**MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST REGULATION.—  
LICENSED PORTERS.**

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1890*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulation, viz.:

151. When a vessel just arrived in the port shall come to on the outside of another vessel lying at any wharf, no porters shall stand on the top of the paddle-boxes or bridges, or on the side of the inner vessel, but they shall arrange themselves in the middle of the inner vessel. But if the vessel just arrived shall occupy an inside berth, they shall then arrange themselves on the wharf, at least 5 feet from the edge thereof, until regularly called and passed on board by an officer of the vessel so arriving. And no porter, on being engaged to carry luggage, shall attempt to transfer it to another, but shall himself accompany his employer agreeably to his engagement.

PORT OF PORT PHILLIP.—SUBMARINE MINING IN THE VICINITY OF SWANSPIT LIGHT-SHIP.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable John Adrian Louis, Earl of Hopetoun, Viscount Aithrie, and Baron Hope, in the Peerage of Scotland; Baron Hopetoun of Hopetoun, and Baron Niddry of Niddry Castle, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom; Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following addition to the General Rules for the Ports in Victoria, that is to say:—

5. The following drawbacks in carriage will be allowed on Wheat conveyed by rail from the under-mentioned stations and shipped at Portland, Port Fairy, and Warrnambool for places outside Victoria, viz.:—

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulations Nos. III. and XIX. of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid by Order in Council bearing date the sixteenth day of October, 1890, and doth make the Regulations following in lieu thereof respectively, viz.:—

## III.—PAYMENTS BY WAY OF RESULTS.

1. Payments by way of results will be made to head teachers and assistant teachers upon examination of their schools by an inspector in the subjects specified in the course of free instruction.

2. The maximum payment which any teacher can obtain by way of results will be an amount equal to one-half of his fixed salary.

3. In order to entitle the teachers of any school to this maximum—

(i) Every scholar who has attended the school during any part of the two weeks preceding such visit must be presented for examination, unless prevented from attending by any unavoidable cause, such as—

- (a) Removal from the district;
- (b) Suffering from severe bodily accident or sickness, or being excluded on account of infectious disease at home;
- (c) Flooded state of the roads;
- (d) Death of a near relative.

Scholars who, within the two months immediately previous to the inspector's visit, have resumed attendance after exclusion from school for at least two months on account of infectious disease need not be taken into account in calculating the percentage unless the teacher so desire.

(ii) The inspector must be satisfied—

- (a) That every scholar has a satisfactory knowledge of the work of the class in which he is enrolled, and has made adequate progress, and that singing and drawing and the special lessons mentioned in the General Notes to Regulation I. have been satisfactorily taught.

Scholars over seven years of age in Class I. who have been not less than twelve months on the roll, must be presented for individual examination. Other scholars in that class may be so presented if their attainments be satisfactory.

Children (1) who have been less than six months in their class, or (2) have attended less than half the number of possible attendances during the six months preceding the examination, need not be taken into account in calculating the percentage, but should be examined to test their classification and progress; provided that of the children due for examination in any school the number excluded from examination on the foregoing grounds shall not exceed during the year 1890 twenty per cent., during the year 1891 fifteen per cent., and during subsequent years ten per cent. In the case of the children included under (1) above, who have been promoted less than six months prior to the examination, the inspector must be satisfied that their promotion was necessary or desirable; and in the case of those included under (2) above the irregularity of attendance must be satisfactorily explained. A satisfactory explanation would be one which showed that the irregularity was in no measure due to negligence or want of energy or tact on the part of the head teacher.

(b) That the names and ages of the scholars are stated correctly in the rolls.

(c) That the scholars are properly classified.

(iii) The average age of the scholars examined individually in Class 1 must not exceed 8 years; the average age of the scholars in Class 2 must not exceed 9 years; of those in Class 3, 10 years and 6 months; of those in Class 4, 12 years; and of those in Class 5, 13 years and 6 months.

(iv) In special cases where considerable progress is shown no deductions will be made on account of the average age of any class exceeding that specified in the preceding clause. "Considerable progress" shall be thus defined for this purpose—

(a) The scholars to be properly classified and to pass well, gaining not less than 80 (eighty) per cent. of the possible passes, exclusive of the merit grant.

