ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MASTERS.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE LANDING OF COAL IN BAGS ON WHARFS, AND ERECTION OF FENCING AT CUSTOMS SHEDS ON WHARFS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Governor in Council has approved of the adoption of the following regulations made by the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners in pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, relating to the landing of coal in bags on wharfs, and erection of fencing at Customs sheds on wharfs:—

REGULATIONS OF MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.
IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulations, viz.:—

No. 187. Notwithstanding anything contained in clauses 102 and 103 of part 2 of the regulations made by the Commissioners on the 30th day of November, 1891, it shall be lawful for the Harbor-master to grant permission to place on any of the wharfs mentioned in the said clauses, coals required solely for use and consumption on board of any steam-ship moored or to be moored within 24 hours after such placing alongside any of the said wharfs, provided that such coals shall be in proper bags and placed or stacked in such quantities and in such places as the Harbor-master may approve; but nothing herein contained shall prevent the Harbor-master from requiring the removal of any coals placed or stacked on the said wharfs for the purposes aforesaid, should he find it necessary to do so in the interest of the port, and the owner of such coals must remove the same when so directed. Any persons committing or suffering a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £50 and not more than £500.

No. 188. If at any time the Commissioner of Customs shall require any portion of a wharf fronting any Customs shed to be fenced off, the Harbor-master may authorize such fencing to be erected for such period as to him may seem fit.

These regulations shall be read and construed together with the regulations of the Commissioners made on the 30th day of November, 1891.

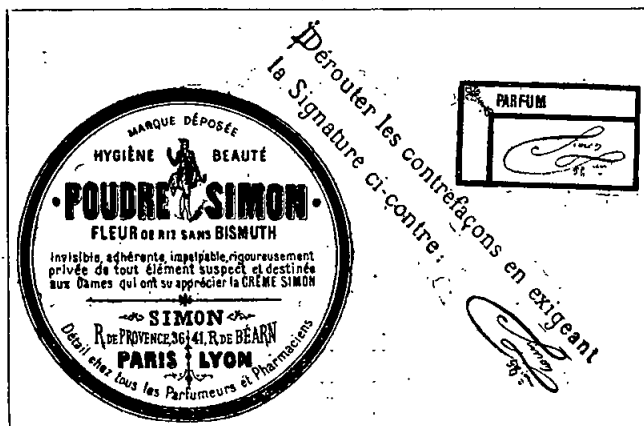

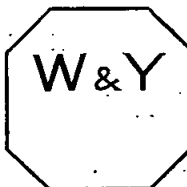

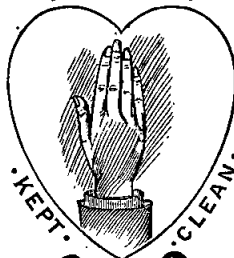

The births of 1,443 children, viz., 733 boys and 710 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. In the month of January, 1,429 births were registered, or 14 less than in the month under review. The births were 443 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but only 175 above that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in February numbered 698, viz., 377 of males and 321 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 745, or 107 per cent. The deaths were fewer than those in January by 78, and were also fewer by 4 than the average of February during the previous ten years; if, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 192.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district, the proportion of births registered was 2.94, and of deaths registered 1.42.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 96.5° on the 22nd, and the lowest was 47.1° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (66.2°) was three-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (44.0°) took place on the 7th, and the least (8.2°) on the 8th. The mean daily range was 20.6°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded (30.160 inches) was on the 2nd, and the lowest (29.524 inches) on the 29th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.933 inches) was a little above the average.

Rain fell on 4 days, the amount of rainfall being 0.60 inch. The average rainfall in February during the previous ten years was 1.36 inch, or three-quarters of an inch more than in the month under notice.

Fog occurred on 1 day during the month.

Males contributed 54 per cent., and females 46 per cent., to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 years of age contributed 49 per cent. to that mortality, as against 49 per cent. in 1891; 48 per cent. in 1890; 52 per cent. in 1889; 47 per cent. in 1888; 52 per cent. in 1887; and 48 per cent. in 1886.

