is incorporated therewith, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. *Repeal of inconsistent by-laws.*—All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Water Supply (in so far as the same are inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this by-law) shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. *Rates and charges.*—The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board, that is to say:—

1. *Minimum.*—On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.
- ii. *On valuations above minimum.*—On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds inclusive, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds.

III. *Store rate.*—Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds, and One pound per centum on the amount of such valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds.

IV. *Water troughs.*—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the board, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 20,000 gallons per annum. Troughs erected in any public highway, with the consent of the municipal authorities, shall not be deemed to be private troughs.

*Special supplies.*—Water will be supplied as follows:—

V. *To shipping at wharfs and piers.*—To shipping at the Melbourne wharfs, at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons; at special berths there, with fixed meters, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; at other wharfs or places, at the rate of Four shillings per 1,000 gallons, subject to regulation at the will of the board as to quantity and time of supply.

VI. *Mixing concrete.*—For the making and mixing of concrete, and for masonry and brickwork, at the rate of One penny per cubic yard of such materials as measured in the work.

VII. *Building rates.*—For general building purposes at the following charges, viz.:—On the scale of Ninepence in the pound upon the estimated assessable value of the completed building during, from date of commencement, three months in cases where such value does not exceed Fifty pounds; four months where such value exceeds Fifty pounds and does not exceed One hundred pounds; and six months where such value exceeds One hundred pounds. But for wooden buildings the charge shall be one-half of the foregoing rate. After the termination of each such period to date of completion in each case the charge will be at the scale of Sixpence in the pound upon such value. In any cases of water supply for building purposes, the builder may use a meter, and pay for water used at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

*Special rates.*—And for the following purposes at the undermentioned rates, unless in cases where the board shall order that the supply shall be only by meter measurement, in each of which cases the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter and pay for the water according to measurement thereby:—

VIII. *Steam boilers.*—For steam boilers, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each such boiler.

IX. *Gas engines.*—For gas engines, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each engine; or if the supply be from an approved cistern, Five shillings per annum per horse-power.

X. *Hydraulic blasts.*—For plumbers' blasts, Twenty shillings each per annum.

XI. *Horse and cattle rate.*—For horses, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse; and for cows wholly or partially kept upon the premises, Five shillings for each cow, but the owner may, if he so prefer, take the supply by meter.

XII. *Special rate may be fixed in cases not provided for.*—Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the board shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the board before a supply can be taken or used.

XIII. *Allowance of gratuitous supply to public charities.*—Excess to be charged for.—The following terms and conditions shall be those upon which a gratuitous supply of water will be furnished by the board to the public hospitals or charitable institutions mentioned in section 452 of the *Water Act 1890*, that is to say, such supply must be received through a meter, and shall be in the proportion of 11,000 gallons for each bed in such hospital or institution which shall have been occupied by one or more inmates or persons during in all not less than nine out of the preceding twelve months. Any water used in excess of that quantity must be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

XIV. *Meter, rate of charge, and minimum supplies other than domestic.*—Water supplied by the board by meter measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will be for 20,000 gallons per annum.

XV. *Minimum meter charge.*—*Domestic supply.*—The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

3. *Meters to be tested and approved.*—No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the board, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch,  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexion above ground in a conveniently accessible position and properly protected.

4. *Where meter ceases registering, &c., average may be charged.*—If any meter in use cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the board will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

5. *Hire of meters and rate of rent thereof.*—*Meter rent to be exclusive of rate.*—*Hirer to give notice of removal.*—The board will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

For  $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, Twelve shillings and sixpence,  
For  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, Fifteen shillings,  
For  $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch, Twenty shillings,  
For 1-inch, Twenty-five shillings,

which rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter, and the occupier of the premises shall, at his own cost, cause such meter to be fixed and kept in proper repair, and when required on behalf of the board so to do, shall cause such meter to be removed to the office of the board to be tested, and when it shall have been so tested, shall cause it, or such other meter as may be furnished to him in lieu of it, to be replaced at his own cost, and shall be in like manner responsible for the same. Any person so hiring a meter from the board, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. *Services to be separate except by permission.*—Excepting with the permission of the board not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The board may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7. *Extensions subject to consent of the board.*—No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the board.