(b) The infants to be efficiently taught on a proper system.

(c) Of the children presented for individual examination, excluding those who have been previously examined in the sixth class, not less than 75 (seventy-five) per cent. shall be presented for examination in a higher class than that in which they were presented in the preceding year.

4. Not more than 90 per cent. of the marks obtained by any school shall be granted for compliance with the conditions specified above under 3 (ii). The remaining 10 per cent. shall be awarded according to the degree of merit shown in the following respects, viz.:—

(a) State of premises, furniture, apparatus, and supply of requisites.

(b) Arrangement of school work (including time-table), distribution of staff, supervision, and classification.

(c) Style of work at examinations and inspections, progress (as shown by percentage of promotions), presence of a Sixth class where practicable, &c.

(d) Discipline and tone.

5. Marks will be withdrawn for individual scholars and for classes failing to comply with any of the required conditions. Provided that if the classification and progress are satisfactory—

(1) No deduction will be made for the excessive age of scholars in part-time schools;

(2) That in full-time schools the age of any pupil who has been less than 12 months on the rolls of the school may be disregarded.

6. The result payment made to the teachers will be in the same ratio to the maximum as the number of marks actually awarded to the school is to the number which might have been obtained; provided that in schools having more than one teacher entitled to result payment, any such teacher who has displayed marked inefficiency may be paid on some lower percentage of the maximum than that awarded to the school.

7. Any change in the amount payable for results, consequent upon an examination of the school, will take effect from the first day of the month succeeding that in which the examination is held.

8. In new schools result payments will be based upon a percentage of 80 until the school shall have been examined for results; but the payments upon that percentage will cease from the last day of the month in which the examination takes place.

9. The examination of a school for results will be held annually, and, as far as practicable, in the same month of the year.

#### XIX.—DRILL AND GYMNASTICS.

1. Allowances, by way of results, will be made to teachers who may be appointed in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act 1890* to give instruction in military drill, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) That the teacher giving the instruction hold a certificate of qualification from the Department, or have passed in the written work of the examination for such certificate, and have not failed or refused to submit to examination in the art of teaching drill, or have passed an examination in Parts I. and II., Field Exercise, before a military board.
- (b) That every class receiving instruction be taught for not less than one hour per week at the time specified in the school time-table.
- (c) That the pupils exhibit a fair amount of proficiency.

2. The maximum allowance that may be obtained will be as follows:—

and so on; but teachers of drill will not be appointed to schools with an allotment based upon an average attendance of less than 50 pupils, and only boys in classes above the Second will be included in estimating the attendance by which the number of teachers of drill will be determined.

3. Any qualified teacher of drill may be required by the Department to take charge either of a drill class or (with the approval of the Defence Department) of a cadet detachment in his own school.

4. The payments to a teacher of drill may at any time be discontinued should the allotment be based on an attendance of less than 50 pupils, or should the attendance at the drill class render necessary a reduction in the number of teachers of drill.

5. The proportion of the maximum allowance to be paid to each teacher of drill will be determined upon examination by an inspector or other officer appointed for the purpose; but in schools which have not been examined in drill, 80 per cent. of the maximum allowance will be paid until the first of such examinations takes place.

6. When gymnastics are taught by a qualified instructor appointed in accordance with the provisions of the *Public Service Act*, an allowance at the rate specified in clause 2 above will be paid, subject to the foregoing regulations respecting military drill, so far as they are applicable.

**BRIDGEWATER WEIR AND HEAD-SLUICE.**

A weir on concrete masonry, situate on the Loddon River at a point north-westerly from the north-west angle of section 4 of the township of Bridgewater, in the county of Bendigo, and about ten (10) chains north-easterly from the side of the bridge that carries the Bendigo to Inglewood line of railway across the Loddon River; together with the masonry, offtake, and sluices situate adjacent to the right or eastern end of the said weir, and which forms the headwork for the diversion and regulation into the Bullock Creek channel; as the same is shown and described in drawings and specifications deposited in the Office of Water Supply, Melbourne.