Twenty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of influenza; a clerk of works and a porter, each aged 76, of apoplexy; a blacksmith, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 77, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 77, of heart disease; a contractor, aged 77, of injuries received from a fall; a female, aged 78, of pneumonia; a female, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a miller, aged 80, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 80, of injuries resulting from a fall; a female, aged 81, of apoplexy; a female, aged 81, of ascites; a female, aged 84, of dysentery; a female, aged 86, and a carpenter, aged 87, of diarrhoea; a blacksmith, aged 87, and a merchant, aged 88, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 88, of senile gangrene; a gentleman, aged 73, and three females, aged 73, 78, and 84 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-five deaths were ascribed to external causes during the month, of which 28 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A female, aged 14, a ship's steward, aged 26, and a gatekeeper, aged 66, were passed over by railway trains; a labourer, aged 23, was passed over by a cart; two labourers, aged 27 and 30 respectively, a boatswain, aged 31, a civil engineer, aged 33, a cordial maker, aged 36, a publican, aged 37, a messenger, aged 72, a contractor, aged 77, and a labourer, aged 80, died of injuries consequent on falls; an infant, aged 1 day, a jockey, aged 16, a carter, aged 20, and a gardener, aged 48, of fracture of the skull; a potter, aged 31, of injuries, the nature of which was not stated; a female, aged 34, was burnt to death; a civil engineer, aged 70, was choked in a lift; a labourer, aged 59, was poisoned by swallowing a mineral acid; a fireman, aged 33, a labourer, aged 38, and a male of un stated occupation, were drowned in the River Yarra; a labourer, aged 30, and a female, aged 57, in Hobson's Bay; a collector, aged 27, in the lagoon at Port Melbourne; and a boy, aged 17, was found drowned. The homicidal deaths were those of a male and two female new-born infants who were suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a bootlicker, aged 34, and a gentleman, aged 60, who poisoned themselves—the former with "rough on rats," and the latter with strychnine; a cooper, aged 60, who drowned himself in the River Yarra; and a female, aged 19, who threw herself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and fourteen deaths, or 16 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 55 in the Melbourne Hospital, 11 in the Alfred Hospital, 3 in the Women's Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 8 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 4 in the Austin Hospital, 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 342, of which 172, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 170, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 206 were under one year of age, 54 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 356. Of these, 205, or 58 per cent., were males, and 151, or 42 per cent., were females; 9 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 26 were between twenty and twenty-five, 40 were between twenty-five and thirty, 39 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 21 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 29 were between fifty-five and sixty, 31 were between sixty and sixty-five, 23 were between sixty-five and seventy, 22 were between seventy and seventy-five, 15 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 12 were upwards of eighty.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

Deaths from typhoid fever rose from 16 in January to 23 in February, and deaths from diphtheria from 6 to 12; moreover, 1 death in the latter month was set down to diphtheritic group. On the other hand, deaths from influenza fell from 5 to 4, deaths from whooping cough from 21 to 14, deaths from diarrheal diseases from 58 to 43, and deaths from diseases of the digestive system from 155 to 124. Seven deaths of child-bearing women occurred during the month as against 4 in January. If these numbers be compared with the births, it will be found that 1 death of a mother took place to every 206 children registered as born alive during the month under notice, as against 1 to every 357 such children in the previous month.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 2.—REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF OFFICERS.

Preamble.—Whereas by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890* (54 Victoria No. 1197), hereinafter called "the Act," it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of that Act, the board may from time to time make such by-laws and regulations as it thinks fit with respect to, *inter alia*, the duties, discipline, and regulation of all officers and servants of the board under that Act, and may also in such by-laws, with the approval of the Governor in Council, impose reasonable penalties, not in any case exceeding the sum of £20, for the violation of any such by-laws or regulations. Now therefore the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, hereinafter called "the board," doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred as aforesaid, or otherwise possessed by the board, make the by-laws and regulations following, which shall be binding upon all officers and servants of the board, in addition to the provisions as to officers which are prescribed and enacted in the Act, sections 42 to 48 inclusive.

