FEEES TO MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS FOR REPORTING CASES OF DANGEROUS INFECTIOUS OR CONTAGIOUS DISEASE.

WHEREAS by section 125 of the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by order published in the *Government Gazette*, make all regulations necessary for carrying out the provisions of the said section and for the payment of fees to medical practitioners for forwarding reports under that section: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the provisions of the said section, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:-

1. The regulation made on the fifth day of February, 1889, fixing the fee to be paid to medical practitioners for reporting the occurrence of a case of dangerous infectious or contagious disease under the provisions of section 9 of *The Public Health Act 1885* is hereby repealed.

2. After the publication in the *Government Gazette* of a notice by the Board of Public Health, under the provisions of section 125 of the *Health Act 1890* or the corresponding provisions of any Act repealed thereby, every legally-qualified medical practitioner resident in the place or part named in such notice who may report in the form prescribed the occurrence of any case of the disease named in such notice shall be entitled for each case so notified by him to a fee of Two shillings and sixpence if the case occurs in his own private practice, and to a fee of One shilling if the case occurs in his practice as medical officer of any public institution, which fee shall be paid quarterly by the said Board out of the moneys that may from time to time be appropriated by Parliament for the expenses of the said Board.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 3.—WATER SUPPLY.

Preamble.—The Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on such board by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890* (54 Victoria No. 1197), and by so much of the *Water Act 1890* as is incorporated therewith, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in anywise enabling the said board in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. **Repeal of inconsistent by-laws.**—All by-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Water Supply (in so far as the same are inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this by-law) shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed, or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. **Rates and charges.**—The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the board, that is to say:—

I. **Minimum.**—On every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

II. **On valuations above minimum.**—On every house or tenement above the annual value of Twenty pounds, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds inclusive, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds.

III. **Store rate.**—Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, a rate of Sixpence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds, and One pound per centum on the amount of such valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds.

IV. **Water troughs.**—Private water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except where, in the opinion of the board, a meter shall be necessary, in which case the minimum charge shall be for 20,000 gallons per annum. Troughs erected in any public highway, with the consent of the municipal authorities, shall not be deemed to be private troughs.

Special supplies.—Water will be supplied as follows:—

v. **To shipping at wharfs and piers.**—To shipping at the Melbourne wharfs, at the rate of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons; at special berths there, with fixed meters, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons; at other wharfs or places, at the rate of Four shillings per 1,000 gallons, subject to regulation at the will of the board as to quantity and time of supply.

VI. **Mixing concrete.**—For the making and mixing of concrete, and for masonry and brickwork, at the rate of One penny per cubic yard of such materials as measured in the work.

VII. **Building rates.**—For general building purposes at the following charges, viz.:—On the scale of Ninepence in the pound upon the estimated assessable value of the completed building during, from date of commencement, three months in cases where such value does not exceed Fifty pounds; four months where such value exceeds Fifty pounds and does not exceed One hundred pounds; and six months where such value exceeds One hundred pounds. But for wooden buildings the charge shall be one-half of the foregoing rate. After the termination of each such period to date of completion in each case the charge will be at the scale of Sixpence in the pound upon such value. In any cases of water supply for building purposes, the builder may use a meter, and pay for water used at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

Special rates.—And for the following purposes at the undermentioned rates, unless in cases where the board shall order that the supply shall be only by meter measurement, in each of which cases the party desiring to be supplied must provide the meter and pay for the water according to measurement thereby:—

VIII. **Steam boilers.**—For steam boilers, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each such boiler.

IX. **Gas engines.**—For gas engines, at the rate of Ten shillings for each horse-power of each such engine; or if the supply be from an approved cistern, Five shillings per annum per horse-power.

X. **Hydraulic blasts.**—For plumbers' blasts, Twenty shillings each per annum.

XI. **Horse and cattle rate.**—For horses, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse; and for cows wholly or partially kept upon the premises, Five shillings for each cow, but the owner may, if he so prefer, take the supply by meter.

XII. **Special rate may be fixed in cases not provided for.**—Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the board shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the board before a supply can be taken or used.