8. *Service-pipes to be repaired by owner or occupier.*—*Penalty for refusal or neglect to repair service.*—The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none the owner, shall upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

9. *Waste of water.*—Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

10. *Water not to be used or supplied without written authority.*—Any person receiving water from the board who, without the written permission of the board, shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. *Unlawful taking of water without permission.*—Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the board, who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. *Unlicensed persons not to interfere with pipes or services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. *Licences to plumbers to be during pleasure of the board.*—Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the board, and the board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the board to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Act or of this by-law.

14. *Proof of fitness to be given by the applicant before granting of licence.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the board, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the by-laws of the board relating to water supply, with Part II. of the board's Act, and with the sections of the *Water Act 1890* thereby incorporated in the board's Act, but the board may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

15. *Notice of work proposed to be given.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. *Fittings to be of the best quality and subject to approval.*—No person shall use any tap, stock-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet-cistern, service-box, waste-not regulator, bath-tap or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the board which is not of the best quality and approved by the board.

17. *High-pressure cocks to be used.*—No person shall use any stop or bib-cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship, and approved by the board.

18. *Cisterns and tanks.*—No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and the overflow-pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the board.

19. *Water closets.*—No person shall construct or use any water closet fitting not approved by the board, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet-cistern or service-box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service-pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water-closet.

20. *Public urinals.*—Private urinals will receive water without meter, and public urinals will receive water without charge and without meter, provided they be constructed to the satisfaction of the board.

21. *Ordinary connexions.—Special size services.*—Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which for iron services a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch, and for houses rated over Twenty pounds per annum the size of such service-pipe must not exceed  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the board, and the supply be taken through a meter, and no such larger service shall exceed 1 inch in diameter, unless the average number of persons residing upon the premises be more than twenty-five, or the rating be at not less than One hundred and fifty pounds per annum, and shall not exceed 1 $\frac{1}{4}$  inches in diameter unless the number of persons be more than one hundred, or the rating be at not less than Two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

22. *Notice to lay service, &c., to be given.—Material to be approved and work inspected.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

23. *Lead piping.—Specification of material to be used.—Galvanized iron piping.*—Lead piping shall be of the following weights:—

and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services, except with the written consent of the board.

24. *Tappings under pressure by an officer of the board at cost of consumer.*—Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with and tap the pipes of the board, he shall be informed on behalf of the board whether it is or is not desired that such tapping should be made by an officer of the board, and if it be so desired, such person shall not tap any such pipe, but shall provide for and be at the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the board the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows, viz.:—For  $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch pipe, Seven shillings and sixpence;  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe, Ten shillings; 1-inch pipe, Fifteen shillings; 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch pipe, Twenty-five shillings; 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch pipe, Forty shillings; 2-inch pipe, Sixty shillings.

25. *Maximum tappings without clip.*—The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—

- For 3" and 4" pipes,  $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch tapping.
- For 5", 6", and 7" pipes, 1-inch tapping.
- For 8" pipes, 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch tapping.
- For 9" pipes, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch tapping.
- Over 9" pipes, 2-inch tapping.

26. *Private fire services, plugs, &c.*—Subject to previous written consent of the board, private fire services will be allowed, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the board's officer shall have certified in writing that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof, and a sum of Ten shillings per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire no person shall, without authority of the board, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken, accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the board, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a continuing penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

27. *Connexions brass couplings.*—All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

28. *All lead joints to be "wiped."*—All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who by himself or his workman shall break these regulations.

29. *Stop-cock and cover-box.*—A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an improved cast-iron cap shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.

30. *Baths, restriction as to capacity.*—No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons except with the special permission of the board.

31. *Reflex valve to be fixed in steam services.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

32. *Street watering to be by permission.*—No person, other than an employe of any municipality, shall, without the written permission of the board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

33. *Supply to public parks and gardens.*—The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the board, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

34. *Hose not to be affixed without meter.*—No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the board for domestic purposes to any houses or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. *Consent of board.—Notices to be addressed to secretary.—Conditions as to notice.—Consent may be given by chairman, secretary, engineer-in-chief, or engineer of water supply.—Consent to be reported to committee.*—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the board before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the secretary of the board and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this by-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the board's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the chairman of the board, the secretary, the engineer-in-chief, or the engineer for water supply, who, severally, shall be competent to give the board's consent, and on behalf of the board to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the water supply committee, with a view to report thereof to the board for confirmation.