Introduction.—*Rights of officers under Act No. 1197, section 71.*—*Application of Public Service Regulations.*—The regulations under the *Public Service Act 1890*, made by the Public Service Board, approved by the Governor in Council, and published in the *Government Gazette*, 5th January, 1891, shall apply to all officers of the board who have rights protected by the 71st section of the board's Act, substituting for verbiage of the said regulations, which relates to the government or to administrators or officers thereof, verbiage applying as nearly as the circumstances will admit to the board and its administration, but shall not apply in so far as the said regulations are overridden by, or are inconsistent with, the provisions of this by-law.

ATTENDANCE.

1. *Hours of attendance.*—The hours of attendance at the office of the board shall be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Five o'clock p.m., except on Saturdays, when the hours of attendance shall be from Nine o'clock a.m. to Twelve o'clock noon.

2. *Luncheon.*—One hour will be allowed for luncheon, from One o'clock until Two o'clock p.m., save for such officers as may be told off to attend in the meantime, and who shall have a like time for luncheon, either before One or after Two o'clock.

3. *Record of times of arrivals and departures to be kept.*—The times of arrival and departure both in the morning and at luncheon time shall be recorded in the attendance books, which shall not be available for signature after five minutes past the time for arrival. All officers, excepting those specially exempted by the engineer-in-chief, secretary, or treasurer, shall sign the attendance books, which shall be in the custody of the officers in charge.

4. *Officer to be deemed irregular in attendance when more than five minutes after due time.*—Any officer arriving at the office after five minutes beyond the time for arrival shall report himself to the officer in charge, who shall record the time of his so arriving in the attendance book.

5. *Irregularity in attendance, when an offence.*—Every officer in charge shall, at the end of every month, report to the secretary through the head of his branch, any irregularity of attendance during the month on the part of officers under him. If any officer shall be found to have been irregular in his attendance for more than three times, he shall be deemed guilty of a breach of these regulations.

ABSENCE FROM DUTY.

6. *Absence without leave.*—Any officer who shall be absent from duty without permission shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations.

7. *Leave of absence for recreation.*—The officers' and servants' committee, upon the recommendation of the chief officer of the branch, may grant holiday leave of absence which shall not exceed in one year eighteen working days, exclusive of gazetted public holidays, and will be granted only when the work will permit of the absence of the officer, and will, moreover, be dependent upon the applicant's good conduct and regular attention to duty.

8. *Leave of absence through sickness.*—Applications for leave of absence on the ground of illness shall be addressed to the secretary, and shall be supported by medical testimony. By direction of the chairman or secretary, the applicant may be subjected to medical examination. The duties of any absent officer shall be performed by his brother officers, without additional salary or remuneration, in such manner as the responsible officer may authorize or direct.

9. *Officer absent through illness or through emergency not entitled to pay during absence.*—Any officer obtaining leave of absence on account of illness, or in any other emergency, shall not be entitled to receive pay during such absence. Nevertheless the officers' and servants' committee may, if it think fit, order that the absent officer shall receive pay for such periods and at such rates as the committee may direct and the board approve.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

10. *Incivility or discourtesy an offence.*—Any officer guilty of any incivility or discourtesy in his official intercourse with the public shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations.

11. *Discipline to be maintained.*—*Appeals of officers to be to the chairman.*—Every officer shall obey promptly all instructions that may be given to him by the officer under whose immediate control or supervision he is placed. If any officer should think that he has ground of complaint arising out of such instructions, or from any other cause whatsoever, he may at all times report the same, through his immediate superior, to the chairman.

12. *Accounts, collections, and payments to be in accordance with the "Audit Act 1890."*—In the matter of accounts and the collection and payment of the board's moneys, officers are enjoined to conform strictly to the provisions of the *Audit Act 1890*, as modified by the board's Act, and to such regulations and directions as may from time to time be issued by order of the board.

13. *Officers not to incur liabilities or alter contracts without authority.*—No officer shall be authorized to incur, or shall attempt to incur, any liability, or shall have authority to make, or shall attempt to make, any contract on behalf of the board, without the authority, in writing, of the chairman. The general conditions and forms of specifications and of contracts which may from time to time be prescribed shall be strictly adhered to by the professional and other officers, unless under special circumstances an alteration therein be made, and be approved in writing by the chairman.