That the sum of Thirteen thousand seven hundred and ninety pounds eighteen shillings and seven pence sterling (£13,790 18s. 7d.) shall be transferred from the liabilities of the said Loddon United Water Trust, and form part of the cost of the national works aforesaid, and be a charge against the amount set forth in the 4th item of the Third Part of the Schedule to *The Water Supply Loans Act 1889*.
2. That the sum of Three thousand two hundred and nine pounds one shilling and five pence sterling (£3,209 1s. 5d.) shall be transferred from the liabilities of the said Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and form part of the cost of the national works aforesaid, and be a charge against the amount set forth in the 4th item of the Third Part of the Schedule to *The Water Supply Loans Act 1889*.
3. That the said transfer shall take effect from and be deemed to have been made on the twenty-fifth day of November, 1889, the date on which the works aforesaid were declared by the said *Water Supply Loans Act 1889* to be national works.

WE, George Williamson Bruce, Henry Butler, and Robert Reid, the duly appointed committee of management of the reserve for a cricket ground and for other purposes of public recreation in the city of South Melbourne, having framed the following regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:

1. The reserve shall be divided as follows—
  - (1) The grand stand, pavilion, members' and ladies' reserves.
  - (2) The playing ground.
  - (3) The remainder of the reserve.

2. All persons shall be admitted to the 3rd division, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on days whereon international, intercolonial, cup, and other important cricket or football matches shall be played, or on days on which sports shall be held in the reserve: Provided always that the number of days upon which fees for admission to the reserve may be charged and collected shall not exceed fifty-two (52) in any one (1) year.

3. No person shall enter at any time into any part of the 1st division except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing such person in that behalf.

4. Every person paying for admission to the 3rd division, or any part thereof, or to the grand stand, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall upon demand produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand production or surrender of same; and no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued.

5. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure for the occasion of any cricket or football match or sports may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten (£10), which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure; and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, buildings, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee; and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

6. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

7. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

8. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any grass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

9. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, sheep, goats, or other animals.

10. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord.

11. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent in writing of the committee of management first obtained.

12. No person, except workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for the plantation of young trees or shrubs.

13. Any persons committing in the reserve or in any of the building or erections for the time being thereon any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased and shall or may be in possession of a ticket of admission thereto or to any part thereof—

- (a) Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language.
- (b) Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner.
- (c) Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or during practice at cricket, or when crossing or trespassing upon the ground would be injurious to it as a cricket ground.
- (d) Being found in any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division of the reserve, and not producing on demand, or surrendering if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized a ticket for the admission of such person to the place wherein he may be found, unless such person shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to such person has been lost.
- (e) Obtaining admission to any part of the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd division when not entitled to such admission under these regulations.

14. Public betting in any part of the reserve or enclosures shall not be permitted, and every person infringing this regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and the reserve.

Every person offending against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such regulations, and who, after

**EASTER EXCURSIONS.**

Holiday Excursion tickets will be issued to and from all stations (Suburban excepted) from the 11th till the 22nd April (both dates inclusive), available for return for one calendar month from date of issue. Example:—An excursion ticket issued on the 19th April will be available till the 19th May. When the last day falls on a Sunday, the ticket will be available till the next day. The journey must be commenced on the day the ticket is issued, but after a distance of 15 miles has been travelled the journey may be broken at the discretion of the passenger. (See also additional notices re tickets from Melbourne.) During the same period tickets will be issued at Messrs. T. Cook and Son's, 82 Swanston-street, City, from Melbourne to all stations; and at Yarra-street, Geelong (C. H. Swift); Lydiard-street, Ballarat (F. W. Niven and Co.); High-street, Bendigo (J. Hemming) to Melbourne only.

*Sydney Excursion tickets.*—From the 11th till the 22nd April (both dates inclusive). Excursion tickets will be issued at Melbourne for Sydney at the following return fares, viz.—First class, £3 6s. 6d.; second class, £4 1s. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, but will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. first class, and 10s. second class, in addition to the above-mentioned fare. The journey cannot be broken on that line.