36. *Penalties.*—For every offence against any provision of this by-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall upon conviction be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

37. *Interpretation clause.*—In the construction of this by-law, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, the words "the Board" shall be understood to mean the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the words "the Act" and "the Board's Act" shall be understood to mean the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890*.

The foregoing by-law was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed, the 9th day of February, 1892, in the presence of—

NOTE.—The apparent increase of population in 1891, or that obtained by adding the excess of registered births over registered deaths to the excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures was 29,163, as against 35,523 in 1890. The actual increases are known to have been less than these, in consequence of the departures by sea being imperfectly recorded. If allowance is made for the probable number of unrecorded departures in 1891, the net increase of population during that year will be reduced to 24,538, viz., 10,854 males and 13,684 females, as shown above.

The registered births numbered 38,516, and the registered deaths 18,625 in 1891; thus the former exceeded the latter by 19,893, or 107 per cent. The births exceeded those in 1890 by 938, and the deaths exceeded those in 1890 by 611.

The recorded arrivals by sea numbered 62,448, and the recorded departures by sea numbered 53,172 in 1891. The gain to the population by excess of the former over the latter was thus apparently 9,276. The number, however, must be reduced by an allowance for unrecorded departures estimated to have amounted to 4,631, which brings the probable net gain by immigration down to 4,645.

The gain by excess of births over deaths in 1891 was greater than that in 1890 by 327; but the gain by excess of recorded arrivals over recorded departures was less than that in 1890 by 6,681.

In 1891, the recorded arrivals from were greater than the recorded departures for New South Wales and Queensland by 4,018, Tasmania by 3,129, South Australia by 1,860, the United Kingdom by 993, New Zealand and the South Seas by 715, and Foreign countries by 521. On the other hand, the recorded departures for Western Australia exceeded the recorded arrivals therefrom by 1,960.

At the end of 1891, the estimated population of Western Australia was 53,285, the increase during the year being 4,085; the estimated population of New Zealand (exclusive of 41,718 Maoris) was 634,057, the increase during the year being 8,549; and the estimated population of Tasmania was 152,619, the increase during the year being 7,329. No returns have been received from any of the other colonies.

As regards the Victorian estimate, it should be stated that the figures of births and deaths during 1891, and consequently those of the population, will be slightly altered when the returns of the Deputy Registrars are finally examined.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1892.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz:—

## REGULATION No. 12.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1892 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement above Ten pounds and not exceeding Fourteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of ten per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement above Fourteen pounds and not exceeding Nineteen pounds annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, an amount of eight and three-quarters (8 $\frac{3}{4}$ ) per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement of Twenty-six pounds and not exceeding Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds five shillings.

6. For every house or tenement of Thirty-six pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to six and a quarter (6 $\frac{1}{4}$ ) per cent. upon the annual municipal value of such property.

7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, One pound sterling.

8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of above Twenty pounds annual municipal value, an amount of five per cent. on the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

10. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount equal to five per cent. on the annual municipal value of such piece or allotment of land. Provided that in any case the rate shall not be less than the sum of One pound.

11. For every water-trough One pound per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied through a meter shall be 8,000 gallons.

12. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed upon), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum 16,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum 24,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.

In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for scabbling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

13. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

14. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 40,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre.

15. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

16. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 4,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

17. For water supplied to syphon pumps Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

18. For water supplied for private fountains Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1892, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by section 150 of the *Customs Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor in Council may by any Order from time to time specify the articles on which a drawback of duty paid on importation into Victoria may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed; and may alter or cancel any such Order; and may approve of regulations and conditions for the repacking of dutiable goods, whether such goods be in bond or be entitled to drawback; and for the due protection of the revenue under which or upon which drawbacks may be allowed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Regulations relating to Drawbacks made on the twenty-ninth day of September, 1890, that is to say:—

To Schedule No. 2 of the Regulations the following words are added, viz:—

ALLOWANCES TO WITNESSES IN CRIMINAL CASES ON A PROSECUTION BY ANY OFFICER ON BEHALF OF THE CROWN AND AT INQUESTS AND MAGISTERIAL INQUIRIES.