14. *Officers in charge responsible to maintain discipline.*—*Monetary transactions between officers discouraged and forbidden.*—Officers in charge shall be at all times accountable for the maintenance of good order and the regulations, and shall afford in all respects the utmost aid and support to the head of the branch. All monetary transactions between officers or between them and any persons employed under them are strictly forbidden.

15. *Information not to be given without authority.*—Except in the course of official duty, no information concerning the business of the board shall be given by any officer directly or indirectly, without the express direction or permission of the chairman.

16. *Officers responsible for care of board's property.*—Officers will be held responsible for the careful use and preservation of all property and buildings in their possession, custody, or care, and shall, in the event of repairs being required, make a requisition for the same.

MISCELLANEOUS.

17. *Applications of officers, how to be made.*—The application of any officer for promotion, leave of absence, change of quarters, or upon any other matter affecting his position, shall be made through the head of his branch to the secretary.

18. *Requisition, how to be signed.*—Stores are only to be obtained upon orders signed by the chairman, engineer-in-chief, or secretary.

19. *Officer intoxicated to be reported and suspended.*—If any officer in charge shall observe that any one under his direction or supervision is unfit to perform his duties properly by reason of over-indulgence in intoxicating liquor, he shall temporarily suspend him from duty, and immediately report the matter, through the head of his branch, to the secretary, who shall inform the chairman forthwith.

20. *Extra work to be performed in cases of emergency.*—Officers will be required to perform duty beyond the usual hours whenever it may be necessary to bring up arrears of work, or in any temporary pressure of business or other emergency.

21. *Officers to be acquainted with and give effect to by-law.*—All officers are required to acquaint themselves with these regulations, and must comply with and give effect to the same, and to all instructions issued for their guidance in the performance of any duty which may be intrusted to them.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.

22. *Travelling allowances.*—*Scale.*—Travelling allowances will be made upon the following scale, viz:—

Officers receiving £500 per annum and upwards	20s. per day
£250 per annum and less than £500	15s. "
less than £250 per annum	10s. "

Full day, when allowed.—A full day's allowance shall only be made when the absence necessitates the obtaining of breakfast, dinner, tea, and bed. All other allowances shall be *pro rata*.

Of stationed officers.—When officers are absent on duty in fixed or other localities for more than one week, special weekly allowances will be made at reduced rates by the officers' and servants' committee.

Incidental expenses, how certified.—Incidental expenses for horse hire, coach hire, buggy hire, &c., will only be allowed upon the certificate of the chairman, engineer-in-chief, or secretary.

RATE COLLECTORS.

23. *Rates collected half-yearly.*—All rates due in each district must be collected and paid in by the expiration of each half-year, and collectors will be held liable for all arrears, unless proper steps have been taken to recover same.

24. *Collecting books to be supplied early.*—Collecting books will be supplied as early as practicable each half-year, and any difficulty experienced in obtaining a sufficient number weekly must be reported in writing at the time to the officers' and servants' committee.

25. *Notices to be delivered and rates enforced in course.*—The notices are to be delivered with all despatch, and two subsequent applications made for payment (except in urgent cases of tenants leaving, &c.); a "final notice" may then be served, and should the amount not be paid at the expiration of one week from date of serving "final notice," a warrant of distress to be issued. The dates of each application, and of serving the notices, likewise of payment, must be entered in the blocks of the collecting books. The writing of receipts, &c., otherwise than in ink, is expressly forbidden.

26. *Collections to be lodged with bank.*—Sums in excess of £20 to be retained (34 Vict. 1197, sec. 121).—The collections are to be lodged as often as possible to the credit of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, Metropolitan General Fund, in such bank as may be directed, and in no case shall a collector retain any sums amounting to £20 beyond the day after receipt of same. Collectors must not dispose of any such moneys otherwise than as herein directed.

27. *Cheques to be crossed to metropolitan general fund.*—When cheques are received for water rates they are to be at once crossed, and the words "by cheque" written on the face of the receipt.

28. *Cheques to be drawn or indorsed by the person from whom received.*—All cheques received should be drawn by the person paying the rates, or indorsed by him to identify the payment. The practice of accepting cheques for a larger amount than due, and giving change, is prohibited.

29. *Cheques not to be taken when previous cheque has been dishonoured.*—Cash only must be taken from any person whose cheque has on a previous occasion been returned from the bank dishonoured.