XIII. **Allowance of gratuitous supply to public charities.**—Excess to be charged for.—The following terms and conditions shall be those upon which a gratuitous supply of water will be furnished by the board to the public hospitals or charitable institutions mentioned in section 452 of the *Water Act 1890*, that is to say, such supply must be received through a meter, and shall be in the proportion of 11,000 gallons for each bed in such hospital or institution which shall have been occupied by one or more inmates or persons during in all not less than nine out of the preceding twelve months. Any water used in excess of that quantity must be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

XIV. **Meter, rate of charge, and minimum supplies other than domestic.**—Water supplied by the board by meter measurement will be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and in cases where the supply is solely for purposes other than domestic, the minimum charge will be for 20,000 gallons per annum.

XV. **Minimum meter charge.**—Domestic supply.—The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter where water is supplied for domestic purposes, as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which at One shilling per 1,000 gallons equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

3. **Meters to be tested and approved.**—No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the board, and each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons, and each $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch, and 1-inch meter must be capable of registering 10, 15, and 20 gallons per hour respectively, and each meter must be fixed with approved lead connexion above ground in a conveniently accessible position and properly protected.

4. *Where meter ceases registering, &c., average may be charged.*—If any meter in use ceases registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the board will estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe, and charge upon estimate from the registering thereof.

5. *Hire of meters and rate of rent thereof.*—Meter rent to be exclusive of rate.—Hirer to give notice of removal.—The board will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate per annum of—

- For 3-inch, Twelve shillings and sixpence,
- For 4-inch, Fifteen shillings,
- For 5-inch, Twenty shillings,
- For 1-inch, Twenty-five shillings,

which rent shall be exclusive of, and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due, and must be paid quarterly in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year, the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then-current quarter, and the occupier of the premises shall, at his own cost, cause such meter to be fixed and kept in proper repair, and when required on behalf of the board so to do, shall cause such meter to be removed to the office of the board to be tested, and when it shall have been so tested, shall cause it, or such other meter as may be furnished to him in lieu of it, to be replaced at his own cost; and shall be in like manner responsible for the same. Any person so hiring a meter from the board, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. *Services to be separate except by permission.*—Excepting with the permission of the board not more than one house or tenement shall be supplied from a single water service. The board may in special cases consent to two or more tenements being supplied from one water service, but in such cases the sub-services shall be so arranged that the supply to each house shall be independent of the supply to the remaining houses, and be controlled by a stop-cock on such sub-service, and any person offending against the provisions of this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

7. *Extensions subject to consent of the board.*—No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the board.

8. *Service-pipes to be repaired by owner or occupier.*—Penalty for refusal or neglect to repair service.—The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any) and if none the owner, shall upon receiving notice that his service-pipe requires repairing immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and in default be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after receipt of such notice; and the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected.

9. *Waste of water.*—Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

10. *Water not to be used or supplied without written authority.*—Any person receiving water from the board who, without the written permission of the board, shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. *Unlawful taking of water without permission.*—Any person, not having agreed to be supplied by the board, who shall take or carry away water from the premises of any other person so supplied, or from any drinking tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. *Unlicensed persons not to interfere with pipes or services.*—Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. *Licences to plumbers to be during pleasure of the board.*—Such licence shall be at and during the pleasure of the board, and the board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof being judged by the board to be incompetent, or by himself or his employes committing any breach of the Act or of this by-law.

14. *Proof of fitness to be given by the applicant before granting of licence.*—Before any such licence shall be granted by the board, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber, and that he is thoroughly conversant with the provisions of the by-laws of the board relating to water supply, with Part II. of the board's Act, and with the sections of the *Water Act 1890* thereby incorporated in the board's Act, but the board may, if it so see fit, refuse to grant such licence.

15. *Notice of work proposed to be given.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. *Fittings to be of the best quality and subject to approval.*—No person shall use any tap, stock-cock, bib-cock, ball-cock, valve, closet-cistern, service-box, waste-not regulator, bath-tap or valve, or other fitting in connexion with a supply of water of the board which is not of the best quality and approved by the board.

17. *High-pressure cocks to be used.*—No person shall use any stop or bib-cocks which are not screw-down high-pressure cocks, made of hard brass or gun-metal, and in every respect of best quality and workmanship, and approved by the board.

18. *Cisterns and tanks.*—No person shall use any cistern or tank that is not provided with an equilibrium ball-valve, and the overflow-pipe laid and fixed in a suitable manner, open to inspection, and in a position approved by the board.