At the Railway Offices, Ararat, the twenty-fifth day of February, 1892.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Governor in Council bearing date the twenty-seventh day of October, 1890, certain rates of allowances to be made to witnesses and interpreters summoned to attend at the Supreme and Circuit Courts, Courts of General Sessions and Petty Sessions, at Inquests, and Magisterial Inquiries were prescribed: And whereas it is expedient to rescind the said Order and make another in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that, on and after the first day of March next, the said first-mentioned Order shall be rescinded, and that on and after that day the allowances to be made to witnesses and interpreters required to attend at the Criminal Sittings of the Supreme Court, and at General and Petty Sessions, or before justices, and at Inquests and Magisterial Inquiries shall be in accordance with the Regulations following: Provided that witnesses at Petty Sessions, or before justices, and at Inquests and at Magisterial Inquiries, other than professional witnesses or experts, members of the Police Force, and interpreters, shall be paid only in accordance with the provisions hereinafter specially set out in that behalf.

For Travelling.

1. To every witness or interpreter (not being a member of the Police Force) the sum actually paid, but not exceeding One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) for every mile he may reside from the court at which he may be required to attend.
2. To every witness and interpreter who may travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, the sum actually and properly paid for fares both in going to and returning from the court at which he may be required to attend.
3. No allowance under clause 1 will be made to any witness or interpreter residing within three miles of the court which he may be required to attend.
4. In all cases where practicable witnesses and interpreters must travel by ship, coach, railway, or tram, and in such part of the vessel, vehicle, or train as may be suitable to their station in life.

6. To every witness or interpreter who may be necessarily detained, or who may be prevented from proceeding on his journey or to his place of abode, either before or after attending the court, the same allowance from the date of detention up to the date of attending the court, or of departure, as paid to witnesses residing beyond twenty miles from the court, and mentioned in the third column, or, in the case of members of the Police Force, as mentioned in the second column.

7. Witnesses at Petty Sessions, or before justices, and at Inquests and at Magisterial Inquiries, other than professional witnesses and experts, members of the Police Force, and interpreters, shall be paid sufficient to cover the loss which has been or will be sustained through such attendance, but not to exceed in any event the amounts hereinbefore set out, and it shall be the duty of the police magistrate, or (if no police magistrate is present), the chairman of the bench, or the coroner or presiding justice (as the case may be) to satisfy himself that such loss has been or will be sustained through such attendance, and a special minute to that effect must be placed on the face of the account, signed by such police magistrate or presiding officer. In paying witnesses at the Supreme Court and at Courts of General Sessions, under clause five, for attendance, the officer performing the duty shall similarly satisfy himself, and shall indorse and sign on the back of the abstract a general certificate that he has done so.

8. Witnesses who attend in more than one prosecution or matter will be entitled to a proportionate payment only in each.

9. No allowance will be paid to any member of the Police Force for attendance at a Court of Petty Sessions, or before justices, or at any Inquest or Magisterial Inquiry held within the city, town, borough, or township in which he is stationed or does duty.

10. No allowance will be paid to aboriginal natives, nor to any prisoner of the Crown, but every protector, constable, warder, or other person having charge of any such native or prisoner will receive the expenses actually and necessarily incurred in taking him to and from and keeping him in attendance at the court.

11. The abstract of payments to witnesses and interpreters must be certified at the Supreme Court by the Crown Solicitor; at Courts of General Sessions by the Clerk of the Peace, countersigned by the Prosecutor for the Queen, as inspected and approved; at Courts of Petty Sessions or before justices, by the police magistrate, or (if no police magistrate is present) by the chairman of the bench; at inquests by the coroner, or justice acting as such; and at magisterial inquiries, by the magistrate.