30. *Official receipt to be given.*—Receiving payment for water rates without giving the proper official receipt for same, or altering any receipts, is expressly forbidden, and shall be deemed an offence against this by-law.

31. *Weekly statement of collections or receipts to be furnished to treasurer.*—A detailed statement must be rendered by each collector or receiver, on the usual form, of every rate collected or received, supported by duplicate bank vouchers for amount of same, to the treasurer to the board at such times as may be directed. All duplicate bank-slips are to have the list of cheques indorsed thereon.

32. *Examination of collecting books.*—Collecting books must be delivered up for examination at such times as required by the treasurer.

33. *Receipts to be stamped, if required.*—Duty stamps must be affixed to all receipts for £5 and upwards.

34. *Officers to insure their lives.*—*Scale of insurance.*—*Disposition of policies.*—All officers entering or who have entered the service of the board, and whose names are not included in the Fifth Schedule to the Act, shall insure their lives in the form of an endowment, payable at the age of 60 years, or sooner in the event of death. The amount of the insurance shall be upon the following scale:—

Salary or Wages.	Amount of Insurance.
Not exceeding £100 per annum	£100
Above £100, but not exceeding £200	200
Above £200, but not exceeding £300	300
Above £300, but not exceeding £400	400
Above £400, but not exceeding £500	500

and so on, the insurance being in every case increased by £100 in the above proportion as successive advances in salary of £100 or fractions thereof are made. The policies shall be in the names of the assured, who shall duly assign the same to the board, and shall be deposited with and retained by the treasurer to the board during the officer's employment under the board, and upon cessation of such employment the policy shall be re-assigned and returned.

Premiums of life insurance to be deducted from salary.—It shall be the duty of the said treasurer to deduct half-yearly from the salary or wages of the assured the premiums due to the insurance companies, and to pay the same to the said companies.

Return of policy in certain cases.—Upon any officer leaving the service of the board, or upon dismissal, the insurance policy or policies in his name shall be re-assigned and returned to him, and in case of death shall be assigned and given to his legal representative.

35. *Guarantee or security to be given by officer, if required.*—Before any officer or servant of the board enters upon any office or employment by reason whereof he will or may be intrusted with the custody or control of money, the board will require and take from him such security for the faithful execution of such office or employment, and for duly accounting for all moneys which may be intrusted to him by reason thereof, as it thinks sufficient. In all cases of security given to the board the expense of giving such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.

36. *Officers offending subject to penalty—of fine, suspension, or dismissal, &c.*—Any officer proved to the satisfaction of the officers' and servants' committee to have committed a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, which may be deducted from any salary, wages, or moneys coming due or owing to him by the board, to be suspended from employment pending the board's dealing with the committee's report upon the case, and to be dismissed or otherwise dealt with.

The foregoing By-law was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works on the 9th day of February, 1892, subject to approval by the Governor in Council of the penalties imposed thereby for offences against the provisions thereof.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Mines Act 1890* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and such Regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made on the 28th day of July, 1890, respecting licences to search for any metal or mineral other than gold, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE "MINES ACT 1890," RESPECTING LICENCES TO SEARCH FOR METALS OR MINERALS OTHER THAN GOLD.

1. MODE OF APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE.

Any person desirous of obtaining a licence to search for metals or minerals other than gold may apply therefor by delivering or causing to be delivered to the Secretary for Mines an application, duly dated, containing the name and address of the applicant, the name of the metal or mineral for which it is proposed to search, and the precise locality, together with a plan or sketch showing the extent of the area for which a licence is desired.

2. EXTENT OF THE AREAS.

The maximum areas to be occupied under such licences shall be as follow:—

For lands supposed to contain Coal, an area not exceeding 640 acres.

For lands supposed to contain the Ores of Iron, an area not exceeding 100 acres.

For lands supposed to contain other minerals or metals (except Gold), an area not exceeding 50 acres.

Special Cases.

In cases where it shall be shown that a departure from the foregoing areas would, under special circumstances, be desirable, the same may be diminished, extended, or otherwise altered, provided that the total area shall in no case exceed 640 acres.