19. *Water closets.*—No person shall construct or use any water closet fitting not approved by the board, nor unless the same be supplied with water from the service pertaining to a tenement through a proper closet-cistern or service-box, fitted with approved waste-preventing apparatus. No person shall fix or use any service-pipe which communicates directly or indirectly with the basin or trap, or otherwise than with the cistern of a water-closet.

20. *Public urinals.*—Private urinals will receive water without meter, and public urinals will receive water without charge and without meter, provided they be constructed to the satisfaction of the board.

21. *Ordinary connexions.—Special size services.*—Ordinary connexions with sub-mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which for iron services a length of not less than 3 feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only for domestic supply to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed 1/2 inch, and for houses rated over Twenty pounds per annum the size of such service-pipe must not exceed 3/4 inch, unless permission for a larger service shall have been received in writing from the board, and the supply be taken through a meter, and no such larger service shall exceed 1 inch in diameter, unless the average number of persons residing upon the premises be more than twenty-five, or the rating be at not less than One hundred and fifty pounds per annum, and shall not exceed 1 1/4 inches in diameter unless the number of persons be more than one hundred, or the rating be at not less than Two hundred and fifty pounds per annum.

22. *Notice to lay service, &c., to be given.—Material to be approved and work inspected.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipes to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

23. *Lead piping.—Specification of material to be used.—Galvanized iron piping.*—Lead piping shall be of the following weights:—

1/2-inch	5 lbs.
3/4 "	6 "
1 "	7 1/2 "
1 1/4 "	9 "
1 1/2 "	12 "
1 3/4 "	22 "
2 "	30 "
2 1/2 "	45 "

and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services, except with the written consent of the board.

24. *Tappings under pressure by an officer of the board at cost of consumer.*—Upon any person giving notice of his desire to lay a pipe to connect with and tap the pipes of the board, he shall be informed on behalf of the board whether it is or is not desired that such tapping should be made by an officer of the board, and if it be so desired, such person shall not pay for any such pipe, but shall provide for and be at the cost of all labour and material necessary for such connexion, and for the restoration of the ground to the satisfaction of the local authority, and be liable for the consequences of failure in so doing, and shall pay in advance to the board the expense of such tapping, including the stop-cock and ferrule as follows, viz.:—For 1/2-inch pipe, Seven shillings and sixpence; 3/4-inch pipe, Ten shillings; 1-inch pipe, Fifteen shillings; 1 1/4-inch pipe, Twenty-five shillings; 1 1/2-inch pipe, Forty shillings; 2-inch pipe, Sixty shillings.

25. *Maximum tappings without clip.*—The maximum tapping that will be allowed without clip for each size of main is as follows:—

- For 3" and 4" pipes, 3-inch tapping.
- For 5", 6", and 7" pipes, 1-inch tapping.
- For 8" pipes, 1 1/2-inch tapping.
- For 9" pipes, 1 1/2-inch tapping.
- Over 9" pipes, 2-inch tapping.

26. *Private fire services, plugs, &c.*—Subject to previous written consent of the board, private fire services will be allowed, but every such service must be sealed, except in cases where the board's officer shall have certified in writing that sealing is unnecessary. For each such private fire service there shall be paid a sum of Ten shillings upon the fixing thereof, and a sum of Ten shillings per annum thereafter. No water shall be taken from any sealed portion of such service except for extinction of fire. Except in case of fire no person shall, without authority of the board, wilfully break the seal affixed to any private fire service, and in the event of any such seal having been broken, accidentally or otherwise, the occupier of the tenement shall, within twenty-four hours thereafter, give notice in writing of the fact at the office of the board, and failing to do so shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and to a continuing penalty of Ten shillings for every day during which he shall neglect to give such notice.

27. *Connections brass couplings.*—All connections with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings.

28. *All lead joints to be "wiped."*—All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper-bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of the licence of the plumber who by himself or his workman shall break these regulations.

29. *Stop-cock and cover-box.*—A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock properly secured and covered with an improved cast-iron cap shall be fixed on each water service between the main and the building line.

30. *Baths, restriction as to capacity.*—No bath shall be allowed which has a holding capacity when full of more than 100 gallons except with the special permission of the board.