And the Honorable John Gavan Duffy, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1111, section 85) it is enacted that the Licensing Court for each Licensing District shall, in the month of December in every year, hold an annual sitting of the Court at the place appointed, of which annual sitting one month's previous notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*: Provided that the Governor in Council may, by an Order in Council, extend the time for the holding of such Court by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order extend the time for holding the Annual Sittings of the Licensing Courts appointed to be held in December last, at Bacchus Marsh, Ballan, Beechworth, Daylesford, and Melbourne, by a period not exceeding two months from the thirty-first day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

**REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO DEFENCE OF  
DESTITUTE PERSONS CHARGED WITH CAPITAL  
CRIMES AND OF ABORIGINALS CHARGED WITH  
INDICTABLE OFFENCES.**

**THE** Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulations.

JOHN GAVAN DUFFY.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. When any person charged with an offence punishable by death, or any aboriginal accused of an indictable offence, requires assistance from the Crown for his defence, he shall, seven days before the first day of the gaol delivery, circuit court, or court of general sessions at which he is to take his trial, or so soon as he shall know that he is to be tried for such offence, apply to the sheriff of the bailiwick for such assistance, and shall show to the satisfaction of such sheriff that he is without sufficient means wherewith to employ legal assistance.

2. Upon the sheriff being convinced of the truth of the allegations contained in such application, and having ascertained from the Crown Solicitor or the clerk of the peace, as the case may be, that the applicant is to be tried on a capital charge, or, in the case of an aboriginal, that he is to be brought to trial, he shall communicate to a barrister and solicitor, to be named by the applicant, the desire of the latter to be defended by him, together with the amount of the fees to be allowed, and shall forward notice of the same to the Attorney-General. The fees shall not (except in special cases, to be approved of by the Attorney-General *before the trial*) exceed the sum of £10 10s. where such barrister and solicitor conducts the whole case himself, or £14 14s. where the defence is conducted in court by another barrister and solicitor briefed for the purpose.

3. The above sums are exclusive of the expenses of any witnesses whom the judge or the chairman of general sessions presiding at the trial shall certify to have been material and necessary (which expenses shall be paid at the same rate as those of Crown witnesses).

4. The barrister and solicitor so engaged shall, after the trial, present his claim to the sheriff by whom he was so engaged, and shall, when the claim is £14 14s. (or upwards), produce to the sheriff a receipt for the fee paid to the barrister and solicitor who has conducted the case in court.

5. Only those persons who comply with these regulations shall be entitled to receive aid from the sum voted by Parliament.

6. Every gaoler shall, as soon as possible after the commitment for trial of any prisoner to whom these regulations apply, communicate the purport of them to such prisoner.

## SHIRE OF RODNEY.

## BY-LAWS.

THE following by-laws were duly made, ordered, and passed by the municipal committee in and for the Shire of Rodney, this 21st day of September, 1886:—

By-law No. 1.—That Part Eleven of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1874* is hereby adopted in and for the Shire of Rodney.

By-law No. 2.—That all contractors shall be required to complete their works for the bulk sum named in their tenders, and within the time named in the specification, and that no application to correct the amount named in any tender deposited in the tender-box or to correct any irregularity be considered by this council.

By-law No. 3.—That Part One of *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, be adopted in and for the Shire of Rodney.

By-law No. 4.—If any person shall wilfully, and without the authority of the council, cut, break, bark, root up, or otherwise destroy or damage the whole or any part of any tree, sapling, shrub, or underwood growing in or upon any street, road, or place under the management of the council, although the injury done shall not be to the amount of One shilling, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

If any person shall, without the authority of the council, break, displace, or remove the surface or soil of any land belonging to or under the control or management of the council, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

For the purpose of those provisions of any Statute now or hereafter to be in force whereby any person may be authorized to destroy goats, land shall be deemed to be securely enclosed and fenced if the same be enclosed or fenced with a substantial three-railed fence of the usual height, and the openings in which (if any) shall at the time of trespass be secured or barred with gates or other fastenings of like closeness and strength with the fence, or if such land be enclosed or fenced with any fence and gates or fastening of equivalent closeness and strength with such first-mentioned fence.

## (1) NUISANCES OF VARIOUS KINDS.

By-law No. 5.—Every owner or keeper of any goat usually kept within the municipal district shall register with the municipal clerk his name and address as a keeper of goats, and shall at the time of such registration pay to such clerk the sum of Sixpence, and shall place and keep upon the neck of every goat so owned and kept a collar bearing the name and address so registered; and if any person shall without lawful excuse offend in any respect against this section he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

2. If any goat shall be found having on its neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person registered as aforesaid, such goat shall *prima facie* be presumed to be owned and kept by such person.