3. THE AMOUNT OF FEES.

The amount of fee shall be paid prior to the issue of licence, and shall be in accordance with the following scale:—

For an area exceeding 320 acres, but not exceeding 640 acres—12 months, £10; 6 months, £5; 3 months, £2 10s.

For an area exceeding 160 acres, but not exceeding 320 acres—12 months, £5; 6 months, £2 10s.; 3 months, £1 5s.

For an area exceeding 80 acres, but not exceeding 160 acres—12 months, £2 10s.; 6 months, £1 5s.; 3 months, £1.

For an area exceeding 64 acres, but not exceeding 80 acres—12 months, £1 5s.; 6 months, £1; 3 months, £1.

And for any area not exceeding 64 acres—12 months, £1; 6 months, £1; 3 months, £1.

4. FORM OF LICENCE.

The licence shall be in the form hereunto annexed, and shall have indorsed thereon a plan of the lands on and over which the licensee may search for the mineral or metal named in such licence; and such licence shall be subject to the restrictions, limitations, and conditions in the memorandum indorsed thereon or thereunder written or printed.

Miners or other persons requiring to occupy for mining purposes any part of the surface of the land, or to enter thereupon for such purposes, or for the purpose of cutting, constructing, repairing, or cleaning any race, shall, with the consent of the Minister for the time being having charge of the Mining Department, and on paying the licensee such compensation as the said Minister may direct, be permitted to do so; and the acceptance by the licensee of any sum so determined shall render void this licence so far as regards the portion in respect of which such payment shall have been made.

5. The licence shall not apply to any lands for which any application has been made for a lease or licence prior to the date of the application for this licence, if such application has not been disposed of by the proper officer.

6. The Governor in Council shall at any and all times have full power to sell, lease, or license the lands, or any part thereof, comprised in this licence without any payment of compensation to the licensee; and in such case this licence, so far as regards the lands sold, leased, or licensed, shall be rendered void.

And the Honorable Alfred Richard Outtrim, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, hereafter referred to as the Trust, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulations following:—

1. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

2. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away from any drinking tap, trough, or public or private service-pipe any water shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary, such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement, in accordance with the yearly charge fixed by the Trust. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on same is capable of registering one million gallons.

4. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

5. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

6. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

7. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust to affix such self-acting valve.

8. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

9. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Before any licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.

The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

11. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve-pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and, if none, the owner, shall in every instance in which damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

13. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as the Trust may seem best.

14. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

15. If any person bathe in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, which, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, has been required to be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply, or in any other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash, or throw, or cause to enter therein any dog or other animal, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

16. If any person throw or convey, or cause or permit to be thrown or conveyed, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing into any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or wash or cleanse therein any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any clothes or other thing, he shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

17. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything, which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or neglectfully allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise; and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

18. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

19. In the construction of these Regulations, the word person shall extend to and be deemed to include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word Trust shall mean the Nhill Waterworks Trust.

OMEIO WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Omeio Waterworks Trust do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation:—

1. Every person desiring to be supplied by the Trust with water by measure shall, at his own expense, provide a meter (which meter shall be submitted to and examined by the proper officer of the Trust, who, if he shall find the same correct and in proper working order, shall give his certificate to that effect) which when fixed shall be maintained and kept in proper working order by such person.

The meter must be so placed as to be open for inspection and so as to be protected from injury, and with means of access thereto. The key of the meter shall be in possession of the Trust.

No meter shall be connected with more than one separate and distinct inlet-pipe leading from the service-pipe unless otherwise permitted by order of the Trust.

2. All service-pipes with necessary stop-cocks shall be supplied and fixed at the cost of the person or persons requiring the same under the direction and supervision of such officer or servant as the Trust may appoint.

3. All delivery-cocks to be of high pressure and of strong hard brass, and all exposed places to be open and shut by a movable key or handle.

4. Plumbers and other persons employed to lay on service-pipes and to fix meters, or to relay or refix the same, must satisfy the proper officer of the Trust that they are competent to perform the same in a workmanlike manner, and shall pay a licence-fee of One pound per annum.

5. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering one million (1,000,000) gallons.