31. *Reflux valve to be fixed in steam services.*—Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

32. *Street watering to be by permission.*—No person, other than an employé of any municipality, shall, without the written permission of the board, water streets or thoroughfares by means of hydrants and hose attached to fire-plugs. Any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

33. *Supply to public parks and gardens.*—The water supply to all public parks and gardens shall be exclusively under the control and direction of the officers of the board, and any person not duly authorized who shall turn on the water or otherwise interfere with such water supply, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

34. *Hose not to be affixed without meter.*—No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the board for domestic purposes to any houses or premises) for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a meter is fixed and the water supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

35. *Consent of board.—Notices to be addressed to secretary.—Conditions as to notice.—Consent may be given by chairman, secretary, engineer-in-chief, or engineer of water supply.—Consent to be reported to committee.*—In every case in which it is necessary to obtain the consent of the board before doing any act or commencing any work, such consent must be asked for by notice in writing addressed to the secretary of the board and delivered at his office, of such length as is mentioned in the Act or in this by-law, and in no case less than two days prior to the time proposed for the doing of such act or the commencement of such work, and such notice must state clearly the act proposed to be done or work to be commenced, and such act shall not be done or work be commenced save upon the board's consent in writing, and then only subject to and in accordance with such directions or conditions as shall be therein specified. Such consent may be given by and under the hand of the chairman of the board, the secretary, the engineer-in-chief, or the engineer for water supply, who, severally, shall be competent to give the board's consent, and on behalf of the board to prescribe any directions or conditions attaching thereto and subject to and in accordance with which only such consent shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of every such consent shall notify the same to the next following meeting of the water supply committee, with a view to report thereof to the board for confirmation.

36. *Penalties.*—For every offence against any provision of this by-law for which a penalty is not hereinbefore specially prescribed, the offender shall upon conviction be liable to and shall pay any sum not exceeding Five pounds.

37. *Interpretation clause.*—In the construction of this by-law, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, the words "the Board" shall be understood to mean the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the words "the Act" and "the Board's Act" shall be understood to mean the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1850*.

The foregoing by-law was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, and the common seal of the said Board was hereunto affixed, the 9th day of February, 1892, in the presence of—

PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY OF VICTORIA.*

THE majority of the Trustees for the time being of the body politic and corporate, named the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria, do hereby repeal the rules made on the 19th day of September, 1890, by the majority for the time being of the above-named Trustees, and in lieu thereof make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS OF THE GENERAL BODY OF TRUSTEES.

1. *Ordinary meetings.*—The trustees shall meet monthly.
2. *Special meetings.*—A special meeting shall be convened by the librarian, on the requisition of two trustees.
3. *Quorums and adjourned meetings.*—Three trustees shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not formed within half-an-hour of the time named, the meeting, whether ordinary or special, shall be called for a day to be named by the trustee or trustees then present; but if no trustee be present, the business will be adjourned until the next monthly meeting.
4. *Notice of meeting.*—The trustees shall be duly supplied by the librarian with a notice of the day, hour, and place of every meeting, and of all motions to be made or special matters to be considered thereat; and any trustee may hand to the librarian a notice of motion in writing, which it shall be the librarian's duty to insert in such notice paper, and also in a book to be called the notice of motion book.

5. *Sections.*—For the more convenient and effectual performance of the duties imposed upon the trustees, they shall be divided into five sections:—

- (1) The Library.
- (2) The Industrial and Technological Museum.
- (3) The National Museum.
- (4) The National Gallery.
- (5) The Building and General.

For each of the sections a committee shall be appointed from the trustees, which committee shall have the control and management of the business of the section, subject to the approval of the trustees; and it shall be competent for the trustees to dissolve such committee and appoint another in its place. Each sectional committee shall once at least in twelve months report its proceedings to the trustees; and the trustees may at any time require a special report.

6. *President.*—There shall be a president, a vice-president, and a treasurer elected annually in April, and each shall remain in office until his successor be appointed. The president shall preside at the meetings of the trustees; in his absence, the vice-president; in the absence of both, the meeting shall elect its chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes shall give a casting vote.

7. *Treasurer.*—(1) One of the trustees shall act as treasurer, and shall sign all vouchers and financial documents. (2) The treasurer shall be an *ex officio* member of each sectional committee, but shall not be chairman.

8. *Committees.*—Each committee shall meet monthly. Three members shall form a quorum. A special meeting for the consideration of business shall be convened, on the requisition of any member.

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT AND INFORMATION OF VISITORS TO THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY.

THE LIBRARY.