3. The council from time to time shall provide one secure enclosure for the keeping and custody of goats for the purpose of this subdivision, and forthwith when any such enclosure shall have been provided shall notify the same and the situation thereof in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood.

4. Every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place may, by the proper officer of the council, be forthwith seized and confined in such enclosure as aforesaid until dealt with as hereinafter provided.

5. Whenever a goat having on the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of a person resident within the municipal district, registered as aforesaid, shall be seized hereunder, the proper officer of the council shall forthwith cause notice of such seizure to be given to such person or left at the place of such address.

6. Subject to the provisions hereinafter in this by-law contained, every goat so seized and confined as aforesaid which shall not have upon the neck a collar purporting to bear the name and address of some person registered as aforesaid may, by the proper officer of the council, be destroyed at or after noon of the day following the day of such seizure, and every such goat which shall have on the neck such a collar as aforesaid may by the said officer be destroyed at or after noon of the day following next but one the day of such seizure.

7. The owner of any goat which shall have been seized as aforesaid, may apply *ex parte* to any justice that such goat be restored to such owner, and such goat shall, if a justice shall so order and not otherwise, be, unless the same has been destroyed, restored to such owner accordingly, and such order of a justice or any minute thereof under the hand of such justice shall for all purposes of this subdivision be conclusive evidence that the person so applying was the owner of such goat.

8. The owner, whether registered hereunder or not, of every goat found at large in any street, road, or public place shall, whether such goat be destroyed or not or be restored or not, forfeit and pay a penalty of Five shillings.

9. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing by limits to be set forth therein portions of the municipal district in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine; and if any person shall keep any swine within any such prescribed limits he shall forfeit for every day during which he shall so offend a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Every person who shall empty any privy, or load, carry, move, or deposit any night-soil, offal, or other offensive refuse or matter, save between such hours of the night, or shall deposit the same save at such places as respectively shall have been appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, or who shall use for any such purpose any cart or carriage not having a covering proper for preventing the escape of the contents of such cart or of the stench thereof, shall forfeit for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and it shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for appointing such hours and places as aforesaid.

## (2) PRIVATE SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

11. Except it be by some Act of Parliament otherwise expressly provided, it shall be lawful for the council (if the council shall not as yet have provided abattoirs, within the municipal district and duly notified the same as ready for public use to license upon payment of such sum not exceeding Two pounds, as shall be appointed by regulation in that behalf, such slaughter-houses (not being in any case within one mile from the corporate limits of the city of Melbourne or the town of Geelong), as they, from time to time may think proper for slaughtering cattle, and every such licence shall be in force until the 31st day of December in the year for which such licence shall be granted.

12. Every person who without having such licence as aforesaid in force uses as a slaughter-house any place within the municipal district other than a slaughter-house which was in use at the time of the coming into operation of the Act numbered One hundred and eighty-four, and has so continued to be used ever since, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and a like penalty for every day after conviction upon which he shall so offend.

13. Every place which at the time of the coming into operation of the last-mentioned Act was in use as a slaughter-house, and has so continued ever since, shall within three months after the coming into operation of this subdivision be registered by the owner or occupier thereof at the office of the council, and on application to the council for that purpose and on payment of such sum not exceeding Twenty shillings as shall have been appointed by regulation in that behalf they shall from time to time cause every such slaughter-house to be registered in a book to be kept for that purpose, and such registration shall be of effect for one year after the making thereof and no longer, and every person who after the expiration of such period of three months uses or suffers to be used any such place as a slaughter-house without its being so registered, shall forfeit on conviction a sum not exceeding Five pounds for such offence, and a further sum not exceeding Ten shillings for every day after such conviction during which such place shall be used as a slaughter-house without having been so registered.

7. It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following (that is to say):—

For the licensing (where the council are empowered to license) and for the registering and inspection of all private slaughter-houses:

For appointing, subject to the limits herein prescribed, the fees for licences and registration:

For preventing cruelty in such slaughter-houses:

For keeping the same in a cleanly and proper state, and for removing the filth at least once in every twenty-four hours, and requiring them to be provided with a sufficient supply of water:

For confining the use of licensed slaughter-houses to the slaughter of any particular kinds of animals:

and every person offending contrary to such regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, a further sum not exceeding Ten shillings for every day during which such offence shall continue after such conviction.