**Adelaide Excursion tickets.**—From the 11th till the 18th April (both dates inclusive), Excursion tickets available by the express and ordinary trains will be issued at Melbourne for Adelaide at the following return fares, viz.:—First class, £4 4s. 5d.; second class, £2 10s. 8d. These tickets will be available for return for two calendar months from date of issue, and the journey may be broken.

**Luggage.**—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and have the address so secured that it will not come off.

Separate tenders will be received for each schedule, but they must include the whole of the articles therein mentioned, and a separate price must be stated for each article for one and three years respectively. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Security will be required either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Deputy Postmaster-General, for the amount of the deposit required (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security will be calculated at Ten per cent. on the total amount of contract.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

In the event of the contractor failing to carry out the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Persons failing to take up their contracts will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.) within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Supervisor of Maintenance, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 6, or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

13. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

#### CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheds, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. The empties to be removed at the contractor's expense.

4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal.

5. Milk.—The milk must be fresh, pure, and of the best quality, and subject to test when required by the department. Should the supply prove to be not of contract quality, any expense incurred will be charged to the contractor.

6. Fresh meat is to be supplied in such proportions as may be required, and, when the quantity admits, to be delivered in fore and hind quarters alternately, also buttocks only when ordered. When shins of beef form a portion of the supply, a fair proportion of the bone, not less than ten inches, must have been cut off. The sticking pieces must be removed from the fore quarters of beef.

7. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

8. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned or any officer authorized by him.

9. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted and shall return the order to the contractor, and the account is to be rendered as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies accompanied by the receipted delivery order. For the supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts, the account is to be rendered monthly for such quantities only as are issued, the difference between the supply and issue to be kept at the contractor's credit. Supplies not issued at the termination of the contract to be removed by the contractor. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

10. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

11. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

12. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

13. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

15. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.

16. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the persons to whom the rations are due or to the contractor in waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department, or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be obtained by the officer requiring it. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

17. A refusal to execute orders, or a repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the said Treasurer may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal or repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith and forfeit the whole or any part of the security money.

18. 5. To amend section 8 of Act 1173 by substituting the date 31st December, 1893, for 31st December, 1892, at the end of said section.

6. To make provision as to the application or investment of surplus loan moneys heretofore or hereafter to be borrowed by the Tramways Trust under the powers conferred on that behalf by divers Acts of Parliament.

7. To provide that the cost of remitting to England interest on money borrowed by the Trust, and also certain other payments to be made by the Trust, shall, after 31st December, 1893, be charged against sinking fund instead of being contributed by the several municipalities represented on the Trust, and to amend section 8 of Act 1173 accordingly.

8. To alter the date of the election of members of the Tramways Trust by suburban municipalities, and to amend section 10 of Act 952 accordingly.

9. To make provision for the disqualification of members, and to amend clause 7 of the 4th schedule to Act 765 accordingly.

## HORSHAM DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

BY-LAWS of the Horsham District Hospital, incorporated under 27 Vict., No. 220.

## OBJECTS.

1. The objects of the institution are to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of colour, country, or creed, and to treat casualties.

2. The institution shall consist of a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, governors, and contributors, who shall be deemed the contributors for the time being.

## QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS.

3. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of governors and contributors:—

£20 personal contribution (in one year), life governor  
£10 layman (collecting in one year), annual governor  
£10 society or company (in one year) to entitle to nominate, annual governor

Any municipality contributing a percentage of its revenue shall have the privilege of nominating one person for each £10 given; such person to be deemed and have the privileges of an annual governor.

£1 yearly contributor (eligible for election as a member of committee), with power to recommend patients, according to the undermentioned scale:—

Life governor—1 in-patient or 3 out-patients annually.  
Annual governor—1 in-patient or 3 out-patients annually.  
Contributor—1 in-patient and 3 out-patients annually for £1 subscription

Individual members of a firm shall pay not less than £1 per annum to qualify them, or either of them, for a vote

4. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which subscription is paid, and no governor or contributor will be entitled to any privileges until the subscription be paid.

5. Life and annual governors and contributors of £1 and under £5 per annum shall be entitled to one vote; contributors of £5 and under £10 per annum, two votes; contributors of £10 and upwards per annum, three votes at all meetings of governors and contributors.