6. If any person shall waste water of the Trust by neglecting to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the mains of the Trust into the premises of such person, after receiving notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as the Trust may see fit until the necessary repairs shall be effected.

7. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, nor shall any person not supplied with water, by measure at any time use water by hose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Water-closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main but from a cistern only, so constructed that water cannot flow continuously, and not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

9. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take or carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

10. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

11. No person shall lay any pipe, to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

12. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of the customers shall each have a stop-cock at the main and another at the footpath, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. diameter.

For the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -in. diameter.

For the supply of water for other than domestic purposes, and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize in each case.

13. No pipes shall be affixed to the main pipe nor to any service-pipe or apparatus connected therewith, nor shall any alteration be made in any existing pipes or apparatus without notice in writing of the intention so to do being given to the Trust, and the consent of the Trust thereto first had and obtained.

14. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted, the inlet-pipe to which must be visible and accessible, and attached to the bath above the bottom thereof, and the bath provided with a proper well-fitted and water-tight ground outlet plug or cock.

15. All water-troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps, to prevent overflow.

16. Buildings in the course of erection will be supplied with water at the rate of One per centum on the contract price of foundations, masonry, brickwork, and plastering, to be paid in advance, before making any connexions. Buildings not being built by contract, at such a charge as shall be agreed to by the Trust.

17. The water supplied in the Trust district shall be received and used under and in accordance with these regulations and the *Water Act 1890* and such parts of the *Public Works Statute 1890* as are incorporated therewith.

18. If any person, whether supplied with water by the Trust or otherwise, shall commit a breach of these regulations, such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence; and any such person, if supplied with water by the Trust, shall be liable to have the water cut off from his premises, either by cutting the pipes by or through which such water is supplied or otherwise, as the Trust may think fit, and such supply shall cease so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

19. In the foregoing resolutions, wherever the word "officer" or "servant" appears, the same shall be deemed to be taken and mean an officer or servant of the Trust duly authorized in that behalf.

The foregoing regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Omeio Waterworks Trust under and by virtue of the *Water Act 1890* this 8th day of March, 1892.

OMEO WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION MAKING A RATE FOR WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeo Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1892 upon all lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house and tenement of the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling;
2. On every house and tenement above the annual municipal value of Sixteen pounds a rate of Six and one-quarter per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic use, and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate, which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—
Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 8,000 galls. per annum.

Do. " 16,000 " "
Do. " 23,500 " "
Do. " 40,000 " "

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons, or fraction of 100 gallons, after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BALMORAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*,
the Trustees of the Balmoral Cemetery make the following Rules
and Regulations, that is to say:—

- These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A

given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed, nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COROP CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Corop Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

- These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
- The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
- All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.
- Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.
- Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.
- No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary, gatekeeper, or sexton.
- Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.
- No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above any coffin previously buried in the same grave.
- The hours for burials shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.
- No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

WE, Richard Dods, James Gray, John Holmes, John McLay, and Henry Filcock, the surviving members of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation purposes in the town of Marong, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the reserve, nor shall remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals, or poultry, without the permission in writing of the committee of management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority in writing of the committee of management.
7. No person shall camp in the reserve, or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.
8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantation of young trees or shrubs.
9. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for races, sports, or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to any gatekeeper or other person authorized by the committee of management to collect the same.
10. Any person being drunk or disorderly, or assaulting any other person, shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.
11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as it may be set apart for races, fêtes, or sports, shall be as follows:—

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any vermin district shall within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act; and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the vermin district for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the vermin districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said vermin districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the vermin districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District shall be Two shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District shall be Two shillings per square mile.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee of any vermin district may, in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate, to be called a "fencing rate," specifying the amount thereof to be paid by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its vermin district upon whose boundaries any vermin-proof wire net fence has been erected by the Board of Land and Works, for the purpose of paying the interest upon the cost of the erection of such fence, or any portion thereof, and for the repair and maintenance of the same: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the North-Eastern Vermin District has recommended a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing to be the fencing rate payable for the current year under the provisions of Part II. of the Act aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of Two pounds ten shillings per mile of fencing to be the fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit as shown above in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be

found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carriers to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 13 of these conditions.

11. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

12. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

13. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money.

14. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.