1. The Library shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Ten p.m., except on Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.
2. No book is to be taken out of the Library.
3. In making extracts from books no person shall lay the paper upon which he is writing on the book he is using.
4. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book, is strictly prohibited. Ink is not to be used except by special permission.
5. Children under fourteen years of age are not admitted.
6. No person, unless he be a medical practitioner, a medical student, or an attorney or a barrister-at-law, shall be admitted to the Medical Department without special permission from the librarian or from the officer in charge of the Library.
7. No person shall be admitted to the Fine Arts Gallery without written permission from the librarian. All books must be used under the supervision of the officer in charge of the gallery at a table provided for the purpose, and must be returned to him.
8. No person shall be admitted to the Patent Gallery without special permission from the librarian or from the officer in charge of the Library.

THE LENDING LIBRARY.

1. The Lending Library shall be open from Two to Eight p.m. every day, except Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday, and such other days as the trustees may by special order direct.
2. Any person satisfying the librarian that he is a ratepayer of any municipality within the colony of Victoria may borrow books from the Lending Library.
3. Any other person having reached the age of fifteen years who shall deliver to the librarian a guarantee signed by two such ratepayers, may borrow books from the Lending Library.
4. Every application for the loan of books and the guaranty required by the next preceding regulation shall be in the form provided from time to time by the trustees.
5. The librarian may issue to any person who may borrow, on his or her personal application, a borrower's ticket, which shall entitle its holder for twelve months to borrow books subject to the regulations of the Lending Library.
6. Any person signing the guaranty shall, on notifying to the librarian in writing his or her desire to withdraw from it, be released therefrom as soon as any book lent to the person guaranteed has been returned, or any loss or injury to any book, set, or series has been made good.

7. All books borrowed must be returned to the librarian within a fortnight, and for every failure to comply with this condition the borrower shall incur a fine, to be paid to the librarian, of Threepence a day.

8. No book can be obtained from the Lending Library by a borrower who has not paid all fines incurred.

9. There shall be no obligation to send notice of any fine incurred by a borrower, and failure to send such notice shall be no excuse for non-payment of fines.

10. The librarian shall cause each book returned to be examined, and if it shall be found to have been injured, the borrower, or his guarantor, shall, within one week of the date on which the injury has been notified to him, replace or pay to the librarian the value of any book, set, or series injured. The borrower shall be entitled to the injured book, set, or series, on depositing with the librarian its full value, or a new copy. The librarian shall be sole judge of the value of any book, set, or series, and of the injury done to them.

11. Borrowers ceasing to use the library are required to return their tickets to the librarian, in order to have them cancelled, as until the tickets are returned borrowers and their guarantors remain responsible for any book taken out in their names.

12. Borrowers changing their residence are required to notify the change to the librarian, and to have their addresses entered on their tickets. The right to borrow may be forfeited for failure to comply with this condition.

13. If a borrower's ticket be lost, a second ticket may be issued in the manner provided in the case of the issue of the ticket in the first instance. If the second ticket be lost, three months must elapse from the time of the notification of the fact to the librarian before a third ticket shall be issued.

14. Borrowers losing their tickets are required to give immediate notice in writing to the librarian, and until they have done so shall be liable for any books taken out in their names.

15. Borrowers must under no circumstances transfer their tickets for use to any other person.

16. Borrowers must not lend books taken from the library nor exchange them with each other.

17. No borrower shall be allowed to have more than one volume at the same time. When, however, the connexion of two or more volumes of one work makes the use of the whole of the work necessary, several volumes may be issued together, the number of volumes to be plainly written on the application card in such cases.

18. In applying for books at the delivery desk borrowers, after ascertaining that the book is in, must write on the cards supplied for the purpose—

- (1) The same name and address as on the borrower's ticket.
- (2) The shelf number and title of the book desired, in the proper columns. And hand in the card and ticket together at the desk.

19. Borrowers must ascertain from the catalogues, and not from the library officers, the shelf number of the book desired.

20. Borrowers finding any book written on, defaced, or mutilated are required to report the fact to the librarian.

21. No person other than an officer of the library can be admitted to the shelves.

22. No loan of a book will be renewed if the book be required by another borrower.

23. If a borrower find a book wanted by him out, on deposit of an addressed post-card with the librarian the return of the book will be notified to him, and the book kept two days for him.

24. The librarian has power to refuse to lend books to any person who neglects to comply with the rules of the Lending Library, or who is, in his opinion, for other reasons, not to be intrusted with books.