6. No person shall vote as a governor or contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the hospital; nor shall any person hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of subscribers to the hospital unless he shall have been a subscriber for the space of six months previous to such meeting. Provided always that where a subscriber shall have paid his subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place the payment of his subscription for the then current year at any time before such meeting shall entitle such subscriber to vote.

## GENERAL MEETING.

7. At all the meetings of governors and contributors the president or one of the vice-presidents, or the treasurer as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes a casting vote.

8. The annual meeting of governors and contributors to the hospital shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of July in every year, for the following purposes:—

(1) The election of the president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, honorary medical officers, and two auditors for the ensuing year.

(2) The election of members of committee of management

(3) The transaction of any other business of which due notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting.

9. At all general meetings of governors and contributors ten shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorum is present within one hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week at the same day, hour, and place.

10. It shall be competent for the committee of management, or any ten or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the secretary or president to summon a special meeting of contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being specified in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

11. All elections when contested shall be by ballot. Life governors only may vote by proxy.

## COMMON SEAL.

12. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept with the bankers of the hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the president, and the other by the secretary.

13. The common seal shall not be fixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the committee of management at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

14. On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.—(54 Vict., No. 1099, s. 21.)

15. If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or shall cease to be a personal contributor of £1 per annum, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent from four consecutive meetings of the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the said Act, are required to go out of office.—(54 Vict., No. 1099, sec. 15.)

15A. The qualification for membership on the committee of management shall be a personal donation of £1 annually.

16. The institution shall be managed by twenty-four members of committee (twelve of whom shall be residents in the country districts). They shall be elected by ballot at the annual meeting by the governors and contributors for the time being in the following order:—President, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and twenty members.

17. The committee of management shall direct the general business of the institution, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution.

18. They shall meet on the second Tuesday, at 3 p.m., in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint, four to form a quorum. The chairman of committee of management shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of equality of votes a casting vote.

19. The committee of management may depute two or more of their number who, together with the medical officer, shall have full power to consider any applications, and discharge any patient who in their opinion is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution, reporting in their minutes the reason for refusing any application or ordering any discharge.

20. No paid officer of the hospital shall be a contractor directly or indirectly, nor shall any member of the committee of management be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

21. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance-sheet at the annual meeting of governors and contributors in July of each year, such balance-sheet to be published in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

22. The president shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees.

#### HOUSE COMMITTEE.

23. The committee of management shall choose from among themselves a house committee of three, two to form a quorum, who shall attend to the internal management of the house, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the medical officer's, collector's, dispenser's, and house steward's books, and such other matters (except the final acceptance of tenders) as may be delegated to them by the committee of management.

24. They shall retire quarterly, and their places shall be filled by the appointment of other members of the general committee of management.

25. They shall meet once in each week, or oftener, on such days and at such hours as they may appoint, and the honorary medical and surgical officers, if any, shall be members *ex officio* of the house committee.

26. They shall also, once at least in each month, inspect all books, audit the house accounts, compare the balance in the secretary's ledger with the bank pass-book, and examine the books relating to provisions, wines and spirits, &c., kept by the house steward and dispenser respectively.

27. They shall watch the entire expenditure of the institution, and shall carefully scrutinize the monthly analysis of such expenditure, with a due regard to the number of patients in the house, reporting to the committee of management any matter of importance.

28. They shall be present (without notice) once in each fortnight at the receipt and distribution of stores, wines, and spirits, and once in each quarter shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores, wines, and spirits with the house steward's and dispenser's books.

29. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by members of the house committee their signatures shall be appended, with the date of examination, in token of the correctness on such books or vouchers to that date.

#### AUDITORS.

30. The accounts of the hospital shall be verified annually by two auditors appointed for the purpose by the governors and contributors. At such audit the accuracy of the whole accounts for the preceding year, and of the balance-sheet prepared (with lists of subscriptions and donations, and statements of securities for the annual meeting), shall be certified for the satisfaction of the governors and contributors for the time being.