15. The justice before whom any person is convicted of any offence against this subdivision, in addition to any penalty, may suspend for a period not exceeding two months the licence for any slaughter-house granted hereunder to such person or the effect of the registration of any slaughter-house of which such person is the owner or occupier, and upon the conviction of any person for a second or subsequent like offence may, in addition to any penalty, declare the licence granted hereunder to such person revoked, or the registration of any slaughter-house of which such person is the owner or occupier cancelled, and no licence while so suspended or after such revocation, and no registration while the effect thereof is suspended or after the same is cancelled shall exist or avail for any purpose whatsoever.

16. Nothing in this subdivision shall be deemed in anywise to affect any of the provisions of the *Abattoirs Statute*, or to render lawful any act or thing therein prohibited.

## SHIRE OF RODNEY.

BY-LAW No. 8, for the Protection of Fish, made by the Shire Council of Rodney on the 26th day of March, 1883:—

1. That no person shall use in any tank, dam, water reserve, running stream, or other water right under the control of this municipality any net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary in any way or manner for the purpose of taking fish.

Fishing permits may be issued by the secretary of the shire on payment of Two shillings and sixpence for each season.

2. That no person shall angle for, remove, or take from the said places any fish that may be therein during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September in each and every year.

3. That no person shall angle in the said places with more than two hooks covered with live bait, or more than two artificial baits of any kind whatsoever at one and the same time, or between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

4. That no person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in the said places for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot or for any other purpose whatsoever.

5. That all persons catching any fish in the said places under four ounces in weight shall forthwith return the same to the water whence it was taken.

6. That no person shall remove or take away, or cause to be removed from the said places, any ova or spawn without the consent of the Council of the Shire of Rodney being first obtained.

7. That no person shall angle for or by any other means endeavour to take fish from the said places on any Sunday.

8. That each and every violation of this by-law shall be deemed an offence, and for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be inflicted.

BY-LAW NO. 42.

By-law making a rate for Water Supply Purposes and for fixing a scale of charges for water supplied by measure.

THE Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by Part VI. of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rate for one year from the 1st day of January, 1892, upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District of St. Arnaud (that is to say):—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes—

- On every house or tenement of the annual value of Five pounds and under, the annual sum of Ten shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of Five pounds and not exceeding Ten pounds, the annual sum of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds, the annual sum of Twenty shillings.
- On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, the annual sum of Five pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation.

Water supplied by measure.]

The charges for water supplied by measure for all purposes, except in cases of special agreement with the council, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per thousand gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the council for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum 5,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum 7,500 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum 12,500 gallons.
- For every additional half-acre, per annum 12,500 gallons; and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of market gardens shall be as follows:—

- One-eighth of an acre and less, per annum 10,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-eighth of an acre but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum 15,000 gallons.
- Exceeding one-quarter of an acre but not exceeding one-half of an acre, per annum 25,000 gallons.
- For every additional half-acre, per annum 25,000 gallons; and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every additional fractional part of an acre.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to owners or occupiers of livery, bait, coaching, carriers', and carters' stables shall be as follows:—

- (a) For each stall not exceeding ten, per annum 1,750 gallons.
- (b) For each stall above the first ten and not exceeding twenty, per annum 1,000 gallons.
- (c) For each additional stall above twenty, per annum 750 gallons. In open sheds used for the above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged as a stall.

For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be one thousand gallons for every thousand bricks or fractional part thereof, and five hundred gallons for every cubic yard of concrete or fractional part thereof used in the construction of the building or of the appurtenances thereto.

For manufacturing purposes the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per thousand gallons would be equal to the amount of 4d. in the £1 of valuation for the lands and tenements used for such manufacturing purposes. And the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the said borough in which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively for the purposes of this section of this by-law.

The rates and charges for water supplied by measure under special agreement with the council shall be payable as agreed upon.

The rates and charges hereinbefore specified shall be due and payable in advance as from the 1st day of January, 1892.

In the construction of this by-law the word "Council" shall mean the Borough Council of St. Arnaud.