25. Every book must, under a penalty of Five shillings, be returned to the librarian at such times as shall be publicly announced.

LOANS TO FREE LIBRARIES.

Conditions upon which Duplicate Books will be lent by the Trustees to Free Libraries.

1. Books may be lent to the trustees or committees of mechanics or literary institutions, or to the councils of municipalities.

2. The borrowers shall place the books lent in a suitable apartment, to be approved by the committee, and shall admit the public to the use of the books therein for such hours as may be appointed by the local committee, but subject to the following rule of the Public Library—

Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book, is strictly prohibited.

3. The borrowers shall pay all the expenses for cartage to and from the railway stations.

4. The borrowers shall give security to the satisfaction of the committee, in an amount equal to the value of the books lent to them, that the works will be returned at the expiration of the period of the loan in good condition, regard being had to reasonable wear.

5. The borrowers and sureties are to be liable for—

I. The value of any volume not returned, or where a work consists of more than one volume, the value of the work, set, or series to which the volume belongs.

II. The estimated value of the injury done to any volume, work, set, or series, or book-case.

6. When any work, set, or series rendered imperfect is replaced by the borrower, the imperfect work, set, or series shall be handed over to such borrower.

7. The committee shall be the sole judges of the value of, or injury done to, any volume, work, set, or series, or book-case.

THE INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL MUSEUM.

The Industrial and Technological Museum shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

Lectures.

Admission to the lectures shall be by ticket, to be obtained either gratuitously or on such terms as the trustees may fix.

Rule for Students.

Persons desirous of joining the class lectures may do so on application to the superintendent of the museum, on such terms as the committee direct.

THE NATIONAL MUSEUM.

The National Museum shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

The National Gallery shall be open every day from Ten a.m. until Five p.m., except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.

Rules for Students in the Schools of Drawing and Painting.

1. The period of studentship is limited to five years, but it may be extended from time to time by the permission of the trustees in favour of meritorious students, on report from the director. It is divided into two courses; the first for drawing, the second for painting.

2. The year is divided into two terms, the first term commencing on the third Monday and ending on the Saturday before the twenty-sixth Monday in the Year, and the second term commencing on the twenty-eighth Monday and ending on the Saturday before the forty-ninth Monday in the year.

3. An applicant for admission as a student shall submit specimens of drawing to the director. If such specimens be considered satisfactory, the applicant shall be admitted on probation, and shall prepare drawings within the school of drawing; and on the same being approved by the director, the applicant shall, on payment of fees, be registered as a student.

4. If an applicant for admission be found endeavouring to impose upon the director, by presenting drawings not being the applicant's unaided work, he or she shall not, for a period of two years, be admitted as a student.

5. At the end of each term students shall submit drawings to the trustees; and if at the end of the fourth term the drawings of any student be considered unsatisfactory by the trustees, he or she shall cease to be a student.

6. Before admission to the School of Painting a student shall submit to the trustees a drawing of a figure from the antique, a figure from life, a head from the antique, a head from life, and a perspective drawing, done in the School of Drawing, and, if such drawings be approved, shall be admitted.

7. Every third year a gold medal may be awarded for the best painting done in the school, or, in the case of a landscape, under the supervision of the director, by a student who has attended the school of painting for not less than three nor more than nine terms.

8. This gold medal will carry a travelling scholarship of £150 a year, tenable for three years.

9. The holder of this scholarship shall study painting in one of the great art schools of Europe to be approved by the trustees, and shall, during each of the first two years, paint and present to the trustees a copy of some well-known painting by an old master.

10. During the third year he or she shall paint and present to the trustees an original picture.

11. The trustees shall have power to cancel the scholarship in case the above conditions be not complied with, or in case of improper conduct on the part of the holder.

12. An exhibition of the student's works shall be held annually.

13. No student who has been awarded a first prize at the annual exhibition of the students' work shall be eligible to compete for a similar prize in the same department in subsequent years. But this will not disqualify such prize-holder from competing with the same or other painting for the travelling scholarship.

14. Students shall pay in advance to the librarian the term fee fixed by the trustees, and will not be admitted to the class-rooms except upon production of the receipt.

15. No person will be allowed to copy any picture, drawing, or work of art in the galleries of painting and sculpture without having first obtained permission in writing from the committee; and such permission shall specify the part or parts of any such picture, drawing, or work of art not to be included in the copy.