31. They shall specially call attention to erasures or important alterations in any book or document, and shall report to the governors and contributors for the time being, or to the committee, on any matters within their province.

32. They shall be appointed at a general or special meeting of governors and contributors for the time being.

#### HONORARY SURGEONS.

33. It shall be optional for the annual meeting of contributors for the time being to elect one or more honorary medical officers, who shall be legally qualified medical practitioners, and shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the hospital at all times; they shall assist the medical officer in the performance of capital surgical operations, but unless in very urgent cases no such operations shall be performed without previous consultations of the medical staff, and they shall regularly consult, where practicable, in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the hospital.

#### MEDICAL OFFICER.

34. The medical officer shall be allowed private practice within the borough of Hursley only, and the hospital shall at all times have the prior claim upon his services. He shall visit the institution every morning not later than eleven o'clock, and every evening not later than eight o'clock, and not leave until every patient has been attended to, prescribed, and dispensed for. He shall also attend at all other times his services are required. At all his attendances at the hospital the hours of his arrival must be entered in a book to be kept in the dispensary for that purpose. He shall receive the certificate from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, decide on their fitness for admission, and discharge all patients as soon as he considers them fit to leave. He shall have charge of all patients in the hospital and of their treatment, but in cases of difficulty or danger or long continuance in the hospital he shall consult the honorary medical officers. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs and chemicals, carefully examine them both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects to the house committee. He shall also make an inventory of same in a book to be kept in the dispensary for that purpose, and keep an account of receipts, expenditure, and loss or breakage of same. He shall, in June of each year, prepare to submit to the committee a list of surgical instruments required during the ensuing year. He shall, there being no dispenser, perform such duties as would devolve upon that officer. He shall be responsible to the committee of management for all drugs and chemicals received, and shall at the close of each year furnish the committee with a list showing the gross quantities of the principal drugs used during the year, with the quantities remaining in stock. He shall dispense all medicines required in the institution, and make such medical compound as is considered necessary or advisable. He shall order and receive all drugs and chemicals from the contractors at such times and in such quantities as may be necessary, and see that they correspond in description, quantity and quality with the tenders and orders, and in case they do not he

shall have the power to return the same. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the matron and nurses, and shall see that the ward-beds, bedding, and clothes are kept in a proper state of cleanliness, and in case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty on the part of any of the officers, nurses, or servants of the institution, he shall have power to suspend same and report to the house committee. He shall enter regularly in books, to be kept in the dispensary for that purpose, the names of patients with the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment, also how each in-patient is prescribed for, and shall put the names of diseases on the cards at the head of the patients' beds. He shall perform all surgical operations and *post-mortem* examinations, and give notice to the honorary surgeons when consultations are to be held or operations performed; but in all cases of emergency he shall act to the best of his judgment. In the event of his requiring temporary leave of absence, the house committee, if satisfied of the necessity and that due arrangements have been made for the performance of his duties, may grant such leave, not exceeding one week, and report the same to the committee of management at the next monthly meeting. Any longer term of leave of absence can be granted by the committee of management only. Should he be absent from his residence on private practice, he shall make provision for being communicated with without delay.

#### TREASURER.

35. All moneys received on account of the hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and be deposited by him in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

36. On receiving any money from the collector he shall sign the block of the collector's receipt-book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

37. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president (or a vice president) and the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

38. Previous to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the treasurer shall require a warrant, signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

39. He shall prepare or cause to be prepared by the secretary, for submission to the committee at the meeting of each month, a statement showing in detail the actual position of the hospital funds on the previous Monday, with a certificate of the amount paid into the banking account since the previous meeting; such statement and certificate to be signed by him, and laid on the table by the secretary, with the bank pass-book made up to the same date. He shall place all money received from the secretary on account of patients to credit of a trust account in the name of the hospital.

#### SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

40. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the hospital, compile all reports and returns, conduct the correspondence subject to the control of the president, attend all meetings, and bring all business before same, carry out all resolutions, and perform all clerical duties not assigned to other officers, and that may be ordered by the committee of management. He shall see that all documents relating to patients are carefully preserved.

41. He shall collect subscriptions and all money due to the hospital; in all cases give a receipt for the same, and pay to the treasurer on the day after receipt all money he may have received, and render an account of same to the committee of management. He shall furnish security from a public company to such an amount as the committee may deem necessary. All money received by him from patients at the time of their admittance shall be handed to the treasurer not later than on the following day.

42. He shall live in the house. He shall not absent himself from the hospital for more than three hours at any time or after twelve o'clock at night without the leave of the house committee or president. He shall have the immediate control and general superintendence of the male servants of the hospital, and in case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty on the part of any of them, he shall report the same to the president, house committee, or medical officer, whichever is first available. He shall see that the grounds are kept in proper order and cleanliness. He shall attend to all matters requisite for the repairs of building, such as painting, plastering, and draining in or about the premises, and to the efficient state of the bath-rooms and water-closets. He shall keep an inventory of the articles in use in each ward, and shall monthly or oftener, if required, inspect the same to see what things may be deficient. He shall keep the key of the mortuary and deliver to the undertaker the bodies of all deceased patients, and in no case shall he allow a body to be removed without taking a proper receipt for the same, to be entered by him in a book kept for that purpose. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, and garden implements. He shall make an inventory of same in a book to be kept for that purpose in which he shall regularly enter the receipt, loss or breakage of each article, and he shall in the month of January prepare and submit to the house committee, for the committee of management, a list of such articles as may be required in his department. He shall order and receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and tradesmen, and see that they correspond in description, quality and quantity with the orders, and in case they do not he shall have power to return the same, and in case they do not he shall have the provisions and other necessaries required for daily consumption; shall daily hand same to the matron and shall receive her receipt. He shall not permit any of the provisions, utensils, or stores to be carried away from the hospital. He shall furnish to the house committee a monthly report of all provisions, wines, and spirits received and disbursed during the month, and communicate any other matter of importance regarding the welfare of the hospital to the house committee.

MATRON AND NURSES.

43. The matron and nurses shall live on the premises, and shall not leave for any length of time without the permission of the medical officer or house committee; they shall be regular in their attendance, behave with tenderness to all patients, and with civility and respect to strangers.

44. They shall pay great attention to cleanliness personally and in their respective wards, and in all things entrusted to their charge, particularly to the bedding of the patients, and have it changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

45. They shall administer to the patients the medicines and the diet at the time and in the manner directed by the medical officer, and not permit them to take any which have not been prescribed; they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the said officer, and watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients, and report the same to the medical officer.

46. They shall not permit patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines, or diet, or anything to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors without an order from the medical officer.

47. They shall be careful to collect all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c., to the dispensary, at which they shall attend at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

48. They shall not admit any stranger without permission from the medical officer or matron, except upon the days and during the hours appointed for that purpose.

49. They shall be obedient to the regulations of the hospital, and carry out all the details in the agreement as entered into between them and the committee of management, and report immediately to the medical officer or secretary any impropriety of conduct or infringement of the rules by any patient, visitor, or other person; and, if such complaint is not properly attended to, report the same to the committee of management at its next meeting.

PATIENTS.

50. Members of committee of management and honorary professional staff shall have a discretionary power of recommending in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the committee of management. Accidents and cases of decided emergency shall be admitted at any time, and in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) at such hours as may be appointed by the committee of management.

51. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with primary syphilis, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of the medical officer, honorary surgeons, or of the committee of management, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

52. Any person wishing to be received in the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted with the sanction of the house committee; he shall be charged 6s. per day (or a smaller sum if deemed expedient by the committee of management), and in the event of any operation being performed, a fee shall be paid by him to the hospital, the amount of such fee to be decided by the medical officer, but in no case shall it exceed five guineas.