16. All students shall sign the students' book on every day they attend before entering the gallery.

17. All students shall, when leaving the gallery, remove or carefully put away all materials used by them in drawing or painting.

18. The committee will not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, property which any student may have left in the gallery.

19. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct on the part of any student will subject the student so offending to suspension, on the written order of the committee, and the offence, when proved to the satisfaction of the committee, shall subject such student to be excluded for such period as the committee may think fit; provided that in case of suspension the matter shall be reported by the director to the committee within three days.

20. No work done by students of the Art Schools under the supervision of the director is to be exhibited at any outside exhibition previous to being submitted for competition at the students' annual exhibition.

21. Any student being absent from the classes for the whole of one term shall not be permitted to attend the classes again except after application to the director, and by permission of the committee.

GENERAL.

1. The trustees shall have power to vary the hours during which the Public Library, Lending Library, Museums, and National Gallery are open by notice published in the *Government Gazette*, and such change shall not take force till a week after the publication of such notice.

2. Any visitor behaving in an unbecoming manner, or being, in the opinion of the officer in charge, unfit to remain in the institution, shall be excluded therefrom.

The common seal of the Public Library, Museums, and National Gallery of Victoria was hereunto affixed this 18th day of June, 1891, by the authority of the trustees for the time being whose signatures are hereunto set.

RULES AND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE NYORA CEMETERY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE "CEMETERIES ACT 1890."

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or vault re-opened.
- Orders for interments shall be given to the trustees at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial.
- The time fixed for the burial to take place shall be the time at which the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- The hours fixed for burials, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m.
- No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been lodged with the trustees, together with the name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of the deceased.
- Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults shall be interred in each, unless the grave be of greater depth or of extra-width, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
- Before a private grave shall be re-opened, the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same shall be obtained.
- No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited with the trustees a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and, in case of re-interment or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.

9. No fence shall exceed 3ft. 6in. in height, including the coping, and shall be subject to the approval of the trustees previous to erection.

10. No servant or person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

11. No dogs, horses, or carts will be allowed to enter the cemetery without special permission.

12. No trees or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery, except as approved by the trustees.

13. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery without the authority of the trustees.

14. The certificate of title to allotments to be signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PENSURST RACE-COURSE AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Terence O'Brien, John Earls, John Mackiehan, Edward Twomey, and John A. Hutton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Penshurst Race-course and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by the said Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890* :—

REGULATIONS.

- The reserve (which consists of the following divisions) shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except for training and exercising horses and as otherwise hereinafter provided :—1st division, the grand stand; 2nd division, the saddling paddock enclosure; and 3rd division, the remainder of the reserve.
- No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or gates, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
- No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission in writing of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.

7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to any gatekeeper or other person authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.

10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd divisions of the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports, shall be as follows :—

12. The net proceeds of all races, sports, or fêtes other than those for the benefit of the public charitable institutions shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve.

13. The members of the local rifle club shall be permitted to engage in rifle practice at the club's ranges within the reserve in accordance with any arrangements made, or that may hereafter be made, by the committee of management of the reserve and the committee of the said rifle club conjointly.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

CORINDHAP COMMON.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th August, 1890, the Managers of the Corindhap Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council :—

REGULATIONS.

- Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

2. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable quarterly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year:—

- For every horse or mare, Five shillings per annum.
- For every head of other large cattle, Four shillings per annum.
- For every head of small cattle, Four shillings per annum.

3. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bond fide* owner.

4. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine months shall be depastured on the common without the sanction, in writing, of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast which in their opinion would be dangerous to other stock.

5. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers any indication of disease in stock on the common, and shall give notice thereof, in writing, to the owners of such stock; and the managers shall at once take steps to remove such stock from the common, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owners of such stock may suffer.

6. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster during the first week of every quarter all stock on the common, and shall also during the same week take delivery of stock that may then be put on the common; and on the prescribed fees for all such stock, whether newly put on or previously depasturing on the common, being paid for the current quarter, and the number and brands of such stock given in writing, the managers shall give a receipt for the same; and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar or a mixture of both.

7. The stock on the common shall be mustered by the herdsman at any time or place appointed by the managers for the purpose, and all unregistered stock found on the common shall be liable to be impounded.

8. The managers of the common shall not be responsible for the loss of or injury to any stock depasturing thereon.

9. Any stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid before Four p.m. on day of mustering shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Nidry of Nidry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.