53. Patients quitting the hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

54. Any person who either before or after his admission into such institution makes a statement to the effect that he is in destitute circumstances and unable to pay for his maintenance, attendance, or relief, and who in consequence of having made such statement is admitted or maintained by or who receives medical attendance or relief from any charitable institution, society, or association incorporated under this Act, or the Principal Act, or from any hospital not so incorporated, shall be liable to contribute towards the same according to his means any sum not exceeding the actual cost of such maintenance, attendance, or relief which the committee or trustees may demand, and such sum shall on demand thereof be a debt due by such person, and may be recovered from him or from his executors or administrators after his death by such incorporated charitable institution, society, or association, or by the treasurer of such hospital as aforesaid. A written statement of the amount so due, purporting to be signed by the secretary of any such incorporated charitable institution, society, or association, or of any such hospital, shall be *prima facie* evidence of such amount, and in addition to the amount so due such person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds to be recovered on complaint before two or more justices. Provided that the committee, court, or board of directors or governing body of any such incorporated charitable institution, society, or association of any such hospital shall have absolute discretionary power to remit or postpone payment of all or any sums of money due to them under the provisions of this Act.—54 Vict. No. 1099. Sect. 25.

55. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, strictly observe all the directions of the surgeon, matron, and nurses, take their medicines and diet at the time directed, and not take any other than those prescribed; neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

56. They shall not leave their ward and go into another ward, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than has been granted without the express leave of the medical officer.

57. They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, deface or injure any part of the ward, furniture, bedding, or clothing, nor sing, blaspheme, nor use rude or indecent language, neither shall they smoke without permission from the medical officer.

58. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the medical officer, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the house committee at each meeting.

59. Patients not paying full hospital fees deemed able by the medical officer to assist in the work of the hospital staff shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

60. Patients shall not sit up after Eight p.m. in winter, nor Nine o'clock in summer; and all patients considered by the medical officer able to do so, shall rise not later than Seven a.m. in the summer, and Eight o'clock in the winter.

61. Paying patients may be admitted, provided the wards are not all occupied by ordinary patients.

62. The admission tickets of paying patients to be signed by two members of committee, and the charge for admission shall be fixed by the committee of management.

63. Paying patients to receive the same treatment as ordinary patients, and they must abide by the same rules, it being left to the medical officer to place them in any ward, either separate or with other patients.

63a. Out-patients shall attend the hospital at the times given on the notice board at gate, viz., "On Tuesdays and Fridays, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Twelve noon, and shall provide bottles, corks, &c., for medicines as required."

PATIENTS AND VISITORS.

64. Patients and visitors shall not give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or other person connected with the hospital.

65. Visitors are admitted on Sundays and Wednesdays between the hours of Two and Five o'clock in the afternoon, except persons from a distance, who may be admitted at any time by permission of the medical officer or matron; but no visitor will be allowed to remain more than one hour, except ministers of religion, who may visit the patients at any time.

66. Visitors shall not give to, or leave with, any patients medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other things without the permission of the medical officer, nor interfere with the nurses, nor disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

67. Any visitor or patient violating any of the rules of the hospital or behaving with impropriety will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the medical officer of the committee of management.

GENERAL.

68. Any officer, nurse, or servant, or other persons in any way connected with the hospital who shall receive, directly or indirectly, any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and will not in future be permitted to hold any office or appointment belonging to the hospital.

69. The committee of management may grant such leave of absence to the officers as is considered desirable, making any arrangements necessary to fill the positions temporarily.

CLERGYMEN AND RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTORS.

70. Every clergyman or religious instructor who visits at the hospital shall confine his visits to the sick patients who belong to his religious communion, unless his services are specially requested by any patient of another communion.

71. Every such clergyman or religious instructor shall perform the duties of his office at the bedside of his patient in such a way as to be as little overheard as possible by the surrounding patients.

72. No person shall read aloud or conduct public religious service in the sick wards of the hospital.

73. The operating-room of the hospital shall, as far as practicable, be available for public worship among the convalescent patients.

74. Clergymen and other visitors must retire from the bedside if requested to do so by any member of the medical staff or matron.

Memoranda.

The friends of the institution are informed there is a library for the use of the patients, and that donations of books, periodicals, &c., will be thankfully received; also old clean calico and blankets.

Each patient should, if possible, be provided with a change of clean clothing, particularly with cotton and flannel shirts and stockings.

The foregoing bye-laws were adopted at a meeting of contributors held in the Town Hall, Horsham, on 12th February, 1892, as the bye-laws of the Horsham District Hospital.
